Resolutions

Ok, so it is that time of year again when we end one year and begin another. As people gather for year end celebrations many will make resolutions for what they hope to accomplish in the new year.

Common resolutions include losing weight, exercising more, stopping a bad habit like smoking or drinking, getting a promotion, spending more time with family, hitting a financial target for retirement and the list goes on and on. Sadly, most resolutions will fall by the side by the time the second month has come around.

I would imagine that everyone who reads this article has experienced a resolution that was left unachieved during a year. Despite the best of intentions we often are not equipping ourselves to achieve our goals.

Here are some simple thoughts on how to improve our ability to complete the resolutions we make.

- 1. Make it specific. Instead of saying you want to lose weight, set your mind on a specific amount. If you need to lose 50 pounds, break that down to a weekly goal of 1 pound. Then make the needed adjustments to your routine to lose that 2.28 ounces each day (i.e., cut out the milkshakes!). Specific goals are measurable and can be easily broken down into manageable segments.
 - 2. Make it meaningful. Link your resolution with

your longer term objectives. A resolution to have a date night each month with your wife can be seen as supporting your lifelong commitment to her.

3. Make it known. Write your resolutions down and share them with others. The lack of accountability is a common element in failed resolutions. Having friends that know your resolutions will help you keep your focus on reaching them. Post your copy of resolutions where you can frequently read it.

Now, instead of just saying "I want to be a better Christian" as your resolution, apply these three suggestions and see how your new resolutions seem more attainable.

Are there questions you have about the Bible? Make a list and work to find the answers this year. Would you like to know better how to share the message of salvation with others? There are great tools already available. Pick a date and come begin your study. Do you have friends that need to hear the gospel? Write their names down and begin praying and inviting them to learn about Christ. Share your goals with others so they can support and encourage your efforts!

"And whatever you do, do it heartily, as to the Lord and not to men" (Col. 3:23).

Being The Best Bible Teacher You Can Be

The following article is by my friend Adam Faughn, who preaches for the Lebanon Road Church of Christ in Nashville, TN. I thought his article was right on target. I hope you enjoy it. If you are not in a Bible class already, you need to be. Why not start this Sunday. A listing of the new classes, topics and teachers can be found on page 2 inside.

Teaching Bible class is something I greatly enjoy. It is truly a skill, and one I need to hone! I pray often that my classes see that I am trying and that I truly enjoy the honor of teaching. It is a blessing to teach classes in which students offer input and are willing to answer questions and provide feedback.

That being said, teaching is work! It isn't hard to tell when a teacher has "thrown together" a class at the last minute. No teacher is going to be 100% prepared every single week, but it should not be a pattern for the instructor to be waiting until the last minute to "get up a lesson."

Those who teach often ask for "helps." They want to do a great job, and they ask for resources, books, websites and other materials that can help them present God's Word effectively. This post is not meant to list 100 resources or books that will help. Instead, it is meant to give you one step you can take to maximize your effectiveness.

If you were to ask me, "What is the one thing I need

to do to be the best Bible school teacher I can be?" I would give this answer:

Love your class!

When Jesus was asked what the greatest commandment was, His response, basically, was "Love God." When we think about any area of life, and we want to improve, we can answer with "love."

That is the case with Bible school teaching. If you truly love your class, you will do the best you can do! Will you win an award as the greatest teacher ever? Probably not (and neither will I, by the way), but your class will see the passion and desire you have to share with them the truths of God's word.

If you are a Bible school teacher, take a small test. This will only take about 1 minute. Write (or type) at the top of the page, "I love my Bible class because...". Now, write 3-5 reasons why you love that class (not Bible school in general). When you are finished, read it again...

- ...when you get a bit discouraged, read it again...
- ...when it's Saturday and you're stressing out, read it again...
- ...when Sunday comes and you are nervous, read it again!

Your class will know that you love them because you will be excited, prepared and ready out of love for them. When you love your class, preparation will take care of itself.

Moments With Mike

Proverbs

Many years ago I listened to a preacher describe a month-long process of reading through the book of Proverbs with his family. He took one chapter a day (31 chapters/31 days) and read a chapter as his family ate their breakfast each morning. He recounted it as a very beneficial process.

Solomon wrote much of the book of Proverbs and the first nine chapters are in the setting of a father speaking with his son. He addresses "my son" some fifteen times during these chapters, so it is natural for parents to think of sharing the wisdom of this book with their children.

Proverbs, both biblical and secular, are commonly found interwoven into the fabric of our lives. Common secular proverbs include the following. "A penny saved is a penny earned." "Every cloud has a silver lining." "Haste makes waste." "The rolling stone gathers no moss." "What's worth doing is worth doing well."

A proverb is a short, often pithy statement that expresses a basic truth or practical principle. A Hebrew word for proverb is *mashal*, which means "a comparison, to be similar to, resemble. The proverbs found in the book of Proverbs are maxims in a condensed format that are easily understood and easily remembered.

I've just completed teaching this book to the

Seekers class and starting this Sunday I'll be teaching it to the small auditorium class. There is a 60 page study guide that I've prepared that will be available as well. I hope that you will consider being a part of this class, especially if you are not already involved in a Bible class on Sundays.

One of the key themes of Proverbs involves learning. Common words found in the book include wisdom, instruction, knowledge, understanding, discretion and prudence. God gave wisdom and understanding to Solomon, but Solomon instructs his son to acquire wisdom and always be open to receiving and following instructions.

Here are a couple of thoughts for you to consider. Try reading just one chapter of Proverbs each day for a month. Don't try more than that. You need time to digest what you read in each chapter. Share this as a family reading if you wish.

Consider how much time your family is spending in Bible study each week at home as well as here at West Erwin. Parents, let's lead by example and show our children how important it is study the Bible at home as well as in an organized class with others. "A wise man will hear and increase learning, And a man of understanding will attain wise counsel" (Prov. 1:5).

What I'm about to refer to will date me, but I figure most all who read this were there anyway. It's about "The Fonz" in the sitcom Happy Days. Occasionally, the Fonz, as near perfect as he saw himself, would have to admit he was wrong. The problem was he could not say those words, but he "I was wwwrrr...." would try. wwwrrrrroooo..." "I was wwrroooooooo..." He just could not admit that he was wrong.

In our Covenant with GOD, the word confession means to admit wrong. We are called to confess our wrongs and to verbalize it openly to GOD and our fellow servants.





These concerns easily give way to fear. With the negative orientation our news and gossip magazines take, our hearts can be seized with anxiety and dread. Our prayers soon become laundry lists of things for God to fix — listen to our words: "Give me!" "Help me!" "Heal me!" "Rescue me!" Certainly we are to turn to God honestly and openly about the burdens of our hearts to "receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need" (Hebrews 4:16 TNIV). But with our cries for help, we must not forget the importance of being thankful for the incredible blessings we have in Jesus (Colossians 4:2). God isn't asking us for false or forced thanksgiving or some kind of simplistic relabeling of bad stuff. We are called back to the deep spiritual wells of grace we have in Jesus. From prison, Paul writes: Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ (Ephesians 1:3). Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will quard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:4-7). Because we have Jesus, and because he has us, our future is secure. Our relationships in Christ are eternal. All partings and every agony we face here are temporary. With this hope, we are to reframe all of life in a chorus song of thanksgiving: Cultivate thankfulness. ... Let every detail in your lives — words, actions, whatever — be done in the name of the Master, Jesus, thanking God the Father every step of the way (Colossians 3:16-17 MSG). In Jesus, the liturgy of our lives is thanksgiving — not just one day a year, but every day until we are lost in the thankful wonder of His presence, at home with Him forever. Yes, dear God, we do thank you for all the ways you have blessed us, for they are indeed, NOT small! www.heartlight.org

If you have watched football in person or on television you have no doubt witnessed the excitement that comes with a two minute offense. For most of the game the teams will take their time and methodically run through their playbooks. But when time is short before halftime and at the end of the game, an exciting transformation occurs.

The two minute offense is a series of plays designed to gain the most yardage and score with a minimal amount of time run off the clock. Some teams are so effective at this offense one rightfully wonders why they don't employ it during the rest of the game.

Just this past Sunday night I was watching a game between two rivals. One team was up 13 points and the other team needed to score twice in just over 4 minutes. They effectively used their two minute offense and scored. They got the ball back and scored again all within 4 minutes. They worked the clock effectively and scored the winning touchdown with only seconds remaining.

Of course, had they built a lead of several points instead of being behind there would have been no need to use the two minute offense. Instead, they had very clear goals and a short time in which to reach them.

Someone has said, "A person without a goal will get nowhere and won't know when he gets there." I think

this is correct, don't you? What about spiritually?

What are your spiritual goals? Do you want to become a Christian? Teach others the gospel? Invite friends to Bible class or worship? Live to see all of your family become Christians?

Having goals is important. But how much time will you have to accomplish these goals? The answer is one lifetime. The key is to learn to use that lifetime wisely.

Here's what Paul had to say about the urgency of putting on Christ. "And do this, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep; for now our salvation is nearer than when we first believed." "But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to fulfill its lust" (Rom. 13:11, 14).

When the coach calls for the two minute offense it means that it is high time to reach the goal. The game is on the line. In many cases, it is time to do what should have already been done earlier in the game.

Friends, don't let your spiritual life need a two minute offense to come out on top. Take care of your salvation and spread the good news to others now. Live your life in such a way that the outcome is never in doubt!

Psalm 51

No one in the Bible wrote more honestly and openly than David. Psalm 51 may have been his most difficult Psalm to pen. It's his prayer after Nathan came to him and confronted him with his adultery with Bathsheba and ordering the "hit" on Uriah. Psalm 51 is his prayer. He writes the words out for all generations to read. He opens with these words:

> "Have mercy on me, O GOD, according to your unfailing love, according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin."

"For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me."

David knew all that he had done wrong. His wrongs were replayed over and over in his heart. He had no rest. He found no comfort until Nathan came to him. He found no peace until he confessed the knowledge of his sins.

Knowing GOD was his answer. Knowing GOD still loved him. Knowing GOD was filled with compassion. Knowing GOD could wash away his iniquities. Knowing GOD was willing to cleanse him. That's where these words came from in Psalm 51. Read them often. Let David be your Nathan and call upon the same GOD. He has not changed.

Rom 8:1; 1 John 5:13), but it is also an overreaction to endorse the perseverance of the saints. In fact, Scripture warns repeatedly that salvation is sure only as long as one remains "in Christ" (cf. Rom 11:22; 1 Cor 9:25-27; Gal 5:4; 2 Pet 2:20).

A Harrisburg, PA, newspaper wrote, "We pass over the silly remarks of the president; for the credit of the nation we are willing that the veil of oblivion be dropped over them."

The London Times reported, "Anything more dull and commonplace it would not be easy to produce."

Ouch! After such bad reviews one would consider that speech doomed to the trash heap of history. Instead,

A few weeks ago I purchased three books in a this ten sentence speech, delivered in around three minutes, has gone down in history as one of the greatest speeches ever written—the Gettysburg Address.

If critics and enemies had their way, many great stories would never be told. But with perseverance one can overcome these obstacles and tell what needs to be told.

When it comes to the Christian walk we are sometimes challenged by critics and enemies when we tell the story of salvation. Rather than accepting God's plan of redemption with gladness, many will ridicule it and attack the messengers—us. To them it is silliness, a table, farfetched and something only the unlearned will follow. But to the Christian it is the greatest story to be shared.

In 1 Corinthians 1:18 Paul said, "For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved, it is the power of God."

The challenge to us is to keep telling the story regardless of what others say. May none of our friends ever think of it as the greatest story we never told!

"For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek" (Rom. 1:16).

MICHAEL Whitworth Last week, I began a three-part series on the teachings of Calvinism. This week, I want to discuss briefly the next three points of Calvinism. **Unconditional Election**: This is more popularly known as **Predestination**. It asserts that, before creation, God arbitrarily chose those who would be saved. Those who are not predestined for salvation cannot do anything to reverse the decision. Passages normally used to support this belief are Rom

9:15-16, 22-24; Eph 1:4-5, 11. However, while the Scriptures indeed speak of predestination or election, this election refers to groups of people rather than individuals. God has predestined the righteous for eternal life and the wicked for eternal punishment. **Limited Atonement**: This point of Calvinism teaches that Jesus' sacrifice only redeemed the elect, rather than the whole world. This point is easily refuted by passages such as John 1:29; 3:16; 2 Cor 5:14-15; and 1 John 2:2. **Irresistible Grace**: God's grace will save the elect when and how God chooses, regardless of individual choice. It will be impossible for an elect person to resist God's grace (Rom 8:29-30). However, the Bible teaches that salvation is a choice that we all make (cf. Acts 22:16; Rom 6:17) and that it is indeed possible to reject the grace of God (cf. Luke 18:18-23; Acts 26:28; Heb 2:3).



Moments With Mike

Messing With Time

At two times during the calendar year most Americans go through the Saturday night ritual of adjusting their clocks: forward an hour in the spring and then back again in the fall. Not everyone likes this process and I can't say that I blame them. Being creatures of habit we really don't like it when people mess with our time.

But, believe it or not, it could be much worse!

In 46 B.C. the Roman calendar was off by more than two months. Adjustments had been made previously to the 355 day calendar, but something needed to be done to straighten things out for good. Julius Caesar directed that a new calendar be created. He moved the start of the new year from March 1 to January 1 and fixed the calendar at 365 days following the solar cycles. One day was also added every four years to keep the calendar accurate.

But unlike our annual exercises of moving forward and back an hour, these changes were more severe. In order to catch things up for that year, Caesar added an extra two months between November and December and another three weeks between February and March. The year 46 B.C. ended up being 445 days long.

This seemed to work pretty well until 1582, over 1,600 years after Julius Caesar made these corrections. Each of those years had been off by just eleven minutes

but those minutes added up. Pope Gregory XIII appointed a committee to refine the calendar to keep it on true time. The resulting calendar meant that ten days now had to be trimmed from the current year. So on October 4, 1582, people went to sleep and woke up the next day, October 15, 1582! Some were outraged that 10 days had been stolen from them.

After reading about this recently (*The Greatest Stories Never Told, 100 Tales from History to Astonish, Bewilder & Stupefy*) I suddenly didn't feel so badly about setting our clock forward or backward an hour at a time.

The underlying lesson here is that time exists with or without our attempts to keep it. We can set a clock back an hour but we can not retrieve that hour to live it over again. Time marches on. We cannot "make time." We can only utilize the time we presently have.

Paul tells us to redeem our time (Eph. 5:16) being careful to follow God's ways. Friends, lets make every moment, every hour, every day count. Time is a gift from God. Don't mess with your time by throwing it away.

Both sermons this Sunday will deal with time and how we utilize it. I hope you will set aside your time on Sunday and join us in worship.

This week, I want to begin a three-part series which will discuss the teachings of Calvinism. John Calvin's beliefs were expressed in his commentary on the Bible and in a collection of works known as *Institutes*. Several religious groups adhere to some or all of his teachings. But in recent years, Calvinism has experienced a revival within religious groups that did not previously embrace it. There are commendable attributes of

Calvinism—it is based upon absolute faith in God's sovereignty. But Calvinism also has its flaws. The first of Calvinism's five points is **Total Depravity**: At birth, a person inherits Adam's sin and is totally depraved or sinful. It is thus impossible for someone, of free will, to love or be obedient to God. To be saved, God must enable that person through the Spirit to love and be obedient. Passages normally used to support this belief are Gen 8:21; Psa 51:5; John 6:44, 64 -65; Rom 5:12-19; 8:7-8; and Eph 2:1-3. But the NT teaches that a person dies spiritually because s/he sins, rather than inheriting Adam's sin. Spiritual death is a consequence of our own sins, rather than Adam's (cf. Ezek 18:20; Rom 3:23). We are all sinners and in need of Jesus' redemption, but we must personally decide to obey the gospel!



Where Do I Stand?

Throughout the school year many students will approach the teacher and inquire about their current grades. This happens with greater frequency just before the mid-term exams and especially before the finals. The students want to know where they stand.

What they do with the information may still be a mystery to some teachers. Having teachers in both my family and in my wife's family, I've heard plenty of stories of students who questioned where they stood on their grades and then apparently did nothing to better themselves.

The Bible records an example of a very fortunate young man. This fellow was able to approach Jesus and ask Him questions directly related to his relationship with

His first question was, "Good Teacher, what good thing shall I do that I may have eternal life?" (Matt. 19:16). Jesus replied by saying that he should keep the commandments.

Then, like many students today that may wish to further clarify the situation, he asked his second question. "Which ones?" (Matt. 19:18). This time Jesus lists a few of the Ten Commandments, including the ones for murder, adultery, stealing, bearing false witness and honoring parents.

The young man had successfully kept these commandments and so he presses for a third question. "What do I still lack?" (Matt. 19:20). Knowing of the young man's love for his riches, Jesus instructs him to sell what he has, give that to the poor and then follow Jesus.

Unfortunately, the young man was unwilling to give up what he treasured so much. Jesus knew where the man stood. Material things had replaced God in his life. But just like the failing student who declined to apply himself for a passing grade, this young man went away with great sorrow for he had many possessions.

We would do well to consider the questions the voung man asked Jesus. What must we do to have eternal life? Which commands are we to follow today? What do we still lack?

Friends, we'll find the answers to those questions in the Bible. But here's the real question for us. Will we do what God expects of us in order to go to heaven?

David wrote the following in Psalm 139:23-24. "Search me, O God, and know my heart; Try me, and know my anxieties; And see if there is any wicked way in me, And lead me in the way everlasting."

What we believe about Jesus is very important. Christians profess that Jesus was God-in-the-flesh and the Christ. But what proof do we have of such claims? 1.) Jesus was a historical person. The historical reality of his life cannot be denied. Dozens of Roman historians refer to him. There is simply too much written about Jesus—ancient and modern—for him to be a myth or legend. 2.)

Jesus claimed to be God. We do not give Jesus a position he did not claim for himself. On several occasions, he claimed that he was God (John 5:17-18; 10:30) and accepted worship as if he were God (Matt. 8:2). 3.) Jesus fulfilled every messianic prophecy. Scattered throughout the OT, there are several predictions about the Messiah (cf. Psa. 22:14-18; Isa. 9:1-2; Mic. 5:2). According to the gospels, Jesus fulfilled every one of these! Jesus' resurrection was the final proof of his deity. 4.) Jesus predicted his own resurrection (Matt. 12:38-40; John 2:18-22). Resurrection critics propose all sorts of absurd theories, including the allegation that his followers stole the body. But the reality is that Jesus truly died, rose on the third day, and appeared to hundreds of eye-witnesses. Isn't it great to have such solid evidence for our Savior?





Currently I have about a dozen books that are devoted to the history and origin of songs. Our church library also has several books on this subject.

When we learn about how a song came to be, we often develop a greater appreciation for the deeper meaning of that song. For example, I can't sing It Is Well With My Soul today without thinking about H. G. Spafford and his tragic loss of his daughters drowning at sea.

The story below is included in the book. A Sona Is Born, by Robert J. Taylor.

Ira Stamphill wrote the song Mansion Over The Hilltop after hearing the following story from a visiting preacher, Gene Martin, while in Dallas, TX, in 1949.

"A man of considerable means, facing imminent bankruptcy, took a driving trip through a rural part of the country. Here, one particular house caught his attention. It was badly in need of paint and repairs of every kind. Most of the windows had oil paper to replace the broken glass. Parts of the roof and shingles were missing. He wondered how the house was still standing. Out front, playing in the yard, was a young girl about 8 or 9, who was poorly

dressed. The traveler felt an urge to stop and talk. During the conversation, he mentioned how sorry he was that the young lady had to live in such poor surroundings. The voung girl replied. 'Why, haven't you heard? My daddy just inherited a fortune and he's building us a mansion just over that hill over there. Don't know when it will be done, but I won't have to live in this house forever."

Jesus said in John 14:1-2, "Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in Me. In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you."

Isn't it a great comfort to know that our Lord has a place prepared in heaven for us? We may live in many different houses during our life, but we will not find any permanent dwellings here. These are all temporary. The dwelling place we desire is eternal in heaven.

React Or Respond

I've always been a huge fan of Zig Ziglar. From my days in the business world I found insight, wisdom and energy from his books and tapes. The same is of benefit to me as a preacher as well.

A few weeks ago I rediscovered a few of his tapes and listened to them while traveling up to Kentucky. found it very refreshing to hear his voice again and to reflect on his insights.

One concept he taught caught my attention more than the others. He was speaking of how we interact with others (managers, family, customers, friends, etc.) and how there is a difference between reacting or responding.

For example, one might say that a person had a reaction to a medication, meaning that they had complications. On the other hand, one might say that a person is responding well to treatment of an illness.

How about in our lives? Do we tend to react more or respond more?

When something bad happens to us (and you know it will) we need to be prepared to handle that situation righteously. James reminds us of this in James 1:19-20. "So then, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath, for the wrath of man does not produce the righteousness of God."

A reaction to an insult or an injury might well be to return like for like. But a response falls more in line with what God desires from us. Peter speaks of our responses being with "meekness and fear" so that as people speak against us as "evildoers" our good conduct may cause them to be put to shame. See 1 Peter 3:15-17.

Here is another passage to consider. In Ephesians 4:26-27 Paul says, "Be angry, and do not sin: do not let the sun go down on your wrath, nor give place to the devil."

Friends, let's focus on spending more time on righteous responses rather than quick reactions.

I have always found personal introductions awkward. When I speak somewhere, I am always asked for a bio sheet so that I can be introduced. You run the risk of getting the facts wrong or mispronouncing the name of his lone

I will strengthen you, though you have not acknowledged me, so that from the rising of the sun to the place of its setting men may know there is none besides me. I am the Lord, and there is no other. One of the Old Testament's most beautiful stories is found in Ruth. A woman known as Naomi lost her husband and her two sons. In the aftermath, she returned despondent to her homeland of Israel with little hope for a bright future. Her surviving daughters-in-law were under no obligation to go with her, but one chose to do so: Ruth. In this beautiful story of

faithful love and devotion, I see three important lessons concerning our personal relationships First, Ruth teaches us that relationships are not cheap bonds to be broken when circumstances demand; rather, loyalty is a sacred calling. As Christians, we take comfort in the fact that Jesus is faithful to us even beyond our own death (Matthew 28:20), and Christ expects us to be devoted to one another just as he is devoted to us. Second, Ruth's devotion was the only flicker of hope in Naomi's otherwise shattered life. Your un-faithfulness has the power to shatter someone else's life, but your faithfulness could very well be the final thread of hope to which someone clings. Finally, in hindsight, Ruth's loyalty to Naomi had lasting repercussions in the history of Israel—her lineage included David and Christ. Your faithfulness could also have eternal implications, but unfaithfulness could spell disaster for generations.



Moments With Mike

Renewal

A few weeks ago I received a notice in the mail about my registration renewal on my car. As in the previous year. I went down to the Cotton Belt building and submitted my payment with proof of insurance and received a new renewal decal for my windshield.

Unless I decide to trade for another car, I'm good to go for the next year. I'm in compliance with the laws of Texas and my car is considered legal to drive.

When you stop to think about it, renewal is a common part of our lives. The newspaper sends you a renewal notice when your subscription runs out. The same is true with magazines. They know that you are a current customer, but your original agreement is about to expire and they want to sign you up for another round.

Renewal can also be seen in relationships. Occasionally you will hear of a married couple who renew their vows to one another, reaffirming their love and commitment to one another. Sometimes this is done in the aftermath of a marital difficulty, but hopefully it was just at a milestone in their marriage. In either situation, renewal is seen as a positive step.

Renewal can be seen not only as a recommitment but also as a recharging of our strength and faith. Concerning God, Isaiah wrote, "He gives power to the weak. And to those who have no might He increases strength...But those who wait on the Lord Shall renew their strength; They shall mount up with wings like eagles, They shall run and not be weary. They shall walk and not faint" (Isa. 40:29, 31).

As a preacher, I often ponder what can be done to help people understand the power of renewal in their lives. God will supply our strength, but we must be willing to connect with that power.

Some will connect when times are difficult. David wrote Psalm 51 after Nathan had exposed his sin with Bathsheba. In verse 10 David wrote, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, And renew a steadfast spirit within me."

David knew that his commitment with God needed renewal. Calling upon God for mercy, David requests that God help put him back in a righteous relationship with Him.

But we don't need to wait until we are separated from God to seek renewal with Him. Sunday morning's lesson will deal with some of this as we examine the topic, "Renew Our Spirit." In the weeks to follow I hope for us to continue with this theme as we seek a renewed commitment with God, with our Savior and with the church. Make your plans to be here.

It requires replacing old beliefs that we have acquired by living in a fallen world where things No one can make you unhappy. Your ability tend to fall apart. Seek those beliefs GOD offers us

Misunderstood Signals

Jeff Jenkins from Lewisville, TX, recently wrote a humorous story on his blog. One of the greatest statements in all of Scripture is found in Romans 11. The context, as is the case with every passage, is crucial to our appreciation of Paul's statement. For three chapters (Romans 9-11), Paul discusses God's scheme of redemption, including the entrance of the Gentiles into the Kingdom. Paul's argument is that God acts in whatever way

he feels is best. God is sovereign. God is just. God is merciful. Paul's words in Romans 11:36, the final verse of this section, are an understated summary of the Bible's greatest claim: "For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be the glory forever! Amen." Three prepositions are used in that first sentence; they seem so innocent yet are so full of power. "**From** him..." God is the source of all things. All things originate from him. He is all-powerful. "**Through** him..." God is the means by which all things happen. I am, at all times, sustained by his mercy. "To him..." God is the end of all things; all things point to him so as to glorify his great name. "To him be the glory forever!" I want to challenge you, in sickness and in health, in pain and in praise, in heartbreak and hallelujahs, to give the God of heaven all the glory, both now and forever. S.D.G.

On Choosing Friends

My Sunday morning class has been in a study of the Book of Proverbs. Last week we covered a section on the importance of choosing friends wisely. I've included some notes below on that topic. We still have room for more in class and would love to see you there! Room 403.

"From The Heart of TYLER"

◆ People-oriented

An important choice for children (and adults) is the choice for friendship. Parents worry about the "wrong crowd" and rightfully so. As seen in earlier chapters of Proverbs (5-7), the temptations of evil are very persuasive. "The righteous should choose his friends carefully, For the way of the wicked leads them astray" (12:26).

Choosing one's friends is a very important process. A choice of the wrong type of friend can lead one to evil and away from God. On the other hand, choosing friends who are righteous will help to enforce what godly parents have already instilled in a person.

There are certain types of friends that one should not desire. Solomon lists several. One should avoid befriending the gossip (20:19), short tempered (22:24-25), drinkers and overeaters (23:20-21), changers (24:21-22), liars (25:18-20) and those who are violent (1:10-19).

Those who are wise (13:20) and lead others to right choices (13:14) are the types of people that one should

choose as a friend. But, even with good choices there still remain the occasional problems that threaten friendship.

Here are a few problems that can surface. Gossip (17:9), overstaying a welcome (25:17), meddling in someone else's affairs (26:17), playing bad jokes (26:18-19), being a talebearer (26:20), being contentious (26:21) and using flattery to gain advantage (27:14).

Solomon offers some excellent advice on how to successfully deal with others, including friends. Be at peace with the Lord (16:7), be slow to anger (15:18), be slow to respond (18:13, see also James 1:19-20), avoid quarreling (20:3), speak gently (15:1), speak briefly (10:19), be quick to show love (10:12) and rebuke a friend rather than flatter him (28:23).

Great friends and neighbors can be tremendous assets to a person. "A friend loves at all times, And a brother is born for adversity" (17:17). "A man who has friends must himself be friendly, But there is a friend who sticks closer than a brother" (18:24).

Finally, good friends are interested in helping one another be better. "Open rebuke is better Than love carefully concealed. Faithful are the wounds of a friend, But the kisses of an enemy are deceitful" (27:5-6).

Job asks in verses 12 and 20, "From where then does wisdom come? And where is the place of understanding?" These are great questions.

Knowledge is fairly easily obtained these days. Just do a "google" search on your computer or phone and you can read up on any subject instantly. Of course, not everything you read online is true or accurate. But then, knowledge is not the same thing as wisdom or understanding. Job's friends had plenty of knowledge, but

they certainly lacked wisdom and understanding when it came to assessing Job's situation and offering advice.

In verse 28 the Lord defines wisdom and understanding. "Behold, the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom, and to depart from evil is understanding." This is so simple, yet so many people will never realize the power of that definition.

To fully appreciate and understand true wisdom we not only need to find God's ways, but we also need to turn away from evil. Many people have tried to be righteous while still following the ways of the devil. This will not work.

Jesus addressed this in Matthew 6.24. "No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and man."

As we contemplate our need for more wisdom and understanding, may we always have an open mind for learning and may we always seek wisdom from God. As we open our Bibles daily, may we anticipate learning something that will equip us for the day's challenges.

Our lesson on Sunday night will focus on Job 28 and the quest for wisdom and understanding. I hope that you will be here for that time together.

Pay Attention! By Don Crawford

Having spent most of Tuesday on jury duty and being one of the "chosen" ones I had the opportunity to reflect on the words I heard in the courthouse.

Words like, "Pay Attention," as they gave instructions to the specific panels. Lots of legal terms are passed around in that place as well. Words like: violations, just punishment, neglect and

What's so interesting is that these same words are found in the book of Hebrews. Did you ever pay attention to the words the writer uses when he speaks of the Law of Moses? He wrote: "We must pay more careful attention, therefore, to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away. For if the message spoken by angels was binding,

and every violation and disobedience received its just punishment, how shall we escape if we neglect such a great salvation?"

First, neglect means to disregard, to make light of, or to ignore. The writer wanted to warn us of such an attitude toward the salvation that Christ has provided through the cross. If the Law of Moses was binding and every violation was to receive a just punishment then how much more this great salvation that comes through the Son of GOD?

This Jesus is greater than the angels. He is greater than Moses. Do not neglect the Words of GOD that come through His Son. For Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes the Father except through me." (John 14:6)

Some of my earliest memories are of my dad reading bedtime stories to me every night. Most often it was a tale from the Bible, and as you can easily imagine, Abraham was a regular staple. It's easy to understand why: Israel's religious heritage (Exod. 3:6), physical inheritance (Deut. 1:8), and ethnic identity (Matt. 3:9) were all associated with Abraham. It was often for Abraham's sake that God chose not to destroy Israel (2 Kings 13:23). Ultimately,

Abraham was remembered as a friend of God (2 Chron. 20:7) and his name became synonymous with faith itself. But Abraham's faith—long acclaimed as the ultimate model had as many hiccups as highlights. God made promises of prosperity, property, posterity, and protection to Abraham. But Abraham struggled at times to completely trust in these promises, until God led him to Mount Moriah (Gen. 22) and Abraham learned that the Lord provides. This fact, I believe, gives comfort to those of us whose walk of faith is often "one step forward, two steps back." If the father of the faithful eventually learned to trust, then there remains hope for us as well, the many children of father Abraham. "I am one of them, and so are you, so let's all praise the Lord!"



Helen Keller said, "Character cannot be developed in ease and quiet. Only through experience of trial and suffering can the soul be strengthened, ambition inspired, and success achieved." This is quite a statement from a women who dealt with difficulties every day of her life.

So how will we handle the trials that we face? Are we prepared to accept each challenge and to grow through it? Someone has said, "Nothing will show more accurately what we are, than the way we meet trials and difficulties."

James said to count it joy when we find ourselves being tested. Patience and spiritual maturity will come if we will endure the trial. 

Has It Been That Long?

It has been 40 years since man accomplished what NASA has called the "greatest technological achievement of mankind," that is, landing on the moon and having men to walk on it's surface. On July 20, 1969, at 10:56 p.m., Neil Armstrong, descending from the lunar module's ladder and touching one foot to the Moon's surface, announced: "That's one small step for (a) man, one giant leap for mankind."

This was a great achievement and one that helped complete a challenge from President John F. Kennedy. On May 25, 1961, in a speech to congress, Kennedy said, "I believe that this nation should commit itself to achieving the goal, before this decade is out, of landing a man on the Moon and returning him safely to the Earth."

This country responded to that challenge and in just over 8 years they attained that lofty goal. Without a vision of one day reaching the moon no one would have ever attempted such a task.

Other milestones and achievements have been reached within the space program. But perhaps none unified and energized this country more than the goal to set foot on another world.

Naturally, Christians have something to say about being in another world one day. We've made our preparations and our passage has been arranged to go from this world to Heaven. Whereas only 12 men have ever set

foot on the moon (the last one in December 1972), millions upon millions will be able to inhabit the new world of Heaven.

Sixty-one years ago someone in Tennessee had a dream of sharing the gospel by correspondence in Nigeria. In 1948 a policemen there was the first to obey the gospel through that course. Since that time the church in Nigeria has grown to over 4,000 congregations and around 800,000 in attendance.

A similar vision was cast on India. Our first missionaries arrived there in 1963 and 46 years later some estimates have the number of Christians there at around 1 million. There are great blessings in following our vision.

Nearly 2,000 years ago our Lord issued a commission to us. "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature" Mark 16:15. His challenge should frame our vision. Our world begins at home and reaches outward to our neighborhood, our city, our state, our country and our planet. Our vision should be to reach all that we can reach in our world for Christ in our lifetime.

Crazy you say? That's what they said about landing on the moon also. It took NASA 8 years to reach their goal. How long will it take for us to personally share the gospel with everyone in our own neighborhoods? Think about it.

Lead Me To Some Soul Today

Our lessons last Sunday focused on challenges to church growth and how we can rescue the perishing. Thank you so much for your words of encouragement and for the conversations some of you are starting on how we can be more evangelistic in our communities.

One of the passages we discussed Sunday night was from Luke 14:15-24, The Parable of the Great Supper. In that discussion, Jesus told of the master of the house who sent out his servants three different times to bring people in for that great event.

Those initially invited chose to make excuses and would not come to the supper. So the master sent out the servants to bring in those from the streets and the lanes of the city. Even after this was done, there was still room in the master's house, so another group was sent to seek out more people, this time from the highways and the hedges.

Verse 23 ends with the phrase, "...compel them to come in that my house may be filled." The master's invitation had already been extended, yet there was a need for servants to still compel (urge, make) people accept it and come into the master's house.

One of the great parts of God's plan to redeem mankind is that He has made it possible for everyone to be saved—there is room for all. But, sadly, many people will

reject or ignore God's invitation and our urging for them to come.

Friends, let's set our minds to be more active in reaching the lost and bringing them to Christ. Focus your prayers this week on how we can accomplish this. Think also on the words of the great song listed below.

How Does Your Garden Grow?

Post-Christian World

This past week I read a book that focused on why the younger generation of conservative Bible churches are leaving those churches. The book, *Already Gone*, provided some excellent insight on this latest generation to turn away from churches. The Churches of Christ represented 6.9% of the respondents represented in their research. There were 14 other churches included.

The authors began with a review of religion in England where only 2.5% of the population attend Bible-based churches. Only 6.3% attend any type of church on a regular basis. In 2004 more people attended mosques than worshipped at the Church of England. The new religion of England really has become secular humanism and they are truly living in a post-Christian era.

Similar trends seem to be mounting in our country as well. Although we still enjoy a majority of people who claim to be Christian, that number has fallen from 86% to 75% since 1990. We do have cause for concern.

The authors found that 61% of their sample attended Sunday school on a regular basis as children and teens. We've always stressed the need to be together for worship and for Bible study. But simply coming to class isn't enough.

This research showed that 38% of those who left

believed the Bible to be entirely true and accurate. Yet they didn't have a connection between Christianity and the local church. And while the additional time in Bible class should improve our knowledge of facts, it must also prepare the student to know and defend doctrines, not just become acquainted with Bible characters. Beyond that, our time together should also solidify our need to belong and serve in a local body of believers.

I hope that our country will never see the day when less than 10% of our population attends worship on a regular basis or when other religions outnumber Christianity. But even if it does, I'm more concerned that each local congregation and each Christian take up the charge to make a difference in the lives of others and share the gospel message more frequently and more personally.

Jesus said in Matthew 16:18, "I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it." I believe that. Don't you?

Friends, the post-Christian era for our country will eventually be a reality. Fewer and fewer people have a respect for the authority and truths of God's word. Are we ready to evangelize a world/community that doesn't want to follow Jesus? We'd better be!

Knowledge And Wisdom

Conventional wisdom would tell us that if we educate people more then they will be wiser and make better decisions in life. I think that is true for the most part. But have you noticed that our society isn't really getting better morally even though we are more and more knowledgeable in facts?

Simply knowing something does not make us wise. The acquisition of facts and knowledge is certainly to be desired and even expected. But it is the proper application of that knowledge that leads to wisdom.

My Sunday morning class began a study of Proverbs last week. This is a fascinating book, and one that can hardly be canvassed in a quarter of study.

A wide array of topics are covered including diligence, hard work, honesty, and warnings about the dangers of life such as prostitutes, thieves, lazy people and others. A listing of our class subjects is listed later.

The term "proverb" comes from the Hebrew word mashal, which means "a comparison, to be similar to, resemble." Commonly we see this as a "short, pithy statement of truth that is recognized as a fundamental principle or rule of conduct."

The two categories of key words revolve around wisdom and foolishness. Within wisdom we find

instruction, discipline, knowledge, insight, understanding discretion and prudence. Within foolishness we find folly, simple, naïve, scoffer, scorner and forward.

Solomon clearly notes that some will reject the wisdom from the Lord and even today we find those who would presume to be religious that scoff at God's word.

The theme for the book can be found in Proverbs 1:7. "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge."

Ever Need A Little Boost?

This past week I was driving my son's car up to him in Kentucky. I wasn't sure that the car would make it Christ as being made up of many members. And Paul and that's one reason why I didn't let him drive it up there earlier in the week. But I was pleasantly surprised that the 11 year old car managed to do quite well, even getting over 30 miles to the gallon!

But my boasting in the car's performance was cut short the next morning when the battery decided it wasn't going to turn over. Most of us have been in that position and we know what to do. After purchasing a set of booster cables it took less than a minute to jump start the car and off we went.

I never worried about the battery on the car. It had always worked. However, Joseph and I had invested quite a bit of money to rework the engine, replace brakes and make several other needed repairs.

As I traveled further down the road I began to think about how churches can sometimes be like that car. Scores of major parts and thousands of minor parts go into the making of a car. It can still function without the use of many of the minor parts, and can perform at a lesser level even with damage to some larger parts. But it was designed to function with all of the parts performing together.

1 Corinthians 12:12-27 describes the body of emphasizes the importance of each member not only in that passage but also in Ephesians 4:15-16 where he says that we "may grow up in all things into Him who is the head—Christ—from whom the whole body joined and knit together by what every joint supplies, according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love."

I love that phrase "every part does its share." When that happens within churches growth will come.

When that battery didn't do its share the car didn't function as it should. A boost was needed to get the power back.

Likewise, when members of the body (church) don't do their share, a boost is needed to resupply the power and refocus our efforts.

"And my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:19.

Friends, are you fully charged for service to the Lord? If not, do you need a little boost? Look to God as your ultimate power supply.

Listen To The Wise Man

Now that school is out for the summer most students don't want to hear about learning for a few months. That's natural. I remember those days as well.

However, as students of God's word we should always be in a frame of mind to receive instruction and to continue in our spiritual journey toward maturity. My prayer is that we may all continue to consider ourselves as students and be always looking to learn more from God.

My Sunday morning class will begin a study of the Book of Proverbs on June 14th. My family and I will be away in Tennessee this Sunday for a few short days, and Tony Adams will be teaching my class in my absence.

When I return we will begin to tap into the richness of the wisdom of Solomon in his many proverbs. Each week we will take a topical approach to learning from this rich book. If you are looking for a class to attend, we would love to have you in this class. Bring your Bible.

First Kings 3:7-14 describes how Solomon requested "an understanding heart" so as to be able to judge God's people. He knew that he lacked the skills necessary to take on this enormous task, so he asked God to provide him with the skills he needed. God not only gave him wisdom but also riches and honor, things that he had not requested.

The main Hebrew word for wisdom is hokmah. which is commonly used for the skill of craftsmen, sailors. singers, administrators and others. With this in mind, as we search the wisdom of Solomon we are in fact discovering the skills needed to live according to God's will.

We should listen attentively to this wise man for God said of Solomon that there was no one like him before him nor would there be any like him after him. Notice this reading.

"And God gave Solomon wisdom and exceedingly great understanding, and largeness of heart like the sand on the seashore. Thus Solomon's wisdom excelled the wisdom of all the men of the East and all the wisdom of Egypt. For he was wiser than all men...and his fame was in all the surrounding nations. He spoke three thousand proverbs, and his songs were one thousand and five... And men of all nations, from all the kings of the earth who had heard of his wisdom, came to hear the wisdom of Solomon." 1 Kings 4: 29-32, 34.

I look forward to our study of this great book. More importantly, I look forward to the things I have yet to learn from the wise man Solomon. How about you?

Moments With Mike

Imitate, Don't Impersonate

I received two phone calls late last week informing me that suspicious activity had been detected with my personal information. A total of three new credit accounts had been opened by someone who was impersonating me.

This isn't the first time that I've had my identity stolen. Six years ago I was also victimized by someone who opened up three credit cards in my name. Fortunately in both cases nothing was actually charged on these accounts. However, the reality is that someone was attempting to impersonate me for their own personal gain.

Perhaps you have also been a victim of identity theft. If so, how did you feel knowing that someone else was passing themselves off as you? Can you imagine how it would feel to know that someone was doing something wrong and that people thought it was you?

Solomon wrote of the value of a good reputation in Proverbs 22:1. "A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches, loving favor rather than silver and gold." That's wise advice. Keep your name clean.

Another piece of great advice comes from Paul in 1 Corinthians 11:1. "Imitate me, just as I also imitate Christ."

When you read the 11 verses that lead up to that verse you begin to gain a sense of what it meant to live for Christ as Paul did. Better yet, go back and read 1

Corinthians 9:16-27. Paul was facing the impossible task of becoming all things to all people and his motivation was the hope that he might be able to win some to Christ.

Paul had his share of detractors as well. Some challenged his apostleship. Others misrepresented Paul in the hopes of causing him additional affliction. But through all of this Paul was able to keep his focus on advancing the cause of Christ. He was selfless.

Likewise, Christ also was focused and selfless in His life. Those who opposed Him did so with great ambition, speaking evil and false things against Him and eventually taking Him to His death. Can you imagine how difficult it would be to show love toward those who were about to murder you? Yet Jesus died for those who hated Him. Paul sought to imitate Jesus.

Can you imagine how frustrating it must have been for Paul to have to defend himself from those who sought to misrepresent his motives and damage his reputation? Yet he rejoiced so long as the gospel was being advanced.

Impersonating someone today can be as easy as knowing a social security number, birth date and address. But the real challenge comes with trying to imitate a person's life. Are you ready to imitate Christ?





Friends, you and I both realize that mistakes are a natural part of our lives. We make some mistakes innocently, not realizing our error until someone else helps us to see it. Other mistakes we may make intentionally, knowing the direction in which we are going.

Regardless of our motivation, when we find that we have made a mistake we should want to correct it.

Over the years I've collected various mistakes or bloopers that were printed in church bulletins. These are popular on the internet as well. Here's a sample of some.

"For those of you who have children and don't know it, we have a nursery downstairs."

"Thursday night will be our potluck supper. Prayer and medication will follow."

"Ushers will eat latecomers."

"The outreach committee has asked for volunteers to call on people that are not afflicted with any church."

Not surprisingly we humans can make mistakes. But did you know that some mistakes were actually printed in some Bibles?

In 1763 a Bible was printed that included, "The fool hath said in his heart that there is a God." In 1632 a Bible was printed that omitted the word not, making the seventh commandment read, "Thou shalt commit adultery." Thankfully these errors were noticed and corrected.

But other mistakes in the Bible are still included. They

include the mistakes made by men, women and whole nations as they left the way of God and journeyed into sin. Those mistakes allow us to read about them and learn from them as well.

In last week's bulletin the end of my article was inadvertently cut off leaving the reader without a proper conclusion to the thought. The article was about where your name is listed and the importance of having your name listed in the Book of Life in heaven.

Although it was an error (mistake) to omit the end of the article, it would be a much greater mistake to not obey the gospel and have your name added to the Book of Life. Here is the original ending of that article from last week.

"And anyone not found written in the Book of Life was cast into the lake of fire." Rev. 20:15.

Friend, is your name written there? If it isn't, it needs to be. If you are not sure, we would love to be able to study with you and show you how you can have a place in the Book of Life with your name on it.

Friends, we appreciate your feedback to us when we make an error in the bulletin. Really, we do! It helps us to do better. It is nearly impossible to always catch your own errors.

How much more then should we all be willing to speak a kind word of concern or correction to fellow Christians that may have encountered errors (mistakes) in their spiritual lives. Someone "proofreading" the life of another might well identify mistakes a person has not yet realized. Think about it.

WORTHLESS RELIGION (James 1:26)

The Hasty Tongue

Communication with a hasty tongue is only being a fool says Solomon (Prov. 29:20). Yet, how many times have I offended or hurt feelings because I spoke in haste (long before my brain was in gear)? How many prayers and promises have I quickly rattled out to GOD that I reneged on before the sun

Solomon reminded me earlier (Prov. 18:13) saying, "He who answers before listening — that is his folly and his shame." So, why do I do it? Why are church pews packed with the same problem? Is it our fear of being a failure that causes us to speak so quickly? Is it our need to establish our worth that compels us to answer so hastily?

Jephthah's hasty vow became his most

difficult moment (Judges 11:30-40). He vowed that if GOD gave him victory against the Ammonites he would sacrifice to the Lord the first thing that came out of his house when he returned. Did he think it might be his neighbor's barking dog that he would see first? When his only daughter was the one who stepped out, his hasty words became very bitter.

James reminds us (1:19) "Everyone should be guick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to become angry, for man's anger does not bring about the righteous life that GOD desires."

Join me this week as I take extra time to weigh my words carefully, before I release them. In many cases I would be better off if I learned to exercise silence rather than speaking without thinking.

WORTHLESS RELIGION

You've read it before: "If anyone considers himself religious and yet does not keep a tight reign on his tongue, he deceives himself and his religion is worthless." James 1:26

James later writes: "But no man can tame the tongue" (3:8). Therefore, the only hope for this "restless evil, full of deadly poison" is the Spirit of GOD. The question is, how does this take place?

I would say, first, you and I must become sensitive to our negative uses of the tongue. Secondly, you and I must declare a "verbal fast" by abstaining from such usage.

Words are nothing more than the vehicle by

which we communicate our thoughts to one another. The tongue is the driver of the vehicle. Once you and I unlearn the negatives, we can begin to learn the right words to use at the right times, for the right reasons.

"The sovereign Lord has given me an instructed tongue, to know the word that sustains the weary" (Isaiah 50:4)

GOD wants you and I to use our tongues to encourage tired people. For the next few weeks we will consider specific things to unlearn and specific things to learn in our new journey to becoming a wellspring of life to everyone around us. I pray you will look forward to this verbal fast each week.

REPENTANCE

There is no other teaching in the New Testament that is so pivotal as the word repent.

Yet, I've decided most of us don't want to repent. We want to keep doing church stuff. To be able to do that may mean we have accepted a "different gospel" as Paul termed it in Gal. 1:6.

I maintain (in print) that there can be no repentance until there is an awareness of sin. Nor can there be any salvation without repentance. Anything else is merely synthetic. A synthetic message can only produce a synthetic faith and a synthetic faith turns baptism into a synthetic experience.

We have mostly been taught that turning from sin is the definition of repentance. With that defi-

nition in place we set out with the best of intentions to change our ways. We run out of steam in a short time and become disillusioned altogether.

Repentance is not a change from moral imperfection to moral perfection —— you and I are incapable of that. This is why John calls for people to produce fruit in keeping with repentance (Mt 3:8). The fruit of repentance is the result of it, not the repentance itself. Repentance, then, is not about the new and improved me, but about the new trust I have in Christ who laid down His life to set me free. He is now the center of my existence. Repentance is about turning my trust to GOD and away from myself. It's repent and believe, not repent and do better.



This is a week in which I need to say thanks to a lot of people. First, our recent sendoff for those headed to Whitehouse leaves me with a lot of hope for the future of God's kingdom. But we are also losing valuable servants here at West Erwin. Aaron Duvall was one of our education elders and I will miss greatly his wisdom and encouragement. David Asbill, Brody

Action and Excellence

I really appreciate the feedback and comments from the radio lessons as well as the sermons recently. Your comments have been very edifying and I want you to know that feedback is always welcomed.

I recently came across two quotes that I'd like to share with you. The first concerns arousing enthusiasm and the second deals with excellence.

"Apathy can be overcome by enthusiasm, and enthusiasm can be aroused by two things: first, an idea which takes the imagination by storm; and second, a definite, intelligible plan for carrying that idea into action." Arnold Toynbee (1889-1975).

GOD still works this way to relieve the stress we have in this life. Don't be afraid. Go to Him.



Mexico Mission Trip



Our society has become desensitized to the shame of illegitimate pregnancy. But considering the morally-rigid atmosphere of a small, first-century, Jewish village, you can imagine the gossip that haunted Mary and Joseph as she carried God in her womb. Why is it that God chose such a taboo way in which to enter the world? The birth of Jesus was announced by an angelic choir, but only to a rag-tag group of crass shepherds—roughly the same motley crew

that flip burgers at McDonald's at 2 a.m. In contrast, the birth of John the Baptist had been accompanied by much celebration in his village. So why is it that God chose to be born with more animal witnesses than human? The answer to these questions is that God prefers exaltation through humiliation. The rabbi who taught that the last would be first (Matt. 19:30) abandoned all glory to be humiliated as a man. In what would become the greatest irony in history, it was Jesus' greatest humiliation that ultimately led to his greatest exaltation. And to his followers, he left behind a legacy of humility. "When you do things, do not let selfishness or pride be your guide," Paul would later write. "Instead, be humble and give more honor to others than to yourselves" (Phil. 2:3).

I hope that you were able to be with us this past are hands while others are eyes or ears. Sunday as John Dale delivered his messages on evangelism. We appreciate John so much for his love for the Lord and for his dedication to encouraging everyone to experience the assurance of salvation. Thank you, John, for a great job.



The apostle John strikes me as one who, with advanced years, attained great clarity of thought. "Things are not as complicated as we think," he might have said in a sermon once. While theologians write thick volumes on the nature of the Divine, John put it in three words. "God is light," he wrote in 1 John 1:5, and the implications of that truth are monumental. As a God of light and truth, he hates it when his children walk in darkness and lies. That is why

dishonesty is so horrible: in our deceit, we fail to accurately reflect who God is. Someone dear to my heart lied some time ago to a mutual friend. I knew he knew better. In the aftermath, I thought about my own past struggles with telling the truth and was reminded, upon reflection and study, of Jesus' rather strong words on the subject. "You belong to your father, the devil, and you want to carry out your father's desire. He was a murderer from the beginning, not holding to the truth, for there is no truth in him. When he lies, he speaks his native language, for he is a liar and the father of lies" (John 8:44). Let us remember that honesty is the only policy, not just the best policy. Otherwise, we tread in the footsteps of the Evil One who leads all liars to a damned destination (Revelation 21:8).

Moments With Mike

John Dale And Evangelism, March 1

As I mentioned last week, John Dale will be here on March 1st and will be speaking three times that day. I'm really looking forward to being with John and hearing him present these special messages on evangelism.

I want you to make your plans to be with us for all three sessions. All of our adult classes will meet in the main auditorium for the Bible class. John's topic at that hour will be "Passion For Evangelism."

During the worship hour the sermon will be on the very important concept of "Friendship Evangelism." There are multiple methods of reaching those who need the gospel, but the best of these methods all involve true friendship and lasting relationships.

My dad often told the story of a man who entered a hospital with a strange illness. The doctors ran extensive tests, but in spite of all their efforts, the young man died. A second man was soon admitted with the same disease and died. Other reports from neighboring cities and countries poured in about the deaths related to this same disease. Soon, the plague was considered worldwide epidemic. Finally, the doctors decided to call in one respected physician to find a cure. He

was flown in, ran some tests, and produced a cure within a few days. As he left, he urged them to get the medicine out to as many people as possible as quickly as they could, or else the whole world would soon perish from the plague. However, the doctors spent weeks deciding the form of the medicine: pill or liquid? Color of packaging? Over-the-counter or by prescription? Finally, they agreed on the details and left the hospital conference room, only to find the entire hospital and city filled with lifeless bodies, all victims of the plague. They alone were alive and as they walked the streets, one question echoed in their minds: "Why did we wait so long?" Church, the world needs to hear the gospel cure for sin that our Savior left for us. If we are not careful, we can spend so much time discussing the details of evangelism that we neglect our duty to evangelize. When we realize that we waited too late, that same question might very well haunt our memory one day: "Why did we wait so long?"

"GOD, have mercy on me, a sinner."

Every Part Does Its Share

One of the passages I read on Sunday was from Ephesians 4:11-16. In that last verse Paul uses a phrase to describe one of the conditions upon which the body (church) can and will grow. He said, "according to the effective working by which every part does its share."

Have you ever stopped to consider what "your share" of something may be? Perhaps you go in with a few others to purchase a gift for an upcoming wedding. One person makes the purchase and then divides the cost with the others. "What's my share of the price?" I think everyone wants to be sure that they provide what is expected of them.

In describing the church in 1 Corinthians 12, Paul depicts the body in human terms. Some parts are hands and eyes. Others are ears and feet. Some parts are more visible and some are less. But each part is important.

By having all parts working together effectively, and as Paul says, "doing its share," we find that real growth can occur. Growth in this sense is not necessarily numerical growth, but growing in numbers will be a natural part of the spiritual growth that we all need to have.

This past Sunday morning, Jay Bynum spoke for the elders and informed the congregation of the initial plans to move forward with plans for the church in Whitehouse. He asked for our prayers and for our support in this process. I hope that you are already including the Whitehouse plans and all who are involved with it in your prayers. You may not be in the number to

go and to work in that effort, but your share in helping may well be in your prayers and encouragement offered on its behalf.

A study in 2006 (LifeWay Research) showed why many people no longer are involved with a church. Some respondents gave multiple reasons. Here are the top reasons given:

- ◆ 19% Simply got too busy to attend
- 17% Family/home responsibilities prevented church attendance
- 17% Moved too far away
- 17% Church members seemed hypocritical
- 17% Church members were judgmental of others
- 15% Cited work situation.
- 14% Church was not helping me to develop spiritually
- 14% Stopped believing in organized religion
- 12% Got divorced/separated
- 12% The church was run by a clique that discouraged involvement.

Of those who left church:


- ♦ 16% Said that no one contacted them after they
- ◆ 16% Said no one seemed to care that they left
- 14% Said the church was not helping them to develop spiritually.

That survey also stated that 80% of those who left church did not have a strong belief in God. This suggests that more should be done to teach those who come into the church. The Great Commission says to 1) make disciples, 2) baptize them, and 3) continue to teach them all that

I found the following point particularly interesting. Only 6% of those who stop attending will return to their former church. Others will consider the same kind of church, but a different location. Once a member becomes discouraged, detached and disenchanted, the task of bringing them back becomes even greater. Time is of the essence.

Once I read this line, I had assurance that this company would make good on their promise. I wrote down a list of the missing parts and later phoned their toll free number.

My call was answered promptly by a very pleasant customer service representative who took my information, apologized for the shortage and assured me that the items would be shipped out promptly. She did not attempt to pass the blame to the retailer nor to me as a customer. All she was focused on doing was making right what was wrong.

I have an idea that all of the necessary parts were in those boxes when they left that factory. They likely were lost

when the product was first sold and then returned. It wasn't the company's fault that the product wasn't all there. But that didn't matter. "If anything's wrong, WE'LL MAKE IT RIGHT!

Spiritually speaking, there may be many things that are wrong from time to time. But with God we can make it right!

God made us in His image, but we soon learn to sin and find ourselves dead in our sin. But God can make it right by making us alive again through His Son! (Col. 2:13)
