Surrender in the Moments We Can't Control

Opening Question

Against All Odds:

What's your favorite "back against the wall" story or movie? What makes it so compelling?

Personal Reflection

Have you ever felt stuck—not knowing what to do or what your next step should be?

How did you respond in that moment?

What's the Real Problem?

In Exodus 14, Israel's greatest problem wasn't Pharaoh's army—it was their fear and loss of trust in God.

Can you think of a time when the real issue in your life wasn't just what you were facing externally, but something deeper happening internally?

Surrender vs. Solved

If God always solved our problems immediately, how might that shape the way we relate to Him?

How could it actually limit our trust or dependence on Him?

God's Greater Goal

God eventually delivers Israel—but first, He brings them to a place of surrender.

How does surrender position us to see God's power and bring Him glory?

Why might surrender be more important than immediate rescue?

Be Still

Read Psalm 46:10 aloud

"Be still, and know that I am God..."

What does "being still" look like in a real-life situation where you feel pressure to act or fix something?

Where might God be inviting you to trust Him instead of striving?
