Something great is said about Abraham in Gen. 15:6, that he "believed the Lord, and he credited it to him as righteousness." Interestingly enough, this exact statement about the father of the faithful is used a couple of different ways in the New Testament.

Paul quotes it to remind us that, like Abraham, we must "rely on faith" (Gal. 3:6-9), and that we are justified by faith and trust in God (Rom. 4) and not by works.

Yet the very same statement is used in James 2:20-24 to call us to an active faith, so that, also like Abraham, our faith and our actions are working together, our deeds complete our faith, and our righteousness comes through acting on our faith.

Like Abraham, does your life reflect your belief? Do you trust God enough to obey Him?

MAKING DISCIPLES IS NOT EASY!

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations...baptizing them... teaching them... and behold, I am with you always..." (Matt.28). We recognize these words of Jesus as being among the last He spoke to his disciples. Making disciples is no easy task and we should note that Jesus promised his help in this. Which is easier to accomplish, the baptizing or the disciplining? Both take an investment of time and relationship. Paul gives us a great picture of what a disciple looks like in his letter to the church at Philippi. "Only let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of you that you are standing firm in one spirit, with one mind striving side by side for the faith of the gospel and not frightened in anything by your opponents... For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also suffer for his sake" (Phil.1:27-29). A true disciple is one that stands by his faith, united with his brothers and sisters, no matter if their mentor is there or not. A true disciple is not ruled by fear and lives a life that is worthy of the gospel. A true disciple is willing to suffer for the cause of Christ. This is hard for mature Christians, much less babes in Christ. We lead by example, so what kind of example have we been to others? Have we invested in our babes in Christ? Ponnie Carnathan, Benevolence Minister NOBODY LIKES A WINNER!

Well, another Super Bowl is in the books, the Patriots have won again, and many are thinking they cheated again. Nobody likes a winner. Jesus had to endure that in his life too. Let's look at some criticism that Jesus faced and see how He answered his critics. In Mark 7, Jesus was criticized because his disciples did not follow the traditions of the Jewish rulers. Jesus told them, You leave the commandment of God and hold to the tradition of men."...There is nothing outside a person that by going into him can defile him, but the things that come out of a person are what defile him." (7:8,15). Jesus knew the Pharisees had a heart problem. Ignoring God's words to follow traditions of man is defilement in itself. In Mark 2, we find Jesus being criticized because of who he associated with. The Pharisees did not like the fact that he was eating with tax collectors and sinners. Jesus said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. I came not to call the righteous, but sinners "(2:17). Jesus sought out those that were sick spiritually, not those that were self-righteous and felt they were better than others. In Mark 2 and 3, we see where Jesus was criticized for healing on the Sabbath. Jesus said, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath (2:27)...Is it lawful on the Sabbath to do good or to do harm, to save life or to kill?" (3:4). The Sabbath then, and our Lord's Day today, is to be a day of blessing not harm. On any day, when we fail to bless our fellow man, when we fail to edify each other, and we fail to glorify and honor God, we have missed the point!

Thoughts on Serving in the Kingdom...

Serving... God calls us to step out of our "religious rituals" and look beyond ourselves. Serving God is wrapped up in serving others. For most of us... that requires a change of heart... consider the following:

Micah 6:6-8 "With what shall I come before the Lord and bow down before the exalted God?

Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old?

Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousand rivers of olive oil?

Shall I offer my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?

He has shown you, O mortal, what is good.

And what does the Lord require of you?

To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."

One commentator phrases vs. 8 like this...

"But he's already made it plain how to live, what to do, what God is looking for in men and women.

It's quite simple: Do what is fair and just to your neighbor, be compassionate and loyal in your love,

And don't take yourself too seriously—
take God seriously."

Micah's message is still applicable today. Religious practices, no matter how extravagant, can never compensate for a lack of love. Externally following the rules is not as valuable in God's eyes as a humble heart that simply does what is right. God's people are called to desire justice, mercy, and humility before the Lord.

LIVING FOR THE TENT

"O Lord, who shall dwell in your tent? Who shall dwell on your holy hill" (Psa. 15:1)? This is a great question posed by David. Who will enjoy the hospitality of God in his home? The people David wrote this to had no problem understanding the image of a tent. We might struggle with this. We would relate to the streets of gold or the beautiful city. I think that our journey to and the destination of where we end up will probably be a little different that we expected. David gives us some answers to the question he posed. David said the people that were "living for the tent" would be people that lived with integrity and honesty (15:2). To be welcome in God's tent, we must not slander others and be respected in our neighborhood (15:3). To dwell on God's holy hill, we must protect our friendships, not keep company with those that work against God, and honor those that fear the Lord (15:3,4). If we want to be welcomed in God's tent, we must be willing to keep our promises regardless of the cost and be willing to lend our money without interest (15:4,5). We also need to be fair to all and live from a position of righteousness so that we can never be moved in our spiritual lives (15:5). I like the phrase of "living for the tent" because it speaks of humility, service, and love. It means we are living like Jesus which should be the goal of us all. What are you living for?

Thoughts on Serving in the Kingdom...

Serving... Who is the Christian to serve? Who is my neighbor? An earnest lawyer asks Jesus this question in Luke 10:29. We soon learn it's one of those conversations that's padded out in advance. He asks a question to set up something he wants to say. He was earnest to "justify himself," as Luke makes clear. And obviously, he was feeling pretty good about how it was going through verse 28. But then comes the curve ball. Whatever this lawyer had in mind for the answer, it wasn't the story Jesus told. And it's not what we would expect either. Yes, we may all know the parable of the Good Samaritan, but it can be a little confusing. The "neighbor," it would appear, is the man going down from Jerusalem to Jericho who was beaten and left for dead (Luke 10:30). The neighbor is the object, the one of whom the three other characters encounter. But in the end, Jesus says the Samaritan who helped his man "proved to be the neighbor" (Luke 12:36-37).

So here we are, along with the lawyer, trying to figure out whom we're supposed to love, and Jesus turns the question around. Look at this man who acts in mercy. Stop asking, "Who is my neighbor?" There are deeper questions to ponder. As one writer explains, "When we are done trying to establish, 'Is this my neighbor?' — the decisive issue of love remains: What kind of person am I?"

Why would Jesus choose *that* for His first miracle? I've asked myself that a thousand times. But He did. He changed water into wine (John 2:1-11). So a few comments about this important event.

Whether or not it is okay to drink alcohol is not the issue, nor does this passage address that question. It is not Jesus or John's purpose to justify or condemn the consumption of alcoholic beverages in their day, much less in the present day. Today's alcohol is much stronger; there are many more beverage options available and accessible; and alcohol has become a curse upon our land. So if you look to this passage to justify yourself for drinking alcoholic beverages, I think two things may be true. First, you are seeking a Biblical rationalization for needlessly playing with a dangerous fire that has a history of destroying health, careers, influence and families. Second, you are missing the point of the passage.

The purpose of the act—and all of Jesus' signs that will come—is seen in verse 11. They are meant to reveal His glory and to move people to believe in Him. It's the same purpose as John's gospel itself (John 20:30-31). The greatness is not in the signs; rather they confirm that God is at work in the life of Christ.

Great thoughts by Joe McKeever. Let me know if you'd like the full text of the article... "7 Laws of Service in the Kingdom"

Here are 7 laws–non-negotiable elements, iron-clad principles–regarding serving in the Kingdom of God.

- Only the strongest can serve. The weak, the immature, and the carnal want only to be served.
- Only by constantly humbling ourselves can we do the work of a servant. Why? Because the work of a servant is often difficult, embarrassing, and painful.
- "What can I do to help?" is the constant question of the servant. Why? Because the servant is focused on blessing others. He lives to make others successful.
- We serve in Jesus' name for Jesus' sake. Why? Because we belong to Jesus. He saved us, redeemed us, and sent us.
- The servant seeks no recognition or earthly reward. Why? Because the ego must be constantly placed on the cross.. "It is the Lord Christ you serve" (Colossians 3:24).
- The servant never hesitates to honor others who serve well. Why: Because this is what love does.
- The servant looks to his Master for recognition and reward. "Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a few things; I will make you ruler over many" (Matthew 25:41,23).

A POWERFUL FORCE!

Our words are one of the most powerful forces on earth. I found this quote from Yehuda Berg about our words. "Words have energy and power with the ability to help, to heal, to hinder, to hurt, to harm, to humiliate and to humble". James said that our speech was like a rudder that guided large ships through the wind and also like a fire, a world of unrighteousness (James 3). There are many scriptures giving us warnings and instruction on our speech. What should Christian speech sound like? First, we need to be aware of the damage our speech can cause. Jesus himself said that what comes out of the mouth; this defiles a person (Matt. 15:11). Peter said that if one loves life and wants to see good days, he must keep his tongue from evil and his lips from speaking deceit (1 Pet.3:10). Secondly, we need to use our speech for good. Paul tells us to let no corrupting talk come out of our mouths, but only such as is good for building up,...that it may give grace to those who hear (Eph. 4:29). Solomon wrote that a gentle tongue is a tree of life (Pro.15:4). Lastly, we need to use our speech to praise God. The psalmist wrote, "My lips will pour forth praise for you...My tongue will sing of your word" (Psa.119:171-172). David wrote, 'My tongue will sing aloud of your righteousness... My mouth will declare your praise" (Psa.51:14-15). Our speech should be pure, honest, encouraging, and life giving. Speech that is full of grace and praise is what God wants to hear from us. What does He hear from you?

Thoughts on Serving in the Kingdom...

Great thoughts by Joe McKeever. Let me know if you'd like the full text of the article... "7 Laws of Service in the Kingdom" (continued from last week)

- One... The weak, the immature, and the carnal want only to be served. Other than the cross of Calvary itself, the best illustration of servanthood is found in John 13:1-4. Our Lord washed the feet of His disciples. But before Jesus describing the event, John tells us five important things: 1) Jesus knew what time it was; His hour had come; 2) He knew His own and loved them to the very end; 3) Jesus knew His strength and authority; 4) Jesus knew He was from God; and 5) that His destiny was Heaven. So, knowing all of this, He is able to stoop and serve. Why? Because the work is hard and thankless and requires brokenness.
- Two... Only by constantly humbling ourselves can we do the work of a servant. The disciples were offended. Washing the feet of others, we're told, was not only the work of the lowliest household servant, but preferably someone not Jewish. And here was the Lord Himself doing this humiliating task. Our natural inclination is to want to be served, not to serve. We like acclaim, to be recognized and appreciated, and swoon at thoughts of receiving the adoration of the masses. But those urges are anathema to the child of God. We must humble ourselves. Why? Because the work of a servant is often difficult, embarrassing, and painful.

As a child, I did not understand how well off my family was. I could only look at what some children in school had more of than me. I wanted what they had! I was jealous of those that got new store bought clothes all the time, even though I never lacked for clothing. Chasing vain treasures of this world will not help us in eternity! Thirdly, we need to remember that contentment helps us realize what we really need. "But if we have food and clothing, with these we will be content" (1 Tim.6:8). God provides, do you believe it?

Three... "What can I do to help?" is the constant question of

the servant. The beggar of Jericho kept begging "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" When he stood before the Savior, Jesus said to him, "What do you want me to do for you?" (Luke 18:41). That is the question of a servant. Why? Because the servant is focused on blessing others. He lives to make others successful.

Four... We serve in Jesus' name for Jesus' sake.

"We do not preach ourselves," said the Apostle. "But Christ Jesus as Lord. And ourselves your servants for Jesus' sake" (2 Corinthians 4:5). To serve "for Jesus' sake" means we take orders from the Lord Jesus on how to serve others. The waiter in a restaurant serves customers, but does so "for the manager's sake. "Why? Because we belong to Jesus. He saved us, us, and sent us. Jesus is Lord.

Five... The servant seeks no recognition or earthly reward. In the parable of Luke 17:7-10, our Lord instructed that even when we have done everything He commands-and who among us has done that? -we are to say to ourselves, "I am only an unworthy servant; I'm just doing my duty." It's always to point out that this assessment-"I am an unworthy servant, just doing my job"-is something we say to ourselves, not to one another. Nor will the Lord say that to us. Why? Because the ego must be constantly placed on the cross. "It is the Lord Christ you serve." (Col. 3:24)

A NEW ATTITUDE!

I think one of the best things about my job is getting to see on a daily basis how much God has blessed me. It is sad to see when people have no clue as to what God can overcome in their lives. I think that people can get so used to the sadness without Christ that they can't perceive that life can get better. So, what should our response be once we have tasted the goodness of Christ? We have a new attitude about life. What does our new attitude look like? First, we change our outlook. Paul says that the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking but of righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit (Ro.14:17). We no longer focus on the physical but the spiritual side of living. We try to be more like Christ. We seek peace with God and others, and we realize the true joy of following Christ. Secondly, we change our purpose. "Whoever thus serves Christ is acceptable to God and approved by men" (Ro.14:18). If we are living with Christ, then we have to be serving Christ. If we are serving Christ, then our purpose becomes trying to lead others to Him. Thirdly, we change our pursuits. "So then let us pursue what makes for peace and for mutual upbuilding" (Ro.14:19). What we strive for in life makes a difference in the way that we live. If we live for the things of this world only, Paul says that we are to be pitied. The church needs people that are pursuing peace and looking for ways to encourage others. We have to live outside of ourselves and work to help others see the blessings of Christ. How has your attitude been lately?

Six... The servant never hesitates to honor others who serve well.

Scriptures on this abound: I Timothy 5:17; Philippians 2:29, and I Corinthians 16:16 are examples. Why: Because this is what love does.

We must not miss the irony here. We do not seek recognition, but we must be prompt in giving appreciation. I imagine the implication of that would therefore be, we should not value the appreciation when it is given. If we were to do so, we might become too dependent on it. And the servant who needs to be appreciated is setting himself up for disappointment.

Seven...The servant looks to his Master for recognition and reward. "To his own master a servant stands or falls" (Romans 14:4).

Our Lord has told us what to expect. "Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a few things; I will make you ruler over many" (Matthew 25:41,23). So many other texts prepare us for the moment when the Lord makes things right. "You will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous" (Luke 14:14). And "Henceforth, there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge will award to me on that day. And not to me only but to all those who love His appearing" (2 Timothy 4:8).

OUR APPROACH, OUR JUDGMENTS, AND OUR ACTIONS!

In Luke 7, we read the story of Jesus eating at a Pharisee's house. A woman came to that house to see Jesus. Let's look at Luke's account of that meeting and see what we can learn that will help our own spiritual lives. Behold, a woman of the city, who was a sinner, when she learned that he was reclining at the table... brought an alabaster flask of ointment, and standing behind him at his feet, weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair and kissed his feet...(7:37-38). Like this woman, we need to approach God with humility. We should never forget that we all come to God as sinners, we all come to God as debtors, and we all come to God in need of a savior. As the story continues, the Pharisee makes a judgment about the woman and earns a rebuke from Jesus. Jesus said, You gave me no kiss, but from the time I came in she has not ceased to kiss my feet (7:45). We should never be like that Pharisee and hinder someone from coming to Jesus because we felt we were better than them. We need to be careful of our judgments. As the encounter ended, Jesus said that the woman's sins, which were many, were forgiven because she loved much. Jesus told her, Your faith has saved you, go in peace (7:50). Like the woman, we need to grow our faith and live in peace. Jesus will make a difference in our lives only if we open our hearts to Him. The world is in need of more peacemakers today. Peace with God leads to peace with mankind. Peace with mankind leads to a better world. Humility, fair judgments, and faithful love helps.

IT'S MORE ABOUT GOD THAN US!

Hear O Israel, you are to cross over the Jordan today, to go in to

dispossess nations greater and mightier than you, cities great and

fortified up to heaven...Know therefore today that he who goes over

before you as a consuming fire is the Lord your God. He will destroy

them and consume them before you...Do not say in your heart...It is

because of my righteousness...it is because of the wickedness of these

nations...and that he (God) may confirm the word that the Lord swore

to your fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob (Deut.9:1-5). These

are some of Moses' last words to the Israelites, before they crossed

over into the Promised Land, and before his death. There are three

points I want us to remember from these verses. These apply to us

today. First, in the challenges of kingdom work, God goes before

us! It is his battle; we are just the soldiers. Our job is to follow our

Father and make His will our will. Secondly, it is not because of our

righteousness! We are righteous only because of what God has done

for us. It was His work, His Son, and His love for us. Thirdly, our work

should be confirming the Word of God! We should be teaching God's

Word, living God's Word, and spreading God's Word. We do not live

for the praise of others. We live to bring glory and honor to God. We

do not live to conquer life by ourselves, but we gladly and humbly

turn our burdens over to Him. It is not about us; it is about God's love

and His plan for the world. Do you trust God to help you through your

battles? Does your life bring glory to God? Are you living by His Word?

Not every argument is worth having. Jesus certainly walked away from plenty of them.

There are also several times in Scripture where Jesus' strong words and messages caused the Jews to want to take His life. My thinking is if someone wants to kill you it's not likely that it's because you refused to challenge their thinking...

In John 8 the Jews "picked up stones to stone him." What were they so upset about? Most of the chapter is the back and forth, but ultimately it was this statement by the Lord.

"Very truly I tell you, before Abraham was born, I am." (John 8:58-59)

The Jews understood exactly what Jesus was saying. They understood Him to be saying that He was eternal; that He was divine; that He was the great "I AM." And so He is.

The Final Weeks...

Sometimes when we study the Bible we lose track of when certain events happened and in what order. Reading through the Bible chronologically is very enlightening. The gospels are for many the most favorite passages from all of scripture. The gospels in total represent some 33(ish) years.... The life span of Jesus on this earth. Almost half the book of John focuses on just the last few weeks of Jesus earthly life... (John 11-20) As we approach Easter Sunday in the next few weeks... I thought it would be good for us to focus on some of those powerful stories and events that took place in the final weeks.

John 11:1-44... Jesus receives word that His good friend Lazarus is sick and several days later returns to Bethany to find Mary & Martha grief stricken and that Lazarus had died and been in the tomb for 4 days. The events that unfolded on that day were timely. There was great amazement when Jesus prayed to His Father and then called Lazarus out of the tomb. While much had been discussed, argued about and even in the past concerning resurrection... Whatever each person standing there believed about resurrection prior to that moment... suddenly they were witnesses to the power of God and the resurrection was real. It must have been breathtaking to witness Lazarus coming out of that tomb. While Jesus knew at this moment what was to come for Himself... those apostles and witnesses had no idea the extent of what they just saw and the impact resurrection would on all eternity.

Truly this was the beginning of the Final Weeks... more to come.



RESTORATION AND RESPONSE

In Daniel 4, we see God's humbling of king Nebuchadnezzar because the king failed to recognize that God rules the kingdom of man (Dan.4:25). When he was restored, Nebuchadnezzar gave this prayer of thanksgiving and praise for God. On this Easter Sunday, a day where we recognize the ultimate restoration by God, I believe this pagan king gives us some good guidelines on how to act as restored Christians. Read Nebuchadnezzar's words, "Now I, Nebuchadnezzar praise and extol and honor the King of heaven, for all his works are right, and his ways are just; and those who walk in pride he is able to humble" (Dan.4:37). What can we learn from this king's experience with God? First, we must never forget that God's works are right! God works for the good of His children, His church, and for the good of all that will come to Him. We should not second guess God even in times when we don't know the "why" of His actions. Secondly, we must never forget that God's ways are just! God is fair and loves all who are in this world. There is no better proof than the giving of his son, but that does not mean He will not punish those that deserve it. Thirdly, we must never forget that God is able to humble the proud! One of the biggest weapons that Satan uses against us is our pride. Pride keeps us from being humble, and a lack of humility keeps us from loving as we should. We all are restored beings. God has delivered us from sin and promises us an abundant life as his children. How has your response to God's love and care been in your life?





GRIEVING THE SON!

In the 19th chapter of Luke we read of Jesus looking over the city of Jerusalem and weeping. What would cause such grief in Jesus? Luke gives us some insight in the next few verses and I think it would do us well to learn from their example. It would help us in our walk with Jesus today. First, the city was not at peace with God! "Would that you, even you, had known on this day the things that make for peace" (19:42)! One of the biggest struggles I see of people today is trying to live without the peace of God in their lives. It causes fear, confusion, and lack of harmony with their fellow-man. Peace with God will only come on God's terms, not ours. Secondly, the city was not prepared for Satan's attacks! "For the days will come upon you, when your enemies will ... surround you and hem you in on every side" (19:43). Satan will never let up on his attack on the church and the saints. Anything that promotes division, individual separation, and discord is his goal. Thirdly, the city was not taking care of the next generation! Luke wrote that their enemies would "tear you down to the ground, you and your children ..." (19:44). Our next generation will either inherit our strengths or they will inherit our weaknesses. It matters how we conduct ourselves as the Church and it matters what we leave those that will follow us. What will our next generation see from us? Will they see a church with a desire to do kingdom work or will they see an attitude of letting someone else do our part? Will they see a church that is standing out or just standing by? Let's not grieve the Son!



FOLLOWING JESUS

In John 6 we see the story of Jesus' feeding of the 5,000. It seems that this miracle would convince every one of who Jesus was and why he came to earth, but we see that was not the case (6:15). The next day John records an exchange between some of those that were fed and Iesus. This conversation shows us what it takes to follow Iesus. First, to follow Iesus we need a lasting faith. "But I said to you that you have seen me and yet do not believe" (6:36). Our faith needs to last longer than the crisis in our lives. We need to do anything we can to build and maintain our faith. Secondly, to follow Jesus, we need to know that Jesus will never drive us away. "Whoever comes to me I will never cast out" (6:37). If we walk away from Jesus, it will be us that do the leaving! It is our choice, it is our actions, and it will be our responsibility. Thirdly, to follow Jesus, we need to remember that God wants all men to be saved. "But this is the will of my Father, that everyone who looks on the Son and believes should have eternal life..." (6:40). Jesus' church is about spiritual living and drawing people to kingdom living. It takes work, love, and faith. Lastly, to follow Jesus, we accept that the world's view of Jesus will be distorted. "Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph...How does he now say, I have come down from heaven" (6:42). The world does not know Jesus or believe in the study of scripture. The world does not understand or believe who Jesus was. The world exerts a powerful influence on those who need Christ. The church needs disciples that show Christ by the way they live.



REPRESENTING GOD!

I want to look at the Queen of Sheba's visit to Solomon as recorded in 2 Chron. 9. It is a great example of when a person is truly seeking answers, God will reward them. The queen ended up with all she desired and took back more than she brought (9:12). I want to take a closer look at a statement the queen made to Solomon before she returned home. She told Solomon, "Blessed be the Lord your God, who has delighted in you and set you on his throne as king for the Lord your God! Because your God loved Israel and would establish them forever, he has made you king over them, that you may execute justice and righteousness" (9:8). I thought this was an interesting observation from this pagan queen to recognize the work of God in Solomon's life. I also feel that she gives us three traits we need to exhibit in our own lives as we go about representing God. First, to represent God, we need to show that God is in our life. Our lives need to look different than the world. Our lives need to look like God! Secondly, to represent God, we need to be fair in our judgments and our actions. The Queen of Sheba knew that Solomon showed these traits to those in his kingdom; the world needs to see that in us too. Lastly, to represent God, we need to live righteous lives. We can't lead anyone to Christ if we talk like the world, if we look like the world, and if we act like the world. We were created to do our King's work and to show the world what Jesus looks like. We do live in a fallen world, but God loves his creation and needs us to represent Him to the lost.





WORDS MORE POWERFUL THAN FEAR!

When fear strikes it can cause some anxious moments in our lives. Fear was given to us by God, and it can be a healthy thing when handled properly. When fear gets the best of us though, it can cause many problems. Fear can cause stress, it can cause us to lose our sense of reasoning, and fear can cause doubt in our lives. Fear can even cause us to lose our faith. In Mark 4:35-41 we read of the story of Jesus calming the storm with only the words that he spoke. Jesus was sleeping in a boat when a storm came in. The storm was so bad that water began to come into the boat and Jesus' disciples grew very afraid. They woke Jesus and asked him, "Teacher, do you not care we are perishing?" (4:38). Their fear caused them to doubt that Jesus cared for them! Jesus then spoke those beautiful words, "Peace! Be still!" The storm stopped. Jesus asked them, "Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?" (4:40). Their fear caused a lack of faith! After seeing Jesus' power over the elements, they asked among themselves, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?" (4:41). Their fear caused them to lose their reasoning from all that Jesus had taught them! Had they forgotten the miracles? Had they forgotten where Jesus had come from? Had they forgotten Jesus' destination once He left this earth? Had they forgotten Jesus' teachings on His second coming? This is the power of fear. It was the words of Jesus that overcame their fear and it is the same for us today. We can beat our fears today, but only through the power of Jesus' words!





A GREAT LIFE!

I have heard many people talk about how they have a "great life". They have measured their life in many ways, but I am afraid they have failed to use scripture as their standard. I would like to give you three things from the book of Titus to judge how "great" your life is. First, how fit are you for God's work? "They profess to know God, but they deny him by their works. They are detestable, disobedient, unfit for any good work" (Titus 2:16). A great life comes from great service in the name of the Lord. God's work calls for God's people who live a life worthy of their calling. Secondly, do you appreciate what God has done for you? "But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy..." (Titus 3:4-6). Our salvation is our most precious asset in life. Living with an "attitude of gratitude" keeps us focused on Jesus. Lastly, are you working to keep yourself pure? "Our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, who gave himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for himself a people for his won possession..." (Titus 2:13-14). It takes work to keep pure in this world. We can't claim to be a Christian and still talk, look, and act like the world. The ways of Jesus and the world will not mix. What standard are you using to measure your life?





WAITING UNTIL THE END!

One of the things we struggle with is how does God allow good things to happen to bad people? They seem to have it all, and we struggle to get by sometimes. How do we overcome those feelings? I believe Psalm 73 gives us some lessons on this. The writer gives us the reason for our struggle. "For I was envious of the arrogant when I saw the prosperity of the wicked" (73:3). It is our nature to be envious of those who have more. The issue of envy is a spiritual problem. Let's look at what the unbeliever fails to recognize in their quest for prosperity. Their own pride is their enemy! "Therefore pride is their necklace" (73:6). They fail to realize that all things come from God and not their own hands. Their speech goes against God's goodness! "They set their mouths against the heavens" (73:9). They fail to realize the damage they do to their soul. They don't realize God's knowledge! "And they say, How can God know?" (73:11) They fail to realize they are setting themselves against the all-knowing and all-powerful God! So, how did the writer come to grips with this? "But when I thought how to understand this, it seemed to me a wearisome task, until I went into the sanctuary of God; then I discerned their end" (73:17). How ironic is that? The one person that the writer blamed is the one person that can heal the hurt. When we get closer to God, we get closer to peace. "For behold, those who are far from you shall perish, you put an end to everyone who is unfaithful to you. But for me, it is good to be near God; I have made the Lord God my refuge" (73:27-28).

LESSONS FROM THE GARDEN

He never made excuses; He never blamed anyone for His lot. He continued His walk and finished His job. We see Jesus' authority. His capture, His surrender, His arrest, were all done with His consent. We too need to live with the authority that God has given us. We don't have to live like others in this world. We don't have to compromise our morals. Life is better when we live it in the name of Jesus. We see Jesus' choice to die. Jesus chose to do his Father's will by going to the cross. We too, have that choice to make. In order to gain Heaven we must die to self, we must die to sin, and we must willingly and totally surrender our life to God. Our nature makes this difficult. We see Jesus' love for others. Jesus healed Malchus' ear out of his love for the man. He prevented his disciples' arrest out of his love for them. He washed the feet of Judas, the traitor, out of love. Our love for others is shown by our actions, not our talk. It is shown by our willingness to sacrifice for others. We see Jesus' obedience. In spite of the hardships He was to face, in spite of the suffering He was to bear, and in spite of a world where many would not take advantage of His sacrifice, Jesus said, "Thy will be done!" To become more like Jesus, we need to be more about "the will of our Father".

TAKING OFFENSE

In John 6 we see Jesus speaking in the synagogue at Capernaum. Jesus said some things that were hard for people to hear. In fact, many of his disciples said, "This is a hard saying, who can listen to it?" (6:60). Jesus then asked his disciples, "Do you take offense at this?" I believe there were many times that people took offense at some things Jesus said. Jesus did not say things just to hurt people's feelings; Jesus told people what He knew they needed to hear! When Jesus engaged with people, He did not talk around the issues and He did not take time getting to the point. Jesus spoke about things like the judgment. Jesus talked about the cross and what it meant to the world. Jesus also talked about people's heart, how to protect it, and what to store up in it. Jesus talked about sin, greed, and the problem of using one's position with God to profit from it. Jesus talked about faith and living by the Spirit. Jesus talked about how a lack of belief could harm one's relationship with God. Jesus also talked about taking your relationship with God serious. Yes, it is easy to see how Jesus could hurt someone's feelings. In fact, we see where many of Jesus' followers turned back and no longer followed him (6:66). It is sad to say, but that trend has continued even today. When people leave Jesus, where do they turn next? We all need to remember what Peter said when Jesus asked his disciples if they were leaving too. Peter replied, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (6:68). When Jesus' words offend us it is because he is trying to tell us what we need!

We learn from James 1:12, "Blessed is the man who endures temptation for when he has been approved, he will receive the crown of life which the Lord has promised to those who love Him."

Finally, in I Cor. 10:13, Paul reminds us stating, "No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it."



IF IT IS SO GOOD FOR ME, WHY DOES IT HURT SO MUCH?

I have a confession to make. As a child I got in trouble a few times. maybe a lot of times. I have to give credit to mom and dad; they never told me that "this will hurt me more than you". I will admit the discipline I received helped me in life. In Hebrews 12 we read of discipline from the Lord. The writer says that God disciplines us for our good so we can share in his holiness and that it will yield the peaceful fruit of righteousness (12:10-11). What are the benefits of our discipline? Consider the rest of the passage. "Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees, and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint but rather be healed. Strive for peace with everyone, and for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord. See to it that no one fails to obtain the grace of God; that no root of bitterness springs up and causes trouble, and by it many become defiled..." (12:12-15). From my childhood experiences, I know that discipline hurts, but it yielded the proper fruit in my life. It is part of the process of maturing and feeling the consequences of my sins. The pain, the shame, and the discouragement all play a part in the healing. After the hurt comes peace, strength, the proper direction in life, grace, and holiness. We become the children that God desires for his work on earth. We then can use that experience to minister to those that are going through what we went through. It leads to a sweet life that holds no bitterness toward God, but instead becomes a life of gratitude, love, and service to our Father!





When I was growing up I had to learn how to lose gracefully. There were two reasons for this. First, I was never part of a championship team. Secondly, my dad raised me to believe that losing gracefully was much better for me than winning poorly! Dad reinforced this teaching with discipline when needed. Dad also taught me that there was a "bigger picture" in life that was more important than any outcome of an athletic event. I believe Paul is trying to point out that "bigger picture" in Romans 8. Consider Paul's words, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? ... No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Ro.8:35,37-39). When we are "in Christ", nothing in this life will keep us from the love of God. It is the key to us being winners in this game of life. Nothing will overcome us. Nothing will bring us down. Nothing will keep us from being "more than conquerors". It's the big picture that God wants us to focus on. It is not about "us" in this world. It is all about how we maintain our relationship with God through Christ. It is about what He has promised us after our time on earth is through. Are you a winner in life? You may not get that trophy you practiced so hard for, but how does a crown sound?

There is a huge difference between having pride in self and becoming a prideful person. One should feel good about his accomplishments, good works, and faithful service to God and others. But, hear what Scripture teaches regarding the proud:

- (1) Proverbs 21:4 "A haughty look, a proud heart, and the plowing of the wicked are sin."
- (2) Proverbs 6:16 ff -"These six things the Lord hates, ... a proud look..."

Becoming too proud often originates in self-righteousness (Lk. 18:11, 12), through religious privileges (Zeph. 3:11), by unsanctified knowledge (I Cor. 8:1), by inexperience (1 Tim. 3:6), by possession of power (Lev. 26:19; Ezek. 30:6), or by possession of wealth (2 Kings 20:13).

Being overly proud is forbidden. It will defile a man. It will also harden one's mind.







In John 20, we read of several appearances of lesus after His resurrection. In verses 19-23 He comes to His disciples as they are behind locked doors for fear of the Jews. I can only imagine their apprehension and anxiety. Jesus suddenly appears in their midst and says, "Peace be with you". Jesus showed them His hands and side and the disciples were glad to see Him. Then Jesus said, "Peace be with you. As the Father sent Me, even so I am sending you." His disciples needed peace at this time, but I'm not so sure they were comforted by lesus sending them out. I wonder if they saw the same fate for themselves that Jesus had just suffered. How would they get the courage to face the same enemies that had just killed Jesus? How would they get the courage to go out in public and claim to be followers of Jesus? Jesus gave them the answer they needed. "And when He had said this. He breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them..." (Jo. 20:22-23). Jesus never told them their work would be easy. We are living in a world that for the most part has refused to believe in Jesus. We are led by a government that has struggled to recognize the integrity of the church, yet lesus says that our peace lies in our work for Him! Our best days are promised us when we leave this earth. Be both a candle and a mirror. Don't allow your light to be snuffed out or hidden. Otherwise, your image will dim and eventually vanish away.





A DIFFICULT LETTER!

Have you ever had to write a letter or deliver a message that was going to be hard to receive? Imagine Peter's job as he wrote his first letter to the Christians that were scattered after the persecution of the early church started. These were people that lost their homes, family members, and livelihoods due to their taking a stand for Christ? Was this their reward for believing Old Testament prophecy about the Messiah? What would you say to them? How would you encourage them? Peter wrote, "Since therefore Christ suffered in the flesh, arm yourselves with the same way of thinking, for whoever has suffered in the flesh has ceased to sin" (1 Pet.4:1). Can you imagine their joy at receiving a letter from Peter and then being told that it will get worse before it gets better? Peter does not leave them with that news though. Look how he closes that letter. "Resist him (the devil), firm in your faith, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brotherhood throughout the world. And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you" (1 Pet.5:10). Then and now, it all comes down to perspective. Peter was telling them and us today, that our physical rewards may never come to us in this world, but our spiritual rewards are guaranteed when our time on earth is done. Once we stop living for this world and start living for Heaven, our perspective changes. We wait, we serve, we love, and we spread this message to all who



STRENGTHENED, ROOTED, AND FILLED!

I have always enjoyed in scripture where Paul prays for various people. In Ephesians 3, Paul goes to his knees on behalf of the church at Ephesus. Paul was praying for their spiritual strength and to encourage them in spite of Paul's imprisonment. If this was a prayer of encouragement for the Ephesians then it should be good for us today. When those of our spiritual family are discouraged it would be good to follow Paul's lead. First, we should pray that they be strengthened in power. "That he may grant you to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith" (Eph.316-17). Paul gives us the reason why this is so important... so that the presence of Christ may grow within their hearts. The more that Christ is in us, the better we focus on the things that matter the most. Secondly, we should pray that they return to being rooted and grounded in love. "That you being rooted and grounded in love, you may have strength to comprehend...and know the love of Christ" (Eph.3:17-19). Knowing and accepting the depth of Christ's love for us is a huge step in overcoming the discouragements in life. Hang on to this truth. Lastly, we should pray that they remember that through the Spirit they are filled with all the fullness of God. We are his children, filled with his spirit, and heirs to the promises of Heaven. God will be there for us, He will not leave us, and He will not let us down. The more we live to be like Him the better we become! We then become strengthened, grounded, and filled!



Have you ever been afraid to "step out in faith" and do work for the Lord that you have never done before? Don't feel bad; you are in good company. You are not the first to be afraid when God gives you an opportunity. There are many instances in the Bible where God told someone to not be afraid. We can learn about our own fears when we see what happens when they conguer their fears. After Jeremiah had expressed his concern about his inability to speak, God said, "Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you to deliver you, declared the Lord...Behold I have put my words in your mouth" (Jer.1:8-9). When fear goes away God will help us to speak the truth. When Jesus warned his disciples of their coming persecution, many became worried. Jesus told them, "Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows. So everyone who acknowledges me before men. I also will acknowledge before my Father" (Matt.10:31-32). When fear goes away God will help us face our enemies. When Jesus walked on the water to reach his disciples Mark says that they were terrified and thought he was a ghost. Jesus told them. "Take heart: it is I. Do not be afraid" (Mk.7:50). When fear goes away God will help us see Jesus for who he is. Courage to stand for the Lord is what we need to pass on to the generations that follow us. Read God's words to Joshua, "Just as I was with Moses, so I will be with you. I will not leave you or forsake you" (Jos.1:5). When fear goes away we learn to depend on God even more, and that is when we become more like Him!



Savvy retailers do the same with sales. They put things on sale, you feel great, and the sale price was artificially inflated. The implications and applications of anchoring are profound. If the battle is won or lost in the mind then where you drop your anchor will dictate the outcome. The writer of Hebrews refers to hope as an anchor. A ship's anchor doesn't just keep it from drifting. An anchor can be thrown in front of a ship to help navigate it through treacherous channels. Hope is anchoring ourselves to God's promise. Peace is found the same way. So is joy. For better or for worse your focus determines your reality.



Let me share with you three principles of Christian disciples taken from the book "innovatechurch" by Jonathan Falwell.

Principle #1: Sacrificial

Principle #2: Relational

Principle #3: Transformational

This person understands that the purpose of spiritual growth is directed toward becoming like Christ in word, thought, attitude, and action. They connect us to the grace of God, and through the grace of God we are transformed into the image of Christ.
