

"Like a Child!" | Christmas Kindness: Tied With Love Not Strings Luke 18:15-17

"For it is good to be children sometimes, and never better than at Christmas, when its mighty Founder was a child Himself." - Charles Dickens

How should we receive the gift of Christmas?

Jesus is kind to us in order to restore relationship with us. He desires to genuinely bless us. But we cannot receive His kindness or blessings unless we receive them. That requires humility! And humility goes beyond receiving...but extending that same kindness to others.

Luke 18:15-17:

15 One day some parents brought their little children to Jesus so he could touch and bless them. But when the disciples saw this, they scolded the parents for bothering him.

16 Then Jesus called for the children and said to the disciples, "Let the children come to me. Don't stop them! For the Kingdom of God belongs to those who are like these children. 17 I tell you the truth, **anyone who doesn't receive the Kingdom of God** like a child will never enter it."

The gift of Christmas kindness is Jesus in a manger.→It was baby Jesus the shepherds & the wisemen came to see.

- Christmas is the ultimate proof of God being willing to get down on our level.→God in the flesh...A BABY!
 - Last week we saw Jesus' kindness extended to a Zacchaeus...→Romans 2:4-5
 - This week we see Jesus' kindness extended to children...->Jesus gets down to their level!
- We must become like little kids to receive the gift of Christmas kindness.→Kids WANTED JESUS!

We receive a gift with humility.→Matthew 18:1-5→"Wow...i don't deserve that!"→Wow...I see God for who He is...

- Zacchaeus showed humility by turning from his sins.
- The shepherds showed humility by sharing the good news with others.
- The wisemen showed humility by bowing low and giving back.

→ Receive the gift of Christmas like a child, with humility, and then...do something about it!

- "In a 2018 Lifeway Research study, 65% of Americans said Christmas should be more about Jesus. While 2 in 3 may want more Christ in Christmas, most couldn't give you all the details of Jesus' birth story. Slightly more than 1 in 5 Americans (22%) say they could accurately tell the Christmas story found in the Bible from memory. A plurality of U.S. adults (31%) say they could tell the story but may miss some details or get others wrong. Another quarter (25%) could only give a quick overview and 17% say they couldn't tell any of it." Aaron Earls
- "There was a small community in Mexico in which they created a manger scene at Christmas. A young girl named Pepita approached the manger where Jesus lay and began weeping because she had no gift to give the child. In some versions of the story, an angel sat down next to her and said: "as long as you give it in love, it will be accepted." So, the angel told the girl to pull weeds from the side of the road and lay them at the foot of Baby Jesus. For a day of anger is coming, when God's righteous judgment will be revealed.
