

# What can you find out about the Author, Date, Occasion, Location, Etc. about the book of Exodus?

- Author: Moses - Jesus attributes it to Moses citing Ex. 3:6 (cf. Mrk. 12:26; Lk. 20:37)
- Date: Exodus is somewhere from 1446-1225 B.C.
  - Early date: 1 Kgs. 6:1; Late date: Ex. 1:11 (both have pros & cons)
- Occasion: Israel's redemption & preparation
- Location: events take place in Egypt and the wilderness of Arabia. The book could have been written during that time or near Moab before Moses died and Joshua led the conquest.

# Themes in Exodus

- God's faithfulness (Gen. 12; 15; 17 etc. are upheld despite sin & bad circumstances)
- Israel's origin story as a nation (Ex. 19:5-6)
- God's Name and character (Ex. 3:14; 34:6-7)
- The Law (covenant (24) & tabernacle (25-40))
- The exodus way (a reoccurring theme in *all* the Bible). "Exodus" lit. means, "the way out"!


