Bible Study Discussion Guide

Series: Fully Devoted

Message: The Discipleship Pathway — Lead Yourself & Be Led

Primary Texts: 2 Corinthians 3:18; 1 Timothy 4:7–8; 1 Thessalonians 5:14–15

Sermon Summary

Continuing the series **Fully Devoted**, this message defined how we grow into fully devoted followers of Jesus. Our church highlights four traits that increasingly mark a mature disciple: *biblically rooted believer*, *deeply connected friend*, *missions-minded servant*, and *faithful disciple-maker*. These traits are not a scorecard for salvation; our standing with God is by grace alone through faith alone in Christ. As we walk with Him, the Spirit forms these qualities over time (**2 Corinthians 3:18**). The first two steps of our discipleship pathway are: **Lead Yourself**—own your growth through Scripture, prayer, and worship (**1 Timothy 4:7–8**); and **Be Led**—choose Christian community where others can encourage, correct, and pray for you (**1 Thessalonians 5:14–15**). As we practice these rhythms, God transforms us to reflect Jesus.

Key Scriptures

- 2 Corinthians 3:18 As we behold the Lord's glory, we are transformed into His likeness with ever–increasing glory.
- 1 Timothy 4:7–8 Reject myths; train yourself for godliness. Physical training has some value, but godliness holds promise for now and eternity.
- 1 Thessalonians 5:14–15 Warn the idle, encourage the disheartened, help the weak, be patient with everyone; pursue what is good for one another.
- Exodus 20:12 Honor your father and mother (balances zeal with God's broader commands).
- Matthew 13:20–21 Rocky soil receives the word with joy but withers when trouble or persecution arises.
- John 6:26, 60, 66 After hard sayings, many turned back and no longer followed Jesus.
- Genesis 12:1 Abram called to go to the land God would show him (obedience before full clarity).

The Four Traits of a Fully Devoted Follower

- Biblically Rooted Believer: Beliefs and behaviors shaped by God's Word, not trend or opinion.
- **Deeply Connected Friend:** Pursues meaningful friendships in the body of Christ that point one another to Godliness.
- Missions Minded Servant: Notices physical and spiritual needs and serves while sharing the gospel.
- Faithful Disciple Maker: Grows in Christ and intentionally helps others do the same.

Key Takeaways

- 1 **Grace, Then Growth:** Salvation is by grace through faith; growth is the Spirit's transforming work as we behold Christ (**2 Corinthians 3:18**).
- 2 **Training Matters:** Godliness grows through practiced rhythms—Scripture intake, prayer, and worship (1 Timothy 4:7–8).
- 3 **Community Is Not Optional:** We are shaped in community where encouragement, correction, help, patience, and doing good are normal (1 Thessalonians 5:14–15).
- 4 **Use the Pathway:** A simple loop—Lead Yourself \rightarrow Be Led \rightarrow Lead Others—helps you discern the next faithful step.
- Realistic Next Steps: Consistent habits beat sporadic spurts; start small, stay steady, and invite accountability.

Discussion Questions

- 1 Which of the four traits most needs attention in your life right now? Why do you think the Spirit is highlighting it?
- 2 Practically, how will you 'behold the Lord's glory' this week (**2 Corinthians 3:18**)? Name the times/places you will meet with God.
- Design a simple 30-day training plan (1 **Timothy 4:7-8**): What is your daily Scripture plan? When will you pray? What will corporate/personal worship look like?
- Where will you place yourself to be led (1 Thessalonians 5:14–15)? Name a specific group or relationship for encouragement, accountability, and prayer.
- 5 What barriers usually derail your disciplines or community engagement? What small, concrete adjustments will you make this week?

- Write a 'Rule of Life' for the next month: (1) Daily Scripture & prayer, (2) Weekly corporate worship, (3) One set meeting for spiritual friendship.
- List two people you will invite to speak into your life. Text or email them today to set a time to connect and pray.
