**The Era of Visitation
& Impartation**




When God visits, supernatural breakthroughs occur. Holy impartation is released, and prophetic words are fulfilled. Seasons are shifted and new things are brought to birth. Divine visitation should not be considered an exception; instead, it must become your expectation.

Dayspring is an archaic word meaning “dawn” or “morning.” Dayspring is used today as a term for “a new era”. The dayspring is the spring of the day.





The dayspring is a metaphor for the promised Messiah. The NIV translates the word for “dayspring” as “the rising sun;” the New American Standard Version (NASB) translates it as “the Sunrise from on high.” The word Sunrise is capitalized in the NASB because it refers to the Son of God who would rise like the sun to bring light to all men.



Visitation is the apostolic appearance of Almighty God into the affairs of mankind. Impartation is the direct transfer of grace or divine supernatural resources from God's realm of the Spirit to the earthly realm of man.



An **era** is a distinct period of history with a particular feature or characteristic. It is an epoch, a fixed point in time from which a series of years is reckoned. Everything that you have experienced and encountered up to this point has been designed to maximize your life to fit God's planned purpose. God's "on point" with your process. He hasn't missed it!



As we reflect upon our scripture, we must give vision to the three things that lie in the text that impacts our conception of Christ work:

- **The Darkness** (the unexpected; the unfamiliar; unforeseen & unwelcome)
- **The Dawn** (the period of time just before the breaking of day)
- **The Directing Light** (the glorious guidance and prophetic alignment of God's hand)

The conception of Christ in your life has to spring forth in this era of visitation and impartation. There must be a rising and a shining in your life even in the midst of dark encounters. The darkness cannot comprehend the light of God's visitation and His impartation.



In this dawning era of revelation and manifestation, we must be willing to step away from the familiar. The visitation of God will become visible and viable working to accomplish the intended purpose. We must be able to see in the dark.



A visitation from God:

- **Breaks a Season of Barrenness**
- **Breaks a Season of Bondage**
- **Breaks a Season of Brokenness**



As we move into an era of visitation and impartation, Holy Spirit will give us prophetic insight in comprehending our incomprehensible God. The movement of God is gaining traction on its way to full manifestation. “Eyes have not seen,” however, for those who are positioned in the presence, there will be a parading of God’s goodness and glory.



We are being summoned to “come to the rising.” There is a great rising upon us. It is a rising from the rubble; the broken stones of struggle and proclaiming the power that Holy Spirit has empowered us with. There is a mighty power working within us to conform chaos, calamity and the created evil of the wicked one. God’s truth shall prevail over his divine purpose ascribed to your life.
