Fear has a color in our society. For centuries, white supremacy has painted Black and Brown bodies as the embodiment of fear.

THE FEAR OF EQUALITY

**Supremacy sees equality as loss—loss of
superiority, identity, and control.**

But equality is not loss—it is justice.

Galatians 3:28 – Equality is God’s design in Christ. The kingdom dismantles false hierarchies.

White supremacy projects its own fear onto others.

Example: The criminalization of Blackness in laws, media, and culture.

Truth: Supremacy fears the *collapse of its false hierarchy* if equality is revealed.

Genesis 1:27 – All are made in God’s image. Fear of equality denies the Creator’s design.





Fear Is Used as Control.

Supremacy uses fear to control—slave patrols, segregation laws, “law and order” rhetoric.

Fear justifies violence, policing, and exclusion.

***Exodus 1:8–10:* Pharaoh feared the Hebrews “growing too numerous,” so he enslaved them. Fear always leads to control.**



Love Casts Out Fear

- **White supremacy is rooted in fear, but God's kingdom is rooted in love.**
- **1 John 4:18: Perfect love casts out fear. Fear fuels division; love fuels unity.**
- **The true “color of the kingdom” is not fear but love, justice, and reconciliation.**

Call to Action

1. ***Name the Fear*** – Acknowledge how fear has been racialized and used as control.
2. ***Resist the Lie*** – Reject the narrative that equality is a threat.
3. ***Live the Truth*** – Model in the church the oneness that the world resists.
4. ***Walk in Love*** – Replace fear-driven systems with love-driven community. This has to be attempted on both sides.





The color of fear is not Black or Brown skin. It is the trembling of supremacy at the truth of God's justice.

The gospel declares: equality is not a threat but a gift; diversity is not a danger but a reflection of God's glory.

Let us live as a fearless church, embodying the kingdom where love drives out fear and all are one in Christ Jesus.
