THE ASSEMBLY


Ken Joines, a faithful Christian who I am privileged to call my friend, has preached the gospel for nearly all of his life and for many years was the much loved preacher for the Goodman Oaks church in Southhaven, Mississippi. Although Ken is somewhat "retired" now, he is busy all the time with preaching by appointment, writing, and doing good. He has printed a paper called "Ken's Newsletter" for the last three years and recently he published an article entitled "The Assembly" that provoked some thoughts with me that I want to share with you. Ken began his article with biblical statements that emphasize the assembly of the church such as, "they came together," "when the whole church comes together ...," "they came together on the first day of the week," and "do not stop assembling together." How do you feel about the assembly? Many of us grew up being taught that the assembly was important ... and so it is. There is something God intends for us to get from the assembly that is uplifting, edifying, and profitable. In Hebrews 10:22-24, the writer gives us three wonderful things that are accomplished by the church in assembly: (1) the praise of God (22); (2) the remembrance of Christ (23); and the encouragement of each other (24). No wonder the

inspired writer said, "Do not stop assembling together" (Hebrews 10:25). Being together as "the whole church" (I Corinthians 14:23) to sing together, to pray together, to commune together, to give together, and to listen together "causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love" (Ephesians 4:16). A lot of folks think they have come up with clever alternatives to the assembly, but my question is: are the alternatives promoted by some increasing our Bible knowledge, our genuine spirituality, our growth into the image of Christ, our ability to recognize and follow truth, the general growth of the church and our ability to keen the saved? I know this for sure: when one misses the assembly on a regular basis he has taken the first steps toward drifting away from the Lord; when one because of illness is prevented from being a part of the assembly over a period of time, it is not unusual for them to say that the worst part of it all was missing "going to church"; and when a congregation demonstrates the most apparent signs of spiritual health, the assembly is emphasized in that church. Let's have the attitude of David who said, "I was glad when they said unto me, 'Let us go into the house of the Lord'" (Psalm 122:1) Thanks, Ken, for prompting these thoughts.

I AM AMAZED

Some might think I am legalistic. Others might say I am radical. Still others might show greater kindness and simply dismiss me as "one of those conservatives." I would rather think of myself as moderate. I still believe the Bible is the inspired Word of God which is our standard of authority in religion. I still believe that we must have biblical authority for what we believe and practice. I still believe we should respect the silence of Scripture. And I still believe that the appeal to be simply Christians and members of the church of the New Testament is desirable, practical, and possible. However, I do try to be tolerant, kind, and loving toward those who disagree with me. Having said all that, I want to add that I am amazed at what people do in religion. I am amazed by the use of cute and clever religious clichés that have no basis in Scripture. For example, I noticed this year more than usual the church billboards and car bumper stickers which read, "Happy Birthday, Jesus." Now, I'm

not really trying to be a Scrooge, but consider the facts. We do not know the time of year that Jesus was born. Jesus never asked anyone to remember his birth. He did, however, ask his followers to remember his death and we know that the first century church honored Jesus' request by observing the Lord's Supper every first day of the week. So what do religious people do today? They observe Jesus' birth and fail to observe the Supper except when they choose to do so. How strange! Then people in the church decide that Scripture can be changed to mean what it was never intended to mean, that God will accept whatever we offer to Him, and that if the Bible does not specifically forbid an action then that action is acceptable. Strange indeed! I am amazed at the way people reason in religion. If many of these folks reasoned in other areas of their lives as they do in religion they would lose their jobs, ruin their health, and be bankrupt. - Jay Lockhart Interesting! Alarming! Who cares?

PLURALISM

The dictionary defines "pluralism" as "a theory that there are more than one or more than two kinds of ultimate reality." In our politically correct and anything goes culture, many are buying into pluralism. It is good that the dictionary includes "theory" in its definition because pluralism is a theory and it cannot stand up under the searchlight of investigation. I grant the fact that in the arena of human judgment there is room for a diversity of opinion. For example, in our economy there is room for diversity in deciding what brands we will eat, wear, drive, or live in and one may be as good as another. However, note that the dictionary includes in its definition of "pluralism" the words "more than one or more than two kinds of ultimate reality." the key is: "ultimate reality." It is here that pluralism fails. Let's look at the matter of origins. Either the universe and man came into being by the creative act of God or in some other way (perhaps by a "big bang" and organic evolution). Pluralism would affirm both positions of equal value and "reality," but opposite or contradictory

positions cannot both be true. Consider mathematics. Two plus two equals four and two plus two equals five are not two kinds of "ultimate reality." In science H₂0 is water and is not sulfuric acid, and to say it is doesn't make it so. The same is true in religion. Either Jesus Christ was bodily raised from the dead or he was not, but both points of view are not "ultimate reality." Jesus is the one and only way to God, as taught in John 14:6, or there is another way to God, as taught by Islam, but both views are not correct. Either what we believe, teach, and practice must be in harmony with Scripture or we are free to introduce our opinions and preferences, but both positions are not "reality." Either how we worship matters or it doesn't, but both positions are not correct. Either baptism is a burial in water for the forgiveness of sins or it doesn't matter what the action is or what the purpose is, but there is not "some good in both positions." Can we not see that in "ultimate reality" there is really no place for pluralism no matter how much we might like to think there is? - Jay Lockhart


"WHERE THERE IS LIFE THERE IS REPETITION"

In religion God wants us to know his Word and he holds us responsible not only for what we know but also for what we should have found out. In Matthew 11:20-24 Jesus upbraided the cities in which he had done most of his teaching and miracles because they did not believe him. He said it would be more tolerable in the day of judgment for those who never had the opportunity to hear his word than for those who heard and rejected that word. Jesus held those cities responsible for what they knew and for what they could have found

to find out what you need to know or to seek to prove what you want to believe? What else do you read? Do in every field ... and that's okay. However, there are some you read books that fortify faith or books that create doubts and damage faith? Have you ever read any of the classic books written in days gone by that deal with many of the issues that trouble the church today? Books like M.C. Kurfees' Instrumental Music In Worship or F.E. Wallace's God's Prophetic Word, or James DeForest Murch's Christians Only? Never heard of these? These and other books available to us just may contain some answers to questions that we have no answers to and that we may feel have no answers. Questions being raised today just possibly might have been considered and answered long ago and we might do well to consider what has been said. Just because you do not know the answer doesn't mean there is no answer. And remember, God holds us responsible for what we know and for what we could have found out. What are you reading?



THE BACK BURNER

The back burner of our minds can solve many of it. life's problems if we gather the facts and variables to let

them simmer just like we do a pot of soup. Sometimes our thoughts and ideas need to be left alone to slowly cook together. We don't always have to deep fry everything!

The back burner is not an excuse to procrastinate. To put it all together, place it on the back burner and then turn the burner off is not going to help solve anything. The back burner is to gently, softly, and quietly hold the problems in your mind. It will bring out your most creative juices and your most effective source of thinking in order to work for you on those issues you have no immediate answers for. The most important part is that it offers you time to pray about it.

It's a simple technique and will help you solve many problems and greatly reduce the stress of your life.

When January began we implemented a visitation ministry through our adult Bible classes. Before we began this ministry I met with our adult teachers and education committee for 3 to 4 weeks. In these meetings I explained the mechanics of this visitation ministry. We prayed about it, we involved God in the process, and we designed the nuts and bolts of this ministry. When January rolled around we were ready to go. Since we implemented this ministry multiple members have been checked on and visited. Phone calls have been made and cards of encouragement have been sent. The main purpose of this ministry is to check on those who are absent to make sure their needs are being met, but indirectly this ministry is also geared to help maximize our attendance to our Bible school. Remember our mission statement within the Bible school ministry is: to edify the believers through a systematic study of God's Word and through our study we will also have the opportunity to

evangelize those who are lost, we can successfully grow our classes into a Great Commission model.

Teachers, I hope you are taking this visitation assignment seriously and that you are implementing it with every fiber of your body. This is serious business and it has been laid at our feet (as teachers) to implement. Please figure out a way to maximize this effort and remember to continually involve God in the process.

Just to let you know of the effects that this visitation ministry can have, let me tell you of some of the comments and observations that have come out of my classroom. First, probably 3 to 4 of my students have told me how much they appreciated the phone call, letter, e-mail or visit they received when they were absent from class. They were greatly encouraged and motivated to be sure to be in class the following week. Second, our numbers in my class have risen from about 45 to 63 in just four weeks. Eighteen people who perhaps weren't involved in a study of God's Word now have the opportunity to listen and discuss a subject that could lead them closer to God and ultimately to heaven. Teachers, God bless you as you instruct your classes.

THE LORD WHO IS FAITHFUL

In Isaiah 49 the Lord (YAHWEH or JEHOVAH), who refers to himself as "the Holy One of Israel," made some great statements and gave some wonderful promises to his Old Testament people, Israel. These statements and promises, which are highly Messianic, have meaning and application to us, his New Testament people. Notice what the Scripture says


- 1. "The Lord has called me from the womb" (49:1)
- . "From the inward parts of my mother he has made mention of my name" (49:1)
- 3. "Who formed me from the womb to be his servant" (49:5)
- 4. "I have heard you ... I have helped you ... I will preserve you" (49:8)
- 5. "He will guide them" (49:10)
- 6. "The Lord has comforted his people, and will have mercy on His afflicted" (49:13)
- 7. "I will not forget you ... I have inscribed you on the palms of my hands" (49:15, 16)

These words prompt several responses. *First*, all of those who promote "freedom of choice" and believe an

unborn child is simply a lump of protoplasm are hard pressed to explain how the Lord calls me from the womb and knows the names of the unborn as they are in the womb (1, 2, 3 above; see also Jeremiah 1:5). Second, it is most encouraging to know that God hears his people when they pray, helps his people when they are in need, and preserves his people when they are troubled (4 above). Third, it is most reassuring to know that God guides his people and that they are never forsaken (5 above). Fourth, it is good to know that the Lord comforts his people in their time of trouble and has mercy upon them when they are afflicted (6 above). Fifth, it is comforting to know that God will never forget his people and the words, "I have inscribed you on the palms of my hands" are tender reminders that they are in the thoughts of God and near to his heart (7 above). Add to this the fact that God says he is faithful (49:7) and our confidence in the words of the Lord is so great that we know we never need to be afraid.



about their needs. They need the Lord's help and teaching from week to week.





More than anything else, the story of Jesus is a love story. When Jesus described the judgment scene, he did so not in the language of theology, not in the language of piety, but in the language of relationships (Matthew 25:31-46).

Want to pass from death to life? (1 John 3:14)

How do you get into Heaven? (Matthew 25:31-46)

How do we obtain mercy? (James 2:13)

How do we grow as disciples? (Ephesians 4:15,16)



SPIRITUAL HEALTH

In today's society we are bombarded with information keeping us focused on our physical health. On a daily basis we are concerned about health issues dealing with our weight, blood pressure, cholesterol levels, physical fitness, etc... and the list never ends. The state of our physical health is important, but when compared with our spiritual health the priority of our concerns may need some reflection. As a physician a patient's physical health is of great importance and I encourage patients to be compliant with medical therapy, not to neglect preventive measures that help maintain good health, and to keep their physical health a priority. However, we have to remember that life is but a vapor and the portion of our life we spend on earth is like a blink of the eye compared to the eternal life span of our souls. Therefore, how much more concerned should we be about our spiritual health than our physical health.

Jesus has provided the example that we are to follow to ensure spiritual well being. For us to be able to follow Christ we have to be strengthened on a daily basis. A healthy prayer life and a healthy spiritual life go hand in hand. We would never expect to have a healthy marriage if we didn't have effective communication with our spouse

on a daily basis. Even more so, how can we stay in touch with our God and his will in our lives if we don't talk with him daily. Prayer is a time for us to submit ourselves to God's authority by reflecting on our priorities and realigning our life with God's will. We are instructed to pray continuously throughout our day, but we also need to have private, intimate time with purposeful prayer (Matt. 6:6-7 .. go into your inner room and when you have shut the door, pray to your Father who is in secret ... and when you are praying do not use meaningless repetitions ...). While on earth Christ was strengthened through prayer. Christ needed prayer. We need prayer.

Sometimes we cannot control what happens to our physical health despite our best efforts and intentions. Illness and death are inevitable because we live in a fallen world. If we follow the plan God has for us our spiritual health is assured. Jer. 29:11-13: "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart."

World Bible School and West Erwin

We believe as disciples of Christ that we have a charge and responsibility to carry the gospel message to others. West Erwin has many programs designed for sharing the gospel, and our mission program is an example of this. We are thankful that we are supporting mission efforts in such places as Central America. Mexico, Eastern Europe, Pennsylvania, and others. One mission work that I would like to tell you about is World Bible School at West Erwin.

Reba Sorrells and J.R. Tharpe send lessons weekly to students in such places as Nigeria, Kenya, England and South Africa. When completed lessons are returned to them, they then check the answers and return that lesson with a new lesson to the student. After completing 6 lessons, a student receives a graduation certificate. All through the lessons, the student is encouraged to obey the gospel. West Erwin pays for materials and postage. Frances McBee prepares the lessons for mailing, and Ray Womack takes them to the post office. Others that have been involved as teachers are Jane Ground. Marjorie and Victoria Moriole, Lynda Terrell and Carmen Hilliard. Aubrey Morman currently teaches World Bible School by computer.

Reba Sorrells became involved with the World Bible School while she lived in Quinlan. Reba's husband wanted to spread the gospel from his home, even though his health was not the best. He has passed away, but Reba has carried on with World Bible School. She has taught over 2600 students with many of these being led to Christ, J.R. Tharpe and Aubrey Morman have also been teaching World Bible School students for a long time and have influenced many students to obey the gospel.

West Erwin sends \$1200 each year to Nigeria for a preaching school that Reba encouraged us to support. When a student of World Bible School in Nigeria seeks additional study or baptism, contact is made by this school to the student. Many have been led to Christ and baptized as a result of this contact.

Many of us are hesitant to approach people about the gospel. The World Bible School have names just waiting for someone to teach them the gospel. It is an easy and effective way to contact people about such an important message. Elimination. It is necessary. It's also very difficult -especially for pack rats (people who collect and hoard meaningless items). Elimination becomes offensive and challenging. It's like you are asking them to do away with history!

As Christians we have a tendency to clutter our lives with meaningless activities while we neglect the more important matters like justice, mercy and faithfulness (via Matthew 23:23). Eliminating clutter in our lives rates up there with cleaning out the gutters at our house. It's needed, but easily put off. Recently, I had to remove my gutters and replace the wood trim because the cleaning out

Recently I had the opportunity to look at a study that attempted to answer this question: "What is the number one issue facing the church?" Believe it or not the number one response was unskilled leadership (referencing ministers, deacons and elders). At first I kind of resented that response mainly due to the word: unskilled. What exactly did that mean, unskilled? Within about one hour of the time that I heard about this study I found myself talking to a leader from a church that I worked with at one time in my past. He was relaying to me the decision that the elders at that particular church recently made to hire an "outreach" minister. Unbelievably, he then turns to me and said, "Doug, what exactly would an outreach minister do?" It was at that very moment that I realized what those who were surveyed meant when they said unskilled leaders. Unskilled leaders (ministers, deacons, elders) have a hard time grasping between cultural ideologies and scriptural doctrine. They struggle between tickling the ears of man rather

So, to help us with this elimination concept here is a practical exercise for you to work through while you also think about eliminating the clutter in your life. Go through your closet and pick out two articles of clothing from each member in your family that you are no longer wearing. I'm not asking you to do a spring cleaning, just two articles of clothing from each member in your family. Bring it to the foyer and we will transfer them to the benevolence center to be redistributed to others who are in need. In this practical exercise, please do not neglect the thoughts that come to mind regarding the elimination of other things that have cluttered your life and are keeping you from being a greater servant for Christ. Enjoy Sing and Pray while you work, and be thankful for all you have been given.

than holding firm to the truth of God's Word. They take a ministry and turn it into a program rather than a life altering work for the Lord. And, yes, they find terms like "outreach" hard to define

I consider Christ to be the greatest leader who ever existed. I wonder if Christ would find it hard to define "outreach." It seems to me that his whole life was geared around outreach. Let me suggest a few ways that will help you to make sure that you are never considered to be an unskilled leader:

- Involve God in your leadership role: what I mean by this
 is first and foremost pray to God that He will bless you as a
 leader.
- 2. Study to show yourself approved: Take Paul's instructions to Timothy seriously and open the Bible and wear it out to His glory.
- 3. Live out the song: O To Be Like Thee: Sing this song and really mean it. Take on the actions of Christ, the motives of Christ, and the purpose of Christ.

Perhaps if you do these three things no one will ever accuse you of being an unskilled leader.

The bomber pilots from WWII always said, "If you're catching flack it's a pretty good sign that you are over the target." In the Sermon on the Mount Jesus seemed to say the same thing, but says it this way ... "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me." In other words, persecution will be the certificate of authentic Christianity. Jesus said (John 15:20) "If they persecuted me, they will persecute you also." So what can we expect for living a life of radical purity? The Son of God was never insulated from the pain in this world. He was opposed, laughed at persecuted. Neither will we be insulated from the stress and tension in this world for being a follower of Christ Jesus. Suffering for the sake of righteousness may mean your family disowns you; it may mean you will be the brunt of jokes and sneers because you refuse to indulge in this world's

pleasures and entertainment; it may mean wives who take their children to Sunday school will be met with verbal abuse from their husbands. All in all Christians are unwelcome in Satan's villa! Expect trouble. Here's the interesting part ...how does Jesus expect His followers to react under persecution? (Mt. 5:12) "Rejoice and be glad." Sounds a bit masochistic, but we are to rejoice because we have a hope of a great inheritance ... "for great is your reward in heaven." And being glad means don't sulk, don't lick your wounds in self-pity, and don't retaliate. Expect persecution. Watch for it! It's coming! And keep your eyes on Jesus!

"Heirs Of Life Together" I Peter 3:7 Douglas L. Yates

Colossians 2:8 is an important opening that Paul (through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit) gave to the church at Colossae and to us to warn all about the wickedness of man. This warning was issued toward those in the world as well as those in the church that might be teaching falsely regarding spiritual matters. Below is the scripture (Col. 2:8) taken from the New American Standard Bible. See if Paul's warning is as applicable today as it was in the first century: "See to it that no one takes you captive through (1) philosophies and empty deception, (2) according to the traditions of men, (3) according to the elementary principles of this world ..."

Far too often the world is captured by the agenda of Satan. Satan would love to entrap all of us in this web of deceit. His main goal is to shackle us to his way of thinking and then pull us down to the fiery pits of hell with him. The world should thank Paul for this warning but instead the world has closed its eves and ears to this sound advice. But what about the body of

Christ (church), have we also closed our eyes and ears to this teaching? Recently articles of explanation have been written by some of our brothers in Christ explaining why they have decided to fellowship the denominational world in spite of their teachings which are contrary to God's Word. Some have taken simple teachings, such as, "sing and make melody in your heart..." and they have distorted them into complex and hard sayings rather than accepting them in the simplistic way in which they were written. Some have gone as far as to suggest that baptism is no longer essential to our salvation. All who would teach in such a way are being held captive to the philosophies of men, according to the tradition of men, according to the elementary principles of this world.

Let me show you a better way! It is found in the last part of Colossians 2:8 and it is Jesus Christ. He is the better way. The world may follow Satan but surely we, as Christians (His followers), will not get caught up in such philosophies and traditions that will eventually hold us captive to Satan. Christians, rise up and put on the whole armor of God. Make a stand for truth and be counted worthy.

skills - walking, talking, eating on our own, etc. - imitate: my parents, my wife, older preachers (some through imitation. But the most important imitating we'll ever do is in the spiritual area of our lives, and the ultimate role-model for this imitation is Jesus Christ. A "disciple" is not only a student, but a follower and imitator of his/her Master.

Paul told the Ephesians to "be imitators of God" (Eph. 5:1), which in our understanding of the godhead, would include Jesus. The writer of Hebrews told people to "fix your thoughts on Jesus" (Heb. 3:1), and "let us fix our eyes on Jesus" (Heb. 12:2). Peter enjoined his readers to look to Christ as He was "leaving you an example, that you should follow in His steps" (I Pet. 2:21). John plainly told his readers that "whoever claims to live in Him must Love, Keith walk as Jesus did" (I John 2:6).

Experts tell us we learn some of our most basic life I have many "heroes" that, to varying degrees I try to deceased and several still living). I even have fictional heroes - like Forrest Gump or Jack Bauer but I have to be very selective in imitating carefully selected traits, while thoroughly rejecting others. But my ultimate hero is, of course, Jesus Christ.

This happens through personal study of the Word, being taught the Word, and listening to the Word being preached.







there every time the doors are open" article! But I'm not be attending may denote a certain degree of loyalty, but hesitating to point out, with conviction, that there is a direct correlation between spiritual health and how much we attend church meetings.

Most of you are well aware that Hebrews 10:24-25 has long been our favorite "proof text" regarding church attendance. This great text tells of the purpose of church meetings, and warns to not be like those who had fallen into the habit of forsaking them.

Unfortunately some view this only as a command, neglecting the important truths that are both practical and beautiful. Others claim it only pertains to "worship assemblies," probably because a popular translation uses the word "assembling." The original Greek literally means "the meeting together of ourselves."

I want this to be more than a typical "you ought to be Attending church meetings (any and all of them) just to can fall short of what should be their purpose - "(to) let us consider how we may spur one another towards love and good deeds" (Hebrews 10:24).

> I like being at lots of church meetings, in part because I like being with people. For others, it is not so easy. Some have been conditioned to think they only need to go to church "one hour a week." Others have "a bad taste in their mouths" from church meetings that were less than they should have been. And the church can compound this problem by holding meetings that merely duplicate each other, and ignore great purposes that could and should be accomplished at church meetings.

> Let's all resolve to have the best church meetings we can, and "make the most of every opportunity" (Ephesians 5:16) by attending all we can!

GIVING

5 of 10 in a series on "Dynamic Christian Living"

You have, no doubt, heard or seen many sermons, classes, anecdotes and articles regarding giving ... It's not like it's an unaddressed subject!

Many times preachers write articles about giving to try to help the church's budget, but that's not my motive. I sincerely want to help people see how giving God's way brings many blessings, including helping one's own finances!.

God has a most unusual "economy" - those who give the most get the most! If you don't believe me then check out the numerous references to giving throughout the Bible, especially in places like Malachi, the words of Jesus, and the words of Paul in 2nd Corinthians chapters 8 and 9.

The real issue in regards to giving, the "bottom line," is faith. If we have faith to give, even when it doesn't seem logical or possible, then God will reward that faith.

Are you a "cheerful giver," i.e. are you pleased to have opportunities to give back to the Lord, as you "are prospered" (as you have income) as well as at other times? A missionary told me of attending a worship service of a relatively new congregation in Germany. He said one of the men got up and said, "Now we have come to our favorite part of the service!" He wasn't referring to the sermon or even the Lord's Supper (though each part has great importance!). He was referring to the giving. He continued by saying, "God has given us so much, and it just excites us to have the opportunity to give back to Him!" Is that the way you look at giving?

An article in National Geographic prompted this word picture.

After a forest fire in Yellowstone National Park, forest rangers were combing the mountains to assess the damage. One ranger found a bird literally petrified in ashes on the ground at the base of a tree. Somewhat sickened by the sight, he gently tapped the bird and three tiny chicks scurried from under their dead mother's wings. The chick's mother, aware of the impending danger, had carried her offspring to the base of the tree and gathered them under her wings, instinctively knowing that the heat

- 4. They Make Their Teammates More Successful: Winners are empowerers. As Charlie Brower says, "Few people are successful unless a lot of other people want them to be."

I think John Maxwell hits a homerun with these four points regarding teamwork. Let's build a great team here at West Erwin and in so doing let's continue to grow as God would have us to



FELLOWSHIP WITH CHRISTIANS

We often see the word "fellowship" and think FOOD! Biblically, that's partially true, as demonstrated in Acts 2:42-47, and in the "love feasts" referred to in 2 Peter 2:13 and Jude 1:12. But we do ourselves and the Scriptures a great disservice if we only limit fellowship to activities where we eat!

In I John 1:3, 4 the apostle succinctly points out that our fellowship is first of all with the Father and with Jesus. Then he points out how their joy will "be complete" as that fellowship is extended to more and more people.

Fellowship with Christians includes many other commands and examples we find in Scripture, such as encouraging, comforting, strengthening, bearing with one another, rebuking one another (when necessary), etc. It really means just being active in the "partnership" we share with each other in our Christian lives. Or, put another way, it means dealing with each other as fellow "members" as we live and function together in the body

of Christ, the church. It's as simple as being "a good neighbor," with the neighborhood being the church.

Fellowship with Christians often starts with group activities planned and promoted by the church, but can expand into the hospitality we extend through our homes. Modern applications can include sending cards, phone calls, encouraging e-mails, or even instant messages. (I never thought I'd pray with someone on my computer in another part of the country until I did recently by IM).

Finally ... those church fellowship meals and other gatherings ... if you're not partaking, you're shortchanging yourself of something as valuable as Bible study, worship and prayer. If you don't believe me then carefully read and think about Acts 2:42!

USING YOUR PERSONAL "GIFT(S)"

7th in a series of 10 on "Dynamic Christian Living"

We are rightly concerned about having our sins forgiven and going to Heaven. But if we stop there, we have fallen far short of what God wants us to understand, do and be!

Ephesians 2:8-10 teaches salvation by grace through faith, that we can't earn our salvation ... and ... that we are saved ("created in Christ Jesus") to work for God! To miss the point that God wants us to be busy working for Him would be missing a major part of the New Testament's message!

Remember the parable of the "talents" (Matt. 25:14-30)? A "talent" was a piece of money, but in a larger sense it is any of the natural abilities or talents God has given to each of us — our "gift" that we are to use for Him and to His glory in and for the church. The man who hid or buried his talent was not only rebuked, but what he had was taken away. It's the old "use it or lose it" principle in a spiritual setting

Some "gifts" are more visible, and therefore some think they are more important. Not true! Without all of those

supposedly lesser gifts also being employed by their faithful recipients, all of the ministries of the church, great or small, are hindered.

Look at the "gifts" mentioned in Romans 12:6-8. You are in there! Somewhere in those seven categories of "gifts" (talents, abilities) is the one or two or possibly even three areas where you (yes you!) can and should do something special for God and His church. 1 Peter 4:10, 11 teaches the same principle. Everyone has at least one special talent they can use for the Lord – to deny this is to deny Scripture!

And please, none of that "aw shucks, me?" false humility we often employ to excuse ourselves from this area of privilege and duty. There's hardly anything more satisfying in the Lord than figuring out what your "gift(s)" is (are), developing it (them) and using it (them) for Him!

The late Jim Valvano or Coach V as he was affectionately called by his players used to have a slogan that emphasized to his players from the first practice of a season until the last game of the season: "Don't give up! Don't ever give up!" That slogan became prophetic in Jim Valvano's life when he was diagnosed with cancer. He put that slogan to the test in his epic battle against this disease but on April 28, 1993 he lost that fight.

About 1 ½ months before his death at the first ESPY awards ceremony he made his now famous speech that centered on three questions: (1) Where have you been?, (2) Where are you now?, and (3) Where do you want to be in the future?

From my perspective as a Christian and from your perspective as a Christian we understand just how important those three questions are. I hope and pray that where I've been is not where I am today. With all of the Bible lessons I've been taught, with all of the sermons I've heard, and with all of the opportunities I've had to mature in Christ, it truly would be a shame if I'm still

drinking the milk of God's Word at this point in my life rather than feasting on the meat of God's Word. It is my hope and prayer that I would continue to grow (as I continue to consume His Word) until that great day when I hear: Enter In Thou Good And Faithful Servant. Anything short of hearing: enter in thou good and faithful servant means that I have failed in my ultimate battle on this earth.

There are some things that I am certain of on this earth and some things that I am not as certain of on this earth. But I feel confident to make the following statement. If we truly want to hear: enter in thou good and faithful servant then we need to be in an in-depth study of God's Word. This in-depth study shouldn't be conducted just on Sunday mornings between 9:00 a.m. through 9:45 a.m. but rather every single day of our lives. Likewise this study shouldn't be for our gratification alone but we should share the knowledge that we gain with as many as we come in contact with. So, my challenge to you is this: Don't ever quit your daily walk with God and in so doing you will be at least one step closer to hearing: enter in thou good and faithful servant. I'm looking forward to seeing you in class on Sunday.

And please notice the fabulous promise attached to this appeal - THAT AS WE SHARE OUR FAITH, WE COME TO A FULL UNDERSTANDING OF EVERY GOOD THING WE

Paul simply seems to be saying, as is a main message of the New Testament elsewhere, "Be involved with Christians and the things of the church, and you'll grow

So much of what we do at West Erwin is aimed towards this end - halleluiah!

In "part 2" next week, I plan to focus specifically on the evangelistic possibilities of this "sharing our faith." I'm glad to hear this mentioned frequently in prayers, the meetings being held concerning it, and the class planned fro the fall. I pray West Erwin is on the verge of a season of evangelistic outreach surpassing anything we've seen in a

The principle we must not miss in this passage is that faith comes from looking at GOD -- not a the mountain. Our prayers are often weak and pitiful because we focus on our own inadequacies and instead of God_s adequacies.

In my office I have a book entitled: <u>Inside The Magic Kingdom</u>. This book was written by *Tom Connellan*. Basically what the author conveys in this book is that if you are going to be successful you must take pride in what you do. Simply going through the motions, closing your eyes to programs that are failing, and just wishing that things will get better won't cut it. The Disney Corporation and Disney World are set up to give you the best product possible. We, as Christians, may not always agree with the content of their product but we certainly agree that Disney puts out a high quality product. Putting out such a high quality product doesn't just happen, it comes at a lot of sacrifice or "blood, sweat and tears" as we often say.

Let me give you two quick illustrations regarding what I am talking about: (1) did you know that each night (after Disney World closes) a crew of workers go over every inch of Disney World with paint brushes in hand to touch up any irregularities that they can find, and (2) did you know that if a Disney employee is seen walking by a piece of discarded paper and not

WORLD RADIO

For the past 44 years, World Radio has been reaching out to people who have not had access to the Gospel of Christ. Now, every week, World Radio facilitates over 400 broadcasts by 123 speakers into 62 countries in 35 different languages. The potential audience for these broadcasts is 413 million people. Many have heard and obeyed the Gospel as a result of these radio broadcasts. Local preachers are used as the speakers for these broadcasts. For example, in Guatemala City, Guatemala, Roberto Alvarez is the speaker. Roberto is also the director of the Biblical Institute of Central America in Guatemala City You may remember that West Erwin is also supporting BICA. In just the first six months of 2006, there were 11 baptisms as the direct result of the World Radio broadcasts in Guatemala City. SHARING YOUR FAITH (Part 2)

The bulletin article series on "Dynamic Christian Living"

"I pray that you may be active in sharing your faith, so that you will have a full understanding of every good thing we have in Christ" (Philemon 6).

It would be wonderful if every Christian was a motivated and skilled "personal worker," i.e. active and successful in leading others to become and remain Christians. But I have decided such is not only a fanciful notion, but isn't even Biblical!

I believe every person who has been saved by the grace of God should have a keen interest in seeing others come to faith. (If you or someone else "couldn't care less" about this, then I suggest it is time for some deep soul-searching about your/their understanding and appreciation of the gospel!)

In the list of "gifts" (Romans 12:6-8), which I believe is still totally applicable today, one of those is "teaching." It's easy to confuse this with teaching a class in our contemporary Bible school programs. However, closer consideration would reveal that kind of teaching, along with preaching, more likely falls under the category of "serving," or possibly even "prophesying," i.e., proclaiming and explaining Scripture.

This "teaching" is more likely what we today call "sharing the gospel," or "personal evangelism." I strongly believe that every Christian has been blessed to have at least one of those seven gifts mentioned in the Romans passage - but no one has them all! And we shouldn't put undue pressure or guilt on ourselves to utilize a gift we haven't been given!

You've probably seen them - those rare individuals in the church who just seem to have a "knack" for helping others become Christians. And if they're properly motivated, they have not only the heart and compassion to do this, but will also equip themselves with the knowledge of Scripture to do it right!


I believe a church that recognizes that some of its members will excel in this area, while others will serve in other ways, is on its way to a healthy approach to "sharing our faith."

SHARING YOUR FAITH (Part 3)

The bulletin article series on "Dynamic Christian Living"

I have been writing about "sharing your faith" (Philemon 6), particularly as it relates to what we call "personal evangelism." I have stated that I believe both Scripture (Romans 12:7) and logic shows that some, but not all Christians are "gifted" to excel in this area.

But before significant and ongoing local evangelism can occur, a congregation must come to a MINDSET of developing and maintaining habits and practices that foster and promote outreach. This is what I call "whole church evangelism."

Numerical growth in our churches occurs in two ways: (1) conversions, and (2) members of the Lord's church, from elsewhere placing membership. I am convinced that a church that develops a mindset that is "outreach oriented" can grow, even experience dramatic growth. But without the congregation developing this mindset throughout the membership, individual and occasional evangelistic efforts will create, at best, sporadic numerical growth.

Development of this mindset will not happen easily or quickly, but gradually with these factors present: (a) church leaders that constantly talk about and model it; (b) preaching that is evangelistic in nature; (c) special input, e.g. Classes, in-house

workshops or seminars, etc. That "equip" people for it; (d) worship services that are not only designed to "edify" members, but at the same time are welcoming and inviting to non-members. (That last one is tough, but it can be done!)

One thing that must happen is for a large part of the membership to develop and maintain the practice of constantly inviting family, friends and even strangers to our worship services. That occurs more naturally more naturally, of course, where the "atmosphere" of welcoming people, "visitor friendly" worship services, and the preaching are all conducive towards that end.

Finally, key to this concept is recognition and then utilization that some in the congregation are just better suited (gifted?) To help non-Christians become Christians. When this is recognized, frequent visitors and/or those who are interested in becoming members are naturally "funneled" towards those who can effectively teach them.







WHOLE CHURCH EVANGELISM

In recent weeks I've been writing articles and speaking on I am a big believer in the power of having prospective Sunday nights on this subject. Let me share just a few additional thoughts before we move on.

A congregation that's going to be consistently successful in reaching the lost in its locale will have to develop and maintain a mindset towards that end. This includes a constant and heightened awareness of "outsiders" meetings.

While we understand that the primary purpose of our assemblies is to edify the church, we need to realize at the same time what a powerful evangelistic tool those same meetings can be. (See 1 Corinthians chapter 14.)

This will take some work, ever rethinking how we do things. For example, many congregations think they are "loving" or "friendly," mostly because the members are so glad to see and spend time with each other. That's a good thing for visitors to see ... but we mustn't be so consumed with each other that visitors come and go with Love, Keith hardly a notice!


members visit us, hopefully frequently, before they consider conversion. (Studies have shown that those who have been with the church some before their conversion are about 10 times more likely to stay converted than those who are introduced to the church after their baptism.)

(Colossians 4:5), especially as they visit our church. So, let's always be aware that one of the simplest yet most powerful methods that all of us can do (whole church evangelism) is to be inviting people to visit our church meetings. Then once they have come, hopefully a few times, we should try to get them with one of those "gifted" Christians who is willing and able to successfully lead people to obeying the gospel (see Romans 12:6-8, especially the "teaching").

> When considering the three aspects of the church's mission (edification, benevolence and evangelism) let's work and pray to be doing all three, all the time!

YOUR PRAISE: WHAT'S IT LIKE?

Did you know that what you believe about GOD is reflected in your praise to Him? If you believe that He is your loving, patient, forgiving heavenly Father, your praise will reflect those qualities. Understanding GOD to be your loving Father will keep you eager to praise Him. On the other hand, if you believe GOD is one who sits behind the judge's bench in the courtroom waiting to condemn and sentence you for every little mistake we will be more likely to praise Him all the time. Yet, on the then you will surely avoid praising Him.

Did you know that our praise reflects the value we place on GOD? For the degree we praise Him and the things we praise Him for indicate the degree of trust and respect we have for Him. In other words, knowing GOD is not only able, but eager to help us will determine the intensity of our praise to Him. For

if we do not believe He is bigger than our problems, we will not bother to offer Him praise. Mixed emotions toward GOD will producer half-hearted faith with a reluctance to praise Him at all. Mixed emotions are like this: knowing He is capable, but believing He is unwilling to help. Therefore, know He is able and fully willing to be our GOD will help our praise be sincere and enthusiastic.

Did you know that believing GOD is interested and involved in every detail of your life will also be reflected in the frequency of your praise? When we learn to trust Him in every circumstance and that no situation will ever slip by His notice, other hand, if we believe GOD only cares about major events in our lives then our praise will surely be less frequent.

Take time to look at your life of praise. Examine the content, the intensity and the frequency of your praise to GOD. Learn to embrace Him through praise. Allow Him to transform your life and then watch how your praise changes.

During the course of that trip the train had to pass over a bridge. Unknown to the engineer, the base of that bridge had washed away in a recent flood. The engine made it across

the swollen creek but the majority of the cars did not. They fell into the river and 142 lives were lost that evening. Philip Bliss actually survived the initial fall into the swollen creek but upon hearing that his wife was not on shore, he dove back into the creek. That night the waters of that creek claimed his and his wife's life. As additional debris was pulled from the overturned cars a box was found in which this song was preserved: Hallelujah! What a Savior. Notice the last verse to this song:

"When He comes, our glorious King, all His ransomed home to bring, ruined sinners to reclaim! Hallelujah! What a Savior!"

The children's home in Nueva Rosita is actually a temporary housing facility for infants through age 18 yrs. These youngsters can no longer live in their natural homes due to various troubling circumstances. The goal of the facility is to place the children into foster or adoptive homes.

This summer our visit revealed some 15 children ranging in age from infant to 16 yrs. The facility appears to be operating at maximum capacity. The children at the home regularly attend the church where Rafael Falcon is ministering. They are taken by their caregivers in a large van to services. Most children from the home also attended the VBS that our W.E. youth helped teach.

In speaking with the director of the home, Claudia, she made known to me the fact that the kids aren't able to leave the home very much. This is due to the caretakers striving to create a stable secure environment where these displaced children feel "safe." Also the large number of youngsters and their differing ages make it difficult for outside activity. Going back and forth to church is a bright spot in their lives. Claudia told how special it was to the kids to be able to share time with trustworthy visitors like our group.

During our four day stay in Nueva Rosita we had daily encounters at the children's home. While there we helped clean out, sort and organize two storage rooms piled to the ceiling with donated bags of clothes, toys, and household items. One afternoon, some of our group had the privilege of sitting and holding, playing and coloring with, visiting and loving on the children. Spending time with the children at the home was an experience where the blessings were flowing both ways.

West Erwin is a monthly contributor in this effort. It is just one more way God is using our resources to show His love to others.

SUBMISSION & OBEDIENCE TO SPIRITUAL LEADERS

10th in a series of 10 on "Dynamic Christian Living"

Submission and obedience are tough for all of us, no matter our age "station" in life. I once heard a wise teacher compare the learning process we go through, on our way to greater obedience to God, as being like going through elementary, middle and high school before you are ready for college. Submitting to parents, the laws of the government and spiritual leaders are some of those levels.

One of the tough things about submitting to and obeying spiritual leaders is that we recognize, sometimes all too painfully, that none are perfect – that even though they may be more mature, they are still sinful creatures like us.

Nonetheless, it's very clear that this is exactly the way God designed His church to work, with all of us being submitted to and obedient towards the godhead, then mutually with each other (Eph. 3:20), and finally to spiritual leaders.

Elders obviously fill key roles as both "overseers" and "shepherds," both words implying responsibility and authority. But they aren't the only ones who can fit into the more general term "leaders" to which the Bible calls us to submit and obey (see Hebrews 13:7, 17). Preachers, youth ministers, teachers, deacons, etc. can all fill some degree of "leadership" in your Christian walk.

Jesus taught lessons to his prideful disciples about the temptation to "lord it over" people. Likewise, it is most often our pride that makes it difficult for us to submit to and obey fellow human beings as our leaders.

1 Thessalonians 5:12, 13 is a wonderful passage that can help us with this aspect of our faith. It doesn't say we should submit/obey just because of their titles or position, but because we respect them for their work among us.



SOME MORE THOUGHTS ABOUT EVANGELISM

I'm happy for what seems to be a renewed interest and growing commitment to personal evangelism, especially right here in this town. My recent sermons and bulletin articles on this subject have seemingly been well-received. There's been good interest in the meetings and class spear-headed by Doug Yates. And I've had more than just a few express this sentiment: "It is a great thing that we support a lot of mission work in other places, but we need to see our first 'mission field' as right here in the Tyler area." I couldn't agree more!

But as I share one last thought on this important topic, I do so with a keen awareness of the difficulty of the task at hand. I think we face a largely different set of circumstances and challenges in personal evangelism, even than when I first became a Christian, or for several decades before that.

Much of what we have called evangelism has been working with people who already believed the Bible was the Word of God, that Jesus was the Savior they needed, etc. For example, we may have been helping them understand the need to be baptized, or that the baptism they had received wasn't what the Bible taught. While this is still an important work, we now face a whole new set of teaching challenges.

The effects of moral relativism, secularism and "political correctness" are now more readily manifesting themselves. We may have to work much harder and longer to help people see that there is sin and it is a problem, that being spiritually minded, much less a Christian has relevance, and that Jesus offers something they need.

The days of "easy fruit" may largely be behind us! But, that's okay. God hasn't cancelled the great commission, and He will still give us what we need to get the task done! A determined and ongoing commitment to evangelism will have to be like Paul's advice to Timothy regarding preaching the word - do it "in season and out of season!" (2 Tim. 4:2)

PS - Psalm 119 is incredible; I'm looking forward to sharing more from it on Sunday evening. Hope you'll be there!

Last spring, while I was teaching a class that dealt with evangelism, some of our members spoke up and it was apparent that they thought we should be doing more in this area at the local level. This organization has administered services and assistance throughout the United States. I have known Lynn and Ann Cook for about 28 years. They are terrific people who are true servants of God. When Hurricane Katrina hit in August of 2005 I had the opportunity of doing some leg work for the Disaster Relief organization and I saw first hand just how tremendously accepted this organization was in the aftermath of that horrific disaster. Through phone calls, personal visits, and cards and letters we (West Erwin) raised several thousand dollars to help our Gulf Coast brothers and sisters. We utilized the Disaster Relief organization to help us in this effort. Trucks were sent to local congregations; supplies were distributed from those congregations to the community; the needs of the people in the communities were met; and the local church had a unique opportunity to minister to the people of that area. Much good has come about, in trying times, because of the Disaster Relief organization. I pray that God continues to bless this effort and that churches of Christ continue to fund it.

(continued from last week) Jordan learned a lot this summer. He states: "One of the biggest lessons I learned was what life is like as a minority...... Being the minority this summer changed my worldview. It completely changed how I viewed others who are not like me. I never thought I was racist and before I went to the Bronx, I would have never thought I harbored racist feelings. However, living in New York City brought these feelings to the surface. The racism I have struggled with was the stereotypes that I had about certain people. One thing that Tammy Asbill told me before I left was that God created these people just like he created me and he loves them just as much as he loves me. As my internship went along, God was transforming and shaping my heart. I am very glad to have experienced this."

Jordan feels he was greatly blessed by working with multi-racial churches. He states: "This summer I worshiped with churches of many different ethnicities and I was able to see God in ways that I have never experienced him before. I believe that we as the body of Christ need to do a better job at becoming more ethnically diverse. This does not mean simply allowing other ethnicities into our churches; it goes beyond that. It means to mesh their cultures with ours as well. Only then, I believe, will we be one body of Christ.

Just do everything I tell you to do." There was no real need for her to describe all of the expectations for the entire school year. She simply desired these students to know that if they did what she asked them to do, then they would be successful in class.

Jesus was approached by a young man in Matthew 19:16-17. He asked a very good, but simple question. "Good Teacher, what good thing shall I do that I may have eternal life?" The answer our Lord gave him was very simple, yet complete. "If you want to enter into life, keep the commandments."


Simply obey God. Nothing complicated. Nothing elaborate. Just set your mind to obey all that God asks of you. This young man attempted to complicate the issue later by asking which of the commandments he had to keep, as if he was free to pick and choose which ones to

violate. Such an attitude shows that one is not ready to be committed to God. If we wish to be acceptable to God we will simply concern ourselves with obeying all that He asks.

Jesus speaks a recurring theme of simple obedience in John chapters 14 and 15 as He ties love together with obedience. In John 14:15, He says, "If you love Me, keep My commandments." Many people in the world say that they love Jesus, but they still have not shown their love through their simple obedience to the gospel.

Perhaps Solomon summed it up best at the end of Ecclesiastes when he wrote, "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God and keep His commandments, for this is man's all. For God will bring every work into judgment, including every secret thing, whether good or evil." Eccl. 12:13-14. Simply obey God. Mike.

The healing of Jesus was a gift to each of the ten men. And what a wonderful gift it was—to receive a miracle from Jesus! Yet nine of the men did not think enough to return and give thanks to Jesus.

We can sometimes become ungrateful also with our lives. Since we live in such a prosperous country and enjoy

peace and happiness at very high levels, we can at times become complacent and forget to offer our thanks to God and to others.

A story is told of a man who was at a business lunch with some associates. This man was very polite and treated the waitress with every bit of respect equal to his associates. "Please" and "thank you" were used often as he addressed this young lady. At some point in the lunch one of his associates asked why he was treating this woman with such attention and respect. "After all," he said, "she's only doing her job and that is to wait on us." But the man replied, "I know that she is doing a job to serve us. But she is doing her job well and deserves our respect and our gratitude." This man understood that everyone can benefit from the power of expressing our thankfulness.

Friends, please do not underestimate the power of these simple words—"Thank You." By giving them you can help to uplift, encourage and confirm the actions and directions of others. By receiving them you can help reinforce a purpose in your actions and find strength to push forward. Make it your goal this week to find ways to express your thankfulness to God and to others. "Heirs Of Life Together" I Peter 3:7 Douglas L. Yates

Phil Sanders, a church of Christ minister out of the Nashville, Tennessee area recently wrote an article for *Think Magazine* (October 2007) entitled: A Life Changing Education. Dr. Sanders started his article by reflecting on a recent episode of the Tonight Show with Jay Leno. On this particular night Jay was asking his audience some Bible questions and the responses were sad to say the least. Questions such as: (1) name one of the ten commandments; or (2) name one of the apostles. The audience could name the Beatles when asked but couldn't come up with an appropriate answer to the Bible questions. According to Dr. Phil Sanders, "Leno wasn't putting down the Bible; he was revealing our society, which claims a heritage in biblical principles, that is increasingly losing touch with the Scriptures."

Findley Edge wrote a book entitled <u>Teaching For Results</u>, in which he stated, "The Sunday School has become an important and integral part of church life. It is one of the most powerful forces for good in modern society. In churches of various sizes

and types, teachers lead children, young people, and adults in Bible study, seeking together to understand its meaning and significance for Christian living. In spite of their weaknesses and difficulties, God has used the efforts of devoted teachers to accomplish often significant results in the lives of those whom they teach. Yet most teachers are not getting the results they desire - either in Bible knowledge or in Christian living. There is an amazing lack of Bible knowledge even among those who have attended Sunday School regularly for 5 or 10 years or longer."

When I compare what Dr. Sanders wrote with what Findley Edge wrote it causes me great concern. It also beckons the question: "Just what are some of our teachers teaching in their Bible classes that would produce such a low rate of growth in the knowledge of God's Word?" I think I can say, without hesitation, that they're probably not teaching much Bible.

In the next couple of weeks I would like to continue this thought in my bulletin article. I would like to say this before closing this particular article, "To all of our teachers here at West Erwin who teach God's Word in your classroom, Thank You for your labor of love." - D. Yates

Finding The God Worth Serving


Most people in our country are monotheistic. They believe in one God. That's good news. However, many of these people who believe in one God are not necessarily serving the God in which they believe. That's not good.

(2) How Can I Know God's Word?

Read it again and again. If you wish to know the Book, you must make it part of your life.

Use many helps available. Bible dictionaries; handbooks; commentaries: etc.

Meditate on the Word. Some read the Bible hurriedly or to reach a goal. The best students linger over the Scriptures, treasuring it up in their hearts (Psalm 119:11).

Read different versions. Do a comparative study of the different versions by laying them side by side as you study a particular verse or block of scriptures (-dly)

Determine to do God's will. Jesus said, "If anyone's will is to do God's will, he will know whether the teaching is from God or whether I am speaking on my own authority

"Heirs Of Life Together" I Peter 3:7 Douglas L. Yates

Whenever you think of the Bible school ministry, what comes to mind? Most of us think of a classroom with chairs, desks or tables, a marker board, students and a teacher. The Bible school ministry is all of that but if that is all there was to it, it would be doomed to fail. For too many years we've thought of the Bible school ministry as described above and by thinking of it this way, it becomes simply an organization rather than a living, breathing, vibrant part of our spiritual life. The mission of the Bible school ministry was never meant to be limited to simply teaching our students about the Bible but rather it was also meant to be a method to evangelize beyond the walls of our classrooms. In fact, if you look at our Bible school mission statement you would find the following words:

"The Bible school ministry of the West Erwin Church of Christ will edify the believer through a systemic study of God's Word and it will evangelize those that are lost by reaching out to them through our classes and fellowships."

This mission statement was written 7 years ago and it was designed to remind our teachers that their jobs as Christian educators included more than simply showing up to teach their classes. It also included building up their students and when applicable evangelizing their students.

We seem to have the edification part down but how can we do a better job of evangelizing our classes? Let me remind you of a ministry that we started here about 5 years ago called: 5 touches in 5 days. Here are the 5 simple steps you can do to reach out to those who visit your classroom:

- 1. Collect all necessary data from your guests by filling out the back of the attendance card found in each of our classrooms.
- 2. After that initial meeting, write a note or send a card to the guest thanking them for attending and invite them back.
- 3. Turn the information over to the education minister so that he can make a personal visit.
- 4. Call the visitor and invite them back to the class.
- 5. When they return be sure to seek them out and encourage them to continue to attend the class.
- It is a simple formula that has worked right here at West Erwin. Let's continue to implement this ministry.

When was the last time that you were really fooled? Have you fallen for someone's story only to discover that it was a corny joke? Or perhaps you've become a victim of some internet hoax and innocently passed it along as truth. Chances are pretty good that all of us have been deceived in the recent past.

There are various factors that lead to our acceptance of what eventually is seen as a hoax. First of all, we may want to believe that it is true. Recently an email circulated speaking of sending cards to unnamed recovering soldiers at an Army hospital. We even had it in our bulletin last week. But it turns out that since 9/11 cards of this sort are no longer accepted. The actual name of the soldier must be on any mail delivered to them.

Secondly, we may accept something as truth because we trust the source. Deception seems to be ever present in our world. Some major newspapers have been deceived and have published information that was later found to be false. A close friend may pass along a story to us and we may accept it as truth thinking that our friend has already verified it.

Thirdly, we may be deceived when truth is mingled with falsehood. Many of the hoaxes that surface are true in some respects, but not in all. Sometimes we see elements that we know are true and then accept the rest as truth as well.

The truth is that it is very easy to be deceived, so we must all be on guard. Notice the following advice from James and Paul. "Do not be deceived, my beloved brethren." James 1:16 "Test all things, hold fast what is good." 1 Thes. 5:21

James Galway is widely known for his craft as a master of the classical flute. As he neared his fiftieth birthday, he looked closely at his life (as we all do) and he decided that he was not going to fall into the trap that so many of his musician friends had, that is to say, "getting old and famous for playing bad concerts." He thought about how he could avoid this and his solution was to get back to the basics by practicing his scales for several hours each day. Much to his shock he discovered that it had been so long since he had done this, that it was very difficult. He said, "I could play concerts and repertory pieces but the scales were stiff and inconsistent from key to key."

Doesn't that seem strange, that a master of the flute would have trouble playing the scales? Aren't the scales the very first thing that you learn to play? James Galway had learned a valuable lesson, which is, in order to accomplish great things you can never forget the basics. There are a lot of Christians today who would be well advised to learn the same lesson in their approach to studying God's Word. Many of us are so caught up

in hearing about the latest controversy in the brotherhood that we forget our main goal is to seek and save the lost. Don't get me wrong, we need to study controversial issues also but how many people have been converted by being taught on the controversial issues of the church. Our main goal (after we have taken care of our own salvation) is to seek and save the lost. This is a very simplistic and basic need within the church. Whether in our personal Bible study or in group Bible studies we need to remember the basics and to revisit them often. I think we would all be well advised to remember the teachings of Jesus because, to tell you the truth, he never forgot the basic teachings of God's Word. When he needed the answer to the question of the day, he didn't consult the leading authorities in Jerusalem but rather he went straight to the Word of God. Let's once again become people of the Book. You know we were once accused of being people of the Book. What an accusation! Wouldn't you just love someone to accuse you of that today! One way that we can once again become people of the Book would be by attending Sunday morning class, Wednesday evening class and all other special classes that we offer here. The winter quarter is well underway and things are going great within the educational ministry here at West Erwin. Teachers, let me thank you for all that you do, from your time, effort, and energy in your preparation for your class to your dedication to God's Word as you present the material. Thank you! To each and every student who comes to class and to participate, thank you also for your willingness to learn more about God's Word. Because of your actions I believe you will be richly blessed. I don't want to forget the great support cast that we have here at West Erwin who week after week labor behind the scenes to make our educational ministry a great success. There are simply too many to mention at this time but you know who you are and I thank you from the bottom of my heart. Sometimes I am asked what it takes to have a successful Bible school ministry and at least part of the answer can be found in what I've written above. A dedicated staff that understands the importance of teaching God's Word and who are also willing to make great sacrifices for His cause are crucial in this effort.

God has blessed the West Erwin education ministry over the last several years. It wasn't all that long ago that our attendance was dropping annually by 5%. Our Wednesday evening attendance was at a very disappointing average of 250. Fortunately, since that time we rethought some things and got after it and God has blessed us with spiritual and numerical growth. We currently have 55 classes that meet here weekly with a support staff of 133 teachers. Opportunity after opportunity is presented for us to grow in Christ. Numerically we not only stopped the 5% decline (averaging 390 on Sunday morning just a few years ago) but we have grown, now averaging 435. The Wednesday evening low that we experienced just a few years ago of 250 has witnessed a dramatic change to 346. Again, giving God the glory, we are thankful for this growth. Things are heading in the right direction and I believe that with just some minor tweaking and some additional attention paid to the educational ministry we could see even more classes added; more souls being retained, and many being baptized into Christ. One of the keys to the success of this ministry will hinge greatly on your attendance in 2008 so if you haven't been attending class let's get involved and let's make a difference in 2008.

SHEEP AND GOATS

"When the Son of Man comes in His glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his throne in heavenly glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will put the sheep on his right and the goats on his left" (Matthew 25:31-33).

Jesus will not divide the sheep from the wolves as we might expect, but the sheep from the goats. Have you ever thought much about why he will separate them because they seem to be similar creatures? The big difference is how they behave. Goats have a very negative character. They are independent and almost anti-social. Therefore,

Jesus will say to the sheep, "Come you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world" (:34). And to the goats he will say, "Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels"

In between those two statements, Jesus tells us why. He says the sheep saw me hungry and they gave me something to eat; they saw me thirsty and gave me something to drink; I was a stranger and they accepted me; I needed clothes and they clothed me; I was sick and they looked after me; I was in prison and they came to visit. The goats were different. They were independent and judged each one through their own eyes with their own wisdom. And the King of kings put them on the left, separating them for eternity. Enough said.

Our attendance for Bible class for 2007 has once again improved. We had a weekly average for Sunday morning Bible school (as of this writing) of 436, our Wednesday evening average is 346. As good as these numbers are we still can do better. Let's dedicate ourselves in 2008 to be more consistent in our attendance to our Bible classes. I really believe that God will bless us if we do this:
