Philippians 1:12-18

1. Are you bold for the gospel? Where do you need to pray for courage? Where is God challenging you to be bold in your faith?

Acts 4-5, Daniel, Romans 1:16, Ephesians 6:19-20, 1 Peter 3:15

2. Evaluate your motives, where do you risk jealousy, rivalry and selfish ambition? Do you love others?

3. Are your eyes focused on your difficulties or are they fixed on Jesus? Where do you need to shift your focus?

4. Are you a faithful servant in the hands of a sovereign God? Do you hold your plans loosely?

Paul's Joy That Christ Is Preached

¹²And I want you to know, my dear brothers and sisters, that everything that has happened to me here has helped to spread the Good News. ¹³For everyone here, including the whole palace guard, knows that I am in chains because of Christ. ¹⁴And because of my imprisonment, most of the believers here have gained confidence and boldly speak God's message without fear.

¹⁵It's true that some are preaching out of jealousy and rivalry. But others preach about Christ with pure motives. ¹⁶They preach because they love me, for they know I have been appointed to defend the Good News. ¹⁷Those others do not have pure motives as they preach about Christ. They preach with selfish ambition, not sincerely, intending to make my chains more painful to me. ¹⁸But that doesn't matter. Whether their motives are false or genuine, the message about Christ is being preached either way, so I rejoice. And I will continue to rejoice.
