REEVES' RHETORIC

Weeds and Wheat

Jesus tells the story of a man who plants a field of wheat. But while everyone is sleeping an enemy comes along and plants weeds all throughout the wheat and then slips away in the night. As the first green shoots begin to appear the two look the same. But as the grain begins to form the workers soon realize the field is also inundated with weeds.

The farmer immediately recognizes what has occurred and that an enemy has planted the weeds right along side of his wheat. The farmhands are quick to ask if they should pull the weeds out from among the wheat but the owner knows what damage it would cause. "Let them both grow until the harvest. At that time I will tell the harvesters: 'First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles to be burned; then gather the wheat and bring it into my barn'" (Matthew 13:30).

And Jesus says, "This is the Kingdom." "The Kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed good seed in his field...."

He explains the One who sowed the good seed is the Son of Man, and those who belong to the Kingdom. And the one who sowed the bad seed is the evil one. "The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels" (Matthew 13:39).

But here's my question: Where do we fit in to all of this? If this is a portrait of the Kingdom – What's our role?

To be wheat!

Do we uproot? Do we tear down? No! How much damage would that cause? How much damage has it already caused? No, our calling is to be wheat, in a field that is full of both weeds and wheat. To be wheat, and to show the field what wheat looks like.

And the amazing thing about the message of Christ is that the Gospel provides the way that a weed can become wheat. A complete metamorphosis. A change of state. A change of being.

In reality (if I'm not taking this parable too far) when it comes to being a part of the Kingdom of God, the Gospel should confront us of our own weediness (it's not a real word but I like it!). The Gospel by design compels us to reckon our own weedy nature. Without the Good News of Jesus it is impossible to become or to be wheat.

The Gospel is designed in such a way that the message itself should and must compel us, and convict us, and radically alter our worldview so much so that we seek to live like the wheat we are called to be, in a world that so desperately needs to see what wheat looks like. The message of Jesus allows for the opportunity for weeds to become wheat!



Thinking Beyond Me

If you have gotten anything at all out of following our Lord, if His love has made any difference in your life, if being in a community of the Spirit means anything to you, if you have a heart, if you care at all – then please, do something for me: Be united with one other, love each other, be one in spirit and purpose. Don't push your way to the front; don't con your way to the top. Get over yourself, put yourself aside, and help others get to know Jesus. Don't be obsessed with getting your way. Forget yourselves and see to it that others see Jesus alive and at work within you. – loose paraphrase of Philippians 2:1-4

As our children grow we give them instruction and advice and guidance. We discipline them, but for the greater purpose that they will themselves become self-disciplined people. They make mistakes, we help them through. They make good choices, we praise them for it. All the while with the objective that they would become mature adults.

Certainly we never cease to be mom and dad to them. I joke and say that my goal in parenting is to work myselt out of a job! But Tiersa doesn't like it when I say it at all, so forget I said that.... We'll never cease to be our children's parents. But the goal is that they would think for themselves. That they would develop a healthy, mature perspective of life. To not be obsessed with getting our way, but rather, to forget ourselves and see to it that others recognize Jesus in us.



REFVES' RHETORIC

Gnats, Camels, and Following Jesus

"These people honor me with their lips but their hearts are far from me. They worship me in vain; their teachings are but rules taught by men." – Matthew 15:8-9 (Jesus quoting from Isaiah 29:13)

"Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You give a tenth of your spices – mint, dill, and cumin. But you have neglected the more important matters of the law - justice, mercy, and faithfulness. You should have practiced the latter, without neglecting the former. You blind guides! You strain out a gnat but swallow a camel." - Matthew 23:23-24 (Jesus telling the Pharisees what's up!)

There is a point where religion gives way to faith. In order for this to occur there must come a point in time where God becomes real. To us. Where His kingdom begins to break in all around us. It is a pivotal moment. A crucial moment.

Maybe it comes about in a moment of victory. Maybe it's in a moment of defeat. Maybe it comes about through the words of God in Scripture. Maybe through the words of a friend. Certainly the Spirit is involved, softening our hearts. Whatever it is that brings it about, we must come to a point in our lives and in our faith when a decision is made. God is either God, or He is not. Jesus is either Lord, or He is not. The life-saving work of Christ is either everything to us, or it is nothing to us. Relationship with God is either a get out of jail free card at the end of this physical life, or it is the transformative covenant that it is intended to be here and

Somehow, too often, discipleship is divorced from faith. As if that's possible. As if that's biblical. As if that's acceptable! The call is to follow Jesus (faith). Not simply a system of belief (religion). And too often we find ourselves straining out the gnat but swallowing the camel.

What is discipleship? Taking up our cross daily and following Jesus (Luke 9:23). Where does religion end and faith begin? Only, only, when we follow Him.

If we understand anything from the cross, anything from the resurrection, anything from the design of the Gospel, it is that half-hearted Christianity is a hollow shell of existence, and nothing compared to the overwhelming greatness that comes from living a life defined by Jesus.

Only when we willingly, intentionally give our whole selves over to Him will we begin to live into the fullness of the Kingdom. And only when we are defined by Christ, will we begin see life with the clarity that only He


Pick Up Your Church Directory



REEVES' RHETORIC

One in Jesus

During the Civil Rights Movement, Martin Luther King Jr. would speak of moving "from the who to the what." Both after the murders of Freedom Riders: James Chaney, Andrew Goodman, and Michael Schwerner in Mississippi and then after the beating death of Princeton Seminary student James Reeb in Alabama, King declared "it's not so much who killed them but what killed them." And "when we move from the who to the what, in a very real way we begin to see that we are all in this together."

Of course the "what" was the underlying motive of hate and bigotry and disunity that permeated so much of the world-view of the day. A world-view which in many ways has yet to be overcome. In regard to unity among races and cultures as a whole we still have a very long way to go.

In the church we are called to unity in Christ. To be one in Jesus. We who are many and yet comprise one body through the Gospel are called to oneness. The Apostle Paul implores, "Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit – just as you were called to one hope when you were called - one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father who is over all and through all and in all" (Ephesians 4:3-6). Only God can bring this about. We are different in many, many ways. The call however is to unity, not uniformity. To "move from the who to the what." That we would be united in spite of ourselves. In spite of our differences. In many ways we indeed have a long way to go. However we serve a God whose mercies are new every morning. A God who has revealed Himself as faithful throughout the history of mankind. And a God and who is at work in a wonderful way in the life of His people today.

We begin with the Gospel and we begin with grace. For when we begin to see ourselves in our need for God and in our need for His mercy, the playing field begins to be made level, and all pride is taken away. Only then will God begin to bring about unity.

Jesus on the night before the cross prays for Himself, His disciples, and then for us: "I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one: I in them and you in me. May they be brought to complete unity to let the world know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me" (John 17:20b-23).

How is it that the world will believe and know the truth of God made manifest in Christ? Only when they see unity and oneness in His people....

REEVES' RHETORIC

Nothing Less

Our Wednesday evening class has been studying 1st John for the last couple of months. Although I certainly didn't want to restrict us, I at first had in mind that we'd just spend one quarter with the text. However as the "disciple that Jesus loved" has taught us during our time together, some things are better savored rather than rushed (The same could be said about good coffee...).

I love preaching. Don't get me wrong. But one of the things that I love, love, love about facilitating a class like our Wednesday night group is that so often I'm the one who is taught. I can study and prepare and plan for weeks and then by asking a single, solitary question as the class begins, the interaction and response and spirit of those who are present begins to teach and strengthen me. Those of you who are a part of our class know exactly what I'm talking about it. It's a special group. And one that I'm very glad to be a part of. The Spirit is so very present when we discuss and share as people, the things of God. Our task is to remain open and willing and submissive to Him at work within us.

One of the places our conversations have taken us over the course of our time together has been the perspective of John as he writes the letter. He writes from his experience. He writes out of his belief and certainty of who Jesus was and who Jesus is. "That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched—this we proclaim concerning the Word of Life. The life appeared; we have seen it and testify to it, and we proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and has appeared to us. We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son, Jesus Christ. We write this to make our joy complete" (1 John 1:1-4).

John is writing as an older man. One who has lived a life of faithfulness to the Savior who called him as a young man from his father's nets. He's lived a life transformed by the Messiah in every way. He writes some fifty years beyond the cross and resurrection of Jesus. And now at the close of a valiant life he shares with those he desires to pass on the faith that has carried him through all these years. John's message is simple and yet profound: Live for Christ. Live out of relationship with Christ. Live changed by Christ. For there is no other life worth living.

Whether you've been a Christian for decades or only for a short amount of time, maturity in Christ is revealed in our answering of the calling that we've received in the Gospel message. REEVES' RHETORIC

Never Lost on Us

"Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer yourselves as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God - this is your spiritual act of worship. Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but rather be transformed by the renewing of your mind" (Romans 12:1-2a).

Romans 12 is one of those "go to" places for me. There are others, but these wonderful words from the Apostle speak

This passage serves as a mantra of sorts for us as believers. That we would live our lives for Christ. That we would be those who are "living sacrifices." Those who die to self so that we might live for Him. We are called to holy living. To a way of life that is "pleasing to God." In fact, Paul says that our lives are worship. Worship is not confined to those moments where we gather together as a community of faith and worship our Father together, but rather, the totality of our life and being is worship. We're not to "conform to the pattern of this world," we're to be "transformed," changed into that which is wholly and holy different, by the "renewing of our minds."

What we must not over look is where this holy way of life comes from. "In view of God's mercy." You see our holy living is that which grows out of the mercy that we have each been shown (and are continually shown) through the Gospel of Jesus.

We waver in our faith. Oh not necessarily in our belief in God as God or Christ as our Salvation. But we falter in our faithfulness. I wonder at times if it isn't because of a failure to constantly, consciously consider God's mercy. There must be gratitude in order for there to be faith. Abiding faith at least. Trusting in the One who has revealed His wonder to us in the message of Christ.

Tiersa and I were at Faulkner Park the other day with the boys. Kacey had softball practice at the fields right around the corner from the playground, so while Kacey was doing her thing, Tiersa and I sat on a bench and the boys spent some of their energy. There was a young father there with his two girls. One was around 18 months and the other was about three years old. In the middle of the playground at Faulkner Park there is this huge, synthetic rock that is designed for climbing. It's made for kids to climb on. It's only about five feet high, but to that three year old little girl it looked like Mt. Everest. Slowly, carefully she made her way to the top. But once up there, she vapor-locked. Her dad wanted her to jump to him. He assured her it was safe. But she could barely bring herself to stand and was way too terrified to jump. He assured her it was going to be alright. He promised her he'd catch her. And finally, after some more coaching, she didn't exactly jump, but she sort of leaned forward enough from the edge that she fell into his arms. It was a neat moment. But that was only the beginning. After that, she was good to go! There was no more fear. She'd get to the top of the rock and leap to her father. After a couple of times her confidence was such that she was jumping as high as she could, giggling the entire time. Why? She trusted her father to catch her.

The call of the Gospel is to jump to our Father and to trust Him to catch us. As we journey through life and as we mature as believers we learn to trust Him more and more. Caution-thrown-to-the-wind faith is what our Father is looking for.

May the wonder of the Gospel and the mercy we have been shown never be lost on us....

What a fantastic day we had together on Friendship Day! I am so very grateful for every one of you who invested in our time together as a church family. You invited friends and family, acquaintances and loved ones, those that you know very well and even those that you don't (but who came to participate in our day together anyway).

God is at work in our fellowship. He is active in our faith. He is present in our worship. And He is revealed in all of the facets of church life that we experience together – every day! – and He was revealed in a wonderful way in the things that we were about last Sunday. I am humbled and thankful to be a part of such genuine fellowship and honest community.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer writes that "the church only exists when she exists in community."

As Christ's church we are created to exist in community with one another.

Our communion with God is predicated in His divine nature.

To accept the Trinitarian nature of God is founded upon the basis of faith. God the Father, God the Son, and God the Spirit exist in community. They are three and yet one. As well, we are created in the image of God. We are spiritual. We are created with a spirit within. We have a spiritual nature. We are spiritual beings. And a central facet to our being created in the image of God is that we are created to exist in community.

We are wired in such a way, by God, that we possess an innate need for communion. Not Communion with a big "C," but communion (although the communal aspect of Communion is too often lost in our theology and practice). We are communal beings. Just as God the Father, Son, and Spirit exist in holy community (communion), so too we are intrinsically designed, spiritually, that we are only whole and complete when we go about living life founded within active communion. Communion with God. And communion with one another.

When we engage in this sort of life we come closer to living into the prayer that our Savior prayed the night before the cross: "I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me" (John 17:20-21).



REEVES' RHETORIC

Our Concept of God

Don't we find ourselves at times spiritually plateaued in our journeys of faith? And maybe not even plateaued, but rather, more like spiritually bankrupt? What do we do when we begin to feel this way? Maybe it's found in the ebb and flow of faith. Maybe it only characterizes a small portion of time. Or maybe it is descript of decades. Years of complacency. No zeal. No excitement. No anticipation. No experience of God. What then? What next?

In his book Attributes of God, AW Tozer writes, "A local church will only be as great as its concept of God. An individual Christian will be a success or failure (in the Kingdom) depending upon what he or she thinks of God. It is critically important that we not only have a knowledge of the Holy One, but that we truly come to know Him in all His majesty and wonder."

Maybe what we "think of God," as Tozer puts it, is directly related to our being spiritually plateaued or bankrupt.

Do we think enough of God? How much thought do we honestly give Him during the course of the day? How often do you engage in silent conversation with Him if even for a brief moment? How often do you pray? I mean really, really pray? Not as an aside. But heart and mind, engaged in prayer with our Father. How much time do you set aside in reading Scripture and being fed by God's Word? How often do you read what others have written to broaden your concept of God? How many conversations do you have throughout the week with others who are seeking to be faithful to our Father as well? Do you seek out Christian insight from others who have faith? Because what we "think of God" is answered in questions such as these.

The Apostle Paul writes: "I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know Him better." – Ephesians 1:17

The question is: Do we really want to know Him better?

Somehow spiritual discipline has too often been divorced from faith. Faith is too often seen as mental ascent rather than a life characterized by discipleship. No wonder we find ourselves so often spiritually anemic.

Discipleship. Living cognizant of the presence of God. Spiritual discipline. A life characterized by faith and faithfulness. When our practice reflects our concept of God – it is then and only then that we will begin to know Him better.

Glory to God!

Parables

The parable of the sower is one of His best known parables. Matthew, Mark, and Luke all recorded it. When His disciples asked why He spoke in parables He told them so that those who wanted to know the truth could understand, while those who did not would not understand. Matthew makes a point to say, Jesus speaking in parables was a fulfilling of prophecy in (Mt 13:35).

A sower of seed was common place in the days of Jesus. The four types of soil were well-known. So the meaning is straight forward. The sower is anyone who teaches the Word to others. The soils are the receivers of the Word.

Living in this parable tells us today that we are not soil inspectors. How can we possibly know the heart of another, whether it is rocky or thorny? We pray that the seed falls on good soil and we keep sowing remembering GOD produces the crop. Our role is to never tire of sowing.

Closely associated with this parable is Mark 4:26-29 ----- next week.

Following Together

I am blessed to be a part of a mentoring group that meets in Waco once a month. The discussion and direction is guided by Jim Martin who preaches at the Crestview Church. Jim is a genuine, humble, passionate disciple of Jesus. Qualities which when combined are a true rarity in this world and are precisely why our Father ministers so very wonderfully through Jim and his wife Charlotte's life together. Our group is comprised solely of ministers. Specifically preaching ministers. We pray. We study. We discuss. We dialogue. We decompress. We challenge. We pray some more. It's an amazing group to be a part of. Everyone brings their own skill set to the group. We each leave renewed and "filled to the measure of all the fullness of God" (Ephesians 3:19).

As believers discipleship is what we are about. Correct? We're called to be disciples. We're called to facilitate discipleship in one another. It's the nature of our calling in the Gospel message. We look to Jesus as He calls the Twelve. And yet, what we too often miss is that He calls them together. As Jesus calls the Twelve to follow Him, He calls them to follow together. He does not call them one at a time, each spending time with Him and then sent on their way to go and imitate Him in the world. Rather, He calls them all to come and follow Him together. Together. At the same time. I believe this is significant....

We need the relationships that only being a part of the body of Christ provides. We need these Christcentered relationships in order that we might live into (and up to) our potential as believers. If we are to be the men and women of faith our calling in Christ demands we must invest in a way of life that makes us more like Him. A rhythm of life that is conducive to cross-shaping, heart-softening, and disciple-forging.

Certainly we bless and encourage and strengthen one another through our time together on Sunday or Wednesday (or any other time we come together). Certainly our Father is the One who creates a wholeness within us that we attain nowhere else in this life. And yet, following Him, not simply on our own, but together, is a crucial facet of faith.

It takes effort. It takes an openness that we are often uncomfortable with. It takes intentionality, because believe me it doesn't just happen. It takes God. And it takes relationships that only He provides. Relationships that are God-sent and God-designed.

Whether it's driving over two hours to Waco or down the street at Panera Bread for coffee with a friend or in an office on Tuesday morning with faithful brothers in Christ or around your own dining room table in the evening with your wife and kids. We need these relationships where we mentor one another. Where we become a part of one another. Where we aspire to the oneness that Christ prayed for on the night before the cross and the conviction that His cross demands. Without them, we are less than who God intends for us to be.



Parables

Mark 4:26-29 is called the Parable of the Growing Seed. Notice how closely these words are to the Parable of the Sower earlier in this chapter.

Most of us are impatient to a fault; impatient with the way GOD brings about growth. This parable addresses this issue.

Only Mark records this parable and where he places it makes us think that the Parable of the Sower and the Mustard Seed were part of the same occasion.

The purpose of the parable is to show how the

kingdom of GOD grows. He said, "All by itself the soil produces grain...." First, until you understand who GOD is it may seem as though it happens "all by itself." But there is order: "first the stalk, then the head, then the full kernel in the head" (:28). In other words, the seed did what it was designed to do --- GROW!

Sometimes in our impatience we try to hurry the process...... we baptize folks before we teach them. We persuade them to get in the water without persuading them to love Christ as He has loved them.

I'm reminded of Paul's words in (1 Cor 3): "I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but GOD made it grow." The kingdom of GOD will grow because GOD has designed it and willed it to grow.

REEVES' RHFTORIC

Being Church

Suppose an individual or family moves to a new town and begins to look for a new church home. One of the questions they may ask themselves is: "What are we looking for in a church?" It's a valid question. And one that is answered in the way in which we serve and minister and worship and experience life together as a family of God.

But what about those who are unchurched? What questions are those who have little or no experience with Christ asking? What are they looking for in His people? What are they looking for in the lives of those who profess faith?

They are searching for something that no other pursuit in this life offers: Jesus. And they're so desperately needing to see Him (whether they realize it or not) in you. And in me.

Our friend the Apostle Paul writes in Galatians, "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me. I do not set aside the grace of God, for if righteousness could be gained through adherence to the law, Christ died for nothing!" (Galatians 2:20-21).

Later on in the Galatian letter he declares, "May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world" (Galatians 6:14).

What I understand him communicating to us is the one thing that sets Christians apart. The crucified life. Not merely a voice that acknowledges, "Jesus is Lord," but a life that declares, "Jesus is Lord."

Where else are they going to see it, unless they see it in us? Unless they see it in a people who seek to deny ourselves with a bigger picture in mind. Who intentionally, daily take up our cross and follow Jesus. Unless they see it in a church that's through with "doing church" and is committed to "being church."

REEVES' RHETORIC

Two Questions

Holiness. Not the easiest concept for us to grasp. Oh I think we have an idea of holiness when it comes to God. But I wonder if we see it and believe it in ourselves?

So often we struggle with self. We struggle with self-doubt. And we struggle with self-righteousness. The question should never be: How do I see myself? The question should always be: How does God see me? And, how do I see God? This places us and God where we need to be.

Isaiah steps into the Temple and he's not expecting much. But when he opens his eyes to the wonder and power and holiness of God, it's then that Isaiah the priest becomes Isaiah the prophet (Isaiah 6).

God is holy. He is pure. He is righteous. He is worthy. We understand His holiness no more clearly than when we are confronted by His magnificence and our own inadequacy.

But in this we find the beginning of our dilemma. Because no one knows us better than us. No one knows our inability to measure up to God better than we do. The Gospel calls us not only to salvation, but to see ourselves through the eyes of God. As those who have been made holy through the holy sacrifice of Christ. Holy not because of us, but because of Him. Holy not because of us, but in spite of us.

"Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behavior. But now He has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in His sight, without blemish and free from accusation" (Colossians 1:21-22).

Holy in His sight? Without blemish? Free from accusation? Yes! How? Through Jesus. God sees us as holy because He sees us through the lens of Jesus. And this is what we call "Good News"

We're tempted to not believe it. Maybe we understand it intellectually, but we struggle with allowing it to take hold of our hearts. Because doing so compels us to relinquish control. And to allow God to be God.

When King David prays to God, "Wash me, and I will be whiter than snow" (Psalm 51:7b), literally in the Hebrew his prayer is: "Un-sin me...." "Cleanse me. God, take away my sin. Make me whiter than snow. Remove all my sin stain. Remove my guilt. Make me pure. Righteous. Holy. Accomplish that which I cannot accomplish on my own. Make me more like you." And the amazing thing is, through hearts that turn to Him, He does just that.

To see ourselves as God sees us grants significant insight into faith. It empowers us to live more into (and out of) the lives that He has created for us to live in Christ Jesus.

Two questions remain: Will we allow Him to make us holy? And, do we believe that He can?

The Secret to Happiness

What would it take for you to be happy? I mean life-is-good, smile-on-your-face happy. What would it take? Most often our response comes out of wherever we are for the moment. Whatever our aspirations are. Our goals. Whatever we're struggling with. Whatever we're worried about. Whatever dark cloud looms overhead.

For some it's money. There's a pawn shop in Garland, Tx that has a sign that reads, "Money doesn't buy happiness, but it sure pays the bills." For others it's status or accomplishment or house or possession. And I don't want to diminish the things that often concern us. Maybe it's the house that sits on a hill that you're striving for. Or maybe, it's simply the house you're living in that's falling apart that you'd repair if you could afford it. Maybe you have a dream car in mind. Or maybe you'd just like to not have to pray that the car you have will start every morning. For many the answer is relational. And this is the most difficult one of all. The perfect marriage. The perfect relationship. How many marriages have fallen apart because one or both have come to the conclusion: "I'm just not happy any more." How many relationships are on the verge right now of breaking up because of the sadness and apathy of one or both in the marriage?

How many times have you said: "When I finally get this job, then I'll be happy." "When I finally finish this degree, then I'll be happy." When I pay off this loan, then I'll be happy." "When I.... If I...."

Have you found that contentment is illusive? What does it mean to be content anyway?

We seek happiness, and I know that some would argue that happiness and contentment are two different realizations, but I can't help but think that if we could come to the point in life that we were content, we'd then be happy.

Perhaps no Psalm is more loved and more quoted than Psalm 23. It brings comfort and solace because it draws us into the arms of a Father who is so very welcoming and so very sufficient. In verse 5 David pens, "...my cup overflows." In Scripture one's "cup" is one's lot in life. There is abundance in his life attributed only to God. It's not a situational concept. It's an internal one. An emotional one. A state-of-being. The blessings of living near the Father. A Father who lavishes His love upon us. His grace upon us. His goodness. His strength. He saves us, and then, renews us. What a description of abundance and belonging. "My cup overflows." "It is overfilled." "Filled to overflowing." Because I belong to God!

The Apostle Paul writes, "I have learned the secret of being content..." (Philippians 4:12).

The secret? Jesus!





REEVES' RHETORIC

A Balanced Life

An educated and world-renown psychiatrist walks out of a mental hospital to find that someone has stolen one of the wheels from his car. He has a spare tire but the problem is the thief has stolen its four lug nuts as well. The psychiatrist is beside himself. "How can I put the spare tire on without any lug nuts?" he asks out loud in a moment of frustration. A patient from inside the hospital fence calmly replies, "Why don't you take one lug nut from each of the other three wheels?"

Sometimes the answers to our questions are obvious. Objectively we examine our quandaries and the answers come to us readily. At other times, not so much. We're at a loss. Maybe it's a situation that we've recently been confronted with. Maybe it's something that we've been on the fence about for years. Often when there are emotions and feelings and lives and relationships involved the lines of right and wrong, what's best and what's not, end up very blurred. And too often, we lose our objectivity in the moment.

What does it mean to live a balanced life? Specifically, emotionally and spiritually balanced. Is it possible to be spiritually balanced without being emotionally balanced as well? Peter Scazzero in his book, The Emotionally Healthy Church says "No."

The balanced life reflects the conscious, concerted discipleship of the follower of Christ. In this we see the direct connection of the relationship that our God grants to humanity through the cross of Christ. Relationship with God. Not ritual with God. And the overwhelming reality of daily living in sync, in step, with Him. The lie we're tempted to believe is that somehow we can be effective (or as effective) in our ministry to others, especially to those with whom we are closest, without being both emotionally and spiritually balanced.

How many good days have been completely derailed by failing to keep your emotions under control? How many relationships have been destroyed because of selfishness and pride and arrogance? How many potential opportunities for spiritual growth and the furthering of the Kingdom have been squandered because of the inability and refusal of Christians to respond with kindness and grace and love. Our emotional health works in tandem with our spiritual nature. It is the design of God that His Son and His Spirit bring calm and peace where there was once angst and hostility.

Can we like the Apostle Paul say: "We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ" (2 Corinthians 10:5)? Do we possess "the peace that passes (that transcends) all understanding" (Philippians 4:7)? Maybe that's a place to begin....

A balanced life is only created when we walk in sync and in step with our God. And only when we are both emotionally and spiritually balanced. It doesn't just happen. It takes a conscious, concerted effort. And it takes God leading the way.

REFVES' RHETORIC

A Rhythm of Life

"Busy" describes the lives of most. "Hectic" or "pressured" probably does a better job of describing the lives of many. We over-commit, over-book, and over-obligate. We put demands on ourselves and demands on our children that very often do more harm than good. I say "we" because I have been just as guilty, if not more, than you. I look to my peer group, to those who have children at home, and I see us overextending ourselves in too many areas of life. Spending exorbitant amounts of time and energy in arenas that grant us little in return. Placing emphasis in areas of life that in the grand scheme of things possess little significance. Running full speed in a rapidly spinning hamster wheel and getting absolutely nowhere.

What is needed is a reprioritization of what's important. To sift through the things that comprise our lives and determine what's important and what's not. To determine what we're investing our lives into that's really worthwhile and what it is that needs to be scaled back. Or completely cut out.

We spend so much effort seeking to provide for a lifestyle that we've created, so much so that we spend little time investing in the family we've created the lifestyle for. How does that make

I have to believe that Jesus' life was one of complexity and simplicity. It was balanced. In every way it was balanced. Does "balanced" describe your life too? If not, perhaps some reprioritization is in order.

Jesus spent intentional time with God. He set aside God designated time. Mark 1:35, "Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where He prayed." When is the last time that you did that? Is it a part of your normal rhythm of life? When is the last time you removed yourself from the static of the world and just spent some time in communion with God? Seeking counsel from God. Refocusing upon those things in life which truly matter.

Spending time in prayer and in communion and in silence before God, and committing ourselves to a rhythm of life that intentionally facilitates balance and simplicity in a life filled with complexity, is such a Christ-like way to live.



REEVES' RHETORIC

Longing to See

Each and every one of us brings our own experiences to the table. Our experiences, whether good or bad, influence greatly how we view the world in which we live.

For so many of us even the term "Christian" is one of such blessing and comfort. To be a Christian is to be a follower of Christ. It succinctly defines not solely our reality as those who have answered the call of Christ, but also depicts our way of life as "followers of the Way." There is such authenticity and genuineness found in the simplicity of being Christ followers when we truly see ourselves for who we are called to be in Jesus. When we truly see every moment of life as God designed and God lived.

The reality, however, is that many have had not had such experiences. To them the term "Christian" elicits adverse emotions. However, not only does the Gospel message call us to fidelity to our Savior, but an unbelieving, skeptical world longs to see it. They long to see faithfulness. Authentic faith. Genuine faith. And they long to see it in us. Even if they don't realize it. It's Jesus they're longing to see.

"Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made Himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to death – even death on a cross." – Philippians 2:5-8

When they see the reality of Jesus lived out in the reality of our lives, it is then that they will be drawn to follow the Way of Jesus.

And isn't it this very reality of our Savior that first called us to follow Him ourselves?

REEVES' RHETORIC

Who Do You Say That I Am?

"Once when Jesus was praying in private and His disciples were with Him, He asked them, 'Who do the crowds say I am?' They replied, 'Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, that one of the prophets of long ago has come back to life.' 'But what about you?' He asked, 'Who do you say I am?' Peter answered, 'The Christ of God.' Jesus strictly warned them not to tell this to anyone. And He said, 'The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law, and He must be killed and on the third day be raised to life.' Then He said to them all: 'If anyone would come after me, they must deny themself and take up their cross daily and follow me." (Luke 9:18-23)

This is one of my favorite passages. For so many reasons.... When Jesus asks the disciples who the crowds understand Him to be, to be honest, I don't think He's really concerned with their answers. Certainly He knows what their responses will be, the generalizations of the masses. The presuppositions of those who have heard of His ministry. And so the disciples respond with the understanding of others. "John the Baptist?" "Elijah?" "Maybe a prophet from long ago who's come back to life?" Jesus wanted them to say it. He wanted them to mentally process it. He wanted them to verbalize it. But then He asks the question to which He truly wants an answer. "What about you? Who do you say that I am?" Of course it's Peter who responds with the belief of those who are closest to Him: "You are the Christ of God." "You are the Messiah." "You are God. in humanity, who's come to redeem the world!"

You see what Jesus truly wants an answer to is personal. "What about you? Who do you say that I am?" I think we're tempted to think that this is a verbal acknowledgement. And although included, I think it's much deeper than that. Who we believe Jesus to be is profoundly revealed in our fidelity to Him. In our commitment to the cause of our Savior. In our beliefs. In our faith. In our priorities: How do I spend my time, my energy, my money, my life? Am I faithful in every way? To my Lord? To my spouse? To my family? Am I kind to my children? Do I cultivate faith in them? Am I a trustworthy friend? When others look to me are they convinced that I believe Jesus to be the "Christ of God"?

It is for this reason that Jesus calls for His disciples then and now to deny ourselves. To die to ourselves and take up our crosses of sacrifice daily. Then and only then will we be capable of fully following Him. Fully following.

To be a disciple of Jesus is to fully belong to Him and to be fully committed to Him. Half-hearted Christianity is not Christianity. Is it possible to be a Christian, but not a disciple? Who do you say Jesus is? Does your life confess what your lips acknowledge?

REEVES' RHETORIC.

Searching For Who We Are

We place a lot of emphasis on appearances as a culture and society. It many ways, regardless of era, this has always been the case. Some of it stems from our own narcissism. Some of it from our own feelings of inadequacy. Perhaps it can be attributed to the influence of evil in the world. But in large degree it comes from a desire to be accepted. To be loved. And to be thought well of

If we are not careful we can easily get caught up in the web of people pleasing. Saying and doing things primarily for the purpose of pleasing other people. Why? So that we ourselves can be affirmed. Validated. Looking a certain way. Dressing a certain way. Wearing the right clothes. Weighing the right weight. Being associated with the right people. Driving the right car. Living in the right neighborhood. We're only fooling ourselves if we think that this sort of thing ends after high school. How many are so very caught up in pleasing others that they lose their sense of self? None of us are immune to the pressures. But what we do with them is what's important.

Some are masters of disguise and at keeping up appearances. Somehow life behind closed doors can be accepted as a shambles, as long as no one on the outside knows. As long as it appears to others that we have it all together, somehow we can con ourselves into believing that our created fantasy is our reality, even though our true reality is nothing like it should be. When you really think about it, what kind of sense does that make? That those who are closest to me, those to whom I am most responsible, the family that I have a God-ordained connection to - can be falling apart and disintegrating, but, as long as those who I do not know well, those I am not responsible to, those who in many ways are relative strangers - somehow what they think of me is more important than those who are closest?

And in the process of it all, not only do we lose those with whom we are closest, we lose ourselves. A lostness of identity. A lostness of our sense of self. When this is the case, how can we possibly think that we are emotionally or spiritually healthy people?

Satan preys upon our sense of inadequacy. Upon our desire to be accepted. To be loved. To be thought well of. When we begin to seek these affirmations outside of Christ, Satan is there waiting to trap us. To trap us in the web of people pleasing. Ultimately, his goal is to trap us into finding our worth and value outside of Christ.

In the familiar passage of Romans 12 the Apostle calls for our "offering ourselves as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God." Most often our emphasis is upon the call to discipleship and fidelity in our journey of faith. But there is a profound and innate need that is met when living a life of faithfulness before the Father. We are pleasing to Him. Pleasing to God. People pleasing only leads to frustration and a false sense of self. Seeing ourselves through the eyes of God and seeking to please Him in every aspect of life is the only true way to have peace and confidence within. Only in Him do we find our sense of self and sense of value. Everything else pales in comparison and leaves us searching for who we are.

The Whole Bible By Heart

15th century monastic, Thomas A Kempis, writes in his masterpiece The Imitation of Christ, "Indeed it is not learning that makes a person holy and just, but a virtuous life that makes one pleasing to God. I would rather feel contrition than to know how to define it. For what would it profit us to know the whole Bible by heart and then live without the grace and love of God? Vanities of vanities and all is vanity, except to love God and serve Him alone."

We are linear thinkers. A+B=C. We like reason. We like logic. Much of New Testament theology develops out of a hermeneutic, an interpretation, derived from reason. But the goal of Scripture is not mere knowledge or reason, rather, the goal is assimilation.

Jesus asks, "What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, and yet lose or forfeit their very self?" (Luke 9:25). Derived out of the call to take up our cross and follow Him, the Messiah asks, "What good is anything that we can possibly gain if in the process we lose our very selves? What good is anything we could accomplish, if we fail as disciples?

We are called to have a high view of God and His Word and a humble view of ourselves. However, if our understanding remains intellectual exercise and mental assent (that which is cognitive), rather than that which is relational and covenantal, we've missed the calling of Jesus.

Too often we approach the Kingdom like a math equation. Like a test we're trying to get an A on (or at least a passing grade), rather than the only way of life that is truly worth living.

Somehow I'm afraid we're tempted to believe that "right thinking" equals "right relationship." That somehow if my theology is "right" (as if any of us have the market cornered on God or have mastery of His Word) my relationship with Him is as it should be.

In 1 Corinthians 13 the Apostle Paul gives us such insight when sharing, "When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man I put childish ways behind me. Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known" (vv11-12). Paul, in one sense, compels us to recognize that we are nearsighted this side of eternity. However he sternly refuses to allow us to shy away from the call to conviction the Gospel demands. Both are crucial.

Reflecting, imitating Christ, is our call.

What good is knowing about Jesus, but never knowing Jesus? What good is knowing all about His love and grace, but never truly experiencing them? What good is having an understanding of the Kingdom, but never fully living within it?

Glory to God!

REEVES RHETORIC

The Message of the Cross

"For the message of the Cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." – 1 Corinthians 1:18

These words of the Apostle Paul encourage we who have faith. They affirm to us that no matter what others think or say or believe, no matter the lack of conviction or lack of faith of others, the reconciling message of the Cross of Christ is powerful to us, even if it isn't to them.

But most often in our conversations and in our emphasis, we place a little too much distance between verse 18 and verse 17.

"For Christ did not send me to baptize, but to preach the Gospel – not with words of wisdom, lest the Cross be emptied of its power." - 1 Corinthians 1:17

Now don't think for a moment that the Apostle Paul is downplaying the role of baptism in one's response to the Gospel. Rather, I believe what the Apostle is emphatically seeking to convey is the overwhelming centrality of the message of Christ and the total reliance upon the power of God – that completely rests within the content of the message itself.

Paul strips away anything that we ourselves could add to the message by assuring that it is not with anything that we bring to the table that makes the message more influential. Not by any oratory prowess or skill, or by any honed, tactical argumentation – but rather the power lies within the message. "...not with words of wisdom, lest the Cross be emptied of its power." It is the shock of the story of the Cross. And the shock of the story of the God of the Cross that motivates and prompts response.

The Gospel has always been scandalous, because it is a message of grace. Grace is scandalous because it releases control. It relinquishes control to the only One who truly possesses it. The scandal of the Cross is that it is God Himself who "is both just and the One who justifies" (Romans 3:26).

Christ brings the Kingdom (Reign) and the Cross (Sacrifice) together, which no one can fathom. Therein lies the power of its message.

Glory to God!

Evidence of Our Commitment

As in any relationship, what is within must be expressed in order for it to be truly valid. Too often in many personal relationships the goodness that is within is scarcely expressed. At least it isn't conveyed well enough. What I mean is this... sometimes a husband and father may in his heart love his family. He truly believes he loves them. And in his heart of hearts, he does. But somehow that love stays inside. He may within himself feel that he loves his family. And the family may witness glimpses of that love. But primarily what they experience is a dad who is tired all the time, complains a lot, never seems satisfied, and for the most part wants little to do with the interworking of the home and gives a sense that he just wants to be left alone.

As the old saying goes, "Actions speak louder than words."

The same can be said of faith. The evidence of our commitment to the Kingdom is revealed not by what is within, but rather by what is expressed through intentional action in our lives.

In Galatians 5:22 the Apostle Paul writes, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control."

Paul says to us, "This is what it looks like when the Spirit of God resides within you. Love is revealed. Joy is made evident. Peace sooths from within. Patience is a constant. Kindness is our natural response. Goodness is pursued. Faithfulness is what we are about. Gentleness is the norm. Selfcontrol is a given." And if we think things through, as God orchestrates the design of Scripture, it is the Spirit Himself, guiding Paul's pen, saying to us, "This is what it looks like when I live within you."

Second Century Apologist, Irenaeus, writes: "The glory of God is man fully glive." I cannot help but think our being "fully alive" is conditioned by our relationship with God through Christ, an acute awareness of God, and by our commitment to the Kingdom.

Glory to God!



Effective Communication

The way information is processed and is passed on evolves over time. From word of mouth and letters carried by the Pony Express to the latest multi-media blurb found on the internet, the way information is effectively shared and received continues to develop day by day, year after year.

In the early days of newspapers, when newspapers were the primary method of delivering the news, when something big had occurred, the publisher would not only publish the usual daily paper, but would also publish an "Extra." The extra-newspapers were sold on the street corners, often by newsboys, who had a stack of papers and would sell them to those who passed by. When an Extra was published, the newsboys would call out "Extra! Extra! Read all about it!" to call attention to the fact that something big had happened, and an extra bit of pressing news had been published.

How do we go about sharing the Good News of Christ? How do we go about communicating Christ in a post-modern and, some would advocate, a post-Christian, culture? What is effective? What is not? What was once effective but no longer is? How do we adapt? It has been said that the definition of insanity is doing the same thing over and over believing a different outcome will be the result. The message of the Gospel remains the same. But how do we go about carrying out the mission of Christ in the contemporary world we find ourselves? Sound discussion has taken the place of fierce argumentation. However many today ask the question: "Is there really anything that's worth discussing?"

Christianity has always existed as a culture within a culture. Being a mission-minded people and effectively carrying out the mission of Christ entails both a striving after the Kingdom and an understanding of the environments in which we find ourselves a part.

The Apostle Paul affirms, "I have become all things to all mankind, so that by all means possible, I might save some." Same message. Differing methods. No one has all the answers. But I believe asking the questions is a step in the right direction.

The Avenues of God

Anytime a Christian struggles with faithfulness to God, the avenues of God, readily available to the believer, are intrinsically granted in the covenant that Almighty God has given us in His Son Jesus.

Paul speaks of the Armor of God in Ephesians 6 by which we "take our stand against the devil's schemes" (v11). The belt of truth. The breastplate of righteousness. The shield of faith. The helmet of salvation. The Sword of the Spirit, God's Word (His spoken, written, and Divine Word). These implements are defensive in nature. Protective by design.

In Roman armor the belt is secured first. The breastplate, once in place, is then connected to the belt with leather straps. The helmet was often also, once in place, connected to the breastplate in a similar manner. There are two swords that were at the Roman soldier's disposal. One was long. An offensive weapon. The other was short. More easily maneuvered. In battle the shorter sword was often held in the soldier's off hand because it was utilized primarily as a defensive weapon. Paul's description here is of the shorter, defensive sword. It further depicts God's covenantal, protective nature and the avenues relationship with God though the Gospel of Jesus provide us as His disciples. But, do we devote ourselves to them?

What are the avenues God has given us to draw nearer to Him during times of temptation? To protect us during times of attack from Satan? In order that we might prove faithful to Him? I believe four primary avenues He has granted us are: His Spirit, His Word, prayer, and each other.

However, do we truly invest ourselves in these pivotal facets of our faith? How in tune are we with His Spirit that resides within us? Are we aware of the Spirit's direction, counsel, and the spiritual strength He provides? Do we read Scripture? Do we hide His Word in our hearts? How much time do we spend with God in His Word? And in prayer? Do we intentionally pray? Do we set aside intentional time to pray to our Father? Do we commune with Him every moment of life? Do we strengthen one another? Hold one another accountable? Do we have the relationship with committed disciples of Jesus as faithful participants in the Kingdom that covenant provides and faithfulness requires?

"His divine power has given us everything we need for life and godliness through our knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and goodness" (2 Peter 1:3)

"No temptation has seized you except what is common to man. And God is faithful. He will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, He will provide a way out so that you can stand up under it" (1 Corinthians 10:13)

"Everything we need," Peter assures. "A way out," Paul affirms.

But do we pursue the avenues of God?

I was elated when one shy student who never had attended church went home and showed his parents how he had learned to pray before eating, because a teacher took the time to make this a priority in the classroom. And of course, there are many more stories. But the message is that West Erwin made it possible for so many children to know and love the Lord because of the sacrifices made to support a wonderful cause. We, as a Playschool staff, are all so thankful to say we were a part of something so significant. As the economy has dictated, fewer and fewer families are in need of twoday- a -week childcare. More are in need of full time care; or, are choosing to simply keep their children home. Unfortunately, our enrollment numbers are reflecting this more and more each school year. And so the inevitable has come, a time to wish our teachers and families a fond farewell. With a tear in our eye we say good-bye to a work of the church that definitely will never be forgotten. Thank you to all who prayed for us, encouraged us and generously supported us. I know that God is preparing new things for us, and I am excited to see His next big thing for West Erwin Church of Christ.

The Story We Are Telling

Much has been said and continues to be said about the influence of the church in the world. It's not the need to reach out to the world that's at issue; we not only easily recognize the biblical principle but readily acknowledge the urgency of our mission as believers to share the message of Jesus. We know there are those who are spiritually lost and dying without Him. We look within ourselves and testify to the very real need we each have for the Gospel to be spoken into our lives as well.

The question therefore becomes: How? How do we share? How do we connect? How do we influence?

Because the question of many outside of Christ is: Why? Why is relationship with Christ important? Why should I seek to be faithful to Christ? Why concern myself with salvation when the odds are that eternity is decades away?

The answer is quickly found in the story of the Gospel. But the greatest need that we have in sharing Christ with others is helping them to see themselves in the story.

Maybe you've heard the name "Billy Sunday." Sunday was a circuit preacher during the late 1800's and early 1900's. He preached a "hell tire and brimstone" message. The sermon was not complete until Sunday had sweated and screamed himself into exhaustion. Thousands responded. One of the things Sunday preached was that the ideal life, and ideal end, was to be baptized and then to immediately walk out of the church doors and be hit by a truck!

What do you think? Is that the perfect life?

I believe Jesus was after more than that when He said "I have come that you may have life and have it abundantly,"

What we quickly learn when we peer into the ministry of Jesus is that He walked right along side of people in their journey as he ministered to them. He was constant in who He was. And He helped others to see where they fit into what God was

I think Jesus talked more than He preached. He lived in such a way that God was undeniable. Certainly the response to openness to God was left completely up to the individual. But I believe that so many in Jesus' ministry left a conversation with Him open to the Kingdom simply because they wanted to be a part of the story He was telling.

What I want to convey in all of this is that you have the ability to minister to people that I will never meet. That only you can minister to. God crafts us each to be who we are. Our task is to bring them into the story we are telling. To help them to see where they fit into what God is doing today.

Glory to God!



REEVES RHETORIC

Now I See

"Where would I be without Christ?"

If I were to pose the question, and have you ask it of yourself, what thoughts immediately come to mind?

(I'll wait a few moments for you to think and carry this through a bit).

"Where would I be without Christ?"

We all approach a question like this from differing perspectives. From varying backgrounds. Some were raised with a Christian worldview. Others come to Christ much later in life. But regardless of the journey, surely we've come to a maturity of faith that recognizes our reality in Jesus. And in our understanding of who we are in Christ, do we ever consider who we would be were it not for the Lord in our lives?

Without Christ we are lost. Lost to ourselves. Lost in ourselves. In our sin. In our own depravity. Perhaps a sober consideration of past failings brings us to an inkling of who we would be were it not for the Spirit of Christ. And I believe it can be extremely healthy to recognize who you and I would be without Him. The reality that without Him we would be morally ruined. Spiritually bankrupt. When we come to this conclusion, we in turn are better enabled to minister to those who are indeed outside of Christ.

The Apostle Paul opens our eyes to who we are outside of covenant with God when he writes, "Do you not know that the wicked will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: Neither the sexually immoral nor idolaters nor adulterers nor male prostitutes nor homosexual offenders nor thieves nor the greedy nor drunkards nor slanderers nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. And that is what some of you were..." (1 Corinthians 6:9-10). However, praise God his pen continues, "But, you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God" (v11).

The wonderful question that comes out of Paul's message to these Christians is: "Who can be saved?" And the answer that wonderfully springs to life in verse 11 is: "Anybody!"

Do we see those who are outside of Christ for their lostness? Are we aware that they are who they are and do the things that they do and live the way that they live because they're lost? How else do we expect them to live? They're lost! Do we see them in and for and through their lostness?

If so, does it elicit compassion or disdain on our part? In our heart of hearts, are we filled with the loving kindness of God for them? Or is there a slight (or not so slight) hint of contempt?

Amazing grace how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me. I once was lost but now I'm found. Was blind but now I see.

REEVES RHETORIC

Kingdom Potential

"People were bringing little children to Jesus to have Him touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this, He was indignant. He said to them, 'Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I tell you the truth, anyone who will not receive the Kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." - Mark 10:13-

Jesus saw value in people. I love that about Jesus. Even when everyone around Him was oblivious. Even when those closest to Him were blinded by their own nearsightedness. Jesus saw Kingdom potential in everyone.

REEVES RHETORIC

As Fear Gives Way to Faith

"The Lord is my light and my salvation – whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life – of whom shall I be afraid?" - Psalm 27:1

I believe fear drives us more than we are aware. It drives our lives, it drives our relationships, it drives our churches more than we'd ever like to believe.

When children are small they're often afraid of the dark. Maybe it's a fear of the unknown or an internal fear of darkness, but many kids (and not a few adults) are afraid of the dark. And it's amazing how a dim, little light plugged into the wall can put those concerns so at ease.

And so David in Psalm 27 writes as fear gives way to faith. Boldness, because of the God we serve. "The Lord is my light," he declares. He is our light! And not just some puny Walmart night-light. The Lord is the sun that scatters the darkness in our lives. David continues, "The Lord is my salvation." He is the One who rescues and the One who saves. "Whom shall I fear?" he asks. And look at how personal David's words are: He is "my" light and "my" salvation. The Psalm originates out of the trust and reliance of David upon God. A trust that has grown through experiencing the power and provision of Almighty God time and time again. "The Lord is the stronghold of my life of whom shall I be afraid?" Only when we are close to Him, are we completely protected. Only when we reside in Him, can we fully be at peace.

I wonder what fears you have today? I wonder what might be weighing upon your heart or upon your mind this moment?

- The fear of not being enough.
- The fear of inadequacy.
- The fear of being left out.
- The fear of rejection.
- The fear of past sins.
- The fear of present worries.
- The fear of an unknown and uncertain future.
- The fear of being found out that you aren't who others think you are.
- The fear of (fill in the blank)....

If you can relate to fear, may I speak a word of hope to you today? God is God! He is strong. And He is faithful. 365 times in Scripture He declares to his people, "Do not be afraid." 365 times! One for every day of the year. And I believe the reason He affirms this command to us so many, many times is that we need to hear it! We need to be

God's desire is that fear would give way to faith in the lives of those who belong to Him in Jesus.



Consistently Overwhelmed

I wonder how consistent we are in our relationship with the Father? No one knows us more intimately than God. I wonder how He would answer the question? How consistent would He say we really are?

Isn't consistency crucial in a relationship in order for the relationship to be strong? Certainly there will be moments of struggle. Times of failure. But isn't consistency paramount in any relationship? And doesn't the same principle apply to our relationship with God through Christ?

As a whole, are we consistent? Are we growing spiritually? Are we more and more faithful? To our King? To His Kingdom? To His will? Or is there somehow a disconnect? In life and faith? Between us and God?

"Compartmentalization" is the practice of separating life into individual compartments. A dichotomy of life. Dividing, separating life into compartments like you'd box up last night's Ming's Chinese take-out. Being one person when around other Christians and another when around non-Christians. A different person at home and with the family than at work or with friends or when all alone. In compartmentalization the context dictates who we are in the moment.

The compartmentalization of life is the antithesis of discipleship. The equivalent of hypocrisy. A far cry from living a life formed and shaped by Jesus. When we attempt to compartmentalize life it is impossible to be consistent in our relationship with God. Because we have no core sense of self. We've lost who we are. Because who we are fails to be definitively defined by Jesus.

In chapter 7 of the Gospel of Luke, the good doctor describes an event in Jesus' ministry where our Savior is anointed by a woman who has lived a sinful life. The woman is so grateful just to be in the Messiah's presence that she is overwhelmed. Christ looks within the heart. Motives and willingness are evident to Jesus, no matter how things may appear to others. The religiously pious and those with prideful hearts question Jesus. But the woman is overwhelmed. "Her many sins have been forgiven," Jesus says, "Because she loved much." "But the one who has been forgiven little, loves little." The question out of this moment in Jesus' life is not: "Have we been forgiven little or much?" We've all been forgiven much. The question is: "Are we overwhelmed that we live in the Savior's presence?"

Only when we are defined by Christ will we see life with clarity. Rather than the compartmentalization of life (allowing the context and situation to determine who we are and what we are about) we are called to assimilate life through a Christological lens, a Christ-focused lens. Defined by and purposed by Jesus. Striving toward faithfulness. When we are and when we do, we will find that we are more and more consistent in our relationship with the One we call Lord.



A Message of Hope

Jeremiah 29:11 is Tiersa's absolute favorite verse....

"For I know the plans I have for you declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

Found smuggled within a letter that Jeremiah sends to the elders that have survived among the exiles in Babylon, the prophet pens a word of hope to a people who are weary.

Jeremiah writes while in Jerusalem. The city of the living God. And he writes to the remnant of those Israelites who had once lived within her walls, but now find themselves aliens in a land not their own. In a place that is far from the city of the Lord.

If you read the entire message, it is one of hope and of certainty. It is a message calling God's people to trust. Calling His people then and now to rely upon the Lord. To seek Him with all of our hearts. "You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart" (v13). To live faithful unto Him who is faithful.

The letter is one not only of confidence in the future but also one of hope for today. Hope in the present. Hope amidst pain. Hope in the middle of alienation. Hope proclaimed in seeming hopelessness. As the Apostle Paul exclaims, "Hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what they already have?" (Romans 8:24)

And maybe that's why Jeremiah's message speaks to us so clearly. Perhaps that's the reason why many are drawn to this passage and specifically, this verse.

"For I know the plans I have for you declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

Hope in the present. Hope amidst pain. Hope in the middle of alienation. Hope proclaimed in seeming hopelessness.

REEVES RHETORIC

Victorious In Our Salvation

In Luke chapter 4 we are given insight into the human and divine nature of our Savior as Jesus is led into the desert by the Spirit. During forty days of fasting (or at the conclusion of them depending upon your understanding of the text) Jesus is tempted by Satan. "If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread." Jesus answered, 'Man does not live on bread alone.' The devil then led Him up to a high place and showed Him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. And he said to Him, 'I will give you all their authority and splendor, for it has been given to me, and I can give it to anyone I want to. So if you worship me, it will all be yours.' Jesus answered, 'It is written: 'Worship the Lord your God and serve Him only.' The devil led Him to Jerusalem and had Him stand on the highest point of the temple. 'If you are the Son of God,' he said, 'throw yourself down from here. For it is written: 'He will command His angels concerning you to guard you carefully; they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone.' Jesus answered, 'It says: 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.' When the devil had finished all this tempting, he left Him until an opportune time" (Luke 4:3-

Much could be said about this event in Jesus' life and ministry. The fact that it occurred (when you consider Matthew's account) immediately following the baptism of Jesus is significant. Jesus' discipline and complete and total reliance upon God in fasting during this time powerfully speaks to us. Jesus' response to each test while abiding in God's Word is crucial. Certainly Satan's distortion of Scripture in Jesus' testing is something that should be emphasized. But what I'd like for us to consider are the reasons behind the specific ways in which Jesus is tempted/tested.

"If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread." Notice Satan's condescension: "If...." Did Satan know that Jesus was God's Son? Absolutely. Did Jesus know? You better believe it! Was there anyone else present for this conversation besides the two of them? No. So why begin with question? He's testing Jesus' character! And why bread? Because of Jesus' hunger? Yes. But even more so, if ever there was going to be a moment where Jesus was susceptible and fragile in His humanity this would have been it. Our Lord, however, stood firm. And why the temptation of the kingdoms of the world? Power. Prestige. Authority. Eqo. The temptation of salvation while falling from the pinnacle of the temple? Along those same lines: Pride. Arrogance. Ability. Worth. The writer of Hebrews acknowledges that Jesus was "tempted in every way, just as we are - yet was without sin" (Hebrews 4:15). And we see this reality clearly lived out in our Lord's life in His testing. But in doing so, do we see our own humanness as we are tempted by Satan every day as well?

John the Apostle writes, "For everything in the world - the cravings of sinful man, the lust of his eyes, and the boasting of what he has and does - comes not from the Father but from the world" (1 John 2:16). Precisely the three areas in which our

We are in such dire need of salvation. So God sent us Jesus. But He sent Christ not only to save us, but to show us. To show us how to live victorious in our salvation.





Getting Our Hands Dirty

How well do we minister to the needs of others? Be honest. And when I say, "We" I mean "Us." As believers in Christ, and as His church, do you and I minister as well, and as effectively, as we could? Or as we should?

I'll give you a minute to think about it. Take your time....

Because really, when you get right down to it, whatever our initial gut-level response to such questions reveals where we are at with such things. Ministry is messy. There's no way around it. It just is. But are we so changed by the message of Jesus (as individuals and as a church) that we are willing to get messy? Because good intentions and 50 cents will get you a coke (at least it used to).

In order for us to be involved in one another's lives to the extent that God desires and to the extent that Christian community is designed, care and concern are elementary. Compassion is required. And a big-picture of the Kingdom is paramount. Does that describe your heart? My heart? For others?

In order for us to be involved in one another's lives there is such a foundational need for vulnerability. And if we would be honest with ourselves for a moment, most of us don't do vulnerable well. Do we?

I can't help but believe that this is a crucial element we are missing in effective ministry to others (both those who are churched and those who are unchurched). Maybe it's the crucial element we're missing. I can't help but think that the world would be more Godly and less worldy if we saw the world through the eyes of God, and if we were so prompted by His love and moved by His compassion to act, rather than do nothing.

If I say that a person is: "Not afraid to get their hands dirty," what am I saying about them? I'm saying that they're not afraid to get involved. Right? That they're not afraid to step in. That they're willing to at least try.

And what I can't help but think is that we need more in the Kingdom who aren't afraid to get their hands dirty for the cause of Jesus.

La santificación: El gran plan de Dios (Jer. 29:11)

El Padre celestial tiene un plan grandioso para la vida de cada uno de sus hijos, y puede resumirse en la palabra santificación. Si usted nunca ha estado seguro del significado del término, no es el único; muchas personas no tienen clara su definición. Pero los creyentes debemos entenderlo, pues esa palabra nos define. En su forma verbal --santificar-- el término significa "hacer santo" o "apartar". Por eso, cuando algo es santificado, es apartado de su uso común anterior y dedicado a propósitos sagrados. El Antiguo Testamento menciona varias cosas que el Señor santificó entre ellas: el séptimo día y a la tribu de Leví como sacerdotes, e incluso consagró lugares como el lugar santísimo dentro del tabernáculo (Gé 2.3; Nm 3). El Padre celestial sigue santificando a las personas en el presente.

Antes de que alguien ponga su fe en el Salvador, está

muerta espiritualmente y, en realidad, es enemiga de Dios (Ef 2.1-3; Ro 5.10). Pero en el momento que decide confiar en Jesucristo, sus pecados son borrados y es adoptado en la familia de Dios (Jn. 1:12-13). Esa persona es apartada como un hijo de Dios, con un propósito sagrado. Esto significa que los creventes no estamos aquí para ir tras nuestro beneficio personal, sino para servir al Señor y darle honra y gloria. Como miembros de la familia de Dios llamados a reflejar su gloria, a los creyentes se les conoce como "santos". Se nos ha dado este nombre -- que comparte su raíz con santificación-no porque estemos sin pecado, sino porque vivimos una vida congruente con Aquel a quien representamos, de manera que cada día nos esforzamos para vivir para aquel que nos llamo y nos salvo (1 Ped 1:15-16). ¡Esforcémonos a vivir la vida conforme al estándar de Dios!



A Few Personal Questions

Whether you realize it or not, you are the face of Christ to everyone who knows you. When you placed faith in Him, you took on the role of Jesus revealing. This might come as a surprise to you. You may have thought that it was all about salvation. You may have only understood it to be about your own personal relationship with God. Far from it. Think it through. How selfish would that be? That we could somehow be content to keep God hoarded to ourselves. Surely we're not that self-absorbed. Surely we don't ever think that way. Do we?

If we are truly "converted" in the biblical, transformative sense of the word, how is it that we can find it so very easy, so very often, not to share this way of life that allegedly defines us as a people? If we are truly followers of the Way, if we are "all in" and Jesus defines our way of life, how is it that there is any doubt that we live our lives near Him? When others look to faith, lived out in us, do they fall in love with the One we call Lord?

Allow me to ask a few personal questions: How has your spouse's journey of faith been impacted recently because of your love of God and others? Does she (or he) genuinely see Jesus living in you? Is it evident to them that the Spirit is at work in transforming your heart? What about your children? How has their commitment to the Kingdom been influenced in recent history due to the way that they've seen you honor our Father? Tell me, if I were to have a conversation with your friend Ben from work that you have \$1 tacos with every Wednesday, would he say that he is closer to God because of the relationship the two of you share?

If the answers to these questions lack zeal or conviction or clarity, then allow me to probe a bit deeper into the faith you profess in Jesus....

Is it that your faith is not genuine? I realize the question may sting a little. But it's a valid question to ask, is it not? Might it be that you're faking it? Even if others are fooled, can you at least admit to God that you've been playing church?

If not, is it that your faith is simply not a priority? This is perhaps a more palatable explanation. Could it be that somehow what you feel inside doesn't translate into life or into action? But if this is the case, can what is within you really be referred to as faith?

Or, is it that you don't really believe Jesus to be relevant? Maybe relationship with God through Christ is all in your head. Salvation is a system of do's and don'ts. Covenant is an intellectual exercise. Rather than the paradigm of life God desires.

I wonder... do others go out of their way to spend time with you because it is evident that you spend time with Jesus? Do they gravitate toward you (and in turn, the Kingdom) because they sense something in your life that they are lacking? Do you reveal Christ in living your life? Do you speak hope in a world riven with despair? If the answers to these questions are "No," my next question is: "Why not?"



Disconnected Frustration

Are we faithful to God because our innermost desire is to be faithful to Him? Are we faithful to God because we experience a closeness and tranquility with Him that we have come to conclude exists in no other? Are we faithful to God because unfaithfulness would create angst and turmoil in our divine connection to Him? Are we faithful to God because faithfulness pleases Him?

I am seldom more frustrated than when my cellphone drops a call. I was driving back to Tyler from Waco yesterday afternoon, trying to talk to Tiersa, when my phone disconnected the call about ten times in a two minute time period. I seriously, seriously thought about tossing the phone out of the window!

There is a disconnect that exists between religion and faith. There is a smugness and ego that Satan utilizes to Iull Christ followers into thinking that somehow we've arrived. Somehow we've got it all together. Somehow we've got it figured out (and think that through... somehow we can have God figured out?!). That somehow if we're "following the rules" (our understanding of the rules) we're living up to God's desire for our lives. This immature perspective of faith is ultimately fueled by Satan. Because if he can con us into thinking that relationship with God is a system of belief, or a structure of "do's" and "don'ts," we will never reach our potential as those who have been forever transformed by the message of Jesus. As those who are continually transformed by the Spirit of Christ.

Relationship is deeper. Love and adoration in a relationship come not from that which is external, but rather, from that which is deep within the heart. The same is true of any relationship. But especially in our relationship with God. Genuine. Whole-hearted. Deep faith. Abiding faith. Maturity of faith is what we're after.

This disconnect not only negatively impact us. How can we communicate the relevance of Christ to others if its relevance is lost on us? And if the unchurched have one complaint it is that the church is not relevant. Is it possible that we have some responsibility in that?







REEVES RHFTORIC

You Are Not Alone

"God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them. In this way, love is made complete among us so that we will have confidence on the day of judgment, because in this world we are like Him. There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love" (1 John 4:16b-181.

There's a lot that has brought the Apostle John to this point in his first letter. There are those who feel as if they have the market cornered on God and who readily belittle others who they consider as "less spiritual." John writes to encourage those who are taking criticism and who are truly seeking to have high view of God and humble view of themselves.

The theme of "love" is a thread that runs throughout John's literature. John assures that the very nature of God is love. The Apostle affirms that love is not only the foundation of our relationship with the Father, but is foundational in our relationship with others. With both those whom we agree and those we do not.

Everything of course is encompassed within Jesus' beautiful message: "God so loved..." (John 3:16).

But here in 1 John, the Apostle moves from "love" to "fear." "There is no fear in love." "Perfect love drives out fear." The connection to love (and context of John's message) is enveloped in relationship. Relationship with God. And relationship with others. And what I believe our Father through His servant John hopes to communicate with us in this is that for those who are in a right relationship with God fear is not a part of the equation. The perfect love of God revealed in the Gospel of Jesus drives it away. However, if we were to be honest, we each, very often, have our fears. And even though John is speaking of eternity and how there is no fear ("condemnation" to use Paul's word – cf. Romans 8:1) for those who are in Christ Jesus, I wonder what might be weighing on your heart and mind right now?

I wonder: What is it that you're afraid of? What is it that is causing you concern right now? What is it that is weighing you down? What is it that is keeping you up at night? What is it that is dividing your attention? What are your fears?

Because the message of Jesus can be summed up in these words: "You are not alone."

Jon Walker in his book, Costly Grace, writes: "Fear whispers in our ear that we face danger alone, that God is unaware of our plight and that Jesus is unavailable in our time of need" (p217).

You are not alone. You can trust God. You can trust our Father. You can trust Him.

You are not alone.

Control vs Controlling

There is a big difference in being in control, out of control and being controlling. We often say, "That person is out of control." We're usually talking emotionally. Being in control has everything to do with being self-controlled. To be punctual, we must be in control of the use of our time. To be a good listener, we must be in control of our thoughts and our tongue. To see a job through, we must be in control of our determination. The Bible encourages us to be in control of ourselves and even says that GOD gives us a spirit of self-control (2 Tim 1:7). The writer of Proverbs says, "a

wise man keeps himself under control" (Prov 29:11). Controlling others is not our business. Surely I have enough trouble controlling myself without trying to control all those around me.

You can see this play out in Matt. 26. Jesus is in the garden when a detachment of soldiers came to arrest him. Peter makes an attempt to protect Jesus by swinging his sword at the man closest to him. Jesus stopped him and said, "Do you think I cannot call on my Father and He will at once put at my disposal more than twelve legions of angels?" Jesus admitted that the Father had given him all authority in heaven and earth. He could have easily controlled them all. Yet, it was in his self-control that kept him from being controlling.

Every day, life on this earth comes down to the question, "Who's in control here?"



Our current situations will continue to define our happiness until we are Christ-defined rather than situation-defined.

Haven't you seen Christians who right in the very middle of the crisis of a lifetime reveal such a trusting faith in Jesus? Maybe you've experienced it yourself. The peace that transcends all understanding as the Father brings comfort amidst turmoil. Tranquility in the middle of anxiety.

However beyond the tragic is the everyday. And I believe that one of the many things we struggle with as a people is the ability to calmly, rationally, objectively engage life. And as believers we ought to do better at this.

Paul writes in Philippians 4:4, "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again, 'Rejoice.'" Where is the Apostle when he writes the letter to the Philippians? Prison! Rejoice? Have joy? You better believe it! But only, in Christ. And only when Christ-defined rather than situation-defined.



REEVES RHETORIC

Following Jesus. Hearing His Voice.

We've spoken a lot lately about simplifying. Focusing on what really matters. Removing the clutter from our lives. Freeing ourselves from the noose that we've slipped into. "Throwing off everything that hinders us and the sin that so easily trips us up and running this Christian race well" (to paraphrase Hebrews 12:2).

We're unpacking some key spiritual disciplines on Sunday mornings together. We're seeking to practice the presence of God and striving to live lives that reflect the Lordship of Jesus in very real and very practical ways. Discipline is key. I can't read these words of Jesus in John 10 and not think of what the writer of the Hebrew letter reveals to us as he states, "Therefore brothers and sisters, since we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain, that is, His body... let us draw near to God...." (Hebrews 10:19-22a).

Jesus is the way to God. In Him we have access to God. In Him we are brought near to God. It's a close, intimate, spiritual connection and relationship.

But... can we hear our Savior's voice?

Tuning in to God. Getting rid of the static of our lives and hearing our Savior's voice. "He calls His own sheep by name and leads them out." How can we follow Him well, if His voice is drowned out by all the noise we are allowing in?

REEVES RHETORIC

A Win/Win Situation

If at the end of the day I were to ask you to give me an itemized itinerary of the events of your day and how they unfolded, you'd readily be capable of describing how the day progressed. For me, most mornings the alarm clock goes off at 6:45am. (Some of you you're thinking: "I only acknowledge one 6:45 during the day and it's not 6:45AM!" For others of you, your routine may be that you get up even earlier.) By 8am all the kids are sitting in their desks at school. And by 8:15am I'm either in the office or at a coffee shop depending upon the day. Now that's only an hour and a half's time frame, but a whole lot more went into that hour and a half than that, right? I failed to mention whether or not the kids were in a good mood by the time we walked out the door or if I had to referee. Whether or not we left in plenty of time or had to break several laws of man and a few laws of physics to get them to school before the tardy bell rang (not that I ever do that!). I haven't told you about all the things on my mind during that hour and a half either. Concerns. Commitments. Complications. From the things on my to-do list that I just need to get done, to things that I have no idea what to do about and am still waiting to see how God works through them.

My reason behind this is to acknowledge to you that as much as we are striving to simplify, as much as we are striving to keep the main things the main things, we live lives that involve some degree of complication. Some complications we can actively do something about. But the reality is, for other complications, we're in a holding pattern.

Process these words of the Apostle Paul, "But as surely as God is faithful, our message to you is not 'Yes' and 'No.' For the Son of God, Jesus Christ, who was preached among you by me and Silas and Timothy, was not 'Yes' and 'No,' but in Him it has always been 'Yes.' For no matter how many promises God has made, they are 'Yes' in Christ." - 2 Corinthians 1:18-20a

What Paul assures is that everything in life is a "Yes" when we're in Christ. Everything is a "Yes!" That somehow amidst good and bad, calm and chaos, triumph and tragedy, when we are in Jesus, it's all a "Yes." It's not that it's all easy. It's not that it always makes sense. But somehow when we see life through eyes of faith everything is a "Yes" because God is God. And in Jesus, we are His people. And because we are His, everything is a "Yes." So you got a promotion? It's a "Yes" in Christ. So you lost you're job today? It's a "Yes" when you're close to our Savior. The cancer is in remission? It's a "Yes" in Jesus. Your counts are looking like the cancer has returned? It's a "Yes" when in relationship with God.

Somehow when we are in Christ Jesus, everything is a "Yes." If you are being faithful to God, it's a win/win situation. No matter how that hour and a half looks. No matter what complications you're in the middle of. No matter how promising or how bleak a circumstance. In Him it has always been (and always will be) "Yes!"



A Kingdom Not of this World

Covenant with Christ radically shapes our worldview. Covenant overcomes our culture. In order for us to be as missiologically effective as Kingdomly possible we have to transcend our biases. To overcome our presuppositions. To place Christ at the center of our life and paradigm of life. To see others not for where they are but for where they could be. To view each and every person on the planet as created in the image of God. As valuable. Not only valuable to God. But valuable to us. This way of thinking is not of this world. It is altogether other-worldly. It is Kingdom thinking. Kingdom processing. And it runs contrary to our natural tendencies. Left to our own devices we create a religiosity that places ourselves at the center, rather than Jesus. If and when we do, suddenly God likes all the things we like and hates all the things that we hate. Suddenly God accepts all of those we accept and rejects all of those whom we reject.

Our Master however calls for radically different senses. To have "eyes that see and ears that hear." To consciously acknowledge and actively participate in the Kingdom of God. Conquered and empowered by the Gospel of Christ. Congruent with the Holy Spirit. It is a Kingdom in which we as believers are to pledge our complete and total allegiance. A Kingdom not of this world. A spiritual Kingdom. As a viable part of this Kingdom we therefore view life and all that it contains through the lens of faith. We willfully engage life desiring unity with God and His Word and His Spirit. Intentionally striving to get in Jesus' Way, and at the same time, to get out of His way. To anticipate the breaking in of the Kingdom. To see every facet of life from the perspective of the Messiah. To be so in tune with the voice of God that His counsel and direction are unmistakable and undeniable. To be one, in harmony, in unison, and in sync with the magnificent, spiritual, harmonious, powerful, radical Kingdom of God.

In The Pursuit of God, A.W. Tozer asks (and answers), "Why do the ransomed children of God (that's us) know so little of the habitual, conscious communion with God which Scripture details and offers? The answer is our chronic unbelief. Faith enables our spiritual sense to function. Where faith is defective the result will be inward insensibility and numbness to spiritual things. This is the condition of vast numbers of Christians today. No proof is necessary to support that statement. We have but to converse with the first Christian we meet or enter the first church we find open to acquire all the proof we need. A spiritual Kingdom lies all about us, enclosing us, embracing us, altogether within reach of our inner selves, waiting for us to recognize it. God Himself is waiting for our response to His presence. The eternal will come alive the moment we begin to reckon its reality."



REEVES RHETORIC

An Awareness of Holiness

"Therefore, prepare your minds for action; be self-controlled; set your hope fully on the grace to be given you when Jesus Christ is revealed. As obedient children, do not conform to the evil desires you had when you lived in ignorance. But just as He who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; for it is written: 'Be holy, because I am holy'" (1 Peter 1:13-16; cf. Leviticus 11:44-45).

"But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of Him who called you out of darkness and into His wonderful light" (1 Peter 2:9).

I wonder if a greater awareness of the holiness of God might equip us to be more cognizant of our own holiness? I wonder if willful, intentional contemplation of the holiness of our Father might assist us in realizing our own holy status in Christ Jesus? Certainly we are only made holy in Christ, however we are called to holy living. To a holy way of life. All of life is sacred for those who believe. The Apostle Peter is calling for conviction. He is calling for commitment. Half-hearted Christianity doesn't cut it. "Just as He who called you is holy, be holy in all that you do." We recognize our failings. We acknowledge we are spiritually bankrupt outside of covenant. However just as the Father is holy, we are to be holy. What if holiness were in our thoughts? What if holiness were upon our hearts? What if holiness were a viable part of our vocabulary and conversations? What if a sustainable facet of our faith was the practice of holiness?

Father we pray for an awareness of holiness. To be aware of your reality and your presence in our lives. And to be aware that we have been (and are continually) made holy in Jesus. Our hope is that we would be altogether incapable of being men and women who give little consideration to your character and nature, your purpose and our calling. Our prayer is that we would be a holy people. Light in a world of darkness. Our desire is that we would be like you. That we would reflect your holiness. That holiness would be such an integral part of who we are and so very definitive in what we reveal to the world around us that there would be no doubt as to who we are and whose we are. In the name of the Holy One in whom we place all hope, and all confidence, Amen.

However, without Christian community we hobble our spiritual development and Kingdom impact.

What is needed is grace. Not only God's grace to us, but His grace from us. God's grace in us, freely given to others. Openly extended to others. We have to make room. To allow room. Each of us do. To make room in our hearts for others. The problem is that we are seldom aware of our own Pharisaical tendencies. Relationships are not always easy. But they are always healthy when they are focused upon Christ. And when focused upon the greater purpose of the Kingdom.

Glory to God!



Kingdoms in Conflict

Pilate then went back inside the palace, summoned Jesus and asked Him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" "Is that your own idea," Jesus asked, "or did others talk to you about me?" "Am I a Jew?" Pilate replied. "It was your people and your chief priests who handed you over to me. What is it you have done?" Jesus said, "My Kingdom is not of this world. If it were, my servants would fight to prevent my arrest by the Jews. But now my Kingdom is from another place." "You are a king, then!" said Pilate. Jesus answered, "You are right in saying I am a king. In fact, for this reason I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to me." – John 18:33-37

There is a collision between Christ and Culture. When we respond to the call of Jesus and cling to the Kingdom of God it is required of us that we release the kingdom of this world. The Kingdom of God and the kingdom of the world are in conflict with one another. They are opposed to one another. Jesus declares, "My Kingdom is not of this world." And only to those who are of the Kingdom does the Kingdom make sense.

So why is it that so much of what occupies our thoughts is worldly? Why is so very much of our focus upon the temporal? Why do we give the worldliness of this world such an audience? And how can Jesus so readily be relegated to an afterthought?

Do we separate life into eternal Kingdom and temporal kingdom compartments? Do we elevate the eternal when we look to the day to day? What I mean is that as we go about our day-to-day living are our minds and hearts in tune with what really matters? Because in the grand scheme of it all, only the things of God matter. Right? Why is it then that we spend so much energy focusing upon the minutia of the kingdom of this world, rather than the wonder of the Kingdom of God?

"You are right in saying that I am a king," Jesus affirms.

But the question remains: Is He really your King?





Words of Glory

"Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable His judgments, and His paths beyond tracing out! Who has known the mind of the Lord? Or who has been His counselor? Who has ever given to God that God should repay him? For from Him and through Him and to Him are all things. To Him be the glory forever! Amen." – Romans 11:33-36

speeding or maybe a little creative bookkeeping on a tax return because of a little selfishness? How many times have you struggled with your humility and looked down on others because they were different from you? Paul gives us some help for these struggles in the next few verses. At one time we too were foolish, disobedient, deceived, and enslaved... We lived in malice and envy, ... hating one another. But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, he saved us... He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit (Titus 3:4-5). When you catch your relationships slipping away from you, remember where you came from and what you were without the influence of Christ and the Holy Spirit on your life. Remember who saved you and the fact that Christ did it out of his love and kindness for you. Love and kindness are the foundation for great relationships and Christians should specialize in relationships.



REEVES RHETORIC

Acknowledging Our Brokenness

Last week our focus Sunday evening was upon the Bread of God. We began with the manna from heaven in Israel's wilderness experience (Ex 16). We then transitioned to the call of the Ezekiel, as the Prophet eats the scroll of the Word of the Lord (Ez 2:8-3:4). The scroll tasted sweet as honey, like manna. Our next stop along the way together was the Psalms, where we read from Psalm 19:7-10 and connected to David's praise that "the Law of the Lord" and "the precepts of the Lord" are "sweeter than honey." Our final text came from John 6 where Jesus explains that He is the Bread of God, that gives life to the world.

Our emphasis was upon being sustained by God. Being filled by God. Being satisfied by God. In every way. Recognizing and receiving the daily bread of the Lord (His Word, His Spirit, our experiences, the simple joys of life). Our call was to be filled by Him. Spiritually. And we acknowledged that we are only filled to the extent that we hunger for Him (ref. Mt 5:6).

But I want to flesh this out (see Jn 6) and take it a step further (and if this finds its way into a sermon later on just act like you're hearing it then for the first time).... As we come to the table each week and commune with our Savior and commune with one another and commune with the body of Christ the world over, we break the bread in remembrance of the Messiah (Lk 22:19). Jesus says, "This is my body given for you."

And as we accept the Lordship of Christ we become a part of the body of Christ. When in Christ we are the body of Christ (1 Co 12:27). As we commune with our Lord each week, we celebrate the Good News of Jesus. And we refocus ourselves upon who the Gospel calls us each to be. But I wonder, do we see ourselves in the bread? (Stay with me for a second....) Because only when we are broken, can God do in us and with us and through us what only He can do. Only when we take ownership of our brokenness can our Father begin to create within us that which is Christ-like. When we accept the Lordship of Christ, as we are baptized into Christ, we acknowledge our brokenness and we come to Him to make us whole. As we break the bread each week, do we recognize our brokenness? As those who are the body of Christ, are we, in that moment, consciously aware that only in Him we are made whole?

THE POWER OF TOUCH

Suzie and I were in Houston this weekend helping out with my son's children while his mother-in-law had colon surgery. One of my duties was sleeping with his 4-year-old son, Caden. Caden is an overactive sleeper if you know what I mean. Saturday, during nap time, I had to send him to his dad because he was standing up on my legs. Naptime was not a priority for him that day. Saturday night was another restless night for him, but as the night wore on, I felt his little hand on my shoulder and it seemed to settle him down. All through the night at various times, I would feel his hand, making sure I was still there beside him. I guess that touch was a comfort to him.

Touch can be a powerful thing, especially when people felt the touch of Jesus. In John 9, we see where Jesus healed a blind man by making mud and spit and putting it on the man's eyes. Before he healed the man Jesus said, "As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world" ([0.9:5). Jesus has a way of opening our eyes to the things we need to see. When we allow ourselves to be touched by Jesus, we see how the things we say, do, and think affect his church. We see the church for the treasure that it is.

In Mark 1, we see where Jesus healed Simon's mother-in-law of her fever by his touch. She got out of bed and started to serve those in the house. When we allow ourselves to be touched by Jesus, we become true servants of his work. We are healed of the diseases of hate, prejudice, and envy and his traits of humility and love show through. It is then that we reflect the sweetness of a life under the touch of Jesus.

In Mark 4, we see the miracle of Jesus calming the storm through his words. The disciples thought that Jesus did not care that they were in danger. After the miracle, Jesus asked his disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?" (Mk.4:40) When we allow ourselves to be touched by Jesus, we get through the storms of life. We may still experience the fear, the hurt, the shame, or the sadness, but we will overcome. We have the promise that Jesus cares for us and wants for us to be with him forever. When we are touched by Jesus, we live for heaven and we live with the victory!





REEVES RHETORIC

The Fullness of Obedience

As I write this article I have eight commentaries, four Bibles, and two hermeneutical texts on my desk to help with one particular verse that I'd like for us to consider today. I seldom refer to quite so many, and generally choose for us to be less technical during our "time" here, but in this case I wanted to unpack one specific verse of Hebrews a bit, only to begin to initiate our thoughts in this direction.

First the context: "During the days of Jesus' life on earth, He offered up prayers and petitions with loud cries and tears to the One who could save Him from death, and He was heard because of His reverent submission. Although He was a son, He learned obedience from what He suffered and, once made perfect, He became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey Him and designated by God to be High Priest in the order of Melchizedek" (Hebrews 5:7-10).

Jesus' submissiveness and faith is certainly at the center of the Hebrew writer's thesis. The Messiah willfully chooses the cross so that we might be saved. He is our High Priest, interceding on our behalf as both priest and king, without beginning and without end ("in the order of Melchizedek" – see Genesis 14 – Melchizedek means "King of Righteousness").

Bût the one idea I'd like for us to focus upon is that our Savior "learned obedience" from what He suffered (v8). understand the author's impetus in that Christ is "made perfect." He is made whole/complete/glorified as He is resurrected by the power of God. Atonement for sin is achieved. Eternity secured. But what does it mean that He "learned obedience"?

Are we to deduce that Christ had not "learned obedience" until the cross?! Absolutely not. So what then does it mean?

What if we were to read verse 8 like this: "Christ experienced obedience from what He suffered"? Does that help us in our understanding of what is being communicated? Or, "Christ learned by experiencing the fullness of His obedience"? Does that change our perspective?

Christ's entire life and existence defines discipline and fidelity to the Father. Obedience characterizes the whole of our Savior's existence. We are called to imitate His obedience and discipline as we strive to live called lives (Philippians 2:1-11). And yet what is being communicated to us here in Hebrews 5:8 is Christ's experience of the fullness of His obedience. The Apostle John shares something similar as he describes the Upper Room scene where Jesus washes His disciples' feet, "Having loved His own who were in the world, He now showed them the full extent of His love" (John 13:1). It's not as if He had not revealed His love prior to the moment. And certainly His love will be made manifest the follow morning! But through the servanthood of the Lord in the Upper Room, the Apostle describes the revelation of the Savior's love as it is experienced by His disciples as He washes their feet.

The culmination of the life of Christ, a life lived in complete and total surrender to the Father's will, is revealed as He "humbled Himself and became obedient to death – even death on a cross" (Philippians 2:8). As Christ experienced the fullness of His obedience.

Therefore when Jesus calls us as His disciples to deny ourselves, take up our cross daily, and follow Him (Luke 9:23) experiencing the fullness of obedience, each and every day, is what He is after!

RUNNING THE RACE

Last weekend my daughter-in-law, Rebekah, ran in a relay marathon. She had to run 4.7 miles of the marathon. I was impressed with her effort. It seems that there are different motivations for getting involved in a marathon. Some want to do it because of the competition, some want to celebrate the healthier lifestyle that competing in a marathon brings, and some just want to finish the race on a challenge. Paul compared the Christian life to running a race, so Christians must be motivated to "finish the race" or in other words, remain steadfast in the Lord. How do you finish this race of life? Peter gives us three things in 1 Peter 5 that will

First, it helps to be in a church with strong leadership (5:1-4). There are no perfect elders and there are no perfect members, so we see the importance of working together to accomplish the Lord's work. The relationship between elder and flock must be grounded in love and trust and it is a unique relationship found only in the church. When that relationship is based on God's word, it is a gift from God.

Secondly, we must show true loyalty to each other (5:5-9). We need to deal with each other from a position of humility and not of judgment. We fight a difficult battle with Satan and our ranks must be unified in the effort. Those that "break ranks" become easy prey for Satan, the "roaring lion".

Third, we need to have sincere love for each other (5:10-14). Peter says to greet one another with the kiss of love (ESV). Peter gives us the key to that love in 1 Peter 1:22, Having purified your souls by your obedience to the truth for a sincere brotherly love, love one another earnestly from a pure heart. It takes a pure heart to love one another as Jesus would have us to do. Sincere love comes from a strong spiritual relationship with the Father. When our spirit improves, our attitudes and opinions of others start improving. Remaining steadfast comes from within and is nourished by a steady diet of prayer, study, and worship.



La Azaña comenzaba a las 5 de la mañana con la preparación de los animales, después de que todo estaba preparado nos encaminábamos al campo, al amanecer ya estábamos listos para comenzar. Pero primero; en la mitad del campo en el otro extremo se clavaba la estaca de color llamativo. Esa era la raya principal que iba a dirigir los surcos hacia arriba y abajo.

Cuando el arador iba a comenzar alineaba su yunta y fijaba

firmemente sus ojos en la estaca llamada "la marca" y en ningún momento despegaba sus ojos de la marca para que el surco saliera derecho, mientras se mantenía el ojo en la marca todo estaba perfecto, pero cuando había distracción el surco salía curvado. Ésta ilustración nos da pleno entendimiento de lo que dijo Jesús en (Lc. 9:62): acerca de la vida cristiana el dijo: "Ninguno que poniendo su mano en el arado mira hacia atrás, es apto para el reino de Dios". Cuando usted pone su mano en el arado, debe poner sus ojos en la marca y no mirar a la izquierda, a la derecha o atrás de usted. Entonces usted dará en la marca de Dios para su vida (Heb. 12:2). Como cristianos, mientras fijemos nuestra vista en nuestro Señor Jesucristo todo saldrá bien y estará bien, pero si nos distraemos de nuestra vida cristiana todas las cosas saldrán mal, por lo tanto el consejo de Dios es: "No quites tus ojos de la marca".


