**Before reading the scripture:**

- How would you define purpose?
- What is the purpose of your life?
- Do you think comfort ought to be an aspect of your purpose? Why/why not?

**Read: Acts 13:36**

- “God created a desire in us to live with purpose.” Share your thoughts on this statement.
- David served God in his own generation. What is the biggest need in your generation?
- Obedience to God’s purpose for your life and your generation might cost you your comfort, excuses, old habits, and coping mechanisms. Which one of these speaks to you most in the current season of your life?

**Read: Romans 8:28**

- You vs the unsundered you. God never forces anyone to come to Him, but he gives us the choice to surrender. What prevents us from surrendering to God? How may we overcome this?

**Read: Luke 9:23-26**

- Obedience to God will cost you your life. Discuss...
- "The message of Jesus is worth living and dying for, it is the only thing that fills the Jesus shaped void in our heart." Discuss...

**Works:**

- How can you deny yourself, follow Jesus, and take up your cross this week?
- Are you willing to serve God's purpose for your life and generation even if it costs you your comfort?

**Closing:**
