Words of Encouragement

Philippians 4:2-3

²Now I appeal to Euodia and Syntyche. Please, because you belong to the Lord, settle your disagreement. ³And I ask you, my true partner, to help these two women, for they worked hard with me in telling others the Good News. They worked along with Clement and the rest of my co-workers, whose names are written in the Book of Life.

Philippians 4:2-3 NLT

1. This text reminds us that believers should be agents of reconciliation. Do you believe Paul's words in [Romans 1:16](#)? Are you an agent of reconciliation? What are you known for? Does your life give evidence of this? How does the world view you? Are you resting in the Gospel of Jesus Christ to change lives?
2. Earlier in Paul's letter, in [Philippians 2:2-4](#), he shows us the characteristics of maintaining unity. Are these characteristics evident in your heart and mind? What would happen in your relationships if this was practiced? What would happen in your marriage? In the Body of Christ? In Business? In Culture? What is one thing you can surrender today to move in this direction?
3. No one can be at peace with God while not seeking peace with men. Read [Psalm 139:23-24](#). Where do you need to reconcile with God first? Are there areas of your life and relationships that you have not given over to the Lord?
