Hiding in Plain Sight

Joshua Joshua 7:1-26

Joshua 1:9 – "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."

Truth for Today:

God gives us the <u>freedom</u> to choose, but we can't choose our <u>consequences</u> <u>Sunlight</u> is the best disinfectant.

The cross of Christ transforms guilt into grace.

Bottom Line:

You control your choices, but you can't choose your consequences.

1. <u>Compromise</u> Comes at a <u>Cost</u> (Joshua 7:1–5)

<u>Private</u> sin eventually has **<u>public</u>** consequences.

Galatians 6:7–8: Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. Whoever sows to please their flesh, from the flesh will reap destruction; whoever sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life."

Lie: "My secret sin only affects me."

<u>Truth: "Secret</u> sin takes you further than you want to <u>go</u>, costs you more than you want to <u>pay</u>, and keeps you longer than you want to <u>stay</u>."

II. Repentance restores what sin destroys. (Joshua 7:6-7, 10-13, 16-21)

- What you **cover**, God will **uncover**.
 - "There is nothing concealed that will not be disclosed, or hidden that will not be made known." – Luke 12:2
- What you <u>uncover</u>, God will <u>cover</u>.
 - "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." – 1 John 1:9

God confronts our sin not to **condemn** us, but to **restore** us.

III. Jesus died for what we tried to hide. (Joshua 7:22-26)

Contrast: Achan died for his sin. Jesus died for ours.

- "There I will make the Valley of Achor a door of hope." Hosea 2:15
- "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners,
 - Christ died for us." Romans 5:8

Shame says	Confession admits	Jesus says
I am bad.	I made a bad choice.	You are forgiven and free. (John 8:36)
I am a mistake.	I sinned and I feel bad about it.	You are fearfully and wonderfully made. (Ps. 139:14)
l am a disappointment.	I've let myself and others down.	You are my beloved. (Matt. 3:17)
I have to hide.	l've been hiding out of fear.	Come into the light and be healed. (1 John 1:7)
I'll never be enough.	I can't do this on my own.	My grace is sufficient for you. (2 Cor. 12:9)
I'm defined by my worst moment.	I'm stuck and don't know how to get out.	I make all things new. (Rev. 21:5)
l must earn acceptance.	I've tried to prove my worth.	You are accepted in the Beloved. (Eph. 1:6)
If they really knew me, they'd leave.	I don't want to end up alone.	I will never leave or forsake you. (Heb. 13:5)
My secret keeps me safe.	Hiding hasn't helped me heal.	The truth will set you free. (John 8:32)
I can't change. I'm struggling to grow.	I will finish the work	I started in you. (Phil. 1:6)
