  - Outcasts are loved by God: the poor, tax collectors, sinners, women, Samaritans, & even the Gentiles are
- 2. The transperse of wealth 984 4, 124 154; 16:10-13, 19-31; 18:18-30; it can choke out your faith
  - Jesus is constantly warning about power & wealth & commanding the rich to give what they have to the poor.
- 3. <u>Prayer</u>: 3:21; 5:16; 6:12, 28; 9:18, 28-29; 10:1-2; 11:1-4; 18:1-8; 22:32, 39-46; 23:34, 46
  - Jesus prays at every major point of His ministry!
- 4. The Holy Spirit: 1:15-17, 35, 67; 2:25-27; 3:16, 22; 4:1, 14, 18; 5:17; 11:13; 12:10-12; 24:49;
- Luke begins & ends with the power of the Holy Spirit & worship at the temple. He is central to Jesus' ministry &
- 5. Pr<u>Salvation</u>: 1:5-25, 26-2:38; 4:18-21; 5:30-32; 10:16-20; 19:10; 22:41-42; 24:44-47
  - Jesus being the Savior is emphasized heavily, it's His

# Luke 12 layout

vv1-12 - Fear God, not humanity

vv13-21 - The parable of the rich fool

vv22-34 - "Don't worry about your life"

vv35-48 - Be ready for the return of Christ

vv49-53 - Jesus brings division

vv54-59 - Can't you see that judgment is coming?

In the meantime, when so many thousands of the people had gathered together that they were trampling one another, he began to say to his disciples first, "Beware of the leaven of the Pharisees, which is hypocrisy. <sup>2</sup> Nothing is covered up that will not be revealed, or hidden that will not be known. <sup>3</sup> Therefore whatever you have said in the dark shall be heard in the light, and what you have whispered in private rooms shall be proclaimed on the housetops.

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Hypocrisy is giving impressions of yourself to others that do not correspond to the real you internally or privately.

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Luke 12:1-3 cf. 1 Cor. 4:4-5 the Lord will judge & bring to light!

Hypocrisy may mean that we care about what people think of us more than what God thinks of us.

It is an issue of faith.

8 "And I say to you, anyone who acknowledges me before others, the Son of Man will also acknowledge him before the angels of God, <sup>9</sup> but whoever denies me before others will be denied before the angels of God. <sup>10</sup> Anyone who speaks a word against the Son of Man will be forgiven, but the one who blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven. 11 Whenever they bring you before synagogues and rulers and authorities, don't worry about how you should defend yourselves or what you should say. 12 For the Holy Spirit will teach you at that very hour what must be said."

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"If you say that the Spirit's work is in fact the work of the devil, you have begun to call evil good and good evil, a moral cul-de-sac without turning room. Here in Luke 12 the intention seems broader. Someone who sees Jesus at work and misunderstands what is going on may speak against him, only to discover the truth and repent. But if someone denounces the work of the Spirit, such a person is cut off by that very action from profiting from that work. Once you declare that the spring of fresh water is in fact polluted, you will never drink from it. The one sure thing about this saying is that if someone is anxious about having committed the sin against the Holy Spirit, their anxiety is a clear sign that they have not."

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<sup>13</sup> Someone from the crowd said to him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me." 14 "Friend," he said to him, "who appointed me a judge or arbitrator over you?" 15 He then told them, "Watch out and be on guard against all greed, because one's life is not in the abundance of his possessions." <sup>16</sup> Then he told them a parable: "A rich man's land was very productive. 17 He thought to himself, 'What should I do, since I don't have anywhere to store my crops? <sup>18</sup> I will do this,' he said. 'I'll tear down my barns and build bigger ones and store all my grain and my goods there. 19 Then I'll say to myself, "You have many goods stored up for many years. Take it easy; eat, drink, and enjoy yourself." ' 20 "But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is demanded of you. And the things you have prepared—whose will they be?' <sup>21</sup> "That's how it is with the one who stores up treasure for himself and is not rich toward God."

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vv22-29: lesser to greater arguments that God cares for you v30: two incentives to not worry: 1. the unbelievers do it 2. God (your Father!) already knows your needs

<sup>31</sup> "But seek his kingdom, and these things will be provided for you. <sup>32</sup> Don't be afraid, little flock, because your Father delights to give you the kingdom. <sup>33</sup> Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Make money-bags for yourselves that won't grow old, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. <sup>34</sup> For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

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#### Luke 12:35-48 - Be ready for the return of Christ

V37 What does it look like to be "alert" for us now?

- What do we learn about Jesus in this verse?
- V40 Why does Jesus use the "Son of Man" title?
- A: Dan. 7:13-14 the SoM has kingship (brings judgment)
- When is Jesus returning?
  - A: we don't know (vv39-40)
- What could v45 look like for us today?
- vv47-49 all will be held accountable based on what they were entrusted with. The sin of omission (cf. Jam. 4:17) will be punished just like sins of commission. "From everyone who has been given much, much will be required" (v48a cf. Matt. 25 be ready w/extra oil & don't bury talent!)

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- V50 "baptism" into death (the cross cf. Mrk. 10:38; Rm. 6:3)
- "it consumes me until it is finished!" cf. John 19:28-30
- V51 (cf. 2:14 "peace among those w/whom He's pleased")
- V53 cf. Mic. 7:6 even households will be divided on Jesus
- right away you say, 'A storm is coming,' and so it does. <sup>55</sup> And when the south wind is blowing, you say, 'It's going to be hot,' and it is. <sup>56</sup> **Hypocrites!** You know how to interpret the appearance of the earth and the sky, but why don't you know how to interpret this present time? <sup>57</sup> "Why don't you judge for yourselves what is right? <sup>58</sup> As you are going with your adversary to the ruler, make an effort to settle with him on the way. Then he won't drag you before the judge, the judge hand you over to the bailiff, and the bailiff throw you into prison. <sup>59</sup> I tell you, you will never get out of there until you have paid the last penny."

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
