



How much of your day is committed to reading Scripture?

◆People-oriented

What role does a consideration of God's Word play in comprising your life?

For some, being led and counseled and nourished by Scripture is a normal, healthy discipline practiced each and every day. But if I were to speculate, for many this is not the case.

It is interesting that we will readily testify to a perceived reality of God's Word as a foundational part of who we are as believers, and yet what we generally mean by "foundational," is our understanding of Scripture, rather than its message spoken routinely into our lives.

In gratitude the Psalmist acknowledges, "Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Psalm 119:105).

In reliance he confesses, "I have hidden your Word in my heart, that I might not sin against you" (Psalm

In order for Scripture to be "a lamp to our feet and a light to our path" and so that we might have the philosophy of God's Word such that it is wholly "hidden within our hearts" (with the goal of fidelity to God) continual, intentional time must be invested into facilitating our Father ministering to us through His Holy Word. Certainly He ministers and speaks to us through His Spirit and through life, but Scripture, if it is to be all that our God intends in our lives, is to be unequivocally formative and central.

And as we read the Bible, what is our purpose? What is our aim? What is our goal? Because how we approach Scripture is crucial. Do we read God's Word so that we might master it? Or so that we might be mastered? Do we study so as to gain support of our presuppositions? Or so that we might be filled by God?

At the beginning of the year many make renewed commitments to read and study Scripture. I want to encourage you in this. However my prayer is that we would not only be committed to being a people of Scripture, continually fed by Almighty God through His Holy Word, but also, in our study, have the paramount agenda of closeness and faithfulness to God.

Because if I understand anything from our Lord it is this: He honors genuineness. And He honors faithfulness,


Llamado a Hacer el Bien

REEVES' RHETORIC

Adoration, Praise, Relevance, and Commitment

If I were a relatively unchurched individual and we were talking about the relevance of faith, how would you convince me of the commitment that you have to Christ?

Our first response is generally either one of orthodoxy or orthopraxy? "Orthodoxy" meaning "right doctrine." "Orthopraxy" meaning "right practice." Whichever one we begin with in our explanation (either orthodoxy or orthopraxy) we generally follow with an invested pursuit of the other (which makes perfect sense by the way).

But if I were a person who had little to no previous exposure to the Christian faith, and you and I were going to walk through the commitment that you have to Christ, to the Christian faith, to the church family that you have invested yourself into and who has invested into you, and if you were going to speak to the impact faith has upon every aspect of your life - What would you share with me?

Perhaps you'd begin with a desire to be faithful to God. Faithful to His Word. Faithful to your calling. Faithful to the relationship that He grants through Jesus. Surely you'd tell me of the change salvation brings to your life. A change of heart. A change of priorities. A change of perspective. Maybe you'd speak to me of transformation. The continual transformation that you experience day after day. The transformation that you've witnessed in the lives of others.

When speaking specifically to the concept of commitment to our Savior and to His people, in order for faith to be seen as real and relevant to others (whether to those who are churched or unchurched) it must come from deep within us.

We sing the song Listen to Our Hearts, "How do you explain? How do you describe? A love that goes from East to West? And runs as deep as it is wide?" And then, as the chorus declares to our God, "So listen to our hearts. Hear our spirits sing. A song of faith that flows. From those you have redeemed. We will use the words we know to tell you what an awesome God you are, but words are not enough, to tell you of our love, so listen to our hearts."

The adoration and praise of the Father; a life that adores and praises our Father; a church that adores and praises our Father; is undeniable, relevant, and real when it comes from deep within.

O They Tell Me of a Home

I know that those words make you think of that great hymn. It is one of my favorite songs. Since I started work here, I have come across many that have no home. I have never known the feeling of having no bed, no place of warmth, no kitchen to make a hot meal, and no place to take a hot shower. I have stayed at church camps that are more comfortable than having no home. Having no home is tough physically, but worse than that is having no home spiritually. Just as many of the homeless have made bad decisions that have led to their



Paul wrote to the church at Corinth, Yes, we are of good courage, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord (2 Co.5:8). It makes me think of security, comfort, happiness, confidence, and love. It tells me that my journey with Christ will be worth every sacrifice I made, every problem I faced, and every struggle I overcame. It tells me nothing on earth will be worth more than my home with the Lord. O they tell me of a home.... What do those words bring to your mind? Does it give you peace of mind or does it make you feel a little "homeless"?

REEVES' RHETORIC

Hide and Seek with God

Jeremiah 29:11 is a verse of Scripture that speaks to the hearts of many (it is Tiersa's absolute favorite verse of Scripture). "For I know the plans I have for you declares the Lord. Plans to prosper you and not to harm you. Plans to give you hope and a future."

However I wonder how familiar we are with verse 13? "You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart" (Jeremiah 29:13).

Perhaps we recognize the words. But are we aware of the context in which they are found?

They are words spoken by God through the prophet, communicated to His people as they find themselves living in a world contrary to their calling.

Seeking God. Pursuing God. Searching for God. In a world that is unfair, consumed with self, and spinning out of control. Does that sound anything like our calling today?

When we discussed Christ as the Gate and Shepherd, I was reminded that Jesus is the GOOD Shepherd, not just A shepherd. He is wholly devoted to His own sheep, and in fact was willing to die for them (us). He knows them and they know Him. He cares about each and every one. Aren't you excited, to serve THAT shepherd!



If You're Happy and You Know It

That's one of my favorite old VBS songs. I like the idea of God's children expressing joy at their relationship with Him. Paul's letter to the church at Philippi overflows with joy and thanksgiving, yet he wrote this letter while in prison. We could learn some lessons about joy if we look at what brought Paul joy while imprisoned. In Philippians 1:4, he took joy in their partnership with the gospel. Doing the Lord's work, while enjoying the companionship of other Christians, is a true source of joy. The key is working together! In 1:18, Paul rejoices in the preaching of the gospel. Is there someone whose spiritual condition concerns you? Take joy in proclaiming Christ to them. It is what they need. In

1:25, Paul rejoiced in the progress of the Philippian's faith. Seeing and helping someone grow in their faith is a great blessing. In 2:2, Paul took great joy in the unity and love of the church in Philippi. Does that give you joy here at West Erwin? Are you willing to do all you can to make that happen? In 3:1 and 4:4, Paul urged the church to rejoice "in the Lord". We are to take great joy in Jesus' next coming. We are to take joy in our worship together and our fellowship together. We are to take joy in our time of prayer together. All the things that we do to keep us "in the Lord" should bring us joy. Living for Jesus should be joyous for us. Our walk will not always be a time of celebration; a Christian will experience times of sorrow and sadness, but what we have in Jesus will allow us to overcome those times. We live for Heaven and the world does not understand that, so take Paul's encouragement and, "Rejoice in the Lord

REEVES' RHETORIC

Ten Words

"The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us" (John 1:14). Ten words. That changed everything.

In an instant, everything changed. It was all in God's divine plan. All in His divine providence. All founded in His divine initiative.

Decades later (and especially a century later), the incarnation would be at the center of debate. There were many who questioned the validity of the Word becoming flesh. It wasn't entirely Christ's deity that was under scrutiny. It wasn't solely His humanity that was doubted. It was the mental gymnastics required to accept that He was both. Divine and human. Simultaneously. Upon initial consideration, can we blame them? We have the benefit of 2000 years of theology. But the reality that Christ was 100% God and 100% human, you have to admit, is a doctrine that must be based solely upon faith. Because it makes no earthly sense.

But He was. Christ was with God in the beginning (John 1:1). And then He became (John 1:14). He became, He took on flesh, and He lived and walked and ministered among us. The incarnation is intended to blow our minds. And it should! That God was willing, that Christ was willing, to "take on the nature of a servant" and be made "in human likeness" and to become "obedient to death – even death on a cross!" (Philippians 2:1-11) should amaze us! It is certainly designed to.

And the amazement of the incarnation must not end there. Because the wonder of it all is that Christ is "incarnate" in us (if we can use that terminology). God is revealed "in the flesh" when His people live out our calling as those who belong to Him.

"To them God has chosen to make known among the Gentiles the glorious riches of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory" (Colossians 1:27). Verse 27 comes at the conclusion of an entire section of Paul's letter to the Colossian church which centers upon the incarnation of God in Jesus. He then transitions to the incarnation of Christ, in us!

That a holy God would, through His perfect Son, reside within an unholy and imperfect people should amaze us! It is certainly designed to. Our reality as those who have been sanctified by the Spirit purposes you and I to reveal His deity in our humanity. In our divine and human nature(s). Christ is us, the hope of glory.

"The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us" (John 1:14). Ten words. That changed everything. Ten words. That change us still.

Glory to God!

LOOKING TO IMPROVE

It is hard to pass a mirror without looking at yourself. You want to know how you look and if everything is in place or not. If something is wrong, it gives us a chance to fix it. It's a chance to restore our appearance. That is why I love James' analogy about looking in the mirror. For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror. For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like (James 1:23, 24). This verse makes me think of the dangers of missed opportunities. Just as a look in the mirror gives us a chance to fix what is wrong with our appearance, a lesson from God's word that is merely

listened to and not allowed to take root in our hearts will soon be forgotten. It will never have a chance to grow and have an influence on our lives. We won't get the chance to "touch up" that problem and we won't get the chance to "restore" our spiritual reflection. We missed it, and we have no guarantee of getting it back. James continues, But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he will be blessed in his doing (James 1:25). God's word brings us freedom from sin. Upon our obedience to the Gospel, he fixes us, he gives us new life, and if we do and not just hear, we receive great blessings. The blessing comes from the doing. We are better when we serve, when we reach out, and when we step out in faith. We are better when we put God's words in action. When we start living like that, we truly reflect Jesus. When we reflect Jesus, we have never looked better!



Faith and Affirmation

"The tongue has the power of life and death" (Proverbs 18:21).

Nathaniel Hawthorne came home from his job at a custom house (a building housing the offices that process legal paperwork) devastated that he had just been let go. When he broke the news to his wife, however, she responded with joy! "Now you can write your book!" Puzzled, he asked, "And what shall we live on while I'm writing it?" Mrs. Hawthorne walked over to a drawer in the kitchen, slowly reached inside, and then retrieved a stack of money she had been saving unbeknownst to him. "I always knew you were a man of genius. And that you'd one day write your masterpiece." And because of the faith and affirming words of Mrs. Hawthorne toward her husband, every library in the world has a copy of The Scarlet Letter.

Faith and affirmation. I wonder if you realize how much power God has given you? I wonder if you realize that you have the ability to turn the tide in someone's life through faith and affirming words? Not solely faith in God (certainly that's where it begins as God works in our hearts) but by placing faith in others. By telling them, showing them, that you believe in them. By affirming to them that you believe they can accomplish great things.

Isn't that what God has done for us through Jesus? "I believe in you Jason," the Gospel declares. But what about us? Do we speak a word of hope into the lives of others? appearance. Jesus gave the true standards and they differ from the world's view. Jesus said, But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be your slave (Matt. 20:26-27). Iesus is calling us to put aside our own interests for the benefit of others. Servants are not over others, they are among them. Servants do not force their leadership, but by their example and love, they can motivate others to strengthen their personal commitment to God. Servants do not magnify their own importance, but they magnify the importance of others. Servants do not bring glory to themselves, they bring glory to God. Servants follow the example of Jesus who said about himself, even as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many (Matt. 20:28). When we sacrifice and serve others, we look like Jesus, and we never looked greater!

REEVES' RHETORIC

Jesus Doesn't Answer

"Meanwhile Jesus stood before the governor, and the governor asked him, 'Are you the king of the Jews?' 'Yes, it is as you say,' Jesus replied. When He was accused by the chief priests and the elders, He gave no answer. Then Pilate asked Him, 'Don't you hear the testimony they are bringing against you?' But Jesus made no reply, not even to a single charge – to the great amazement of the governor" (Matthew 27:11-14).

Pilate is amazed. He's dumbfounded. His gears are seriously jamming. Jesus won't defend Himself against His accusers. He answers Pilate when he asks, "Are you the king of the Jews?" But he won't answer those who oppose Him. And Pilate doesn't get it. He can't fathom why in the world Jesus doesn't answer them. But that's precisely why. Because His Kingdom is not of this world. And so He refuses to answer.

Jesus doesn't answer because He is in complete control. Of Himself. Of the situation. It may seem as if things are spiraling out of control, but they are far from it. God is sovereign. Jesus doesn't answer because "as a sheep before his shearers is silent he did not open his mouth" (Isaiah 53:7). Jesus is fulfilling the plan of God, the purposes of God, in every way. And He knows it. Through His actions He's fulfilling prophesy. Intentionally. Jesus doesn't answer because His critics wouldn't listen even if He did. Would it change their minds? Their hearts? No. And so He doesn't answer.

One more crucial reason that I believe Jesus doesn't answer is because He knows who He is as He stands before the Father. He is complete. He is whole. He is without blemish. Without defect. Without fault. And ultimately, it matters not what the critics think of Him; of who they believe Him to be. What matters is that He fulfills the will of the Father in His life. Beyond that, does anything else really matter?

Who we are in the Father's eyes matters more than everything else. When it is all said and done, it's really all that matters.

REEVES' RHETORIC

Giving Up Our Rights

"Now Moses was a very humble man, more humble than anyone else on the face of the earth" (Numbers 12:3).

"He must become greater, I must become less," John the Baptist (John 3:30).

"Paul, a servant of God...." (Titus 1:1).

Humility is elusive, because just when you think you've got it... you don't!

For some humility is a gift. It comes extremely naturally. To very few humility is second nature (my grandmother is like this). However, for most, humility is a daily choice that runs contrary to our nature. A decision that is willfully made. Day after day. Moment by moment. To humble ourselves and be ever so willing to become obedient to death, even death on a cross (connect Philippians 2:8 with Luke 9:23) whether that cross is physical or metaphorical. To give up our rights and die to ourselves so that Christ might be lifted up and exalted through us.

When someone is being questioned in regard to a crime by a governmental official they will first be advised of their rights before any questioning begins. The Miranda warning reads, "You have the right to remain silent. Anything you say may be used against you in a court of law. You have the right to have an attorney present prior to and during any questioning. If you cannot afford an attorney, the court will appoint one to you. Should you choose to begin answering questions, you have the right to terminate the interview at any time. Do you understand you're rights?" When the answer comes back, "Yes." The next questioned asked is, "Will you voluntarily waive your rights and answer some questions?"

In Christ, humility demands that we give up our rights. We give up our rights to be first. We give up our rights to be center stage. We give up our rights to be heard. To be proven right. To be exalted. In order that He might be first. Center stage. Heard. Proven right. And exalted. The cross of Jesus requires that we give up our rights, take up our cross daily, and follow Him. That we would willfully empty ourselves of self. And that in turn, we would be filled by Him.

When we start thinking that no one knows, and when we start thinking that we are above our sin, then it is us that are acting pretty childish. We can fool man sometimes, but we never fool God. The Hebrew writer tells us, And no creature is hidden from his sight, but all are naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must give account (Heb. 4:12). When we keep our sins to ourselves, it eats away at our very soul. Even though it can be painful, we need confession, we need to make amends if we can, and seek forgiveness. In order to gain Heaven, we must die to self, we must die to sin, and we must willingly and totally surrender our life to God. Our nature makes this difficult. We see Jesus' love for others. Jesus healed Malchus' ear out of his love for man. He prevented his disciples' arrest out of his love for them. He washed the feet of Judas, the traitor, out of love. Our love for others is shown by our actions, not our talk. It is shown by our willingness to sacrifice for others. We see Jesus' obedience. In spite of the hardships he was to face, in spite of the suffering he was to bear, and in spite of a world where many would not take advantage of His sacrifice, Jesus said, "Thy will be done!" To become more like Jesus, we need to be more about "the will of our Father".

Missional is of those trending "church" words right now (even though it's been around for quite some time). Simply put, it means to live out our lives called by God every day in our work, in our relationships and in service. Everything we do as Christians should be an extension of our faith, living it out, trying to impact the world for His Name's Sake. Iesus was "missional" before "missional" was cool. I want to be like

Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ (Eph.4:15). Paul followed that thought by writing that we should grow in our love. From whom the whole body,... when each part is working properly, makes the body grow so that is builds itself up in love (Eph.4:16). We are to grow in grace and knowledge. But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:18). Our growth comes from our relationship with Christ. As we come to know Him better, we realize there is always room to

REEVES' RHETORIC

"Q" Time

I wonder what is important to you?

Sometimes life gets in the way and what is urgent gets in the way of that which is important. The lines between what is urgent and what is important are often blurred. A deadline that must be met. A project that is past due. A meeting that needs to be attended. A person that requires your attention. Are these urgent or important? It very often might be that they are indeed both.

Our priorities are easily revealed. And it's not as if the urgent mustn't sometimes temporarily outweigh the important. But the amount of time and attention we give to any particular person or practice tends to grant us insight into that which comprises our priorities.

We may say that our family is a priority to us, but if what our children see in us is that we are capable of granting all sorts of time and energy toward other people and other endeavors, and little time toward them, what does it communicate to them in regard to where they rate on our scale of priorities? We may say (and even believe) that we love our spouse more than any other person on the face of the planet, but if we spend more time on the golf course or more energy at the office than we'd ever think about affording to them, what is communicated to them as to how intentional we are in validating the relationship that we share? And what about God? Where does He fit in? We say that God is first in our lives? Is He really? How much focus is centered upon God during the course of your week? Take church attendance out of the picture. What attention does He receive?

Somehow we've found it extremely easy to con ourselves into believing that right theology equals right relationship. The truth is, if our theology was right, we would find it all together impossible to think this way.

John Stott in his work, "The Living Church," describes how on his calendar he would mark the letter "Q" on one specific day each month (Stott passed away in 2011). The "Q" stood for "quiet." Once a month, on a day that he had designated and planned long beforehand, he would go to a guiet place. Away from the office. Away from the busyness of life. Away from interruptions. And he would spend 10 to 12 hours that day, by himself, "quiet," with God. One day a month with no agenda, other than "quiet" time with God. Prayer. Study. Closeness. Intimacy with God. What does that say about Stott's priorities? What does it say about his desire to be with the Father?

What if you were to plan a "Q" day each month? Or a "Q" hour each week? Or "Q" time each day?

What would it say about your priorities? How might it impact your walk with the Lord?

CARE FOR THE SAKE OF CARING

We've had multiple losses in our church family in the last several months, and it reminded me of the value we have in the lives of others, especially in times of crisis, or even when there isn't one yet. Here's some thoughts...

Care when there isn't a crisis.

There's nothing better than taking someone out for a coke "just because" or a dropping a simple card in the mail that conveys your love for them. Think of this as "preventative care" for the people in your life—even when they aren't in a crisis, they know you care. **Drop everything in an emergency.**

Sometimes it's difficult to tell when something is truly an emergency but when a major crisis or catastrophe hits, drop everything to be there. When you show up in a difficult situation it will be remembered forever. The opposite is also true: If you don't show up, that will be remembered too.

Just be there.

It isn't always easy to know what to say—even when people look at you like you should. Don't underestimate the power of the "be with" factor. Sit with them. Do more than just offer to help with whatever they need—anyone can do that. Sometimes, just getting there and being present in those moments will mean more than anything.



Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world (James 1:27). When we do this, we follow the steps of Jesus in helping those in need. James says that true religion is not found in religious language or empty worship, but in selfless acts of service. Jesus cared for those in need and I wanted to thank you for following His example. A woman that had come for clothes told me that the Benevolent Center was a special place for her. I asked her why and she said, "Here, nobody looks down on us. Ya'll are so nice and friendly. It is like you are being touched by God". Thank you for the smiles, hugs, and the help you give others. Thank you for passing out food,

sorting through tons of clothing, making the quilts, cooking food, honoring prayer requests, and showing Jesus through your actions. Thank you for caring about the orphans. Getting Off the Ladder

When we are children, we think about what we will become and who we will become. We dream about who we will be. What we will do. The things we will accomplish.



REEVES' RHETORIC

Our Concept of God

Don't we find ourselves at times spiritually plateaued in our journeys of faith? And maybe not even plateaued, but rather, more like spiritually bankrupt? What do we do when we begin to feel this way? Maybe it's found in the ebb and flow of faith. Maybe it only characterizes a small portion of time. Or maybe it is descript of decades. Years of complacency. No zeal. No excitement. No anticipation. No experience of God. What then? What next?

In his book Attributes of God, AW Tozer writes, "A local church will only be as great as its concept of God. An individual Christian will be a success or failure (in the Kingdom) depending upon what he or she thinks of God. It is critically important that we not only have a knowledge of the Holy One, but that we truly come to know Him in all His majesty and wonder."

Maybe what we "think of God," as Tozer puts it, is directly related to our being spiritually plateaued or bankrupt.

Do we think enough of God? How much thought do we honestly give Him during the course of the day? How often do you engage in silent conversation with Him if even for a brief moment? How often do you pray? I mean really, really pray? Not as an aside. But heart and mind, engaged in prayer with our Father. How much time do you set aside in reading Scripture and being fed by God's Word? How often do you read what others have written to broaden your concept of God? How many conversations do you have throughout the week with others who are seeking to be faithful to our Father as well? Do you seek out Christian insight from others who have faith? Because what we "think of God" is answered in questions such as these.

The Apostle Paul writes: "I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know Him better." – Ephesians 1:17

The question is: Do we really want to know Him better?

Somehow spiritual discipline has too often been divorced from faith. Faith is too often seen as mental ascent rather than a life characterized by discipleship. No wonder we find ourselves so often spiritually anemic.

Discipleship. Living cognizant of the presence of God. Spiritual discipline. A life characterized by faith and faithfulness. When our practice reflects our concept of God - it is then and only then that we will begin to know Him better.

to tragedy. In light of the events during the Boston Marathon this past week, I asked myself, if found in the face of unspeakable evil or unexplainable sadness, how should I as a Christian respond? We must never lose sight of the fact that we are a people on a mission – the mission of glorifying God by making disciples of all nations. Experiencing tragedy is common to all people. What is not common to all people is the hope that we have in Jesus Christ. We must, therefore, live our lives in a way that shows that hope both in how we respond to tragic situations and how we faithfully proclaim God's glory in the midst of them. It is precisely during these times that we can most clearly put on display this hope that the world does not know. So, in the midst of our suffering and pain, we must be sure not to lose sight of our mission, making known God's glory. And, when others see that difference in our lives and ask us about it, we must be ready to "give an answer" by telling them "the reason for the hope that [we] have," doing so "with gentleness and respect" (1 Peter 3:15). How do we respond to tragedy in light of the Gospel? In a word, TOGETHER. We are ALL the body of Christ.



Dealing with Others

Our day with Brad Harrub last Sunday stirred some thoughts with me on the way we deal with the world on faith issues. We deal with misconceptions; the world does not grasp that we serve a holy God. They don't understand it, and they don't see the importance of that fact. Words like grace, mercy, and sacrifice mean nothing to them. To them, God is someone to reach out to only in emergencies. Faith means something when it is valued, and it is difficult to reach those who don't value faith. It does not make them bad, it does not make them outcasts, it just makes them wrong in their thinking of Jesus. How do you reach them? Just as Jesus did; you love them, you have compassion on them, and you deal

with them in patience. You provide them with a good example and you pray for soft hearts. We deal with fragile faiths. Many do not base their belief in God on scripture, but on feelings and what others have told them. Even those in the church have their times of doubt and fear. We should expect the same from the world. Faith comes from study, prayer, and seeking God. We can't expect spiritual strength from those that don't look to God on a daily basis. We deal with selfish thinking. Some see God as a way to get what they want in life. They take advantage of good hearts for selfish gain. Jesus dealt with this in John 6. When Jesus faced it, he did not condemn and he did not look down on them. Instead, he felt compassion for their souls and saw the opportunity to teach. When dealing with others, it matters what our motives are. The more we think like Jesus, the better we will be.



I FORGOT ALL ABOUT THAT

By the time you're reading this, Jean and I will be all moved into our new home in Lindale. Over are the days of commuting from east of Longview, and we are VERY thankful for that! When you are in one place for a while, you forget about some of those things you have, some of those things in storage or at the bottom of boxes or the back of closets. Pictures, decorations, books, random electronics, pets, (just kidding), and many other things which had begun to collect dust and slip from memory. Out of sight, out of mind. When it's not directly in front of us, we forget about it a lot of the time. When it comes to our Father, sometimes we become complacent and forget we worship a God who is infinitely creative. What do you do when that happens? One way to get out of the slump is to admit to God where you are. He knows already, but it's often helpful to say it aloud. Be honest and self-aware. Can vou face reality and admit you're in a spiritual slump? Another help can be changing things up a bit. Grab a different Bible translation. Read a book of the Bible you always thought was challenging. When we're changing things on a regular basis, it's hard to become stuck in a rut. Lastly, and perhaps most importantly, listen when God pulls on your heart. Those moments don't happen for no reason, so don't ignore them.



Lindsay told me of a shortcut to take on my way to work. It does not save me much distance, but it does allow me to miss three red lights. As with most shortcuts, it comes at a price. The good side is that now instead of seeing Lowes, Wal-Mart, shops, and restaurants; I see some cows, barns, pastures, and tree-limbed covered roads. The price I pay? The time I was saving missing those red lights, I now spend driving slowly through that country road enjoying the scenery. Taking that shortcut is nice for me, but sometimes taking shortcuts in life can be risky, especially when we are dealing with spiritual matters. For instance, how about raising children? It makes a difference when parents take the easy way out. Parents that let their

children grow up with a steady diet of junk food, TV, video games, and worthless movies will pay the price down the road. How about marriage? Your spouse notices it when you take shortcuts in your communication, your leisure time together, and those special occasions. It might not seem so bad at the moment, but years of this neglect will take a toll on a marriage. What about your faith building? There is no quick and easy way to grow your faith. When we neglect the daily discipline of seeking Jesus, we become spiritually weak. The risk is that it could come at a time when our temptations demand that we be at our strongest. Our faith, our marriages, and our family are the most precious things we have in life. In order to sustain them, it takes our greatest efforts. They ensure the quality of our life and they deserve the best we can give. Watch out for shortcuts, they can be costly!

Outside the Box

This Sunday we begin a weekly study of the book of James. I believe that James is an often overlooked letter. For whatever reason, it doesn't seem that much of our conversation centers on this letter from Jesus' brother. And I really don't know why....

We often speak of reaching out to the lost. We often consider how we might impact the world around us. We often engage in discussion as to how the relevance of Christ might be readily evident in us as His people. And yet, somehow, no dialogue from the book of James.

James is a letter of faith. It is a letter of action. It is a letter of practicality. And it is a letter of relevance. Isn't that the answer to communicating the message of the Gospel in what many anthropologists are calling a "post-Christian" culture?

James will question, "Who are you fooling? You claim to be a disciple of our Lord and yet still have areas of your life that you've failed to give Him Lordship over? Does that really sound like discipleship to you?"

We're going to call our study: "Outside the Box." Because James opens our hearts and minds to a whole other world. A radical faith that simply cannot be contained.

I remember when my children messed up and the situation called for their father to step in and "get on them". I don't know if today's generation still uses that term, but I grew up with it, both the receiving and the giving. I would always end with a review of their wrong deeds and then I would close with a reminder of those deeds with an image of what future punishments awaited if they continued. I imagine my kiddos got pretty tired of those lectures. I want to compare my method with Paul's closing of his second letter to the church at Corinth. Paul had addressed many serious issues in his letters to them. He could have given more instruction on any of those huge issues, but he chose to remind them of their blessings as Christians. Finally, brothers, rejoice. Aim for restoration, comfort one another, agree with one another, live in peace, and the God of love and peace will be with

you (2 Cor.13:11). This is great instruction for any church. Rejoice! The world needs to see Christians rejoicing over what God has done for them. We need to remember that any sorrow and grief we bear is only temporary. What we gain for eternity is great cause for rejoicing. Restore! The church should be in constant restoration. Everyday we should work on restoring our spiritual strength, our relationships, and any member that has strayed. Stronger members make for a stronger church. Revive! We should always be aware of when our comfort is needed. Whether it is a phone call, card, visit, or a meal, it is important that others know you care. Caring brings revival! Reunite! Sometimes we have to agree to disagree. If it is done in love and respect, peace is kept and love remains intact. Paul closes the letter by stating the rewards of living right. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all(13:14). Paul did a better job of closing the discipline talk than I did. He did not leave them with the picture of sins and punishments, but chose to remind them of their blessings. That is how to "get on" someone and encourage







REEVES' RHETORIC

Bold Prayers

I believe that there are safe prayers and there are bold prayers. "Father, please bless my life." "Take care of my family." "Grant us a good day." Good prayers... but safe prayers.

Bold prayers dig deeper. They lay our lives before the Sovereign Lord in such a way so as to hold nothing back and give ourselves fully over to Him.... "God make me into your instrument." "Create within me the heart of Jesus." "Father do with me and my life what you will." "Grant me courage and strength and faith so that in every way you may be glorified through me." Bold prayers!

How intentional are we when we pray? Are we conscious of what we are saving? Are our words spoken out of desire for divine deliverance? Words spoken out of total reliance upon God? Do the words we share with God convey our desire that we might unequivocally accomplish His will and purpose in and through the lives He's blessed us to live - no matter what?

Here's what I see with Jesus: every word, every action, every thought, every facet of His life was lived with intentionality and with resolve. There was no doubt! His reason, His being, His purpose - all encompassed within His single-mindedness of who we was and what He was about.

As believers I wonder if that's what is seen in us. Or rather, I wonder if our intentionality and resolve is evident in everything that we are about? I believe a crucial, central component of this is revealed in our prayer life. We can tell a lot about ourselves, our mindset, and our hearts through our prayers.

How often do you pray? (Be honest with yourself). Just you and God? Do you pray with your children? Do you pray with your spouse? Men, do you take the lead? Do you pray specifically on behalf of others? (And do they know that you pray for them?). Do they come to you because they know that you are a man or woman of prayer? Do you pour out your heart to God when you pray?

And when you pray, do you pray bold prayers?

I had a very good friend, Ron Bozell, who passed away from Leukemia last December. Ron was a faithful man of God and a man of prayer. When he prayed it was the outpouring of his heart. His prayer life was an extension of who he was (and who he is to those who knew him). Over and over and over again, Ron would say: "Prayer moves the hands that move the world!" And not only did he say it, he meant it....

PLACING BLAME

When things like the tragedies in Oklahoma this past week occur, a lot of times people are tempted to look at God, themselves, or others and place blame. That's exactly what Job's friends did, and the text is not kind to them for it, because Job is described as "blameless and upright, a man who fears God and shuns evil." Or the disciples, who asked Jesus whether a blind man's plight was the result of his sin or his parents' sin. Jesus, somewhat incredulously, responds, "Neither this man nor his parents sinned, but this happened so that the works of God might be displayed in him." It wasn't Job's fault he lost his family, possessions, and health. It wasn't the blind man's fault he could not see. The Bible teaches that we don't know exactly why suffering happens in every situation, and we shouldn't claim to, but that we are to rejoice with those who rejoice and weep with those who weep, and that when God wrapped himself in flesh and walked among us, God suffered too.



REMINDERS

As I get older, I need more and more reminders to help me in my forgetfulness. My office looks like a commercial for sticky notes. I wanted to take a course in Memory 101, but I could not remember where the course was offered. Anyway, you get my point. God knows our limitations and He has always wanted his children to remember the great things He has done for them. One of the memory pegs He has given me is the wind. Consider these words of Jesus to Nicodemus, The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit (John 3:8). We would be hard pressed to explain where the wind comes from, but nobody can deny its existence. It's

the same when the world looks at those who live by the Spirit. They know there's a difference in the way we live, but they probably can't explain the why. They don't understand how the Spirit helps us. Romans 8 and 12 give us a great picture of how we depend on the Spirit in our walk with Christ. How does the Spirit help us? The Spirit gives us life and peace (8:6). Through the Spirit, we are children of God (8:16). The Spirit helps us with our spiritual strength and intercedes for us in our prayer life (8:26-27). The Spirit helps us in our serving, our teaching, the way we encourage, our giving, and our ability to lead. The Spirit helps with our willingness to show mercy and cheerfulness, and with our ability to love and show honor to others (12:3-11). The next time you feel the wind blow in your face, remember the power of being led by the Spirit, and remember the goodness of God!



REEVES' RHETORIC

Anyone

"Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink" (John 7:37).

Anyone. Anyone who is thirsty. Anyone. Anyone who thirsts. Anyone who has become dissatisfied with a lifeless life. Discontent with existing but not living. Anyone.

Jesus stands on the last and greatest day of the Feast of Tabernacles and declares that for those who are spiritually thirsty, living water is a present reality.

During the Jewish Feast of Tabernacles there were two primary ceremonies. One was the Festival of Lights in which lamps were lit all around the Temple courtyard on the final night commemorating the restoration of the Temple by the Maccabees during the intertestamental period. It is as the light of these lamps floods the Temple grounds that Jesus stands and exclaims, "I AM the Light of the World." Earlier on the final day of Tabernacles was the water libation ceremony in which water would be poured out before the people upon an altar symbolizing the water from the rock in the desert wandering (Exodus 17) through which God saved and provided for His people. It is during this ceremony that Jesus stands and declares, "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as Scripture reveals, streams of living water will flow" (John 7:37-38).

A few chapters earlier in the Gospel of John, Jesus had spoken similar words to the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but those who drink the water I give them will never thirst again" (John 4:13-14).

"This water" (I envision Jesus motioning toward the well). Physical water. The water of this world. Or "living water." The choice is ours.

Why do we continue to believe that this world has anything to offer that satisfies? Why do we find ourselves returning to the well of despair? The well of heartache? The well of futility? Rather than drinking deep from the well of life? The living water of the Kingdom of Jesus.

"Taste and see that the Lord is good" (Psalm 34:8a).

"As the deer pants for streams of water so my souls longs for you O God. My soul thirsts for the Living God" (Psalm 42:1-2a).

Living God. Living water. Life that is life. Life that is filled. For anyone who is thirsty. Anyone.

REEVES' RHETORIC

Stubborn People, Humble Goats, and the Kingdom of God

You have to admit that we can be pretty stubborn sometimes. Right? Or at least, let me confess: "I can be pretty stubborn sometimes."

Webster's defines "stubborn" as: "inflexible, determined to have one's own way." I wonder how often our unwillingness to be flexible or our determination to have things our own way has negatively impacted the relationships we share with others. And I wonder, how our stubbornness has often undermined the God that we purport to belong to.

What place does arrogance or stubbornness or inflexibility or the attitude of "my-way-orthe-highway" have in the Kingdom of God? None.

Jesus says, "If someone wants to steal the shirt right of your back, willingly give the thief your coat as well." "And if someone manipulates you and coerces you into going a mile out of your way for their own selfish benefit, go even further for the sole purpose of Kingdom revealing" (Matthew 5:40-41 in my own words).

The Apostle Paul places it in these terms, "Each of you should look not only to your own interests (how selfish would that be), but look also to the interests of others. Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus..." (Philippians 2:4-5).

Egoism. Stubbornness. Inflexibility. These are not the Kingdom. The Kingdom is: "Righteousness. Peace. And joy in the Holy Spirit" (see Romans 14:17).

In any given situation you are not the most important person. Neither am I. Jesus is!

Stubbornness damages the Kingdom. Every time.

During the Reformation of the 16th century Zwingli and Luther and had come to an impasse. Both were perplexed as to how there could be unity between the two of them with their differences. Until one day Zwingli observed two goats approaching one another from opposite directions on a treacherous, narrow mountain path. A wall of rock on one side, and a thousand foot cliff on the other. As they approached one another, the two goats lowered their heads, as though they were about to crash into one another, but then the one going up the mountain trail lay completely flat on the path and allowed the one descending the mountain to step on top of him. After he had safely passed, the one who had humbled himself then continued his climb.

I wonder what you and I might learn from that?

We use a really neat curriculum here put out by a company called D6. D6 stands for Deuteronomy 6:5-7 which commands dads and moms to take everyday opportunities to impress God's Word upon the hearts of their children. The concept behind D6 is foundational to raising our children for Christ. As a church, we want to come alongside parents, not take their place, and REINFORCE what we hope and pray these students are already being taught in the home. The same basic lessons are taught each Sunday morning in our middle school, high school, and Danny's Sunday morning adult class as well, so that families share a basis for what they learned that day. We pray that in using this approach, our families can live their faith out loud together, and give them one more tool for those God conversations.

God spoke through the prophet Jeremiah and told him why his people had fallen away from God. In this passage, we see that sometimes the things we don't do are just as harmful as the wrong things we do. Consider God's words:

The priests did not say, "Where is the Lord?" Those who handle the law did not know me; the shepherds transgressed against me; the prophets prophesied by Baal and went after things that do not profit (Jer.2:8). What made God's children fall away? It was a combination of five things that led to their failure. First, there were no petitions for the people. The priests that were responsible for the spiritual well-being of the people no longer cared for the presence of the Lord. Secondly, there were no

precepts for the people to follow. Those that were to teach, remind, and encourage, no longer knew God. Thirdly, there was no purity in their leadership. The leaders rebelled when they should have been helping the rebellious. Next, there was no perception of God because they were being fed by false prophets. There was no spiritual sustenance or strength being given to them. As a result, there was no profit in this kind of life. They were chasing after the worthless things in life. Can you see how this relates to the church today? We all have a part to play. We all have a responsibility to the Lord and to each other. We are stronger when we pray for each other. We are stronger when we study together. We are stronger when we live with God, and realize how the world can tear our families apart. We are stronger when we learn from the mistakes of others and watch out for what we don't do!

REEVES' RHETORIC

Reevaluate. Refocus. Reengage.

I think most families find themselves looking forward to summertime. I know ours does. The kids are out of school. Vacation time is planned. Youth excursions are in the works. Trips to grandma and grandpa's are scheduled. Relationships are renewed. Memories are made.

Bald spots are soon worn in the front yard where first, second, third base and home plate are (this drives my OCD nature crazy but Tiersa assures me that when we're through raising kids I can concentrate on raising grass). Something just seems to be different about summertime. It does for me at least. It's a bit of a reprieve from the busyness (and chaos) of the school year. Maybe it's simply where we are in life. But with where I sit right now it sure seems that even though there's a lot planned for the summer, there's also a whole lot of potential as well.

David knew who his sin was against and he realized that only God could restore the condition of his heart and spirit (51:4-10). David also knew that the quality of his worship and his service to God depended on his relationship with God (51:14-17). I love and appreciate living under the covenant of grace, but I never want to take advantage of that gift (Ro.6:1). Our sin should make us feel guilty. Guilt helps us with our repentance and it helps us with our remembrance. We need to remember the cross and the price that was paid for us!



REEVES' RHETORIC

You're Blessed When....

I say it often, and truly believe, if we would live the Sermon on the Mount our world would be turned upside down. That you and I would be altogether incapable of external religiosity because of the inward attention the spiritual kingdom is given in these words of our Savior. When our "righteousness surpasses that of the Pharisees" in heart-filled adoration rather than pious observation it is then and only then that the words of His message come to life.

How do you understand the Beatitudes (the Blessings) with which Jesus begins the Sermon (Matthew 5:3-12)? How would you write them in your own words in such a way as to impact you right where you are in life and in such a way that is current and relevant to the world in which you find yourself a part?

I love the way Eugene Peterson does this very thing, paraphrasing in The Message:

- You're blessed when you're at the end of your rope. With less of you there is more of God and His rule.
- You're blessed when you feel you've lost what is most dear to you. Only then can you be embraced by the One most dear to you.
- You're blessed when you're content with just who you are no more, no less. That's the moment you find yourselves proud owners of everything that can't be bought.
- You're blessed when you've worked up a good appetite for God. He's food and drink in the best meal you'll ever eat.
- You're blessed when you care. At the moment of being "care-full," you find yourselves
- You're blessed when you get your inside world your mind and heart put right. Then you can see God in the outside world.
- You're blessed when you can show people how to cooperate instead of compete or fight. That's when you discover who you really are, and your place in God's family.
- You're blessed when your commitment to God provokes persecution. The persecution drives you even deeper into God's kinadom.
- Not only that count yourselves blessed every time people put you down or throw you out or speak lies about you to discredit me. What it means is that the truth is too close for comfort and they are uncomfortable. You can be glad when that happens - give a cheer, even! - for though they don't like it, I do! And all heaven applauds. And know that you are in good company. My prophets and witnesses have always gotten into this kind of trouble.

When we internalize the message of Christ and realize that He is speaking to us (and not just "them"), it is then that things begin to change for us. It is then that He changes us. Glory to God!



Fully Aware of His Goodness

"...to know this love that surpasses knowledge – that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God" (Ephesians 3:19).

Does Jesus move you?

Let me ask you in another way: When you contemplate the wonder of Christ, does your heart respond with emotion?

Perhaps it would benefit to ask it of yourself like this: Am I stirred when I consider what relationship with God through Christ brings to my life?

In 2006 Barna Research was interviewing church leaders across the country in regard to church growth and church decline and as to what they attributed each congregation's present experience. Then, at the end of the dialogue, the interviewer would ask each leader one final question: "What does Jesus mean to you?" The responses they received were honest and genuine: "He is my savior, my redeemer, my friend." Each response was honest and genuine, and yet, each was what we would expect. Except when they asked it of a man who ministered in a small, isolated church in the northwest. When asked what Jesus meant to his life, the minister began to cry. Incapable of even responding verbally.

Folks that's the response of a life that's abandoned everything for Jesus, and is fully aware of His

I believe too often we've been conditioned to respond void of emotion. Our conditioned response is clinical. Academic. Detached.

When is the last time you've stood speechless before sunrays pouring through the clouds? When were you last moved to tears in praising His name? Have you ever been driven to your knees when singing, "I Stand in Awe"?

There are some who argue emotion challenges reverence.

I say, they're missing out.

REEVES' RHETORIC

Perfectly Content

"When Jesus heard that John the Baptist had been put in prison, He returned to Galilee. Leaving Nazareth, He went and lived in Capernaum, which was by the lake in the area of Zebulun and Naphtali – to fulfill what was said through the prophet Isaiah: 'Land of Zebulun and Naphtali, the way to the sea, along the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles - the people living in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned.' From that time on Jesus began to preach, 'Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is near.'" - Matthew 4:12-17 (cf. Isaiah 9:1-2)

The Jews didn't have a very high opinion of Galilee, because of the large numbers of Gentiles who lived there. Matthew desiring to communicate the universality of the Gospel, emphasizing that very reality, connects to the Isaigh text. The Gentiles were not like them. They were "in darkness." They were "living in the land of the shadow of death." But, quite frankly, most were perfectly content to leave them there.

However this is precisely where Jesus focuses His time. His energy. His efforts. Jesus spent most of His public ministry north and west of the Sea of Galilee. In the land of Zebulun and Naphtali. His message? "Repent, for the Kingdom of heaven is near." A message of change. That's what repentance is. A change of heart. A change of way of life. The Kingdom as a spiritual reality. The reign and rule of God in the hearts and lives of those who will respond.

And so here's my question for us as believers and as a church: Where do we focus our time? Our energy? Our efforts? We invest a lot in one another, and we ought to. We're called to. But are we ministering to the Zebuluns and Naphtalis around us? Are we seeking to connect with those not like us? Are we light dawning to those "in darkness" and "living in the shadow of death"? Or are we, quite frankly, perfectly content to leave them there?

WHEN DOING GOOD FEELS THE BEST

I am a firm believer that helping others makes us feel better about ourselves. I also believe that when we apply certain principles to our service to others, we can grow spiritually also. For instance, when we do something in private, when nobody else knows, it then becomes a matter between us, the person we help, and God. Jesus taught that this was the right way to do it (Matt.6:3). It keeps our motives pure, and we get to personally see God working through us. Our deed then turns into a faith builder for us. Jesus' parable of the Good Samaritan gives us some more thoughts on this. Just as the Samaritan redefined who our neighbors are, I believe that it is a good thing when we step out of our comfort zone and help someone who is not in our normal social circle.

Sometimes we need to heed Jesus' lesson and show mercy where it is least expected (Luke 10:37). I also believe that the parable shows us the blessings of sacrificing when we help others. It is a good thing when we can help out with just a drink or a small amount of food, but don't you feel better when you dig deeper, sacrifice a little more, and step out in faith when you help others? Isn't that what Jesus meant when he said to, give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap (Luke 6:38). Paul wrote that giving "out of their poverty" helped the churches of Macedonia grow in their faith and grow in grace (2 Cor.8:1-5). I am not trying to downplay any act of kindness we may bestow on others; I just believe there are times when we can use our service as a way to build a stronger faith.

(Sal. 51) El diácono de cierta iglesia confesó un pecado terrible en una red social. Después de dar una descripción de lo que había hecho, comentó: "Sé que hay un precio que pagar por este pecado, y ese precio es la muerte". Pero no solo tenía el corazón destrozado por lo que había hecho; sabía también que el efecto sobre sus amigos y su familia sería devastador. Con todo, su temor era más grande que su remordimiento. Se atemorizó de Dios, creyendo que el soberano Señor del universo estaba ahora dispuesto a hacerlo pagar. ¿Qué le diría usted a este creyente? ¿Reflejan sus palabras la respuesta de Dios al pecado? Es cierto que romanos 6.23 enseña claramente que "la paga del pecado es muerte"; sin embargo, este angustiado hombre había pasado por alto la importantísima segunda mitad del versículo:

"mas la dádiva de Dios es vida eterna en Cristo Jesús Señor nuestro". Si nuestro Padre celestial nos da un regalo, podemos confiar en que Él nunca nos lo quitará. No hicimos nada para merecerlo, y por eso no podemos hacer nada para perderlo. Todo descansa en la iniciativa de Dios. Si el pecado del creyente después de ser salvo pudiera requerir su muerte —o cualquier forma de castigo—, entonces el sacrificio de Cristo no fue suficiente. Pero la Biblia nos dice que la muerte del Señor Jesús fue el pago de toda la deuda de pecado de la humanidad (He 10.10).

O la sangre de Jesús cubre nuestros pecados, o no los cubre. No hay término medio. El Espíritu Santo, las palabras de Cristo y el testimonio de la Biblia, afirman claramente que sí los cubre. (1 Jn. 2:2). Dios te bendiga, nos vemos el domingo.



REEVES' RHETORIC

Anchor Verses

Don't some portions of Scripture speak to us more powerfully and poignantly than others? Not that there any that are of less importance (surely we know one another better than that by now), but aren't there some sections of the Bible that are exceptionally meaningful? Out of experience, out of grief, out of triumph, aren't there texts within the text that speak to our hearts and give life to the reality that God's Word is living and active?

1 Peter 2:9 is one of my favorite verses in Scripture. I have probably spoken it more often and gravitated toward it in my teaching and preaching and in everyday conversations even more than Romans 12 or John 1 or Ephesians 3 (which is saying something!).

The Apostle Peter affirms, "You are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His wonderful light." We are a "chosen people." We are chosen by God. He chooses to love. He chooses to redeem. He chooses to forgive. He chooses to adopt. God chooses. We are a "royal priesthood." We come to Him with nothing but our sin, and yet, He elevates us to the status of royalty in His Kingdom. In doing so we are called to be priests. We are those who stand in the gap between God and the world around us. We are "a people belonging to God." Literally, in the Greek, "A people chosen for possession." Our purpose, our meaning, our identity is enveloped in Him and in who we are because of Him. So that we "may declare the praises of the One who called us out of darkness into His wonderful light." For me, each phrase of 1 Peter 2:9 is an arrival. And speaks to me in a very challenging, and yet also, comforting way.

What are your anchor verses? What are Scriptures that you run to? Texts that empower you? Comfort you? Words from our Father that you gravitate toward? Words that are more than words, because they are living and active and speak to your heart?



REEVES' RHETORIC

Here's My Heart

Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing is one of my absolute favorite hymns. Written in 1758 by Robert Robinson when he was only 23. As the story goes Robinson's father died when he was young. His mother, barely able to make ends meet, worked most of the time and so Robinson was left to more or less raise himself. By his late teens Robinson had a number of enemies and number of troubles. However it was at this time in his life that he began to consider his own mortality and the person he was becoming. He turned to seek Christ at the age of 20 and soon penned the words of Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing. Within the words themselves, we sense the Robinson's internal struggle, and perhaps our own....

Come Thou Fount of every blessing, tune my heart to sing Thy grace. Streams of mercy, never ceasing, call for song of loudest praise. Teach me ever to adore Thee. May I still Thy goodness prove. While the hope of endless glory fills my heart with joy and love.

Here I raise my Ebenezer, hither by Thy help I've come. And I hope by Thy good pleasure safely to arrive at home. Jesus sought me when a stranger, wandering from the fold of God. He to rescue me from danger interposed His precious blood.

O to grace how great a debtor, daily I'm constrained to be! Let Thy goodness like a fetter bind my wandering heart to Thee. Never let me wander from Thee. Never leave the God I love. Here's my heart, O take and seal it, seal it for Thy courts above.

We, like Robinson, struggle at times in our walk and in closeness to God. And when that closeness isn't there, we know that it's not God who has distanced Himself from us.

The story continues that soon after writing Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing, Robinson walked away from the Lord. Fast forward 16 years. He is now 39 years old. He has spent the last years just getting by: gambling, drinking, living from one place to the next, no God, no faith, no purpose in life – no life – just existence. Robinson steps onto a stage in England. Half hung-over, depressed, a shell of the man he once was. A woman in the stagecoach with him recognizes how down he is. The story goes that she says to him, "There is a song that we sing at church from time to time that gives me great hope and cheers me up, might I share the words with you?" And after Robinson concedes to allow the woman to share, she begins to sing him Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing....

After the woman stops singing, Robinson, tears in his eyes, replies, "Madam, I am the poor, unhappy man who wrote that hymn many years ago, and I would give a thousand worlds to feel now what I felt then." The moment served as a defining one, a turning point in Robinson's life, in which he recommitted himself once again to God.

Here's my heart, O take and seal it, seal it for Thy courts above. Glory to God! Jason

There Are No More Beautiful Words

How much sleep do you get each night?

Not enough I imagine....

Studies show that adults are in need of 7-9 hours of sleep every night.

Teenagers need 8.5-9.5 hours of uninterrupted rest.

And children require 10-14 hours a night to be 100%.

With how little we actually rest, compared to what is required, it's no wonder, so many are so fired.

When I was at the police department I had a friend that I worked nights with, who on his days off would stay up all day the first day, sleep at night the first night, but then stay up all the next day and then, all the next night (for over twenty-four hours). Basically, he missed a night's (or day's) rest each week. And he did this for years. He went in to a doctor because he was not feeling well and told the doctor his sleeping pattern (or lack thereof). The doctor told him that he had to get more rest. There was no way around it. Until he got enough sleep there would be no way he could feel like he was supposed to. When he finally started getting enough rest he realized that he had really been walking around in a daze for years because his body and mind were so very tired.

I wonder if you might be tired? If you might be weary right now? Maybe you find yourself depleted. In a season of life that is extremely difficult. Maybe your exhaustion comes from trying to spin too many plates. Maybe, as the old folks say, "Your plow is loaded." Maybe you've been trying to do it all on your own but have come to the conclusion that what you're doing is not working, and you're simply tired.

When you are emotionally and spiritually exhausted, rest, rest in Christ is the only cure. He persuades, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" - Matthew 11:28.

When you are tired. When you are weary. When you are depleted. When you are exhausted. There are no more beautiful words.



REEVES' RHETORIC

Spiritual Oxygen

Our bodies require oxygen. I've heard of some who have argued that a glass of water can wake you up in the morning just as well as a cup of coffee because of the oxygen in the water (I of course do not buy this argument and would never think of starting the day without a cup of coffee, but to each his own.... And isn't there oxygen, in the water, in the coffee?). But it is a simple, physiological truth, the body requires oxygen. An abundance of it. When we take a deep breath, oxygen fills our lungs, and then floods the central nervous system, circulatory system, etc. with life. When our bodies are oxygen depleted we do not function to our fullest capacity (those associated with the Tour de France can explain this well). Without breathing in oxygen the body dies. And without an abundance of oxygen the body suffers.

The Hebrew word for breath is "ruack." The Greek word for it is "pneuma." Would it surprise you that these same words (that can be translated "breath") are also the very words that are translated "Spirit"? The Spirit of God breathing life at creation. The Spirit of God breathing life at baptism. The Spirit of God renewing, empowering, uplifting, filling, flooding the body of Christ with spiritual oxygen today.

Without an abundance of oxygen the body suffers. The body of Christ requires spiritual oxygen. When we find ourselves (as individuals or as a church) in need of renewal, in need of revival, where do we turn? To whom do we turn? The Spirit of God gives life. James 2:26, "The body without the Spirit is dead."

Romans 8:11, "If the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, He who raised Christ from the dead will also give life (spiritual life) to your mortal bodies through His Spirit, who gives you life."

When was the last time that you prayed for the Holy Spirit to fill you? To breathe life into you? To renew Christ's church? To bring about revival? To flood the body of Christ with spiritual oxygen?

I wonder what would happen if each of us would pray that prayer and if we were truly open to that prayer being answered?



Another Way of Life

In January of 1863 Abraham Lincoln made public his intentions to abolish slavery in the United States, in the form of the Emancipation Proclamation. Civil war erupted. Lincoln was soon assassinated. And it wasn't until December of 1865, nearly three years later, that Lincoln's dream was realized as the 13th Amendment of the Constitution was passed, abolishing slavery.

Word soon spread throughout the country. From Capitol Hill into every state of the south the headlines of every newspaper read, "Slavery Abolished!"

Yet something happened that no one had expected. Something that no one (especially in the north) could have imagined. A war had been fought. A president assassinated. A law had been signed. However many slaves in the south, who had been set free, willfully chose to remain with their masters. To, in essence, continue to live as slaves. Many for the rest of their lives.

And the question that began to be asked was, "Why?" Why would once enslaved men, women, and children who had been freed, emancipated, why would they continue to live in bondage and in fear. As brutal and as cruel as their old master was, why would they willingly choose to work in his fields, live under his oppression, and remain under his thumb? Why after being liberated, would so many choose the security of slavery, over the risks of liberty?

The answer?

Because they knew no other way of life.

"I tell you the truth, everyone who sins is a slave to sin. Now a slave has no permanent place in the family, but a child belongs to it forever. So if the Son has set you free, you will be free indeed" (John 8:34-36).

I wonder if that might hit home for some of us?



REEVES' RHETORIC

Three Messages

This past Monday, 64-year-old Diana Nyad became the first person ever to swim the seemingly insurmountable 110 miles of open ocean from Cuba to Florida. Nearly 53 hours. Treacherous waters. No shark cage (an apparatus designed to be pulled behind a boat to protect the swimmer from shark attacks). Two nights of suffering. Her face swollen and lacerated from the effects of exposure. Serious abrasions from the stings of jellyfish. Recurring nausea from ingesting salt water. Her first attempt at the swim was 35 years ago in 1978. She has been told over and over it was impossible. But never believed it. 5 attempts and 35 years later she has proved the impossible possible.

Exhausted and depleted, Diana said that she had "three messages" to share: "One is, we should never, ever give up. Two is, you are never too old to chase your dreams. Three is, it looks like a solitary sport, but it takes a team." I am impressed with these three statements. Whether she has thought of these "three messages" for decades, or if they were completely spontaneous, they speak to us right where we are, in a spiritual way.

1) Never, ever give up.

I wonder what have you given up on? Who have you given up on? Where have you conceded defeat? How has Satan convinced you that you do not measure up? What impresses me is that after four failures, Diana kept training, kept dreaming, and gave it another try. (After 35 years, it sounds as if she'd have made a sixth attempt if the fifth had failed.)

2) You are never too old to chase your dreams.

I'm thinking of our life in the Kingdom. What is it that God has called you to do for the world around you that you've come up with every excuse in the book as to why it wouldn't work? (Because that is fear whispering in your ear, not faith.)

3) It looks like a solitary sport, but it takes a team.

There were over thirty people on board boats that traveled with Diana. Cheering her on. Keeping her confidence up. Searching the surrounding waters for dangers. Encouraging her when she was physically exhausted and emotionally depleted. That's precisely who we are to be for one another. Sometimes you're the one navigating the treacherous waters. At other times you're in the boat warning of dangers or providing encouragement and direction. But this Christian life is not a solitary one. It takes a team.

Three messages, that maybe today, you needed to hear.

PREPARED

How many people actually listen to the safety talk on an airplane? Nobody thinks that his or her plane is actually going to be involved in a crash. It almost seems like a waste of time. Everybody knows how to fasten and unfasten his or her seatbelt, right? Maybe not; a study by the British Civil Aviation Authority revealed that an average of 6% of passengers get delayed by seatbelt problems during an evacuation. Every demo discusses what to do if the plane has to make a water landing, but in the 2009 U.S. Airways landing on the Hudson River, only about half took a seat cushion for floatation and only 10 of 150 passengers thought to grab a life jacket. They'd heard the briefing, but hadn't really listened. Few pay attention to the very information that can save their lives. I can't help but feel that we treat God the same way. We're vaguely aware that He's there; we know that we really ought to learn more about Him, but we don't take the trouble to do so, until we find ourselves in an emergency. Then we wish we knew Him better. We wish we knew more about how to pray. We wish we were more confident about knowing what He expects of us and how we should behave towards Him. My suggestion is not to wait until that crisis hits. Take the time to learn about God. Connect with people who know Him and can guide you. Learn the basics about Bible study, then make reading the Bible a part of your daily routine. Start talking to God on a regular basis... your prayer life is vital. Connecting with God is easier than inflating a life vest or opening an emergency exit on a plane, and His rescue lasts forever. (Tim Archer)



REEVES' RHETORIC

Satan's Native Language

"When Satan lies, he speaks his native language, for he is a liar, the father of lies." – John 8:44

As Christians I believe we easily acknowledge that Satan has one mission: To separate us from God. That's his mission.

"The thief comes to steal, kill, and to destroy." – John 10:10

As believers we readily confess we have one mission: To connect others with God. That's our mission.

"For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does. The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against God, and we take captive every thought and make it obedient to Christ." – 2 Corinthians 10:3-5

Satan never ceases in his attempts to derail our lives, our faith, our eternity. However, not only is the enemy seeking to alienate us from God, he also attempts in every way to interfere in our relationships with one another. To distance us from one another. To create animosity or stress or distrust or anxiety within the community of faith. Why? Because it impedes our effectiveness.

He's the "father of lies" remember? He is the deceiver. If he can convince us that disharmony (not disagreement, but disharmony) is acceptable, it limits our effective witness in the world. When he is successful in deceiving us and convincing us that the enemy is a fellow believer with whom we have disagreement, the father of lies, is "speaking his native language." Satan wants nothing more than to stifle momentum in Christ's church. And very often he accomplishes this not through outright sinful behavior, but by diverting our attention, and cloaking divisiveness in the shroud of religiousness. The tension is such that if you're not a part of the solution, you're a part of the problem. When we allow the father of lies to whisper in our ears, we serve as conduits, as he shouts from the rooftops. And very often, through wellmeaning believers misguided in who the enemy truly is.

"If you keep on biting and devouring each other, watch out, or you will be destroyed by each other." -Galatians 5:15



Putting It All Together

Tiersa is capable of composing something great out of seemingly nothing at all better than anyone I know. "What's for dinner," I'll ask her. "Let me see what I've got," she'll say. And she'll take a bunch of things that to me don't even appear to go in the same pantry, much less on the same plate, and she creates something incredibly wonderful (she would dominate on the Food Network shows Chopped and Iron Chef!).

At Creation, God creates something out of nothing. He speaks life into existence. "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters" (Genesis 1:1-2). The word translated "created" in Hebrew is "ex-nihilo." Literally it means, "out of nothing." Technically the text could read, "In the beginning, God, out of nothing, the heavens and the earth." Cool stuff!

And we believe it. Right? We believe that God speaks everything that is into existence. Don't we? We believe that "ex-nihilo" God creates through His Word and breathes life through His Spirit. Do we not? Why then do we find it so difficult to believe that He can accomplish the same in and through υsŚ

Very often, you and I, we look at our lives and all we see is what I see when I go the pantry the day before Tiersa goes to the grocery store. We see nothing that's good. Nothing that is appealing. Nothing that can be put together, or that can be salvaged, or that's worthwhile. But God sees you and I, like Tiersa sees all of that stuff in the pantry, that to me looked like starvation. For what it could be. For what we could be.

God is in the putting it all together business. He is an expert in stepping in and saving the day. He continually creates something absolutely wonderful out of a complete mess. Triumph out of defeat. Beauty out of ashes.

Look to Scripture. Look to the lives of fellow followers of Jesus today. He's still doing it! "Ex-nihilo." God. Out of nothing. Faithful, strong, redeemed, alive, made new, made whole, focused, joyful, at peace - men and women of the Kingdom.

"The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me to preach the Good News to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the broken hearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives, and release from darkness for the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor..." (Isaiah 61:1-2b; cf. Luke 4:18-19).


- 1. Alejarnos de Dios por medio de métodos directos y también sutiles.

REEVES' RHETORIC

Fear, Doubt, and Anxiety

"Then Caleb silenced the people before Moses and said, 'We should go up and take possession of the land, for we can certainly do it!' (Numbers 13:30).

Hove the story of Joshua and Caleb scoping out the Promised Land. I think most of us do. They covertly travel the landscape with ten other "spies." They return and confirm that the land God had promised to them was more than they could have ever thought possible. Caleb declares before the entire Israelite community, "What are we waiting for?!" (It reminds me of what the Apostle Paul will write in Romans 8:31, "If God is for us, who can be against us?") But what do the other ten spies who went with Joshua and Caleb come back and say? "We seemed like grasshoppers in our own eyes, and we looked the same to them" (Numbers 13:33).

Twelve men, two perspectives. It is a story of fear versus faith in God. Doubt versus trust in God. Anxiety versus confidence in God.

A few weeks ago we held a premiere of the movie "Home Run" in the FLC. We had 250+ in attendance, many of whom were invited by friends, all of whom benefited greatly from the evening together. The movie centered upon struggling with addiction and struggling in relationships. Ultimately, the movie centered upon trusting God. One of the best lines in the movie was, "Nothing great happens when you hold back."

Fear, doubt, and anxiety hold us back. As a people. As a church. We fear failure. We doubt God. When we do, anxiety reigns, the Kingdom is crippled, and the enemy is pleased.

When will we understand, "Nothing great happens when you hold back."

And so I ask you these questions: What do you need to let go of? Is your faith as strong as it ought to be? In what way are you not trusting wholly in our Father? What creates anxiety within you? What do you need to give to God?

Caleb asks the people of God, "What are we waiting for?!"

Today, I ask the same.

I enjoyed Jason's sermon last Sunday dealing with our conversion. It took me back to my chemical plant days working with DuPont. As you can imagine, a chemical plant is all about conversions. The last unit I worked in before I retired made Hydrofluoric Acid. The process started with mined dirt called spar. The spar was dried, and then put into a large reactor where it was mixed under heat with Sulfuric Acid and other chemicals. After some more refining, out came the finished product. Each chemical that was added to the process was tested by our labs to ensure its quality. That was because each chemical added something that was needed in the process. If any one of those chemicals had a flaw, it hurt the quality of acid we were trying to produce. It was a process of steps, and each step was important to the big picture. As lason pointed out, our spiritual conversion is an ongoing process too. We become Christians at baptism, but total conversion or maturity comes with study, worship, a strong prayer life, and service. All these acts deepen our faith and they all play an equal part in the process. You can't leave one out. When these efforts become "quality time" with God, we speed the process along, and we become the kind of people that Christ needs to grow His church. Consider Paul's words to the church of Colossae, ... we pray for you asking that you be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom... so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, pleasing to him, bearing fruit,...strengthened with all power, ...enduring with joy... and giving thanks to the Father ... (Col.1:-12).

Dando sentido a nuestra vida





REEVES' RHETORIC

The God of the Towel

Ministering to others is the primary way in which we reveal Jesus to a lost and broken world. Allowing the love of Christ to bring healing to a broken world through those who themselves are continually made whole in Jesus is what serving and sharing and ministering is all about.

Jesus sets the pace:

"The evening meal was being served, and the devil had already prompted Judas Iscariot, son of Simon, to betray Jesus. Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under His power, and that He had come from God and was returning to God; so He got up from the meal, took off His outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around His waist. After that, He poured water into a basin and began to wash His disciples feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around Him" (John 13:2-5).

John's Upper Room narrative intimately describes the motive and method of Jesus. God has placed all things under His authority. Jesus is in complete control. John acknowledges Jesus' awareness of His divine nature and authority, "He had come from God and was returning to God." And because of His divine prerogative, the God of the towel rises from the meal, wraps a towel around His waist, and pours water into a basin. Jesus' connectedness to God and divine reality as God incarnate compels Him to take the nature of a servant (cf. Philippians 2:6-8).

Isn't it the same with us? Isn't it such that our connectedness to God and spiritual reality as those within whom His Spirit dwells, compel ministering to others, and bringing hope and healing to a broken world?

But, is this you're perspective? Is this your philosophy? Is this your practice?

Glory to God!



REEVES' RHETORIC

Sanctuary

As a church, on Sunday mornings we are investing into a pursuit of "Sanctuary." An admission on behalf of God's people that we yearn for solace. And an admission on behalf of God's people that true sanctuary is only found in Him.

"A place of refuge" is our subheading that we are working under. The theme of God as our refuge is a common thread throughout the Psalms and so each week we are centering ourselves and building upon one of the Psalms that invite us into the presence of God as we take refuge, solace, sanctuary in Him.

Psalm 18 is one of my favorites. It's not one that we are going to consider as a primary text during this Sunday morning series largely because I fully acknowledge that I come to this well very often. But truth be told, I come to this well often because, for me, it is so deep, and its water so pure. It is a Psalm like so many of the Psalms that indeed ushers us into the wonderful presence of God.

"I love you, O Lord, my strength. The Lord is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer; my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge. He is my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold. I call to the Lord, who is worthy of praise, and I am saved from my enemies" (Psalm 18:1-3).

Our working definition of "Sanctuary" is: a place of refuge; a safe haven; a space of protection; a quiet, still place of rest.

In the coming weeks we'll navigate through the theme of God as our sanctuary, we as His sanctuaries, and the church as sanctuary.

I want to encourage each of us not only to intentionally come and be a part of our time of worship with one another, but to also seek out friends and loved ones who might be inclined to share in this theme of "Sanctuary."

Because if I'm correct in this, there are many who could use a little more sanctuary in life.





REEVES' RHETORIC

The Message of the Cross

"For the message of the Cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." – 1 Corinthians 1:18

These words of the Apostle Paul encourage we who have faith. They affirm to us that no matter what others think or say or believe, no matter the lack of conviction or lack of faith of others, the reconciling message of the Cross of Christ is powerful to us, even if it isn't to them.

But most often in our conversations and in our emphasis, we place a little too much distance between verse 18 and verse 17.

"For Christ did not send me to baptize, but to preach the Gospel – not with words of wisdom, lest the Cross be emptied of its power." – 1 Corinthians 1:17

Now don't think for a moment that the Apostle Paul is downplaying the role of baptism in one's response to the Gospel. Rather, I believe what the Apostle is emphatically seeking to convey is the overwhelming centrality of the message of Christ and the total reliance upon the power of God that completely rests within the content of the message itself.

Paul strips away anything that we ourselves could add to the message by assuring that it is not with anything that we bring to the table that makes the message more influential. Not by any oratory prowess or skill, or by any honed, tactical argumentation - but rather the power lies within the message. "...not with words of wisdom, lest the Cross be emptied of its power." It is the shock of the story of the Cross. And the shock of the story of the God of the Cross that motivates and prompts response.

The Gospel has always been scandalous, because it is a message of grace. Grace is scandalous because it releases control. It relinquishes control to the only One who truly possesses it. The scandal of the Cross is that it is God Himself who "is both just and the One who justifies" (Romans 3:26).

Christ brings the Kingdom (Reign) and the Cross (Sacrifice) together, which no one can fathom. Therein lies the power of its message.



REEVES' RHETORIC

Gravitational Pull

I've been spending some time in the Gospel of Luke lately. Not for a class that I'm teaching or for a sermon that I'm working toward, but rather, just for me (of course perhaps it'll lead us somewhere as a church later). But for right now, it's just me, the Gospel according to Luke, and a cup of coffee.

Luke is the only non-Jewish author of Scripture. Behind this reality lies insight that is raw and real and expressive. In Luke's account of the Good News we find Jesus telling stories more often, more readily. Luke provides us with more parables than the other three Gospel accounts. Many of these stories we find no place else (the Lost Son(s) come to mind, chapter 15). Luke sees life through the eyes of the outsider. The outcast. Primarily because in the Jewish world, he is one. In this, we find ourselves naturally drawn to the marginalized and to the margins because of Luke's natural gravitation. He opens our eyes to the poor, the sick, the foreigner, the ostracized. He elicits/demands compassion and humility within us. Luke places intentional emphasis in the Gospel story upon the role of women and Gentiles, who were seen as "less than" in the narrow field of vision of the religious elite. Luke presents a wonderful Gospel that is inclusive rather than exclusive. Moving rather than stationary. Engaging rather than stagnant. Liberating rather than burdening.

Life on the margins is the way of Jesus. And it is the call of His disciples. Reaching those who have been marginalized in this world, and recognizing that because of our Kingdom designed role in this life, we are called to live marginalized. We are to live marginalized. Because we are not of this world. We pledge allegiance to another King. We belong to another Kingdom. And because of this reality, we feel the gravitational pull toward the margins. Because in life at the margins we find our Savior.

Glory to God!

REEVES' RHETORIC

Gravitational Pull

I've been spending some time in the Gospel of Luke lately. Not for a class that I'm teaching or for a sermon that I'm working toward, but rather, just for me (of course perhaps it'll lead us somewhere as a church later). But for right now, it's just me, the Gospel according to Luke, and a cup of coffee.

Luke is the only non-Jewish author of Scripture. Behind this reality lies insight that is raw and real and expressive. In Luke's account of the Good News we find Jesus telling stories more often, more readily. Luke provides us with more parables than the other three Gospel accounts. Many of these stories we find no place else (the Lost Son(s) come to mind, chapter 15). Luke sees life through the eyes of the outsider. The outcast. Primarily because in the Jewish world, he is one. In this, we find ourselves naturally drawn to the marginalized and to the margins because of Luke's natural gravitation. He opens our eyes to the poor, the sick, the foreigner, the ostracized. He elicits/demands compassion and humility within us. Luke places intentional emphasis in the Gospel story upon the role of women and Gentiles, who were seen as "less than" in the narrow field of vision of the religious elite. Luke presents a wonderful Gospel that is inclusive rather than exclusive. Moving rather than stationary. Engaging rather than stagnant. Liberating rather than burdenina.

Life on the margins is the way of Jesus. And it is the call of His disciples. Reaching those who have been marginalized in this world, and recognizing that because of our Kingdom designed role in this life, we are called to live marginalized. We are to live marginalized. Because we are not of this world. We pledge allegiance to another King. We belong to another Kingdom. And because of this reality, we feel the gravitational pull toward the margins. Because in life at the margins we find our Savior.

We are to show a new life after baptism: We live to a higher standard as Christians. We are to imitate God by loving each other, forgiving each other, serving each other, and striving for purity (Eph.4:25-5:21). God wants our families to reflect the beauty of His church: God wants husbands and wives that love and honor each other in the example of Christ. God wants parents that lead by example and children that want to grow up imitating Christ. God wants to be honored in the home and for his families to spread their influence in the world. Sounds like a plan to me!

King David. The man "after God's own heart" (Acts 13:22; cf. 1 Samuel 13:14). The David of David and Goliath. Confesses, "My sin is always before me."

"I can't get away from it." "It consumes me." "I am overwhelmed by it."

REEVES' RHETORIC

A Few Steps Away

Soon after Francis of Assisi (1181-1226) turned his back on his life of wealth and chose to live a life of poverty and simplicity he encountered a man with leprosy outside of the city. We would expect he stopped to see if he could care for his needs. However, that was not the case. The story is told that as Francis saw the man, he averted his eyes, walked around him, and completely avoided any contact.

He had very recently, swore allegiance not only to live a life of poverty and a life of simplicity, but to love and care for others. To wholeheartedly follow the way of Jesus and to reveal the Jesus Way in all facets of life. To be committed beyond what was "required." But somehow, he avoided the possibility as soon as it arrived.

But the story doesn't end there. After wrestling within himself, with his actions (and lack thereof), Francis turned around, went back to the leper, embraced him in the name of Jesus, saw to his needs, and then continued on his way.

After taking a few steps away from the leper, Francis turned to see him again, but the man had disappeared. He was nowhere to be found. For the rest of his life, as he would retell the story, Francis was convinced that the man he had embraced and cared for and almost missed, was Jesus.

"Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go and visit you?' The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these, you did for me'" (Matthew 26:37-40).

We are at that time of the year around my house. This seems to be the time of the baby rabbits. When we come home after dark, we stand a good chance of spooking 3 or 4 rabbits that are hanging out in the yard. When the lights of the car hit them, they scatter everywhere. It's funny to watch them. They get so scared they don't know which way to go; they just run around real fast and when they think they are at a safe place for cover, they jump in! Our yard provides them food (our flower beds), but they know it is not a safe place for them to be caught in. When they scatter, they don't always take the safest route; their indecision puts them in further danger. Does this sound familiar? It reminds me of how we try to dabble in the world sometimes. The temptations there are sometimes too hard to resist, even though we know of the dangers involved. Then, when our deeds become obvious in the Light, we find that we are too involved to make a timely and safe escape. We go in protective mode, making excuses, justifying our mistakes, and blaming others. We become so busy covering up, we forget the "Sanctuary" that God has always provided for us. In the rush to get out of sight, we can put ourselves in the vulnerable position of making even worse decisions. This is why we need to build our faith. We need a faith that does not waver, a faith that does not fail us. James wrote about the man with a weak faith, "he is a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways" (James 1:8). Stability comes from making sound decisions before temptations arise. If you need to run, don't just scatter like the rabbits, run to God!

WAS IT BARGAINING OR HONORING?

In Genesis 23:1-20, we read of Sarah's death and how Abraham came to purchase her place of burial. The transaction for the burial cave strikes me as a good model of how God wants us to reflect Him in our treatment of others. Richard Rogers described this story as an "honorable bargaining session" and I agree. Abraham called himself an "alien and a stranger" to those he was dealing with, so we see that this did not happen among his family or friends. In fact, He loved man so much He was willing to give up His own son so that mankind would have a chance at salvation. I like Thanksgiving more than Christmas. Is that ok for me to say? It's not that I dislike Christmas. Or that I dislike giving gifts. Or receiving Starbucks gift cards... (Hint. Hint.) Both holidays provide an atmosphere of thankfulness and appreciation that we choose to embrace. It's not that I don't enjoy traveling or eating or sharing or spending time with extended family. I do. We do that with both holidays. I think what it is, is, the busyness of it all. To me, and maybe this is just me, but it seems like with Thanksgiving there's less of an agenda. Sure we plan and schedule and balance time with family and friends, but I think I like Thanksgiving more simply because Thanksgiving just is. It just is. The goal is just to be.

We carve out time just to be.

I love the portrait of Christ and His followers in Mark 4. Jesus' disciples find themselves in a desperate situation as their boat is overwhelmed in a storm, at night, on the Sea of Galillee. Where is Jesus? Asleep. As He stands to His feet after being awakened by His panic-stricken followers, He "rebukes the wind, and says to the waves, 'Quiet! Be still!' Then the wind dies down and it is completely calm" (Mark 4:39).

Here's my point: Things are about to get busy. For you and your family. If they aren't already. And odds are that between now and New Year's, some of us are going to find ourselves a bit overwhelmed. A little overextended. Slightly (ok, maybe more than just slightly) overcommitted. And maybe even more than moderately stressed.

My prayer is that we would allow Christ to step in and bring calm. That we would be receptive of Him as He speaks stillness into our lives. That we would intentionally create opportunities to simply be still. And to carve out time to iust be, with Him.

To "be still and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10).

If we will, I believe we will find the seas of life a little calmer; and face the storms of life with a little more boldness.

The Message that Cannot be Chained

"Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, descended from David. This is my Gospel, for which I am suffering even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But God's Word is not chained. Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they too may obtain salvation that is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory" (2 Timothy 2:8-10).

"Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, descended from David. This is my Gospel..." was our focus last week. 76 times in the letters of the Apostle Paul he pens the word Gospel. And each and every time, his intention is to communicate this very reality. The resurrection of the Messiah proclaims His deity. His descent from David reveals His humanity. Both facets, intrinsically crucial to the Gospel message.

What we sometimes miss is that Paul is in prison as he writes this second letter to Timothy. We think of Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Philemon as prison letters. But somehow we miss 2 Timothy. During his first imprisonment in Rome (Acts 28), Paul of course comprises Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Philemon. Upon his release (62AD), he then makes his fourth missionary journey. 4-5 years later, however, Paul is again arrested for his faith. This time he languishes in a dungeon. Chained for his belief in our Lord. "But God's Word is not chained."

"This is my Gospel, for which I am suffering even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But God's Word is not chained."

God's Word is not chained! What a powerful statement.

Certainly the written Word is included. Surely Christ the Divine Word is a part of this theology. However, when the Apostle declares, "God's Word is not chained" he's referring to the crux of the text, the message of the Gospel. The message of "Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, descended from David."

The message that cannot be chained.

Glory to God!

The Power of the Gospel Message

"Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, descended from David, This is my Gospel, for which I am suffering even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But God's Word is not chained. Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they too may obtain salvation that is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory" (2 Timothy 2:8-10).

For three weeks we have considered these three verses. As Paul, at the end of his life, chained in a Roman dungeon for his faith, reminds Timothy and reminds us of precisely what the Gospel is: "Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, descended from David. This is my Gospel...." And that even when we find ourselves in the most dismal of life circumstances, the message of the Gospel is unchained: "This is my Gospel, for which I am suffering even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But God's Word is not chained."

However, if we fail to live up to the Gospel, or if we define Gospel in some lesser way, we in fact are capable of chaining it. Don't hear me wrong, the message of the Gospel is powerful, and compelling, and without restraint. But if there are any constraints on the message lived out in our lives as individuals or as a church they are placed there by us.

And as the Apostle writes to Timothy, in this the last letter we have from his pen, perhaps days before his death, he includes a word of perspective. "Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they too may obtain salvation that is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory."

What greater message is there for the church today? That all of life is to be lived for the purpose of the Kingdom. "For the sake of the elect." Our situations do not define us. We are defined by our Lord. "Salvation that is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory." And because of our identify in Christ and the wonder of the Gospel message we embrace a divine reality. And we transcend the here and now. And we call others to join us, to follow us, as we follow Christ. This is the power of the Gospel message.
