WHAT IS A DISCIPLE?

- Greek word translated as disciple more than 250 times in the New Testament – <u>Mathetes.</u>
 - Means <u>close follower</u>

- A disciple is a learner and a follower. He or she is not only learning the truth about Christ; they are putting that truth into <u>practice.</u>
 - To make disciples, you must first be a disciple.

"And if you do not carry your own cross and follow me, you cannot be my disciple."

Luke 14:27 NLT

"Disciplemaking happens through intentional, intimate relationships with other people." - Robby Gallaty

PUT INTO PRACTICE

 Discipleship is deeper and more intimate than Sunday mornings and large-group Bible studies.



WHO DO I DISCIPLE?

"...Now teach these truths to other trustworthy people who will be able to pass them on to others."

2 Timothy 2:2b

 Remember Jesus' command was not to <u>win</u> converts but to <u>make</u> and <u>teach</u> disciples.

- FAITHFUL People who are faithful will <u>persevere</u> and <u>endure</u> through hardships. They are <u>steadfast</u> in their commitments and hold true in spite of the circumstances. (Heb 12:2)
- AVAILABLE Those you invest in should be available. They are <u>ready</u> and <u>willing</u> to do the work of God. They are also committed to the <u>time investment</u> of required for discipling. (Rom 12:1,6,11)
- INTENTIONAL They are people <u>seeking</u> the Kingdom of God and they <u>see</u> opportunities for ministry and <u>seize</u> them for His glory. (Eccl 3)

- TEACHABLE Probably the <u>most important</u> of the character traits. It is a strong <u>desire</u> and <u>willingness</u> to be taught. (Acts 4:13, 1 Pet 5:5, Prov 9:9, 4:5, 12:1)
- HUNGRY They should have a <u>hunger</u> and <u>thirst</u> for God. They will not be satisfied until they come to know Jesus in a deeper way. (Matt 5:6)
