Know the Truth of Jesus

James and John, the disciples in Mark 1, grew up in a culture that was intimately familiar with the concept of dropping everything to follow after a spiritual leader. From the first moment they could understand it, they would have had this goal ingrained in them: "become a disciple of a Rabbi." They would have spent their childhood memorizing the first five books of the Hebrew Scriptures all with the goal of advancing, of gaining the attention of a Rabbi. And this Rabbi, seeing that they had done well, would have asked them to come and follow after him, to walk where he walked, to eat what he ate, to do what he did.

And because we see them on the shore with their father and his fishing boat, we know that they failed. They had not done well enough to gain the attention of a Rabbi, they were told to support their community, to work, and to pray that their children might become Rabbi.

The words James and John had been longing to hear their entire childhood: "come, follow me" were ringing in their ears. Of course they dropped their nets! Of course they left their father and his fishing boat, they knew their purpose!

Know the Truth of Jesus

When we reflect on the immediate obedience of the disciples, we should know that we have that same opportunity as modern followers of Christ. Our worldview is not like theirs: we've been trained to try to stay on course, not to quit our jobs and follow a wandering Rabbi. Even so, our choice is the same. Jesus is reaching out to us, beckoning us to come follow Him. He's asking us to go where He goes, to walk where He walks, to eat what He eats, to do what He does.

We have the opportunity to recognize what these disciples recognized: it's worth it.

Jesus is calling us to accept and know the truth, to apprentice under Him, to truly and deeply know Him. When we take our chance, we let go of the things that the world has placed on us, we drop our nets. We know that He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life, and He promises us that it will be worth it in the end. Just like the disciples, our chance is here.
