Sermon Title: Always a Portion, Sometimes a Sacrifice

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 8:1-5

We want you to know, brothers, about the grace of God that has been given among the churches of Macedonia, 2 for in a severe test of affliction, their abundance of joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. 3 For they gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own accord, 4 begging us earnestly for the favor of taking part in the relief of the saints— 5 and this, not as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then by the will of God to us.

Points to Consider:

The Churches of Macedonia's Giving was:

- -Attributed to God's Grace
- -Abundant in Spite of Affliction
- -According to and beyond their Ability
- -Adamant because of their Attitude

Discussion Questions:

Consider 2 Corinthians 8: 1-15. How are the Macedonians' generosity and the grace of God linked? Consider the kingdom principle of generosity (gleaning) outlined in Leviticus 23:22. How are these passages linked? In what ways can we emulate the generosity of the Macedonian churches described

Given the question above, how does Paul's description of the Macedonian churches challenge our understanding of generosity and wealth as it relates to God's kingdom on earth?
What role does joy play in the act of giving, as illustrated in these verses?
