## Welcome:

Before reading the scripture:

- What does it mean for people of faith to truly be united in Spirit?
- Is it possible to be in unity even if you are not the same as someone else? If so, how?



#### Read: Acts 4:32-37

- "The Church was one in heart & mind." What can we learn from the church in Acts regarding practically caring for each other?
- An orchestra has to be tuned to the same tuning fork, the instruments do not need to be tuned to each other. How does this analogy reflect how believers ought to align with Christ first, which will automatically mean that we will align with each other? What does it mean to be aligned with Christ?
- How can we better recognise and celebrate the giftings of other members of the Christian family?
- How do you think a practical outworking of care aligns with the statement in James 2:26 that faith without works is dead?

#### Read: John 17:20-23

 A church full of Christ is full of grace. How are we being called to have more Grace with fellow believers?
