

Love My Enemies | Written in Stone Exodus 20:1-2, 13

What is the 5th commandment and WHY does it matter?

God has set us free so we can live free. That means we prioritize God in our life so we can filter out whatever does not serve us to serve Him. As image bearers, we represent Him in how we talk & how we spend our time...especially to our kids! Learning to honor our parents help us to honor God and people. Today, we talk about murder!

While 10 Commandments didn't save the Israelites, they did provide a framework to build their new FREE community. They would discover that even though the Law was GOOD, they were still enslaved to sin. The Law reveals we still need Jesus to set us free and live out our lives loving God and loving people.

Exodus 20:1-2, 13: Then God gave the people all these instructions: 2 "I am the Lord your God, who rescued you from the land of Egypt, the place of your slavery. (Relational-personal God who has rescuED us from slavery to FREEDOM) 13 "You must not murder.

We must not murder.→Wilkin Quote

- What is the difference between between "kill" & "murder?"→Hebrew word for kill is: "רָצַח," (ratsach)
- Murder: unsanctioned taking of human life w/malicious intent or premeditation.
 - Cain & Abel > Family is the laboratory of learning faith...and its its the incubator of murderous thoughts.
 - Pharoah / Egyptian Culture: Murdered all the baby boys (Ex. 1:15-22) = INCONVENIENT.
 - Herod (Mt. 2:16-18): Herod tried to murder Jesus! = Threat to his rule.
- What does murder include/exclude?
 Clarksville: We had a bunch of soldiers in our church.
 - EXCLUDES MORAL KILLING: Self-Defense, Just War, & Capital Punishment, Hunting.→PETA Quote
 - INCLUDES IMMORAL KILLING: "MURDER"→What constitutes "human?"→Does God sanction abortion?
 - Zygote contains all genetic info needed to develop into a human being. → Heart beats at 3 weeks.
 - Quote by Robert P. George: "Human embryos are not...some other type of animal organism...
 - Life begins at conception: Sinners in womb: Psalm 51:5→Psalm 139:13-16→Is. & Jer. called in womb.→Lk. 1:15 John the Baptist filled w HS in womb.→He gets us VIDEO.→Jesus...a baby in a womb.
 - The unborn, elderly, physically or mentally challenged, poor, powerless, the foreigner...MY ENEMY?!
- Kingdom Culture: (Jesus is King): We serve a God who creates, sustains, & enters into life because he VALUES life.
- VISION: What is Mesa: We are PRO-baby Jesus→hope→women→men→responsibility→education→justice→ assistance→Bible→TRUSTING JESUS even in IMPOSSIBLE situations…bc a hard life is still a HOLY life.

Jesus takes murder to a deeper level.→Breaking the the 6th commandment...is easier to break in our HEARTS.

- Jesus famously taught: "If you call someone an idiot…"→ Matthew 5:22-24
- Jesus goes deeper...to the root of our sin...our hearts.→Cain: Offense→Anger→Hate→Murder→I have forgiven...
- Jesus was murdered so the cycle could be broken.→We have sinned→offended→angered→murdered...
 - Jesus died on the cross to take the punishment of our sin. This SATISFIED the JUSTICE of God.
 - Jesus rose from the grave to give us life after we die. → This FULFILLED the LOVE of God.

How do we love our enemies?

- REST→Redefine enemy→Take anger to God→Imagine them in God's arms→Forgive→Pray→Kill em w/kindness→Share
- Robert Rule/Linda QUOTE.→Robert RELEASED Gary.→"Father, forgive them for they know not what they do...
- →When we love our enemies, we live out the Gospel.

TEACHING NUGGETS:

Why commandments? What is the purpose of the Law?

- 1. **Revealing God's Holiness**: Exodus 20:7-8 (NLT) "You must not misuse the name of the Lord your God. The Lord will not let you go unpunished if you misuse his name. Remember to observe the Sabbath day by keeping it holy."
- 2. **Establishing God's Covenant**: Exodus 34:28 (NLT) "Moses remained there on the mountain with the Lord forty days and forty nights. In all that time, he ate no bread and drank no water. And the Lord wrote the terms of the covenant—the Ten Commandments—on the stone tablets."
- 3. **Guiding Moral and Ethical Behavior**: Exodus 20:12 (NLT) "Honor your father and mother. Then you will live a long, full life in the land the Lord your God is giving you."
- 4. **Maintaining Social Order**: Exodus 21:23-25 (NLT) "But if there is further injury, the punishment must match the injury: a life for a life, an eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth, a hand for a hand, a foot for a foot."
- 5. Revealing God's Will: Psalm 119:105 (NLT) "Your word is a lamp to guide my feet and a light for my path."
- 6. **Teaching Love and Compassion**: Leviticus 19:18 (NLT) "Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against a fellow Israelite, but love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord."
- 7. **Revealing Humanity's Sinfulness**: Romans 3:20 (NLT) "For no one can ever be made right with God by doing what the law commands. The law simply shows us how sinful we are."
- 8. **Pointing to Christ**: Galatians 3:24 (NLT) "Let me put it another way. The law was our guardian until Christ came; it protected us until we could be made right with God through faith."

Augustine on "Just War":

The earliest church father who is often associated with outlining the principles of a just war is Augustine of Hippo (354-430 AD). His ideas are found in his work "The City of God" (Latin: "De Civitate Dei"), specifically in Book XIX, chapters 7-17.

- **Legitimate Authority:** Augustine emphasized that a war must be waged by a legitimate authority, typically the government or a ruler, rather than by individuals or groups acting independently. This authority should declare war in accordance with proper legal procedures.
- Just Cause: Augustine argued that a just war must have a legitimate and morally defensible reason, such as selfdefense, the defense of innocent lives, or the restoration of justice. The cause should be in response to a significant and unjust harm.
- Right Intention: The primary intention of going to war should be to restore peace and justice, not for selfish gain or
 revenge. Augustine emphasized that the motivation for war should be the pursuit of a just outcome.
- Proportionality: Augustine recognized the importance of proportionality in the use of force. He cautioned against
 excessive force and harm inflicted during warfare, stressing that the benefits of the war should outweigh the harm
 caused.
- Last Resort: Augustine believed that war should be a last resort, used only when all peaceful means of resolving the conflict had been exhausted. Diplomacy, negotiation, and non-violent methods should be pursued first.
- **Right Conduct:** Augustine advocated for the humane treatment of prisoners of war and the protection of non-combatants, particularly civilians. Deliberate harm to innocent people should be avoided.
- **Right to Self-Defense:** Augustine supported the idea of self-defense as a just cause for war. If a nation or community is under attack or facing a grave threat, it has the right to defend itself.
- **Pursuit of Peace:** Augustine stressed that the ultimate goal of a just war should be the reestablishment of peace and order. War should not be waged for its own sake but as a means to achieve a just and lasting peace.

- Exodus 1:15-22: "15 Then Pharaoh, the king of Egypt, gave this order to the Hebrew midwives, Shiphrah and Puah: 16 'When you help the Hebrew women as they give birth, watch as they deliver. If the baby is a boy, kill him; if it is a girl, let her live.' 17 But because the midwives feared God, they refused to obey the king's orders. They allowed the boys to live, too. 18 So the king of Egypt called for the midwives. 'Why have you done this?' he demanded. 'Why have you allowed the boys to live?' 19 'The Hebrew women are not like the Egyptian women,' the midwives replied. 'They are more vigorous and have their babies so quickly that we cannot get there in time.' 20 So God was good to the midwives, and the Israelites continued to multiply, growing more and more powerful. 21 And because the midwives feared God, he gave them families of their own. 22 Then Pharaoh gave this order to all his people: 'Throw every newborn Hebrew boy into the Nile River. But you may let the girls live.'"
- Deuteronomy 19:11-12 "But suppose someone is hostile toward a neighbor and deliberately ambushes and murders him and then flees to one of the cities of refuge. In that case, the elders of the murderer's hometown must send agents to the city of refuge to bring him back and hand him over to the dead person's avenger to be put to death."

- Joshua 20:5 "And when the one who has avenged the death is satisfied, the murderer must not be executed. But if the
 family of the victim is not satisfied, the avenger of blood may continue to pursue the murderer into the city of refuge and
 kill him."
- Psalm 51:5 "5 For I was born a sinner—yes, from the moment my mother conceived me. 6 But you desire honesty
 from the womb, teaching me wisdom even there.
- Psalm 138:13-16 You made all the delicate, inner parts of my body and knit me together in my mother's
 womb.14 Thank you for making me so wonderfully complex! Your workmanship is marvelous—how well I know it. 15
 You watched me as I was being formed in utter seclusion, as I was woven together in the dark of the womb. 16 You saw
 me before I was born. Every day of my life was recorded in your book. Every moment was laid out before a single day

- Matthew 2:16-18: "16 Herod was furious when he realized that the wise men had outwitted him. He sent soldiers to kill all the boys in and around Bethlehem who were two years old and under, based on the wise men's report of the star's first appearance. 17 Herod's brutal action fulfilled what God had spoken through the prophet Jeremiah: 18 'A cry was heard in Ramah—weeping and great mourning. Rachel weeps for her children, refusing to be comforted, for they are dead."
- Matthew 5:22-24 "21 'You have heard that our ancestors were told, "You must not murder. If you commit murder, you are subject to judgment." 22 But I say, if you are even angry with someone, you are subject to judgment! If you call someone an idiot, you are in danger of being brought before the court. And if you curse someone, you are in danger of the fires of hell. 23 'So if you are presenting a sacrifice at the altar in the Temple and you suddenly remember that someone has something against you, 24 leave your sacrifice there at the altar. Go and be reconciled to that person. Then come and offer your sacrifice to God.
- Luke 2:12 12 And you will recognize him by this sign: You will find a baby wrapped snugly in strips of cloth, lying in a manger."

- Ephesians 4:26-27 "And 'don't sin by letting anger control you.' Don't let the sun go down while you are still angry, for anger gives a foothold to the devil."
- Exodus 20:1-17 Then God gave the people all these instructions:
- 2 "I am the Lord your God, who rescued you from the land of Egypt, the place of your slavery.
- 3 "You must not have any other god but me.
- 4 "You must not make for yourself an idol of any kind or an image of anything in the heavens or on the earth or in the sea. 5 You must not bow down to them or worship them, for I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God who will not tolerate your affection for any other gods. I lay the sins of the parents upon their children; the entire family is affected—even children in the third and fourth generations of those who reject me. 6 But I lavish unfailing love for a thousand generations on those who love me and obey my commands.
- 7 "You must not misuse the name of the Lord your God. The Lord will not let you go unpunished if you misuse his name.
- 8 "Remember to observe the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. 9 You have six days each week for your ordinary work, 10 but the seventh day is a Sabbath day of rest dedicated to the Lord your God. On that day no one in your household may do any work. This includes you, your sons and daughters, your male and female servants, your livestock, and any foreigners living among you. 11 For in six days the Lord made the heavens, the earth, the sea, and everything in them; but on the seventh day he rested. That is why the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and set it apart as holy.
- 12 "Honor your father and mother. Then you will live a long, full life in the land the Lord your God is giving you.
- 13 "You must not murder.
- 14 "You must not commit adultery.
- 15 "You must not steal.
- 16 "You must not testify falsely against your neighbor.
- 17 "You must not covet your neighbor's house. You must not covet your neighbor's wife, male or female servant, ox or donkey, or anything else that belongs to your neighbor."
