Mary

Luke 1:35 (NIV[®])

³⁵ The angel answered, “The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God.”

Zechariah, Elizabeth & John the Baptist

Luke 1:15 (NIV[®])

¹⁵ for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He is never to take wine or other fermented drink, and **he will be filled with the Holy Spirit even from birth.**

Luke 1:41 (NIV[®])

⁴¹ When Elizabeth hear Mary’s greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit.

Luke 1:67-68 (NIV[®])

⁶⁷ His father **Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit** and prophesied: ⁶⁸ “Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, because he has come and has redeemed his people.

Luke 3:16 (NIV[®])

¹⁶ John answered them all, “I baptize you with water. But one more powerful than I will come, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. **He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit** and with fire.

Simeon & Anna

Luke 2:25 (NIV[®])

²⁵ Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and **the Holy Spirit was upon him.**

Jesus’ Baptism

Luke 3:21-22 (NIV[®])

²¹ When all the people were baptized, Jesus was baptized too. And as he was praying, heaven was opened ²² and **the Holy Spirit descended** on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: “You are my Son, Whom I love; with you I am well pleased.”

Jesus, “led by the Spirit”

Luke 4:1 (NIV[®])

¹ Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the desert.

Holy Spirit & the power of God

Luke 4:14-16 (NIV®)

¹⁴ Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news about him spread through the whole countryside. ¹⁵ He taught in their synagogues, and everyone praised him. ¹⁶ He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. And he stood to read.

Gift of the Holy Spirit

Luke 11:11-13 (NIV®)

¹¹ “Which of your fathers, if your son asks for a fish, will give him a snake instead? ¹² Or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion? ¹³ If you then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, **how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!**”

Guidance of the Holy Spirit

Luke 12:11-12 (NIV®)

¹¹ “When you are brought before synagogues, rulers and authorities, do not worry about how you will defend yourselves or what you will say, ¹² for **the Holy Spirit will teach you at that time what you should say.**”

Blessings & Woes

Luke 6:20-26 (NIV®)

²⁰ Looking at his disciples, he said:

- A. “Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.
 - B. ²¹ Blessed are you who hunger now, for you will be satisfied.
 - C. Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh.
 - D. ²² Blessed are you when men hate you, when they exclude you and insult you and reject your name as evil, because of the Son of Man. ²³ “Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, because great is your reward in heaven. For that is how their fathers treated the prophets.

- A. ²⁴ “But woe to you who are rich, for you have already received your comfort.”
 - B. ²⁵ Woe to you who are well fed now, for you will go hungry.
 - C. Woe to you who laugh now, for you will mourn and weep.
 - D. ²⁶ Woe to you when all men speak well of you, for that is how their fathers treated the false prophets.

“Do Unto Others”

Luke 6:27-36 (NIV®)

²⁷ “But I tell you who hear me:

Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you,

²⁸ **bless** those who curse you, **pray** for those who mistreat you.

²⁹ If someone strikes you on one cheek, turn to him the other also. If someone takes your cloak, do not stop him from taking your tunic.

³⁰ **Give** to everyone who asks you, and if anyone takes what belongs to you, do not demand it back.

³¹ **Do to others as you would have them do to you.**

“Be Merciful”

³² “If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? **Even ‘sinners’** love those who love them.

³³ And if you do good to those who are good to you, what credit is that to you? **Even ‘sinners’** do that.

³⁴ And if you lend to those from whom you expect repayment, what credit is that to you? **Even ‘sinners’** lend to ‘sinners,’ expecting to be repaid in full.

³⁵ But love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back. Then your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High, because he is kind to the ungrateful and wicked.

³⁶ **Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.**
