Sermon Title: Someone's At The Door

Sermon Text: John 10

Date: Sunday, July 5, 2026

Congregational Reading:

John 10:9–10, “I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. They will come in and go out, and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.”

Question of the Day: Who are you **following**, and where are they **going**?

Bottom Line: The One who gave His **life** can be trusted with **yours**.

1. The doors you **enter** determine the life you **find**. (John 10:1–10)

Application Question: What door am I trying to force open because I believe a **better** life is on the other **side**?

2. The voice you **listen** to becomes the voice you **follow**. (John 10:3–5, 14–16, 27–30)

Application Question: How am I learning to hear God's **voice** above all the **noise** around me?

3. Love is revealed by the **price** it is willing to **pay**. (John 10:11–18)

Application Question: Where do I need to **trust** the Shepherd today instead of trying to **manage** life on my own terms?

Benediction / Blessing:

May the Lord Jesus Christ, the Gate into life and the Good Shepherd of your soul, lead you into the fullness of life only He can give.

May God the Father remind you that you are known by name, held in His hand, and never beyond His care.

May the Holy Spirit tune your heart to the voice of Jesus above every voice of fear, shame, desire, distraction, and despair.

May you have the courage to stop forcing doors that cannot give you life, the humility to follow the voice that calls you by name, and the faith to trust the love that laid itself down for you.

And as you go, may you trust the One who gave His life for yours.
