Ezra 6: "Becoming a Finisher"

Wrestling season...→How can i become a finisher?→Ezra 6:1-22

- "Its not in how you start, but in how you finish that counts." EVERYONE
- "Finishing is better than starting. Patience is better than pride." Ecclesiastes 7:8

A sports season→college / university→a goal or life objective→a career→a life...George O. Wood Zeigarnik effect - our brains are obsessed with unfinished business...waiters remember orders until after delivered...

1-12→Nothing gets done w/out DILIGENCE!→ "Get 'er done!" - Larry the Cable Guy→Tara

- 1-3: Cyrus Decree → 4/5, 8-10: Provision → 6-7, 11-12: Help & Protection → 12: Obey w/DILIGENCE!
- DILIGENCE: careful and persistent work or effort→University, developing career, raising kids, & church building.
- Obstacle to diligence? Apathy, laziness, fear, insecurity, distraction, temptation, & disobedience...
- We don't always FEEL like obeying & being diligent.
- Diligence has less to do with inspiration as it has to do with perspiration.

 Learn to love doing hard things.
- Where is God asking me to be more DILIGENT?→MAKE YOUR BED Quote→Maybe start w/making our beds...

13-18→**When it's done...dedicate it.**→They took time to celebrate this great victory bc they understood it had been a spiritual battle of fighting off apathy, hardship,& persecution. After exile...they had rebuilt God's house.

- Celebration & dedication remind us of God's role in our lives. → HIGHLIGHT VIDEO → This is why we give, serve...
 - Look what God has done...is doing...will do. Past. Present. FUTURE.
 - This is what dedication is all about...last week→Marriage→My kids being dedicated.
- The Israelites had failed, been exiled, but God was giving them a NEW START to experience relationship with him.
- Dedications are new starting points. → New starting points require new sacrifice.
- What can we celebrate and dedicate to God?→What new starting point is God putting before us?

19-22→**Recognize my limits.**→EThe Israelites celebrated the Passover Meal→"It is Finished"

- Passover Meal/Lamb & Festival of Unleavened Bread→"It is finished."
- Moses/Joshua→Zerribbabel, Jeshua, Haggai, Zechariah, people, Cyrus, Darius, & ArtaXe→Jn. 4
- There are some things in life only God can finish.: This is not a cop out...its just true.
- God's story is NEVER finished until God finishes it. → Jn.
- Nightbird.→Is God asking me to leave something UNFINISHED?

→ Finish what God is calling you to finish & trust God to finish you can't. → PRAYER: Father, help...!

Ecclesiastes 7:8

"Finishing is better than starting. Patience is better than pride."

Ezra 6:1-22

1 So King Darius issued orders that a search be made in the Babylonian archives, which were stored in the treasury. 2 But it was at the fortress at Ecbatana in the province of Media that a scroll was found. This is what it said:

"Memorandum:

3 "In the first year of King Cyrus's reign, a decree was sent out concerning the Temple of God at Jerusalem. "Let the Temple be rebuilt on the site where Jews used to offer their sacrifices, using the original foundations. Its height will be ninety feet, and its width will be ninety feet. 4 Every three layers of specially prepared stones will be topped by a layer of timber. All expenses will be paid by the royal treasury. 5 Furthermore, the gold and silver cups, which were taken to Babylon by Nebuchadnezzar from the Temple of God in Jerusalem, must be returned to Jerusalem and put back where they belong. Let them be taken back to the Temple of God."

6 So King Darius sent this message:

"Now therefore, Tattenai, governor of the province west of the Euphrates River, and Shethar-bozenai, and your colleagues and other officials west of the Euphrates River—stay away from there! 7 Do not disturb the construction of the Temple of God. Let it be rebuilt on its original site, and do not hinder the governor of Judah and the elders of the Jews in their work. 8 "Moreover, I hereby decree that you are to help these elders of the Jews as they rebuild this Temple of God. You must pay the full construction costs, without delay, from my taxes collected in the province west of the Euphrates River so that the work will not be interrupted.

9 "Give the priests in Jerusalem whatever is needed in the way of young bulls, rams, and male lambs for the burnt offerings presented to the God of heaven. And without fail, provide them with as much wheat, salt, wine, and olive oil as

they need each day. 10 Then they will be able to offer acceptable sacrifices to the God of heaven and pray for the welfare of the king and his sons.

11 "Those who violate this decree in any way will have a beam pulled from their house. Then they will be lifted up and impaled on it, and their house will be reduced to a pile of rubble. 12 May the God who has chosen the city of Jerusalem as the place to honor his name destroy any king or nation that violates this command and destroys this Temple. "I, Darius, have issued this decree. Let it be obeyed with all diligence."

The Temple's Dedication

13 Tattenai, governor of the province west of the Euphrates River, and Shethar-bozenai and their colleagues complied at once with the command of King Darius. 14 So the Jewish elders continued their work, and they were greatly encouraged by the preaching of the prophets Haggai and Zechariah son of Iddo. The Temple was finally finished, as had been commanded by the God of Israel and decreed by Cyrus, Darius, and Artaxerxes, the kings of Persia. 15 The Temple was completed on March 12, during the sixth year of King Darius's reign.

16 The Temple of God was then dedicated with great joy by the people of Israel, the priests, the Levites, and the rest of the people who had returned from exile. 17 During the dedication ceremony for the Temple of God, 100 young bulls, 200 rams, and 400 male lambs were sacrificed. And 12 male goats were presented as a sin offering for the twelve tribes of Israel. 18 Then the priests and Levites were divided into their various divisions to serve at the Temple of God in Jerusalem, as prescribed in the Book of Moses.

Celebration of Passover

19 On April 21 the returned exiles celebrated Passover. 20 The priests and Levites had purified themselves and were ceremonially clean. So they slaughtered the Passover lamb for all the returned exiles, for their fellow priests, and for themselves. 21 The Passover meal was eaten by the people of Israel who had returned from exile and by the others in the land who had turned from their corrupt practices to worship the Lord, the God of Israel. 22 Then they celebrated the Festival of Unleavened Bread for seven days. There was great joy throughout the land because the Lord had caused the king of Assyria to be favorable to them, so that he helped them to rebuild the Temple of God, the God of Israel.

John 4:34-38

34 Then Jesus explained: "My nourishment comes from doing the will of God, who sent me, and from finishing his work. 35 You know the saying, 'Four months between planting and harvest.' But I say, wake up and look around. The fields are already ripe for harvest. 36 The harvesters are paid good wages, and the fruit they harvest is people brought to eternal life. What joy awaits both the planter and the harvester alike! 37 You know the saying, 'One plants and another harvests.' And it's true. 38 I sent you to harvest where you didn't plant; others had already done the work, and now you will get to gather the harvest."
