

# Eliminate the Competition | Written in Stone Exodus 20:1-2, 4-6

## What is the SECOND commandment and why does it matter?

God has set us free so we can live free. If we have prioritized God in our life, we will be able to filter everything after that to determine whether or not it serves us to serve Him. Next up? Our worship! The problem here is that we are inundated by cultural influenced. God's desire for relationship cannot co-exist with compromise. Our hearts must be pure. But our hearts have competing desires. Don't they? While we may not bow our knees to wooden or stone idols, we still need to eliminate the desires of our hearts that do not point our "image" to our Creator God. If we do, generations will thanks us.

**Text Prep**: God had set the Israelite FREE...so they could live free. And enjoy the peace, prosperity and blessing of living in a covenant relationship with Him. Again, the 10 Commandments don't save us...but they do reveal our deep need for Jesus...who perfectly fulfills his summary of all the laws to love God and to love people.

# **Exodus 20:1-2, 4-6**: Then God gave the people all these instructions:

2 "I am the Lord your God, who rescued you from the land of Egypt, the place of your slavery.

4 "You must not make for yourself an **idol of any kind** or an **image of anything** in the heavens or on the earth or in the sea. 5 You must not bow down to them or worship them, for I, the Lord your God, am **a jealous God** who will not tolerate your affection for any other gods.

I lay the sins of the parents upon their children; the entire family is affected—even children in the third and fourth generations of those who reject me. 6 But I lavish unfailing love for a thousand generations on those who love me and obey my commands.

We must not make idols. > Idols?! = An idol is something we turn to when invisible God doesn't "show up" as expected.

- Idol / Graven image = Egypt to Canaan
  - Golden Calf: Why? Aaron created a softer more approachable version of he Israelites famously created a golden calf and worshiped it while Moses was on Mount Sinai receiving the Ten Commandments (Exodus 32).
    - Apis Bull/Ptah: a worshipped bull representing the god of creation/craftsmanship.
    - Baal: Baal was a widely worshiped god of fertility and rain. He was represented by a bull.
  - Asherah: was Baal's "wife." Asherah worship included rituals related to fertility and prosperity, and it was common for sacred poles or trees ("Asherah poles") to be erected as symbols of her worship.
  - **Molech**: Molech was associated with fire and child sacrifice. Worshipers believed that offering their children as burnt sacrifices to Molech would ensure blessings and protection.
  - Cultures created idols in hopes that the god would fill that statue with their power and presence.
- God doesn't need us to make Him an image. → Why? → We are His image (Gen. 1:26-27). → Live like Jesus: Col. 1:15-20 / Gen. 1:26-27 → Gen. 2:7 / Acts 1:8
- VISION: Come to the Table...and grow in your relationship with Jesus.→Prayer: Lord, lead us to YOUR way.
   →We must not make idols because God already has images! But we want to do things OUR way.

## We make idols when we allow our image to be directed at anything other than God.→Infinite!→Calvin Quote

- Israel's context for idol creation: impatience, Egypt's influence, lack of faith, crowd pressure, fun!
- Our hearts have competing desires.: A desire is not wrong. But has that desire been submitted to Christ?!
- Cultural Idols: Wealth, sex, beauty & power. = ME!→We struggle to submit our desires to God, don't we?!
  - In my teens & 20's i had desires...and sometimes they became idols.
    - Adventure: I naturally seek new, novel, adventure. If a desire is AN END...→Panama
    - Marriage: I saw an amazing marriage in my parents. I wanted that. → Jane Eyre quote
  - NOW: I have other desires...
    - Comfort: The furniture in my house...is all COMFORTABLE.
    - Control: I get impatient bc i expect something should go a certain way in a certain timeline.
- Eliminate the competition! → We point our desires at Jesus! → Cut off your hand?! Mt. 5:30
  - ELIMINATE competing desires by saying NO…sometimes.→AA

- ELIMINATE competing desires by directing that desire to Jesus...ALWAYS.
- VISION: A church family has people with different backgrounds...that is why we are careful with our freedoms.
- →We stop making idols by eliminating competing desires…by saying no or POINTING that desire to Jesus.

## Every person in the room today can impact their family line for a thousand generations!→We become like Jesus...

- Sin impacts 4 generations? = RELATIONSHIP!→4 generations = great grandparents!→Harold vs. Sigfred.
- Love for God and I? = RELATIONSHIP!→The legacy of a thousand generations... FOREVER LEGACY.
- VISION: Why does the church exist…to change the DESTINIES of families.→Prayer: Lord, LEAD US!.
- →When we eliminate the completion and point our desires to Christ...becoming like Him.

## →We eliminate the competition so a thousand generations can experience God's lavish love!

## TALK ABOUT IT - Questions to GROW through with family, friends, & myself.

- 1. How have your ancestors impacted your faith? How will your relationship with God impact coming generations?
- 2. Are there any specific cultural idols or influences that you find particularly challenging to resist? How can you point the underlying desires to Jesus?
- 3. Think about the desires you've had throughout different stages of your life. Have any of these desires become idols at certain times? How did you navigate the competing desires in your different life stages?
- 4. Reflect on the importance of relationships and community within the church family. How can the church play a role in helping individuals eliminate competing desires and grow in their relationship with Jesus?
- 5. PRAYER: "Father, we desire every desire point back to YOU. Help us eliminate the competition!"

## Why commandments? What is the purpose of the Law?

- 1. Revealing God's Holiness: Exodus 20:7-8 (NLT) "You must not misuse the name of the Lord your God. The Lord will not let you go unpunished if you misuse his name. Remember to observe the Sabbath day by keeping it holy."
- 2. Establishing God's Covenant: Exodus 34:28 (NLT) "Moses remained there on the mountain with the Lord forty days and forty nights. In all that time, he ate no bread and drank no water. And the Lord wrote the terms of the covenant—the Ten Commandments—on the stone tablets.'
- 3. Guiding Moral and Ethical Behavior: Exodus 20:12 (NLT) "Honor your father and mother. Then you will live a long, full life in the land the Lord your God is giving you."
- 4. Maintaining Social Order: Exodus 21:23-25 (NLT) "But if there is further injury, the punishment must match the injury: a life for a life, an eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth, a hand for a hand, a foot for a foot."
- 5. Revealing God's Will: Psalm 119:105 (NLT) "Your word is a lamp to guide my feet and a light for my path."
  6. Teaching Love and Compassion: Leviticus 19:18 (NLT) "Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against a fellow Israelite, but love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord.
- 7. Revealing Humanity's Sinfulness: Romans 3:20 (NLT) "For no one can ever be made right with God by doing what the law commands. The law simply shows us how sinful we are."
- 8. Pointing to Christ: Galatians 3:24 (NLT) "Let me put it another way. The law was our guardian until Christ came; it protected us until we could be made right with God through faith."

That is why the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and set it apart as holy.
- 12 "Honor your father and mother. Then you will live a long, full life in the land the Lord your God is giving you.
- 13 "You must not murder.
- 14 "You must not commit adultery.
- 15 "You must not steal.
- 16 "You must not testify falsely against your neighbor.
- 17 "You must not covet your neighbor's house. You must not covet your neighbor's wife, male or female servant, ox or donkey, or anything else that belongs to your neighbor."

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
