



As we continue our sermons this month examining the topic, "What the Response of Faith DOES," this Sunday we speak of the Biblical call to **repent**. This comes on the heels of our Bible classes this past week which looked at the unrepentant King Saul. Reminded of his disobedience we shared this call:

This week we begin a few lessons on King David. We start with his epic victory over Goliath. And so there is this call in this week's lesson:

Keep trusting God, even when your faith is challenged.

So what battles are you facing this week? What giants are threatening your faith? The good news is the God of David is still there to strengthen us during the fight. And as David knows better than most, the Lord will welcome us home even when we've given in and lost the battle if we would just return to Him. That's called **repentance**. And so I will add this call:

Keep coming back to God, even when you've got a long way to go.

IESUS AND PARABLES

In Matthew 13, Jesus tells His disciples why He taught with parables. Jesus said that they had been given the secrets to the kingdom but not everyone had that advantage. He also said that some people just did not understand and then He quoted Isaiah, You will indeed hear but never understand, and you will indeed see but never perceive. For this people's heart has grown dull, and with their ears they can barely hear, and their eyes they have closed, lest they should see with their eyes and hear with their ears and understand with their heart and turn, and I would heal them (Matt.13:14-15). That sure sounds like the world we live in today. It is easy to tell myself that nobody out there hears, or understands, or even cares about Jesus, and there is nothing I can do for them. But then, Jesus continues His teachings, But blessed are your eyes, for they see, and your ears, for they hear. For truly, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see, and did not see it, and to hear what you hear, and did not hear it (Matt.13:16-17). We are truly blessed for what we have in Jesus. We need to be thankful for that blessing, and we need to remember that we are His messengers to a world that hears but does not understand. It's not easy doing the Lord's work. Are you blessing others with what you have come to understand? Do they see what you see?







DOING THE HARD WORK

Nehemiah was tasked with the difficult job of helping to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem. There was intense opposition from other people in the land and there was disunity among the Jews. What does it take when we are called to do the difficult jobs for our Father? What can we learn from Nehemiah? First, Nehemiah was concerned for God's cause. When Nehemiah heard that the walls and gates were destroyed, he said, "As soon as I heard these words I sat down and wept and mourned for days, and I continued fasting and praying before the God of heaven" (Neh.1:4). Nehemiah knew that God's children were hurting and that concern drove him to action and to his knees. Secondly, Nehemiah had confidence in God's cause. "Remember your word to Moses...but if you return to me and keep my commandments and do them...I will gather them and bring them to the place that I have chosen, to make my name dwell there" (Neh.1:8-9). When God's children stand for God, God stands by them. Nehemiah's faith stood on this promise. Thirdly, Nehemiah cooperated in God's cause. "Jerusalem lies in ruins with its gates burned. Come, let us build the walls of Jerusalem, that we may no longer suffer derision" (Neh.2:17). Nehemiah did not want to give the Lord's enemies reason to exalt, so he was determined to make things right. How willing are you to do the "hard work"?

Over the next few weeks, I'm going to emphasize some of the thoughts & ideas from our Relationships Matter Conference. This week... for couples... Greg Smalley shares this...

Date Night... When a couple spends time alone each week, their levels of happiness, positive communication and sexual satisfaction are more than three times higher than those who don't spend that time together. That means you might be able to dramatically increase these important areas of your marriage by simply dating your wife!

Date night is a fantastic way to make sure you and your wife are connecting positively and enjoying each other's company on a regular basis. It doesn't have to be expensive or elaborate. But it's going to take time, effort and planning. The key to a great date is to make sure you don't administrate your marriage when you go out — don't have conversations about finances, household responsibilities, problems with the kids or sensitive issues. You need to talk about these things, but not during a date. Date night is about *enjoying* each other.

A great date night will feature playfulness and laughter. Ask your wife questions to update your knowledge of her. Reminisce by retelling some of your favorite marriage stories. Talking about your memorable events allows you to celebrate how far you've come as a couple and provides hope as you anticipate future good times together.



WHAT IS THIS YOU HAVE DONE?

I brought you up from Egypt and brought you into the land that I swore to your fathers. I said, "I will never break my covenant with you, and you shall make no covenant with the inhabitants of this land; you shall break down their altars." But you have not obeyed my voice. What is this you have done? So now I say, I will not drive them out before you, but they shall become thorns in your sides, and their gods shall be a snare to you (Judges 2:1b-3). This was God's message to the Israelites. Just like them, we make a bad choice when we fail to completely obey God. When we fail to uphold our end of the covenant relationship we have with God, when we fail to strengthen ourselves in the Lord, when we fail to keep the influence of the world out of our homes, and when we fail to live in harmony with God's will, we put ourselves in danger of losing the blessings we receive because of our relationship with God. Consider Paul's warning to the church in Rome, For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened. Claiming to be wise, they became fools,... Therefore God gave them up in the lust of their hearts to impurity... because they exchanged the truth about God for a lie (Ro.1:21-25). As a church, we need to be praying that we never have to be asked by God, What is this you have done?

Consider the following from Galatians 2:20-21 "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. I do not set aside the grace of God, for if righteousness could be gained through the law, Christ died for nothing!"

Relationships

Over the next few weeks, I'm going to emphasize some of the thoughts & ideas from our Relationships Matter Conference. This week... for Families... Daniel Huerta shares this...

Kids love to be known, and they really love it when their dad reminisces about something they did. Imagine what would happen if dads looked at their kids through the lens of Ephesians 2:10: "For we are God's masterpiece. He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, so we can do the good things he planned for us long ago". Appreciating a masterpiece requires first recognizing its value and then taking time to admire and enjoy it. Imagine your relationship with your kids if you made the effort to observe, admire and enjoy them — they are masterpieces created by God.

Notice that Ephesians 2:10 does not say "created to be formed identical to your earthly father." The diversity in personalities, interests, talents and ideas is one of the riches we are able to enjoy in our relationships. It's what makes us all unique masterpieces.

Sometimes, at night, I will do a "high five" with my kids. I say, "Here are five things I know about you" or "Here are five things I love about you." Many times, they will hold up both hands with all 10 fingers stretched out, hoping to hear 10 things. I want them to realize that they are known and loved by their father.

Let's take time to know, enjoy, observe and engage with the masterpieces in front of us.



Read what the writer of Hebrews says about encouraging, But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called "today", that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. For we have come to share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original confidence firm to the end. ... For who were those who heard and yet rebelled? Was it not all those who left Egypt led by Moses? And with whom was he provoked for forty years? Was it not with those who sinned, whose bodies fell in the wilderness? There once was a man who netted three trout from a mountain stream and carefully placed them side-by-side on a thick patch of grass. Before he removed them from the water, they were like a liquid ballet in motion, Fluid, Graceful, Vibrant, Alive, After he netted them, it was another story.

As the trout lay on the grass, they were motionless. Their eyes were fixed. They gasped for air, and they looked — and acted — stupid.

The man noticed they seemed unhappy, so he talked to them, hoping that his encouragement would change them.

"Little fish, don't be sad. You'll like the grass. Just try it out for a while." No movement. No response. No change.

A few more seconds passed. The man's neighbor walked by. "Hey, Bob! Come and check out these fish!"

Bob sauntered over and the man explained that he was certain the fish could adjust. "I'm sure they could prosper here on the grass. Don't you agree?"

"Why not?" Bob replied. So he also tried to tell the fish it would be good if they learned to like the grass. After all, he liked the grass. Why shouldn't they?

Still, the fish didn't blink. They just lay there looking dumber by the second.

Finally, a little boy approached exclaimed, "What are you doing? Put them back! They can't be all they've been created to be when they are out of the water.

Finally convinced, the man carefully placed each fish back in the stream. After splashing for a split second, all three swam away effortlessly. Again, it was like a liquid ballet. What ease! What grace! What beauty!

In that moment, the man realized that no matter how long the fish lay there they would never adjust to the grass, and would never be satisfied — no matter how much he (or anyone else) told them otherwise. Even if the fish tried to convince themselves they could learn to like the grass, they never would, and they would never prosper. In fact, they would eventually die.

Do you feel like a fish out of water? Your prolonged dissatisfaction, God-given gifts, passions and the voices of others could be telling you that you were created for another purpose. And like these fish, if you feel like you are dying inside, listen up. It could be just what you need to push you into another, more satisfying ocean.

We would be hard pressed to explain where the wind comes from, but nobody can deny its existence. When those in the world look at Christians, they know there's a difference, but they can't explain the why. They don't understand the Spirit. Romans gives us a great picture of how we depend on the Spirit in our walk with Christ. How does the Spirit help us? The Spirit gives us life and peace (8:6). Listen to your dissatisfaction

We've been taught to believe that dissatisfaction is a bad thing, and that we should do everything possible to avoid it. Shove it down. Ignore it. Act like it doesn't bother us. Take a pill. Plaster on a smile. Buy something new. or decide that misery is part of "bearing our cross." But above all, don't consider that God might be using it to make us uncomfortable so we'll want to swim in another ocean where our gifts can shine.

Don't get me wrong; dissatisfaction can be a result of spiritual warfare (Eph. 6:10-12) and not an indication that we are out of God's will. But it can also be a road sign that He has another purpose for us. So if you're miserable in your current career or job, (and you have been for a long time), you've prayed, sought counsel from others, looked for guidance through Scripture, and you're still miserable, consider that God may have another plan.

Listen to others

One of my closest girlfriends lights up when she talks about mentoring young women. She also has tremendous business sense. I've suggested that perhaps God may use her to start a mentoring organization or ministry. When I shared my thoughts with her, she said, "You know, I've heard that from lots of people."

Just as dissatisfaction can be a road sign from God to show you your purpose, listening to what others say about your gifts can do the same; so when someone notices or comments on one of your talents, take note. God may be trying to tell you something through His people.

There are times, however, when we shouldn't listen to what others say. But when what they say about us agrees with our passions, internal convictions, gifting and what God has already revealed to us, it can be a solid indication of our God-given purpose. (To be continued)





In doing so, not only will it result in more peace, but it will mean that you are treating another with the same kindness that you want to be treated with. Listen to your passions

If I could ask you what makes you angry, joyful, excited or passionate, what would you say? Take note of when your emotions are moved; these times can be a sign of your God-given purpose.

I get fired up about the godless condition of the world. When I hear about little children being abused, I get angry. When someone tells me a story about loyal love, I am deeply moved. An exquisite arrangement of words on a page fills my heart with passion. A story of someone's heartbreak grieves me. Talking about Christ stirs me up. When coupled with my talents, these passions point in the direction of my purpose of written and spoken communication about things that deeply impact people on a spiritual and emotional level.

Pray. Ask God to show you the things that move you and make a list. And remember, He wants you to discover His purpose for you more than you do.

Lastly, consider that your purpose is not just about you; it's about what God wants to do through you. Therefore, if you ignore or neglect your dissatisfaction, what others say about you, your gifts and your passions, you are not only betraying yourself, but betraying God; because He has called you to a purpose and wants you to walk in it — for others and for your own joy.

Also consider that since God has called you, He is completely able to reveal your purpose to you, and He will as you diligently seek Him (Hebrews 11:6).



My younger daughter was upset that her sister wasn't in the mood to loan her boots — a big problem in the world of teen girls. Tears ensued. I demanded they go upstairs to work it out. When my husband awoke to the boot debacle, he commented, "Every morning there's some kind of drama. Can't you all just be nice to each other?"

That was it. I had been lumped into the "you all" category when I was simply responding to the drama that *our* kids brought to *our* morning!

My emotions had been ratcheted up to the point where the slightest additional stress could cause me to come completely unglued.

However, this morning I didn't. And that's amazing since I literally felt like I had firecrackers in my blood.

But, over the past couple of years I've been making imperfect progress by learning how to attack the issues without attacking the people I love. If you've ever struggled with getting angry, here are a few insights that might help you, too

Feelings are indicators, not dictators.

My feelings can indicate there is a problem to address but shouldn't dictate how I react to a situation. I need to see the chaotic feelings as a call to action, working to put systems in place to better handle problems.

With anger issues, I used to yell until everyone else got quiet. Now I control what I can (my emotions and my reactions) instead of getting frustrated with the things I can't control (arguing daughters).



BE HONEST WITH YOURSELF!

To be honest with you, I have a hard time admitting I am wrong. It is much easier to blame someone else. One time we were having a problem with our home phone and after three days, I realized I could not fix it and had to call and report the problem. I dreaded the long wait of being put on hold to talk to a technician. But, I needed to voice my displeasure over their lack of service and their many problems in providing me service. After the lengthy wait for the next available person, much to my dismay, we finally discovered the problem. I had failed to plug my phone in. I was so determined to find something wrong with them, that it caused me to overlook an obvious fault of mine. It was a humbling experience to say the least. We get that way in our own spiritual lives too. We tell ourselves that it's never our fault, it's never something we say or do, and it's always the fault of others. This attitude makes it hard to admit that some of the wrongdoing could be on us! Paul says we are to examine ourselves to see if we are in the faith (2 Co.13:5). When we have a problem with someone, we need to take an open and honest look at the situation. We need to make sure we are being fair, before we start placing blame. It is good for our conscience and it is good for the unity of the church. Aim for restoration, comfort one another, and live in peace (2 Co.13:12).

Women and Anger By Lysa TerKeurst... (Continued from last week)

She who holds the tongue, holds the power.

When I yell, I communicate to my family that they have the power to make me act crazy. And I don't want my kids, my husband, the family dog or anyone else to have that kind of power over me. So, in that split second before I yell, I try to insert a pause. Pausing reminds me that God gave me emotions to experience life — not destroy it. Pausing helps me look for a little perspective. And best of all, pausing allows for the Holy Spirit to intervene in my response.

Consequences yell, so I don't have to.

When I see a police officer sitting on the side of the road with a radar gun, I slow down because I know there will be consequences if I don't. If he just stood on the street and yelled and waved his arms without ever dishing out consequences, I wouldn't feel nearly as motivated to pay attention to him. The same is true for dealing with others.

Consequences are powerful and effective tools, but they have to be realistic and consistent. So, the time to think about these isn't in the heat of the moment. Instead, I think about logical consequences for reoccurring issues before they trigger angry feelings. This means that the next time my kids speed toward doing things they shouldn't, I'll have the equivalent of a ticket ready to serve.

Trust me, I still don't do this perfectly. But I am getting better. Less frustrated, less angry. And that's so much better than waking up dreading what the day will







Of course I'm talking about Moses, the great lawgiver and leader of God's people, who stood up to Pharaoh with the Lord's demand, "Let my people

And you would be wrong.

When God called out to him from the burning bush, "Moses!" the great lawgiver responded not with faith but with excuses. One after another.

Don't give up on yourself. God hasn't.

Answer His call.

APPROACHING GOD

In Luke 18:9-14, we read of Jesus' parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector. This parable speaks to us about the way we approach God. Luke sets the story up by telling us who Jesus intended the story for. He (Jesus) told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and treated others with contempt (Luke 18:9). Some translations say that they "looked down" on others instead of having contempt for them. Iesus is saving that the way we "treat" others has a bearing on the way we approach God. The Pharisee said, God, I thank you that I am not like other men ...even like this tax collector (19:11), while the tax collector said, God, be merciful to me, a sinner! (19:13). We can't approach God by relying on our own good works to receive justification. If we do that, we are trusting in ourselves. We also can't approach God by looking down on others. We are not to compare ourselves to others. We need to examine our own hearts and see how it compares to God's word! With that in mind, how do we approach God? We approach God as an unworthy sinner who is pleading for His mercy! When we approach God in that manner, we are looking away from ourselves and trusting God for justification. Jesus said, I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other one (18:14). Which man are you? I hope not the "other one"!

Relationships Over the next few weeks, I'm going to emphasize some of the thoughts & ideas from our Relationships Matter Conference. This week we begin a 4 part series on Loving Your Step Children... This week...

Loving Your Stepkids by Katie Parsons.

I spent all afternoon folding size 6 boys T-shirts, stepping on toys that were not picked up before school, preparing healthy snacks for firstgraders and navigating a new dinner recipe based on my stepson's favorite ingredients. When I asked him to pick up his backpack and shoes scattered across the kitchen floor, he snarled, "Why should I? You never do anything for me."

After three years as a stepmom, I've discovered a few strategies for loving sometimes unlikable stepkids. In these moments as a stepparent, I have to remind myself: I love all my kids - even when I don't particularly like them. Being the secondary mom or dad comes with an added layer of testing, but with the right mentality, you can be a loving stepparent in every situation.

Remember That You're The Adult Your stepkids won't always show you respect, even though they should. You may have chosen them, but they didn't choose you - and that can lead to resentment. Fight the urge to retaliate. Sometimes it's better to walk away or hold your tongue rather than escalating the tension with an outburst.

Seek Backup From Your Spouse For your stepchildren to respect you, your spouse has to give you parenting authority and then back you up. It just means that to parent properly, you need support from the other adult in the house. Communicate with your spouse when you feel like the odd one out in the family dynamic.

Find Unique Moments To Connect In many ways, being a stepparent is like arriving at a party a bit late: You've already missed some of the fun, but there's more to be had. Instead of wasting energy trying to wedge your way into long-standing family traditions or activities, develop some of your own. A few weeks into my marriage, I threw together a dinner of pancakes. My stepson still talks about how much he enjoys having "breakfast for dinner," so I make this meal on special occasions or when he gets a good report from school. It's a unique point of connection for us.

Look for everyday ways to bless your stepchildren, and it will bless

JUST DO IT!

In 1 Chronicles 28, we see David getting ready to hand over the throne to his son Solomon. In the first part of the chapter, he charges Israel with following the Lord. He then gives Solomon the charge to know and serve God. David then tells Solomon, Be strong and courageous and do it. Do not be afraid and do not be dismayed... (1 Chron.28:20a). I think that is good advice for us today. When we are doing the Lord's work, we need just to let go and "do it"! What can help us in this? David gives the answer in the second half of the verse. Do not be afraid...for the Lord God, even my God, is with you. He will not leave you or forsake you, until all the work for the service of the house of the Lord is finished (1 Chron.28:20b). What makes us hold back? Is it fear? Is it a lack of experience in dealing with others on matters of God? Is it a lack of understanding? David had some extraordinary events in his life when he walked with God. David knew what he was talking about when he gave us the two reasons we should just do it! The first is that God is with you! We should never forget that. I'm sure David told Solomon that many times as he was growing up, yet here he is being told again. The second reason is that God will not leave us or forsake us! No matter our struggle, no matter our failure, God will never leave us. Imagine what He will do for us when we are doing Kingdom work!

Relationships Over the next few weeks, I'm going to emphasize some of the thoughts & ideas from our Relationships Matter Conference. This week we continue a 4 part series on Loving Your Step Children... This week... *Hugs and Stepkids* By Chris J. Gonzalez

Ben felt awkward around his 16-year-old stepdaughter, Morgan. It seemed her body stiffened every time he tried to hug her. He figured that after three years they would've made some progress in getting closer. From Morgan's perspective, although she thought Ben was a decent person, she just couldn't think of him as family. Hugging him felt weird, like hugging a gym teacher.

Of all the dynamics in a stepfamily, navigating the relationship with an opposite-gender stepchild is one of the most challenging — especially when the child is a teen. It can feel like a constantly changing game of "how to get close without getting too close."

Research shows that stepchildren, especially stepdaughters, prefer verbal affection over physical affection from opposite-gender stepparents. They may become more comfortable with physical touch as the relationship matures.

When showing affection to your stepchild, there are a few guidelines to keep in mind:

Respond to touch Let the stepchild initiate touch and then respond. Stepchildren need time to define their relationship with their stepparents, and physical space is the most tangible way to accomplish this.

<u>Touch in kind</u> When a child initiates touch as a way to display affection, responding at the same level of touch is best. If your step-daughter gives you a playful punch on the arm, it's not permission to give her a big hug.

Hold your I love you's close Saying those words can feel closer and more intimate than a hug — and therefore can feel too imposing. Instead, reserve the I love you as a response you hope you get to use one day. Until that day comes, find alternatives that communicate the message. When your stepchild succeeds or does something worthy of praise, put your voice to it. No one tires of well-placed and authentic praise. Detecting when something troubles your stepchild is an important skill that communicates your care and concern. Empathy and a willingness to listen go a long way toward building the relationship.

Even through the complexities and ambiguities, it's possible for stepparents and stepchildren to grow close — but it's a slow process that requires patience and humility.

Andrew Jackson is credited with this adage: "One man with courage is a majority." To be courageous is to have the spirit that enables you to face pain, difficulty, or danger within fear. It is akin to bravery. Courage is acting in accordance to your beliefs, especially in spite of criticism.

Daniel is among the greatest examples in scripture of one displaying true courage. He determined in his heart not to defile himself by eating and drinking that which was provided by the king. He held to his convictions. It paid off. God gave him knowledge and skill in all literature and wisdom, as well as understanding in all visions and dreams. (Dan. 1:17). This really worked to Daniel's advantage throughout the book.

Daniel was also aware of the royal statute which read: "If anyone petition any other god or man other than King Darius for the next thirty days, let them be thrown into the den of lions." Daniel went that very day to his upper room with his windows open toward Jerusalem and fervently prayed to the true God of heaven. He knew the cost. (Dan. 6:20)

Perhaps we need to check on our own conviction regarding what we believe. We will stand strong, without fear, through difficult and critical times.

I thought it would be easy: I would be nice, and my stepkids would like me. I would make their favorite meals and agonize over their Christmas gifts.

I did nice. It didn't work.

The problem? The harder I tried, the more I was ignored. Then I went to my stepson Jeremy's hockey game in my true stepmom-of-the-year form, and cheered him on. When I shouted, "Great game!" he completely ignored me.

I cried and sulked. Then I asked a friend for advice. She said, "Like comes later. First, earn their respect."

The next day, I spoke with Jeremy, "Hey, Jer, I love cheering for you at your games, but I don't like being ignored. So I'm not going to go to your games anymore until you tell me you'd like me to come." Jer shrugged, "OK with me. I don't want anyone there who doesn't want to be there."

"That's the problem; I do want to be there. But I can't stand being disrespected, and I can't watch it happen to your dad."

That conversation changed our relationship — for the better.

For over a month, I didn't go to the rink — until one day I drove Jeremy to a game. "Are you going to watch?" Jeremy asked as he got his gear out of the minivan.

Afterward, I said, "Good game." Jer simply said, "Thanks."

As much as I wanted my stepkids to like me, I needed — and they needed — to know that we respected each other. Once I established respect, I could finally develop a relationship with them. Not just as the woman who married their dad, but as someone who was on their side, who was supporting them.

Years later, I've gotten more than I hoped for — not only do they respect me, but they also love me. I just had to get over not being liked.



BECOMING A FRUIT BEARING TREE!

My Dad grew up in East Texas surrounded by good, fruit bearing peach trees. By the time I came along, we were living in the gulf coast area. I can remember him trying his best to get his peach trees to bear fruit, but he never had much luck down south. He always had good gardens, so I knew he had a green thumb; but those peach trees gave him fits. Jesus had a thing or two to say about bad bearing fruit trees, but Jesus was talking about bearing spiritual fruit. Bearing spiritual fruit comes in different forms, from the fruits of the Spirit (Gal.5), to being like Barnabas, the Son of Encouragement (Acts 4), or becoming an incredible soul winner like Paul. Jesus gave us two conditions to bearing fruit. First, you need to be a "good tree"! For no good tree bears bad fruit, nor again does a bad tree bear good fruit (Luke 6:43). A good tree has a stable base, with a good root system that is able to draw nourishment from the ground. It is the same in bearing fruit. We need to have a stable foundation in the Lord and draw nourishment from His word! Secondly, you need to be a good tree with a good heart! The good person out of the good treasure of his heart produces good...for out of the abundance of the heart, his mouth speaks (Luke 6:45). Good fruit comes from "good hearts". Do you guard your heart? What does your speech say about your heart? Are you bearing much fruit?

Relationships... Some Great Thoughts from When Bob Became Dad by Carole Taylor... I slammed the front door of the house, walked toward my car . . , and spotted him in the passenger's seat. "Oh no. You are not going with me," I said as I reached for the passenger door. Bob smiled and pushed down the lock. Oh yes I am. How did it get to this? I was 18 years old, a full-fledged adult. I certainly didn't need my stepfather baby-sitting me on my drive cross-country. Didn't he know that I had never liked him?

Our roadtrip Fine, I thought. I got in the car and backed out of the driveway, turning the music up loud. If we were going to drive 2,000 miles together, I was going to make the trip as miserable as possible for him. Bob was unmoved. He never lost his temper or spoke a harsh word. But he'd always been that way, I met Bob when I was 12 years old. My biological dad walked out on us when my mom was pregnant with their fourth child. It was the '60s, and divorce carried a social stigma. Considering the sheer workload of taking care of four children, my mom did a wonderful job.

My mom's husband Just over a year after the divorce. Mom went on her first date with Bob. On that evening, she introduced him to the baby. On the second date, she introduced him to the 5-year-old. The next date, she brought me out. Bob smiled and looked at Mom. "Come on now; bring out all the children. I want full disclosure!" With that, Mom introduced him to my older brother, too. For whatever reason, Bob didn't leave. A year later, they were married. I didn't like him. I figured as long as he was in our home, my dad wouldn't be able to return. My brother and I conspired to drive him away — just kid stuff such as hiding things or being "forgetful" about anything he asked us to do. But he wouldn't budge in his love and care for us. "You can do these things," he would say, "but I am not leaving. Your mom and I are in this for life." And he was. Bob loved my mother and loved us. He was consistent, kind and gracious. He showed up for things that mattered and celebrated our accomplishments. He seemed unmoved by our hatred, pouring only love into our world.

My journey When young military guys moved in next door, I knew Bob was worried. He had every right to be. Pretty soon I was smitten with one of the young men — and when he moved to Wisconsin from California, I was determined to follow. I had graduated from high school. I was an adult — no one was going to change my mind. Which brings me to the day I walked out to my car and found my stepdad in the passenger seat. He didn't stop me from going, but he wasn't going to let me drive alone. I don't think I spoke two words to him the entire trip. I was fuming. How dare he? Once I arrived safely, he wished me well and boarded a plane back to California. It was only six weeks later when I realized what a horrible error I had made. I called home, sobbing. Bob answered the phone. "I made a mistake," I said. "Can I please come home?" Bob could have said a thousand different things, but he said the one thing my teenage heart needed: "I'll be on the next flight."

My stepdad Using their hard-earned vacation money, Bob booked a flight and arrived in Milwaukee later that day. We packed my stuff and started home. No blaring radio on this trip. I spent the first 1,000 miles of our drive home telling him all that had happened, and we spent the next 1,000 miles talking and laughing. It was the turning point in our relationship. Today, I call Bob "Dad." He is 80 years old, and we've shared 40 years together. He and my mom live down the road, and we visit together regularly. He is a treasured part of my life, Now I know. When Bob promised that he was in this for life, he meant it.





DADDY, LET ME DO IT!

Do you remember when your children were growing up, and they hit that stage of development where they wanted to do everything for themselves? Even though you knew they could not do it you stepped back and let them fail knowing that growth would come through those failures. Remember, God always allowed His people to fail when they chose to not follow Him. Consider Moses' words to the Israelites as the Red Sea was in front of them and Pharaoh's army was behind them, Fear not, stand firm, and see the salvation of the Lord,...The Lord will fight for you, and you have only to be silent (Ex.14:13-14). It was time for the Israelites to quit complaining, put their faith in God, and let God work for them. It seems that they had forgotten all the miracles God provided for their escape from Egypt. God has always had to remind His people to never forget the great things he has done for them! This was a reoccurring problem for them. Consider Moses' words to them as that first generation struggled after the report of the 12 spies. Do not be in dread of them...The Lord your God who goes before you will himself fight for you, just as he did for you in Egypt before your eyes (Deut.1:29-30). The Israelites were better when their trust was in God and not themselves! Have we learned anything from them? Are you standing firm and letting God fight for you? Are you growing?

Over the last few weeks I have visited with several people who are struggling over the loss of their loved ones. The struggle is real. It is my hope & prayer that over the next few weeks, these words about grief may be able to bring you some comfort and hope.

Coping with Death and Grief by Patricia Johnson.

Death is inevitable, yet the loss of a close friend or family member always showers us with a range of emotions. One day we might desperately try to avoid the pain, anxiety and feelings of helplessness we feel when a loved one dies. Other days, we feel like life has returned to normal—at least until we realize that our life has changed irrevocably.

Despite the gamut of emotions we feel, grieving for a loved one helps us cope and heal. The intense, heart-breaking anguish indicates that a deep connection has been severed. Without a doubt, grieving is painful. But it is also necessary.

Going forward doesn't mean forgetting about the loved one who died. Enjoying life again doesn't imply that the person is no longer missed. Piecing together your shattered emotions doesn't mean you, somehow, betray a friend or family member. It simply means that your grief has run its course.

While no single pathway through grief exists, people do share common responses. In 1969, psychiatrist Elisabeth Kübler-Ross introduced what became known as the "five stages of grief," which represent feelings of those who have faced death and

Based on her years of working with terminal cancer patients, Kübler-Ross proposed the following pattern of phases many people experience:

Denial: "This can't be happening to me."

Anger: "Why is this happening? Who is to blame?"

Bargaining: "Make this not happen, and in return I will ."

Depression: "I'm too sad to do anything."

Acceptance: "I'm at peace with what has happened."

Although these are common responses to loss, there is no structure or timetable for the grieving process. That said, understanding grief and its common symptoms are helpful when grieving. Recognizing the difference between trauma and depression is also beneficial.

Besides understanding how stress can take a toll on us physically, emotionally and spiritually, we need to understand the practical guidelines to ease the process. These include taking care of our bodies, spending time with others and reaching out to the church community.

Finally, there will come a time when someone close to us experiences a significant loss. Knowing how to respond to a grieving friend is a good first step in acting as a



BEING THANKFUL FOR THE THESSALONIANS!

It makes me feel good when someone tells me how thankful they are for me. We need to hear that more often in the church today. Paul gave thanks for the church in Thessalonica. Let's look at what he wrote to them and see why Paul appreciated them so much. I believe it will help us in our walk today. We give thanks to God always for all of you, constantly mentioning you in our prayers, remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ (1 Thess.1:2-3). First, Paul was grateful for their work of faith. Their faith was a response to their trust in God. Paul knew that faith always expressed itself in action. The Thessalonians had an active, working, faith. Secondly, Paul was grateful for their labor of love. God loves us in spite of our unworthiness, and that is the kind of love we should express to others. Just as faith motivates action, love does the same. Notice how Paul uses the term labor. It means we love even when it becomes difficult and tiresome. Thirdly, Paul was grateful for their steadfast hope in Jesus. We sometimes struggle with the day-to-day building of our faith. Hope gives us that fuel we need to be more consistent in our faith. Remember, our hope in Jesus will not be met quickly; it will come sometimes in the future! Are you the kind of person that people are always thanking God for?

Sharing a Burden...

Over the last few weeks I have visited with several people who are struggling over the loss of their loved ones. The struggle is real. It is my hope & prayer that over the next few weeks, these words about grief may be able to bring you some comfort and hope. Understanding the Grieving Process By Patricia Johnson

"Grief is a journey, often perilous and without clear direction," writes author Molly Fumia. "The experience of grieving cannot be ordered or categorized, hurried or controlled, pushed aside or ignored indefinitely. It is inevitable as breathing, as change, as love. It may be postponed, but it will not be denied."

Fumia says it well. When it comes to grieving the death of a loved one, there are no linear patterns, no "normal" reactions, no formulas to follow. The word "grief" is derived from the French word "grève," meaning a heavy burden. Indeed, the physical, emotional, psychological and spiritual implications can be overwhelming.

While grief is an expected response to a significant loss, the unfamiliar emotions that arise can lead to feelings of helplessness, fear and isolation.

Following a death, everyone works through these stresses differently. Some are instantly devastated; others feel numb and disconnected. Some withdraw socially, while others reach out for support. What's more, just when the initial shock begins to subside, a deeper sense of reality and despair sets in. Those who grieve may need to learn new skills, adopt different habits and adjust to daily life without the physical presence of the person who died.

Although grieving is an individual experience, there are symptoms many people share after suffering personal loss:

Feels physically drained

- Can't sleep at night
- Forgetful and unable to think clearly
- Noticeable change in appetite
- Physical distress such as chest pains, headaches or nausea
- Stays extremely busy to avoid thinking about his or her
- Eats, drinks, watches television, etc. excessively
- Participates in harmful activities
- Senses or dreams about the deceased
- Becomes withdrawn, lonely and apathetic
- Frequent sighing and crying



THE RIGHT BREAD: THE WRONG REASONS!

I am the bread of life (Jo.6:35). Jesus said this to a large crowd that was seeking him out after He had fed the 5,000. Even though they were seeking the right thing, Jesus told them that their attitude was wrong. Learning from their mistakes then, will help us today as we seek Jesus. Jesus said they had wrong motives. They were looking for the daily physical bread for their bodies and not the spiritual bread they needed. They needed nourishment for their souls. By seeking the physical, they missed the true meaning of the miracle; Jesus is the supplier of much more than just physical life. Do not labor for food that perishes, but for the food that endures to eternal life (Jo.6:27). Jesus also said they had a wrong method. They wanted a list of rules and regulations (6:28) in order to gain favor with God. They felt that meeting certain rules would put God in obligation to them. Jesus told them, This is the work of God, that you believe in him who he has sent (Jo.6:29). Accepting Jesus as the Son of God and trusting in the promises He made to us is the key to our obedience of the gospel. People don't do great works to gain recognition; they do great works to imitate Jesus! Jesus also said that they had a wrong request. Then what sign do you do, that we may see and believe you (10.6:30)? Isn't that just like man? Even though they had the Son of God standing before them, even though they had just witnessed a great miracle, they wanted to see one more sign! For many, it is the same way today. It is selfishness when we make these demands of God. When we do that, we are withholding their loyalty and discipleship. It is a dangerous game to play. Are you seeking the right bread?

Sharing a Burden...

Although grieving is an individual experience, there are symptoms many people share after suffering personal loss:

- Feels physically drained
- Can't sleep at night
- Forgetful and unable to think clearly
- Noticeable change in appetite
- Physical distress such as chest pains, headaches or nausea
- Stays extremely busy to avoid thinking about his or her grief
- Eats, drinks watches television, etc. excessively
- Participates in harmful activities
- Senses or dreams about the deceased
- Becomes withdrawn, lonely and apathetic
- Frequent sighing and crying

Although these are common responses to loss, there is no structure or timetable for the grieving process. That said, understanding grief and its common symptoms are helpful when grieving. Recognizing the difference between trauma and depression is also beneficial.

Besides understanding how stress can take a toll on us physically, emotionally and spiritually, we need to understand the practical guidelines to ease the process. These include taking care of our bodies, spending time with others and reaching out to the church community.

Finally, there will come a time when someone close to us experiences a significant loss. Knowing how to respond to a grieving friend is a good first step in acting as a reliable companion.

The death of a loved one is a shattering experience with far-reaching implications. As difficult as the loss may be, it is possible to move forward with hope for the future.



It is my hope & prayer that over the next few weeks, these words about grief may be able to bring you some comfort and hope. Grief, Trauma or **Depression?** By Patricia Johnson

After a loved one dies, those who grieve may find it difficult to function in everyday situations. Lingering emotional turmoil, a sense of shock and social withdrawal are painful but natural reactions.

Despite these expected symptoms, is it possible to become "stuck" in grief? What if the loss prompts thoughts of self-harm or even suicide? And how can trauma affect the healing process?

Symptoms of grief, depression and trauma can resemble one another. In order to respond to these symptoms appropriately and move on with life, it is crucial to understand the differences.

When Grief Becomes Clinical Depression

It's not unusual for those who grieve to feel despondent, empty and anxious. Grief encompasses different emotions for different people, and it takes time to adjust to the loss and any accompanying changes.

Sometimes, though, the depressive state doesn't diminish over time and continues to disrupt everyday life. This may be an indicator of a depressive disorder.

According to the American Cancer Society, about one in five bereaved people will develop major depression. ¹It is difficult to predict whose grief will or won't turn into depression following the death of a loved one. However, the following risk factors may increase the likelihood:

- History of depression
- Little previous experience with death
- No support network
- Intense depressive reactions early in the grieving process
- Prior issues with alcohol or drug abuse





WHAT LOVE CAN DO!

In John 13, we read the story of Jesus washing His disciples' feet. It is a powerful message that Jesus gave them by this humble act. I also believe that Jesus was giving them a preview of the cross with this act of love. By washing their feet, Jesus showed them that love overcomes evil. We need to remember that Jesus also washed the feet of one who would betray him (Judas) and also one who would deny him (Peter), yet Jesus did not withhold His love for them. It is possible to grieve without being depressed. That said, there is a difference between the sadness of grief and the unrelenting numbness of depression. Here are signs indicating that a grieving person may also be depressed:

- Shows symptoms of grief for four or more months with no sign of improvement
- Prolonged or severe inability to function at home, work and/or school
- Stays in bed all day, doing nothing
- Thinks of suicide and/or has a preoccupation with death
- Speaks and moves slowly
- Hallucinates, which may or may not relate to the deceased
- Feels worthless

If symptoms persist—and especially if suicidal thoughts occur—it is imperative to reach out to a family doctor, counselor or pastor. Those with depression will not simply "snap out of it." However, depression is highly treatable, and with competent care a healthy life can be restored.







Losing a loved one in a sudden or unexpected way—a car accident, heart attack, murder or suicide—may result in a traumatic reaction that hinders the grieving process. This sense of shock can also occur when the death is expected, as in the case of a long illness.

If a person is run down psychologically, suffers from anxiety or depression or has endured previous traumatic experiences, it's more difficult to handle another setback. As a result, additional grief symptoms can be unbearable. In order to cope, the traumatized individual may attempt to avoid grieving altogether.

The National Center for Posttraumatic Stress Disorder highlights broad types of symptoms that differentiate trauma from grief:

- Re-experiencing Symptoms: Mentally replays the trauma while awake or asleep
- Avoidance Symptoms: Avoids trauma-related activities, places, thoughts or feelings
- Numbing Symptoms: Loss of emotions, especially positive ones
- Arousal Symptoms: Difficulty concentrating and sleeping, and a heightened sense of being on guard


Over time, if symptoms continue to influence life at work and home, <u>counseling is advised</u>. In addition to support groups, treatments that are both comforting and effective are available. Grieving the loss may be painful, but it is necessary to allow healing to occur.

Psalm 40 is written by David and is quoted in Heb. 10:5-7 where Jesus is credited with speaking from it. It opens with this, I waited patiently for the Lord; he inclined to me and heard my cry (40:1). Many are longing for a better world to live in and say they are ready for Jesus to come again. But, our lot in life is to live here and continue in the work of the Lord. This psalm gives some benefits of waiting patiently on the Lord. First, God will be inclined to us. Barnes, in his commentary, said God will "turn himself favorably toward us". It is a picture of a father that is leaning toward his child eager to hear his child and help. Sharing a Burden...

Over the last few weeks I have visited with several people who are struggling over the loss of their loved ones. The struggle is real. It is my hope & prayer that over the next few weeks, these words about grief may be able to bring you some comfort and hope.

Helping Loved Ones Grieve By Patricia Johnson

When someone we love is grieving the death of a friend of family member, it's a challenge to know what to do. We want to say the right thing, show support and ultimately help in the healing process. Yet all too often, we end up awkwardly offering advice, sputtering a spiritual rationalization or avoiding the situation altogether. Sara Alcoran can relate. She remembers the early morning phone call, the immediate sense of dread, the sorrow in her husband's voice when he said, "Dad is gone."

She remembers hastily packing up her infant daughter and speeding to the fire station where Linus worked.

"When I saw him, all I could do was hug him and cry," says Sara, a 30-year-old stay-at-home mom. "I had no idea what to say." Like Sara, all of us try to be effective comforters but may find ourselves coming up short. Still, there are specific ways we can respond when those we love lose someone close to them.

Acknowledging the Loss

In an instant, the death of a loved one turns life upside-down.

Emotions are piqued and responsibilities are overwhelming, making it tough to know when to reach out and when to give space.

"I believe it is more helpful to acknowledge the loss," says Ann Kihara, a licensed marriage and family counselor in Pacific Grove, Cali. "You can even simply say, 'I'm so sorry for your loss.' "

Over the last few weeks I have visited with several people who are struggling over the loss of their loved ones. The struggle is real. It is my hope & prayer that over the next few weeks, these words about grief may be able to bring you some comfort and hope.

Helping Loved Ones Grieve By Patricia Johnson

Although the initial contact may feel nerve wracking, take a first step by promptly making a call, writing a letter or paying a visit. Kihara cites other explicit do's and don'ts when standing alongside someone in pain: "It's unhelpful, even callous, to say things like, 'This is God's will,' 'They would not want you to cry,' or 'They are in a better place.'" Kihara reasons, "We cannot presume to know the will of God nor the emotional state of our loved one who is grieving."

Instead, here's what you can do:

Be there to listen. "It's always tempting to give advice, but don't," Kihara says. True empathy, encouragement and compassion will help those going through a difficult time.

Encourage professional help if necessary. If you feel your loved one is unable to cope alone, gently recommend that he or she seek professional help. Providing a list of area grief counselors may expedite the

State specifically how you're able to help. Offer to prepare a meal, provide a ride, or help clean and sort through old items. Be sensitive to your friend's feelings and proactive when it comes to meeting needs. Remind your loved one to take time out to rest, and to hold off on any major life decisions. It is undoubtedly draining to adjust to a loss and this impairs the ability to think clearly and make decisions.

Reach out when your friend most misses a loved one. "Holidays and anniversaries will often trigger the grief response—even many years later," says Kihara. "Those are good times to be extra supportive and loving." When it comes to helping a loved one cope with loss, Renee Mahdavi knows what it's like to be on the receiving end. After experiencing several miscarriages, Renee acknowledges the importance of validating the loss itself.

"I think the most valuable support we can possibly offer is to be there just be there—and be willing to not 'fill the space' with our words," says Renee. "There are few things more powerful than knowing we are loved and supported through the valleys of life."



WHY WE PRAISE GOD!

In class last week, we looked at Psalm 118, one of the "Hallel" or praise psalms. In getting ready for that class, I looked at all of those psalms (113-118). I wanted to share with you some thoughts from Psalm 114. It gives us some reasons why we need to praise God. First we praise God because He is for us! When Israel went out from Egypt...(114:1), Israel's exodus from Egypt is mentioned many times in the Psalms. It is a story of God delivering his people. He is there for us today too. Anytime someone is trying to escape the bondage and entrapment of sin, God is there to deliver. If God is for us, who can stand against us? Secondly, we praise God because He is with us! Judah became his sanctuary... (114:2a). Is there any greater peace than knowing that God is dwelling among us? Do we forget that? God has always wanted to be our God and us to be his people. Thirdly, we praise God because He is over us! Judah became his sanctuary, Israel his dominion (114:2). God's people have always struggled with letting God have reign over them. I don't think we have changed that much over the years. The church is still his kingdom, we are still his subjects, and the God still has all authority. He is our king. Lastly, we praise God because He is before us! Tremble, O earth, at the presence of the Lord, at the presence of the God of Jacob (114:7). The enemies of God's people trembled at the presence of God. People knew and heard how God was working for his children. Will he not do the same for us?

A Social Media Heart Check by Kim Cash Tate Modal

Am I Walking by the Spirit?

Social media is robust with real-time engagement. Timelines are filled with reaction and raw emotion. Opinions are wielded like swords. Political and popular figures are skewered with aplomb. It's easy to step into this fast-moving current and get carried by the flesh.

Social media enlivens our carnal nature. We enjoy quick satisfaction. Emotion wants an outlet. Complaints must be heard. Anger needs to be expressed. And contrary views must be vigorously opposed, because that's what the flesh enjoys as well — superiority. It will mow down another's views — succinctly if on Twitter — while elevating its own, earning a satisfying flurry of shares and retweets. We all know how much the flesh loves validation.

Walking by the flesh may be an accepted norm on social media, but it's not possible to please God in the flesh (Romans 8:8). As believers, we're called to die to those carnal impulses and walk by the Spirit, perhaps especially on social media, given its reach and impact. We should ask ourselves if our posts are gracious and edifying. Am I slow to speak? Are love and kindness reflected? Am I blessing or cursing

"Only as we walk by the Spirit in the social media sphere can we make an impact there for Christ."

Even when our posts are grounded in truth, our heart attitude in sharing that truth is key. Is it about me and my need to be right? Is the Lord being glorified? It's a daily battle, flesh against Spirit. "For these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do" (Galatians 5:17). This battle is amplified on social media, and yet, social media is where we can also shine brightly for Christ.

We can point people to Jesus with the light of our lives, with eternal truth, and with grace-filled interactions. People are watching. Only as we walk by the Spirit in the social media sphere can we make an impact there for Christ. (To be continued)





Am I Bragging?

Somehow, bragging got its wings on social media. In "real life," we don't routinely unpack our awards and achievements for neighbors, coworkers, or fellow church members. We don't feel the need to share everything from compliments to the material blessings we've received. And before social media, acts of service and Bible conferences were not photo ops. But social media stokes that urge within to promote ourselves, to be seen, even to be praised.

Jesus spoke to this human urge, saying, "Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven" (Matthew 6:1). And there's this gem: "Let another praise you, and not your own mouth; a stranger, and not your own lips" (Proverbs 27:2).

It's hard. As our kids insist, "Everyone does it," And I daresay many of us have fallen prev. We're excited, in the moment, and want to share. But that's just it — we're in the moment. It's wise to step back and ask: Why am I posting this? Why did I even take a picture of this? To make myself look good? To show how many showed up for my event? To let my friends and followers know I'm "somebody"?

It's a heart posture we need to resist steadfastly. As the Son of God and Savior of the world, only Jesus had cause to exalt himself. Yet he humbled himself instead, taking on human flesh and dying on the cross. We're to have the same attitude of humility, which may be countercultural on social media — and exactly what enhances our witness as followers of Christ.

Am I Battling Envy and Discontent?

Sometimes a heart check will let us know that we need to unplug from social media, at least for a while. It may be that we're in the midst of a trying time, such that it's difficult to rejoice with others. If your marriage is troubled, joyous wedding anniversary posts may be hard to bear. If you've been praying long to get married, "We're engaged!" posts may rankle. Whatever we are lacking or perceive to be lacking, we will likely scroll past someone prospering in that very area. And if we find ourselves battling discontent or envy as a result, it's time to close the app.

Some battles don't need to be waged. We don't have to consume the lives of others through social media. And when we do, we should keep in mind that we're only seeing a small slice. often the best slice. People post about the good times, that fun family vacation with the loving husband and angelic kids. Chaos might have broken out minutes before or after the photo, but that Kodak moment is what everyone sees. Similarly, posts that highlight career and ministry successes don't often reveal the challenges and hardships.

If social media is tempting you toward discontentment, we alorify the Lord by repenting — after we log off.

If we can keep a healthy perspective and celebrate with those on our timeline, social media can be fun. But if it's tempting us toward heart attitudes that are sinful, we glorify the Lord by seeking him about those issues — after we log off.

Social media can encroach upon the "more needful" things, including the importance of simply being present with family and friends. We need to remain sensitive to the Spirit's leading as to how much time to spend on social media, and even whether it's time to deactivate.

Beau (our youngest grandson) started kindergarten this year. While he was excited to start school, it has not been as easy as he thought! You have to understand that from birth, he has been staying with Suzie until he was old enough for school. It is easy to see how school has gotten him out of his "comfort zone". For instance, since he has started school he has experienced a case of "home sickness". He has discovered that recess is too hot at times and a visit to the nurse will get him excused from that. Also, he told his mother the first week of school that he had a good day because he did not get sent to the principal's office. I will be shocked the day Beau has to be sent to the principal's office.

My point is, Beau will grow into his "comfort zone" with school. Like Beau, we need to learn to get out of our "comfort zone" in doing Kingdom work. Dealing with others mistakes, problems, and shortcomings is not comfortable work. How do we do it? Paul can help us with this instruction. Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful with thanksgiving...Walk in wisdom toward outsiders, making the best use of the time. Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person (Col.4:2,5-6). I can do all things through him who strengthens me (Phil.4:13). We can be a positive influence in this world, if we do it Jesus' way!

What LENGTHS Will You Go To?

A young boy I know, while being encouraged to eat his supper, frequently asks his parents if what he is being told to eat will make him <u>stronger</u>. A simple "yes" from his parents is all he needs to hear to convince him to eat the healthy food in question.

This young boy has learned that eating healthy foods can make him strong. And being strong (at age 4) is currently his #1 goal. In fact, he is so focused on being strong that every time I see him, he flexes his biceps and has me "feel how strong" his muscles are.

This very smart boy has such a desire to be "strong", he recently demonstrated that he was not satisfied with eating healthy foods alone to build his muscles. He must do more! From creative advertising he picked up from the looks of Mr. Clean's biceps that whatever is in that Magic Eraser must be a great way to building strong bulky muscles (more than what eating those healthy foods was doing, anyway). So, what does he do?! What any four-year-old would do! By generously rubbing a MAGIC ERASER on your muscles, in a matter of time, you will have strong muscles as bulky as Mr. Clean. So, obvious! 



Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts (3:15). Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly (3:16). Do everything in the name of the Lord (3:17). Our "new life" with Christ should certainly look different than our old life before Christ. A new life calls for new thinking, a new heart, and a sincere love for mankind. A new life calls for the peace we get from Christ and a soft heart for God's word. How much of our life does Christ want to rule? All of it!



We should leave no doubt in their minds that we care for them. To represent Christ, we need to use our speech for good and not bad. Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt... (Col.4:6). Our speech can be a destructive tool if we are not careful. Let's make sure we use it for building up and not tearing down. Are you showing Christ by your prayer life, your wisdom, and your speech?

One of the hardest things Paul wrote was, Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ (1 Cor. 11:1). Christ is our supreme example of who we are to imitate and one of his hardest traits to follow is loving like Jesus did. Consider Jesus' act of washing His disciple's feet (Jo. 13:1-20). Looking at this act shows us the way in which we are to love one another. First, our love for one another should not be overcome by evil. During supper, when the devil had already put it into the heart of Judas...to betray him (Jo.13:2), Jesus knew that Judas would betray Him. He knew Peter would deny Him and He knew His disciples would flee from the garden. Yet, Jesus still washed their feet. Do we show that kind of love when someone hurts us? Secondly, our love for one another should not be limited by social classes. Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going back to God (Jo. 13:3). One of Jesus' greatest traits was that He loved those that society turned its back on. Jesus looked to the heart rather than the appearance. Thirdly, our love for one another should be a love of action. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet (Jo.13:5). Jesus took on the role of a servant when nobody else had the humility to do it. The disciples could argue over position, but not over a towel. Do you try to love like Jesus?







There is no faithfulness or steadfast love, and no knowledge of God in the land (Hos.4:1). 




