Sermon Title: Plot Twist

Text: Luke 19:1–10

Date: Sunday, September 21, 2025

Luke 19:9-10, "Jesus said to him; Today salvation has come to this house... For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."

Truth for Today

- Resting in God's <u>acceptance</u> > Striving for <u>significance</u>.
- Welcome <u>home</u> > work <u>harder</u>
- What I can give > What I can get

Bottom Line:

Grace reminds us there's always room at the table.

Grace meets us where we are, not where we wish we were. (Luke 19:1-4)

Religion is <u>man's</u> attempt to reach <u>God</u>. Christianity is <u>God's</u> attempt to reach <u>man</u>.

Zacchaeus climbing the tree represents:

- Human **striving** apart from **grace**.
- Spiritual <u>emptiness</u> even in worldly <u>success</u>.
- Our longing to be seen.

II. Grace is an invitation before it's an expectation. (Luke 19:5-7)

Jesus doesn't wait for the "<u>cleaned</u> up" you. He loves the "<u>messed</u> up" you.

At the table, <u>scandalous</u> sinners receive His most compassionate <u>welcome</u>. (Luke 15:2)

God's equation for transformation: **Belong + Believe = Become**

III. When grace <u>shows up</u>, generosity <u>breaks out</u>. (Luke 19:8-10)

Grace corrects what we cherish and changes what we chase. In a world consumed with "What can I **get**?" Christ transforms us to ask,

"What can I give?"

 "But whatever were gains to me I now consider loss for the sake of Christ...I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ." - Philippians 3:7-8

Application:

Stop striving and allow Jesus to meet you where you are.

Say yes to the invitation even if you don't "feel" ready.

Flip the script by moving from consuming to contributing.

Reflection Questions:

 Where in your life are you still trying to earn approval and strive for significance?

• How has the idea that you must "clean up" before coming to Jesus

hindered you from drawing closer to Him?

 What's one thing you can do to move from "getting" to "giving" this week?
