Review:

There are four things most cults have in common:

- 1. Centralized authority
- 2. Us versus them complex
- 3. Commitment for each member to proselytize the unconverted
- 4. <u>Isolationism</u>

They fail to have correct theology according to historic Christianity in the following areas:

- 1. The attributes of God
- 2. The person of Jesus Christ
- 3. The nature of man
- 4. The requirements of atonement
- 5. The source of revelation

History of the Worldwide Church of God

Herbert Armstrong is the founder of the Worldwide Church of God. He was born in Des Moines, Iowa on July 31, 1892. Mr. Armstrong traces his ancestry all the way back to King Edward the Iof England (which is key).

Armstrong's wife challenged him reference faith alone in Christ for salvation. He then said he studied the Bible and concluded that his wife was right, that salvation is not only faith in Christ but also keeping the law.

In other words, Jesus + = <u>salvation</u>. This is not something which is new, it is something that <u>Paul</u> <u>battled</u> in the New Testament

Galatians 1:6-10

Introduction:

Paul and Barnabas are in modern-day Turkey and preached the word and the people accepted Jesus as their savior and they started churches and they even had a little association going on with the churches.

Paul and Barnabas moved on in their missionary journey, and a messenger came to them told them that the <u>Galatians</u> were adding <u>the law</u> to their <u>salvation</u>. In other words, they were starting to teach <u>Jesus plus</u> for salvation.

They were adding religion to salvation: faith in Jesus plus works for salvation.

It should also be noted that men called the <u>Judaizers</u> would follow Paul and tell these young <u>Christians</u> that believing in Jesus was good, but you <u>needed more</u> to be saved.

You might say that is silly but we do the same thing when we add church membership, <u>baptism</u>, confirmation, and <u>your last name</u> to salvation. It is called <u>Jesus Plus salvation</u>. These things I mentioned are good but they have nothing to do with our salvation.

Galatians 1:6

I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting him who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel—

A couple of words we need to focus on:

<u>Astonished-</u> this word in the original language means "to marvel, wonder, to be stunned". This word in the original language and the tense that Paul uses means "I'm continually stunned". Stunned that these believers who knew the truth, their lives had been <u>changed</u>, they had seen <u>God work</u> in their lives were going back into the <u>bondage</u> of working for your salvation. Paul was stunned that they were in the process of deserting.

<u>Deserting-</u> this word means "<u>to change sides</u>". It was used in the military and in politics to describe someone who had changed sides.

There is another word that fits what the Galatians were doing and that is <u>apostasy</u>. We commit apostasy when we embrace faith in Christ and what he has done on the cross then reject it.

When someone deserts their faith (apostasy) they leave three things:

- 1. Leave the gospel- Paul makes it very clear; Jesus plus is leaving the gospel.
- 2. Leave grace
- 3. Leave God to desert is to leave God and follow after an idol of our own making.

not that there is another one, but there are some who trouble you and want to distort the gospel of Christ.

Acts 15:1 explains what these false teachers were doing. They did not deny that you must believe in Jesus, but you must finish the job that Jesus started by obedience to all the regulations of the Old Testament.

Mankind likes this because it appeals to our pride.

In this verse we see how apostasy starts:

- 1. <u>Doubt</u>- apostasy occurs when a disappointment, a tragedy comes into our lives that shakes us up.
- 2. False <u>teaching</u> comes along and <u>twists</u> the truth.

V 8

But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach to you a gospel contrary to the one we preached to you, let him be accursed.

Tells us how to avoid apostasy---- tenacity, hold onto the gospel no matter what happens hold onto it. We must let scripture be our final authority, not the culture or how we feel but what does the Word say. Trust the Lord

<u>Accursed</u>- it means "to be cut off both physically but also spiritually in the lake of fire for eternity".

V 10

For am I now seeking the approval of man, or of God? Or am I trying to please man? If I were still trying to please man, I would not be a servant of Christ.

The false teachers were saying that Paul was a people pleaser; that is why he preached grace. But the fact of the matter is people do <u>not like to hear</u> they cannot earn their way to heaven; it hurts their <u>pride</u>. In fact, this is the area that Paul was stoned and left for dead because he preached grace.

We must realize something, people do not like to hear that they are sinners and cannot work their way back to God. People think that God has to accept them because they are so good.

But the truth of the matter is we cannot achieve our own salvation. It comes through putting down our pride and accepting Christ as our savior.

Teachings of the Worldwide Church of God

Armstrong also taught that <u>Biblical truth</u> had been lost since the first century until <u>he</u> rediscovered it. He taught that he was unique in the human race and he was Christ's new <u>apostle</u>. He also wrote about him being the <u>Elijah</u> who would preach before the second advent of Christ.

Armstrong also said that his organization alone was true Christianity.

Mr. Armstrong made many <u>predictions</u> reference end times here are some of them:

- The Catholic Church would be destroyed through Mussolini in 1936.
- <u>Jesus</u> would return at the end of the Second World War.
- Hitler was the antichrist and would fight <u>Jesus</u> at the battle of Armageddon.
- One-third of the world would be wiped out in 1972.
- The human race would be extinct by 1982.

The Worldwide Church of God <u>taught</u> that we need <u>to keep</u> the dietary laws of the Old Testament

<u>Denied</u> the <u>Trinity</u>: did not believe the Holy Spirit was a person but rather just the power of God.

Keeping the <u>sabbath</u> day which was <u>Saturday</u> in the Old Testament. This was the <u>ultimate</u> test of faith. The reason was that Armstrong believed Jesus was crucified on Wednesday and rose on Saturday, not the first day of the week.

o In fact, those people who continue to practice worshipping on Sunday during the Tribulation will receive the mark of the beast and then cast into the lake of fire.

Teaching on Jesus

His teaching on Jesus is very tricky, but what he says is that Jesus gave up His divinity when He became flesh. This is incorrect. Jesus had two natures; that of eternal God and that of a man.

Neither nature was altered during the incarnation (John 1:1, 1:18, 5:18, 20:28; Colossians 2:9).

Conclusion

One more thing about Armstrongism, he taught British-Israelism. This is not something <u>new</u> but was written about decades before Armstrong. It was a belief that the lost <u>tribes of Israel</u> back in the Old Testament were in fact the <u>English</u> people and the <u>Americans</u>.

The promises given to <u>Israel</u> applied to the British and the Americans because they were the lost <u>tribes</u> of Israel.

Again, Armstrong said he could trace his ancestry not only to Edward the I but on his mother's side to King <u>David</u>.
