

# "IN CHURCH"

One of the most important things we do is worship. One of our greatest privileges is worship. Opportunities for worship are welcomed by the Christian. It seems to me that there are three settings in which children of God worship: private worship (when the worshipper is alone with God); group worship (when the worshipper is with a small group such as a family gathering, a meeting with friends, or a youth devotional, etc.); and corporate worship ("corporate" meaning "a unified group," Corporate worship is unique. It is the worship to which Paul referred in I Corinthians 14 when he spoke of "in the church" (19), "in church" (28, 35), and "in the churches" (34). What did Paul mean by these expressions? He obviously was not referring to a church building, even though "in church" may happen in a building. Paul explained himself in verse 23 when he said, "... if the whole church comes together." I Corinthians 14 is in the context of worship -- chapters 10-16 are worship passages. So Paul called the times when "the whole church comes together" for worship the "in church" meeting. What determines if we are "in church"? Our intention. If our intention when the whole church assembles is to worship we are "in church." If the whole church comes together to

have a work day, a picnic, or to distribute food we are not "in church." The "in church" meeting has a beginning and an ending and is regulated by Scripture -- see Paul's instructions in I Corinthians 10-16. The "in church" meeting is important as we come together with the intention of worshipping God "in spirit and in truth" (John 4:24), and we sing, pray, and teach, and if it be on the Lord's Day we also give and observe the Lord's Supper. "In church" is so important that the writer of Hebrews encouraged Christians to attend the meetings (Hebrews 10:25). We feel that the church coming together on the first day of the week is essential in order to follow Scripture. Other meetings, such as Sunday evenings, Wednesday evenings, etc. are at the direction of the leaders of the congregation and, although a matter of expediency and judgment, are important to our spiritual lives. However, at the direction of the leaders, these expedient services are adjusted from time to time and this year during the holiday season we will not meet on Sunday evening, December 24. All other assemblies during the holidays will take place at their regular times. On Wednesday, December 27, West Erwin will host the annual, area-wide singing. Be with us when you can ... you will be blessed. - Jay Lockhart

We also want to utilize our adult classes to "keep up with each other" so that we will not lose a single member to neglect now that our building program is completed and we will be back in our regular classrooms. This Sunday, wouldn't it be a great time to begin attending Bible class if you are not now enrolled, and wouldn't this be a good time to make attendance in Bible school and worship a priority? Let's keep up with each other and let's begin this week through our Bible - Jay Lockhart classes. See you at 9:00 a.m. Sunday!

#### **FEAR FACTOR**

It's not always easy to be a Christian in an un-Christian world. The place we live constantly challenges our faith. Usually our response is to run. Run from criticism. Run from the negative influences that surround us. So we do our best to create a safe environment. But is this what Jesus intended? He never called us to form a Christian subculture to protect ourselves from being offended or challenged. He calls us to fearlessly engage our culture with hope and the promise of the gospel.

A fellow preacher told me this story. He said, "I sat in a restaurant thinking about this 'fear factor' that had engulfed me when I noticed the waitress was wearing a

ring on her hand that had a fish symbol on it. I thought, isn't that just like the Lord to hand me an opportunity to face my fear .... even if it was just a baby step forward."

The fish has been a symbol of Christ from the early days of the church. It began when the church was under heavy persecution and was driven underground. During those days Christians began a new tradition of drawing an arc in the dirt with a stick or their toe. If the other person drew a second arc opposite the first, completing the fish shape, then they both know that they were Christians and not to be afraid.

I decided to ask this waitress about her faith when she returned, he said. When she came back to the table I said, I noticed that you have a fish symbol on your ring. Are you a Christian?" She said, "No, I'm a Pisces."



athletic event in several passages. In I Corinthians 9:24 he said that as Christians we are running in a race and then said, "Run in such a way that you may obtain it (the prize)." During the Summer Olympics, which take place every four years, I like the running events -- the races. And in a very close race around the track I have often thought, "How good it would be if one of the contestants would just leave the track, cut across the field and win the race." Of course, such is impossible and a runner who did it would be disqualified. Everyone knows that "if anyone competes in athletics, he is not crowned unless he competes according to the rules" (2 Timothy 2:5). Even a little child knows this and will say to his playmate who breaks the rules, "That's not fair!" In athletics one cannot change the rules to fit his own desires. A football player who is knocked out of bounds a yard short of a touchdown could have made it had the field been one yard wider, but he can't move the out-of-bounds marker! A baseball player who is thrown out by just one step at

The Apostle Paul likened the Christian life to an first base can't move the base a few feet closer! A basketball player who makes the winning goal one second after time runs out can't add time to the clock! We all understand these things, but do we see the implications in regard to religion? God has set forth in His word how we are to live the Christian life and he has said, "Hold fast the pattern of sound words which you have heard" (2 Timothy 1:13). If we are to run the Christian race successfully so that we may receive the prize, we must compete lawfully -- we are not at liberty to change the "rules" just to fit our human desires. We cannot add to the length of the field or take away from it. We cannot make the playing field wider or more narrow. We cannot move the base closer or further back. Moses said to ancient Israel. "You shall not add to the word which I command you, nor take from it" (Deuteronomy 4:2). Solomon said, "Do not add to His words, lest He rebuke you, and you be found a liar" (Proverbs 30:6). The best advice I could give to anyone is "to run lawfully" in order "that you may obtain the prize." Are we listening? - Jay Lockhart

Remember the old advertisement for Pepsodent: "You'll wonder where the yellow went when you brush your teeth with Pepsodent." If you read this article -- sing the jingle to me next time you see me.

I'm thinking about the church and I'm wondering where the evangelism went. I read the book of Acts. Evangelism is everywhere. And I'm wondering. When I finish reading chapter 28 I pray, "Lord, do it again!"

### HE MISSED THE POINT

In the August, 2006, issue of The Christian Chronicle a report was made on the Unity Meeting that had occurred between representatives of the churches of Christ and the Christian church. The basic issue in the meeting was the use of instrumental music in worship. While those who were involved found the ground for unity between the two groups elusive, it is not really that difficult. Since the instrument being introduced into worship over 100 years ago caused the division in the first place, the giving up of the instrument today will open the door to unity between the two groups. To speak of unity between the two groups while one continues to have instruments and one does not is far from real unity. In the same issue of The Christian Chronicle there was an interview between representatives of the paper and Alan Highers, a long time preacher of the gospel and an Appeals Court Judge in Tennessee. Highers argued that since the New Testament speaks of singing but does not speak of instruments in the worship of the church, the silence of Scripture prohibited the use of instruments. Then in the October, 2006, issue of the

Chronicle a letter to the editor took exception to the argument from "the silence of Scripture" by saying it would also exclude Sunday schools, church buildings, hymnals, etc. The author of the letter completely missed the point. Every command of God carries with it the authority to do whatever is necessary and expedient in carrying out that command. Of course, the Bible does not mention Sunday schools, church buildings, or hymnals but the Sunday school is a method of teaching the Word of God (something God wants done); God commands us to assemble and a building is a place to do what God commands; and the use of a hymnal is doing exactly what God said to do: sing. The silence of Scripture permits (authorizes) what is necessary or expedient in carrying out God's commandments, but does not authorize doing something other than, different from, or in addition to what God has said. It is precisely at this point that instrumental music is opposed: the Scripture says "sing" and the playing of instruments is something different from and in addition to what God has said.

# **HERE'S A QUESTION FOR YOU**


In my fifty years of preaching I have seen many changes in the church -- some good; some bad; some indifferent. I have lived long enough to see the churches of Christ come from "the other side of the tracks" in many places to build facilities that are second to none and filled with people who are leaders in their communities. I would say that may be a good thing. I have seen our ministers become better trained and better prepared than previously was the case and that may be a good thing. I have seen us take advantage of the explosion in technology and we have more and better teaching aids than ever before. That, too, may be a good thing. However, there are other areas where I have seen changes that are detrimental to who we are what we are to do. First, there is the way we have come to view Scripture. I am seeing more and more evidence that many of our people follow "I think" or "I believe" rather than "the Bible says." Scripture is said by these folks to need to be adapted to our changing culture so that it will be more acceptable. Of course, our job is not to adapt to but change the culture. In matters of methodology and getting the attention of outsiders. we can do anything that doesn't violate Scripture, but at some point people must be confronted by the teachings, the

commandments, and the authority of the Bible. In Peter's words, we need to "speak as the oracles of God" (I Peter 4:11). Second, there is the way we dress for church. In regard to dress there is always the matter of modesty (I Timothy 2:9), a word that means "well-arranged, decent, well-ordered, discreet." While it may be difficult to pinpoint an exact definition of what is or what is not modest, we know it when we see it! Parents can help kids in these things and perhaps the time has come for kids to help parents! Here are some questions about dress: If you were meeting the President of the United States, what would you wear and why? If you were going to a wedding or a funeral, what would you wear and why? When you go to worship God, what do you wear and why? If you are making a statement by what you wear, why not rethink the whole issue? Third, there is what Stan Mitchell, in a recent Gospel Advocate article, called convenient Christianity. This is what Mitchell described as convenience over commitment, failing to distinguish between the sacred and the profane, standing for nothing and falling for anything, and self-serving instead of Savior-serving. In short, convenient Christianity doesn't interfere with everyday life. How sad! Think about it!


### SALVATION ISSUES

Three men, so the story goes, applied for the school bus driver job. The driving test included the question, "If you were driving a bus load of children to school and at the side of the road there was a steep drop off, how close could you come to the edge without endangering the children's lives?" The first applicant said he could come within two feet of the drop off. The second applicant said he could come within one foot of the drop off. The third applicant said that he would not see how close he could get to the drop off at all, but would stay as far away from it as possible. Who do you think got the job? It's pretty easy to see the wisdom in the reply of the third applicant, isn't it? Stay as far away from trouble as possible when the safety of children is the issue. In a recent sermon I mentioned the fact that some brethren are now talking about "salvation issues" in regard to the commandments of God. If by "salvation issues" one means that we are to obey certain commandments of God but we have the freedom to ignore other commandments because they are of "lesser importance" and are, therefore, not "salvation issues," I object. Should we try to see how close we can get to the edge without falling off, or should we stay back

as far as possible from the edge ... for safety's sake? First, we are in no position to make such decisions. How can we know what is of greater or lesser importance unless God tells us so in Scripture? Some things in Scripture are more important than others (of first importance is the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ -- I Corinthians 15:1-4), but we can know that only when God says it. Second, all of God's commandments are important although some things are "weightier" than others. Jesus said to the Jews under the Law of Moses that justice, mercy, and faith were weightier than the tithing of table spices. Yet even here Jesus said the weightier matters should have been done and the other things should not have been left undone (Matthew 23:23). The part of wisdom is to hear the words of Jesus and to do them (Matthew 7:24-28), rather than to look at each of his commandments and then try to select some as "salvation issues" and others as optional. Where does man think he can find the knowledge, the wisdom, and the understanding to make such decisions? It just may be that God considers all that he says to be important and he may consider all of his commandments as "salvation issues"

According to the <u>American Heritage Dictionary</u>, the word ability means: "the quality of being able to do something; to acquire a skill or talent." According to the same dictionary, the word capability means: "the quality of being able to live up to one's ability." Even though these two definitions seem close in meaning, they are really miles and miles apart.

Gary Pinkel, the head football coach for the Missouri Tigers, distinguishes between ability and capability this way: "Ability will get you into the game; capability will get you to the end zone." Gary Pinkel is exactly right.

There are many of us who work with the church, who attend worship services weekly, and who go to many of the church activities, who have the ability to get into the game. Is God satisfied with us simply showing up at church each Sunday or is He expecting much, much more out of us. We can talk about ways to grow the church, we can design elaborate ministries attempting to fulfill the Great Commission. We can even have "experts" come in and talk to us, attempting to point us in the right direction but the bottom line is that God is relying on each one of us individually to take the Great Commission seriously and to take our God given talent (ability) and to get into the end zone (capability) What are you doing to win the victory, showing up or pressing on toward the mark?

## WHAT ARE WE LOOKING FOR?

It seems that more and more people look at religion and the Bible as a buffet from which they can pick and choose what best suits their wants. Is that the way it should be, or should we be more interested in what we need and in what God wants? What child could grow up to be a healthy adult who ate only what appealed to him? What parent would allow that to happen? However, my emphasis here is what most want and what people need. First, people need and generally want to touch the Transcendent. We all long for God, whether we realize it or not. Do you know why this is true? God put that longing in us (Romans 1:19; Psalm 42:1). What a wonderful opportunity we have as the church to share the Transcendent with those who attend our worship assemblies! People should be able, through the quality of our worship, as we simply seek to worship God in spirit and in truth, to have this need fulfilled. Second, people need and usually want to know their identity and worth. People are made in God's image (though fallen because of sin), are worth dying for (the cross proves that), and God wants them in heaven (that is the destiny of the Christian). The message of the church, the simple gospel, should fulfill this

need. Third, people need and want to belong. And the church is a community of believers who, in obedience to the gospel, have entered into Christ and by the grace of God they belong to His family. We should emphasize this in word and deed. Fourth, people need and want to be more than they are -- to be transformed. The teaching of the church emphasizes the possibility of the transformed life in Jesus Christ. Fifth, people need and want to live with purpose. The Word that we preach is the message of living with meaning and purpose. What a wonderful opportunity the Lord has given to the church to be the agent to proclaim a message that meets both needs and wants and when these two things are the same, people have discovered something important. To effectively be the church and to be used by God to speak to universal needs and wants, we must exhibit Christ-likeness and we must be the light of the world and the salt of the earth by carefully knowing, following, and speaking the Word of God faithfully. The opportunity is too great and the task is too important for us to fail. Are we seeking to be faithful?



# WHEN A KING ACTED FOOLISHLY

Gary Montgomery was an associate minister at West king could not offer sacrifice. God had not told Saul, Erwin during the late 60's and early 70's, during the ministries of Dean Brookshire and George Stephenson. Gary, who is now preaching for the church in Hico, Texas, has always effectively served Christ in every church with which he has worked and has been a friend of mine through the years. In a recent bulletin from Hico, Gary printed a Guest Editorial written by the highly respected and widely known Mack Lyon, the host of the international television program "In Search of the Lord's Way." In the article Mack called attention to a passage found in I Samuel 13:11-13 which states that when Samuel was delayed in his arrival for the sacrifice, King Saul "felt compelled, and offered a burnt offering. And Samuel said to Saul, 'you have done foolishly. You have not kept the commandment of the Lord, your God, which He commanded you." Why was Saul's action called foolish by Samuel? How had Saul failed to keep the commandment of the Lord? After all, God had not said a


"You shall not offer sacrifice." What had God said? In I Samuel 10:8 God had said through Samuel that Samuel would meet Saul at Gilgal and that Samuel would offer the sacrifice. God did not say Saul could not offer sacrifice. God had designated priests to offer sacrifices in Israel and that Samuel was to offer the sacrifice at Gilgal. Saul was neither a priest nor Samuel, so wherein did he err? Saul erred in that he presumed that God would be pleased, or at least not displeased, by the offering of the king instead of by the one God had designated. Saul could have said, "But the Lord didn't say I couldn't offer the sacrifice." Precisely! That's the point. God had said nothing about Saul offering sacrifice. God's designation of Samuel to offer the sacrifice excluded Saul from doing it. A failure to honor what God had said and to respect what God had not said (the silence of God's Word) cost Saul the kingdom. What can we learn from this story?



# AN INSPIRED APPEAL

When the apostle Paul came near to the end of his first letter to the Corinthians he made an appeal that would be appropriate for the church in the first century and in all subsequent generations to carefully consider. The appeal found in I Corinthians 16:13, 14 is, "Watch, stand fast in the faith, be brave, be strong. Let all that you do be done with love." The problems that the Corinthian church faced made this appeal especially meaningful. Some of the problems addressed by Paul in this letter were: following men which resulted in dividing the church, immaturity, immorality, going to law with brethren, marriage issues, self-centeredness, worship issues, and questions about the resurrection of the dead. Paul's appeal near the end of the letter should have served as an antidote for the problems with which the church was struggling. First, Paul said, "Watch." This is the word for a soldier who protects a city. He is ever attentive, ever on guard. Second, Paul urged, "Stand fast in the faith." This term spoke of the military man who stood firm against all

onslaughts and refused to retreat or to surrender. The Corinthians were to stand firm "in the faith," so they were to hold to the "body of truth as presented by God." Third, Paul enjoined, "Be brave." The Greek word for "brave" means "to show one's self to be a man; to be mature." The apostle was saying, "Stop acting like children in your spiritual lives." Fourth, Paul pleaded, "Be strong." This word means "to be powerful" with the strength that God supplies. Each of these admonitions are characteristics of the Christian soldier who realized he is in a life or death struggle with evil, error, and darkness. Fifth, Paul changes the picture from military conflict to the attitude that is to be manifested in all of the Christian's relationships: "Let all that you do be done with love." Let love for God, for the church, for brethren, and for all motivate every attitude, every word, and every action. If the Corinthians did this, and if we would do this today, most of the problems the church faces from within would fade away. - Jay Lockhart







#### **TOUGH LOVE**

In the April 27, 2006 issue of Good Tiding of Good Things, a weekly bulletin of the Jacksonville, Alabama church, I read an article by Don Martin that reminded me of the need that sometimes arises for tough love. The article was about Paul "Bear" Bryant, the legendary football coach of the Crimson Tide at the University of Alabama. When Joe Namath was the star quarterback at Alabama, he was found guilty of breaking team rules. Everyone believed that Namath was indispensable to the team and with two games left on the schedule all eyes were on Coach Bryant to see what he would do with his star. Many were surprised when Bear informed Namath that he was suspended for the year and maybe forever. Bryant received over 6000 letters of protest from fans who knew the chances of Alabama winning without Namath were slim. However, the coach stood firm and played the final two games without his star, winning both by narrow margins. Namath returned the next year and led the Crimson Tide to the National Championship. Years later Namath agreed that Bryant was right to stick

by the suspension. What did Coach Bryant teach his team about himself? What did Namath learn from this incident? What did the team learn that would affect it for years to come? There is a time to practice tough love. This principle applies to the family. If parents are to lead their children in the right way, they must learn to practice tough love. When rules are broken, consequences must follow ... parents must stick by their guns. It's not because they love so little, but because they love so much. Life-changing lessons may be learned by the practice of tough love. The principle applies in the church too. Under the leadership of our shepherds we are to dwell together in love and unity. When someone steps out of line, fails to walk in unity and love, and disturbs the life of the body, then that person must be confronted and corrected (Romans 16:17, 18). It's not the easy thing to do, but it is the right thing to do. And it's not because we love so little, but because we love people and the church so much. - Jay Lockhart


#### THE SPIRITUALLY ELITE

Paul gave some sage advice, yes a divine commandment, when he said, "Do not think more highly of yourself than you ought to think" (see Romans 12:3). There are two things to keep in mind here: (1) one should not think more lowly of himself than he should -- this is a false humility that overlooks one's strengths and abilities; and (2) neither should one think more highly of himself than he should -- this is pride that causes one to look down on others and alienates from God (see James 5:5). The proud are the spiritually elite who exalt themselves in their own eyes. They are those who have the attitude, "If you only knew as much as I know, you would think and feel as I do." This attitude causes one to look down on others and to pity them for being unspiritual. This attitude is divisive because it pushes its agenda slipshod over the less spiritual. This attitude is hypocritical because while it claims to be spiritually mature it is often harsh and unloving with those who disagree with it. This

attitude is selfish because it insists upon its own way. This attitude is often rude and hurtful to those it considers to be less mature. This attitude believes it knows how to grow a church whether it has grown one or not. This attitude thinks it doesn't need to be governed by Scripture and places its own thoughts above the revealed will of God. Here's the question: which of the above mentioned things express the attitude of Christ? The answer, of course, is none of them. We all are to be growing into the image of Christ (Romans 8:29). We are to learn to think, speak, and act like Christ. When we fail we may display attitudes that are far from the imitation of Christ. We may only think we are spiritual people unless we are acknowledging what is written as the commandments of the Lord (see I Corinthians 14:37) and allow God's Word to guide our thoughts, our attitudes, and our lives. - Jay Lockhart



#### THE SEEDS OF RESTORATION

In the early days of America, settlers who came from Europe brought their religions with them -- most notable were the Baptists, Methodists, and Presbyterians, as well as Congregational and Catholic churches. By the late 1700's there were people in America who were seeing broader and broader divisions among the churches and who began seeking ways to bring about the religious unity for which Christ prayed (John 17:20, 21). Early on, these people saw the cause of division to be human creeds, human names, and human practices. Therefore, they began to plead for a renunciation of such things and for a return to the New Testament as the only rule of faith and practice in religion. Among the first to make such a plea in America was James O'Kelly in Virginia in the late 1700's. By 1801 Abner Jones, a physician in New England, was making the same plea. Soon Elias Smith joined Jones in establishing nonsectarian churches in the Northeast. Also in 1801, Barton W. Stone and others were making this plea for primitive New Testament Christianity in Kentucky. Then came John Write in Indiana in 1810 and Thomas and Alexander Campbell in Virginia and Pennsylvania and Walter Scott in Ohio. All of these men were saying the same thing: the Bible is the only creed; we should be Christians only: the church of the New Testament is undenominational; what is believed should come form a "thus saith the Lord either in express terms or

approved precedent." Following these principles was a process as they grew in their understanding and application of what they had been saying. For example, the Campbells gradually came to see that if the New Testament was to be the standard of authority then they would have to abandon infant baptism and sprinkling and accept immersion for the forgiveness of sins. Walter Scott grieved over telling people to accept Christ but then not knowing what to tell them to do. After carefully studying the conversions of Acts he came to the conclusion that penitent believers were to be told to be immersed for the forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit. These men, and others, paid a great price to embrace New Testament Christianity. They were not perfect, but they knew what authority in religion is -- the New Testament. We owe much to them since they blazed the trail for us. They have left us a rich heritage and have given us a distinctive plea to "speak where the Bible speaks and remain silent where the Bible is silent." By so doing they believed they would not be starting a new church but restoring the one Jesus built. It is hard to have much respect for a "johnny-come-lately" in our time who hasn't yet made much of a contribution to anything but who will criticize, find fault with, and repudiate the work of the Restorers as insignificant or unimportant. - Jay Lockhart

# "Heirs Of Life Together" I Peter 3:7 Douglas L. Yates

For the past 25 years I have been involved with Christian education in some way, shape, form or fashion. I've had the opportunity of coordinating Bible classes at a Christian school in Miami, Florida and Little Rock, Arkansas. I taught Bible for 3 years at East Texas Christian Academy. And I've overseen the educational ministry at three churches. As often as possible I try to talk about the benefits associated with Christian education but today I want to suggest some ways to improve our classes (school and church) so that we won't fall short of God's glory. Let me make the following three suggestions concerning Christian education:

1. Acquire a qualified staff. Far too often we put people into our classrooms because we have the need to fill a spot or because we feel like we owe a buddy a favor. This is done to the detriment of our students. We need to find the best qualified person to put into our classes (especially our Bible classes). If we are really

striving to help our students obtain a Christian education then why not look intently at finding the best Bible school teacher for that classroom.

- 2. Once you have a qualified staff in place then be sure to recognize and support that staff. In other words, listen and show care, concern and compassion for your teachers. They are making great sacrifices and they should be recognized for those sacrifices. I believe with all of my heart that God will bless good teachers but we also should show our appreciation to them for a job well done.
- 3. Provide our students with the best curriculum possible. Sometimes I wonder where certain classes are headed with what they are teaching. There is no organization to these classes and there is no direction. To help us gain our direction we should remember that the Bible is our textbook for our Bible classes; it shouldn't be a supplement for those classes.

To close, if we are going to call what we do Christian education, then let's get serious about it and seek out the best that God has to offer to help us accomplish our goals.

#### I'M JUST WONDERING

Based upon the predictions of George Barna, recognized leader in understanding the religious climate of America, and an article in The Christian Chronicle (July 2006), I have some questions. Barna predicts that within 20 years one-third of American church members will explore alternative forms of worship such as home churches, workplace ministries, or online faith communities. He suggests that many people cannot get what they need from local churches and will seek alternatives. While Barna's reference is to all religious groups, the article in The Christian Chronicle focused upon members of the church of Christ who are seeking alternatives to the local congregation. Let me say, first of all, that I am in favor of exploring fresh ways of reaching the lost. Second, I am not opposed to non-traditional ways of doing church so long as we are dealing with areas of opinion or expediency and not with matters of faith (things about which God has clearly spoken). Meeting on the Lord's day, the first day of the week, for eating the Lord's Supper, prayer, giving, singing, and proclaiming God's Word is a matter of faith to me. What time we meet, whether or not we have Sunday school, evening assemblies, or Wednesday night meetings are all a matter of opinion and expediency and elders in local churches decide these matters. I recognize that "house

churches" were known in the New Testament, but I also know that there was emphasis upon the "whole church" coming together (I Corinthians 14:23: Hebrews 10:25: Colossians 4:16). Through the years we have had the tendency to look for that one elusive method that will assure success in fulfilling the mission of the church. However, methods come and go and there isn't an easy way to grow a church. While some have decided that the larger local church needs to give way to the small, informal house church in order to reach more people, some questions seem appropriate. Were there no large churches in the New Testament? How many people are being won to Christ in the alternative churches? What is the real motivation? If the small, informal church is the answer for the future, who sends out missionaries? Who cares for the poor? Who sends youth groups on their campaigns? Who are the elders? Who shepherds the flock? Who equips the saints? Who plants churches at home and abroad? Who teaches the children? I'm just wondering. I favor any method for reaching the lost that is in harmony with Scripture. I also favor the congregation that is large enough to impact the community and take the gospel to the world. It remains to be seen as to the real impact of the alternative. - Jay Lockhart



(Note: because of a mistake in the calculations of Dionysius as to when Jesus was born, there is a four year differential in his calendar so that Christ was born in 4 B.C., but the fact remains that history is divided by the birth of Christ). - Jay Lockhart



George Washington accepted the post of General of the Continental Army of the United States on July 3, 1775. He was untested in many ways yet he rose to greatness through this commission during the Revolutionary War. He was held in high regard by his nation, his soldiers, and his officers because of his willingness to see a problem for what it was rather than what it should be. He didn't dwell on the past but he focused on the future and he wasn't afraid to get his boots dirty as he often would lead from the front rather than from the rear. He was a true soldier in every aspect of the word.

Just before the British Army launched a major attack against Washington's post (New York City) he spent countless hours instructing his officers and soldiers of the need to stand their ground and to do battle with the enemy. Even after all of his instructions, when the first wave of British soldiers began their attack against the Army of the United States (as it was now called) many of the soldiers turned and ran from their positions

However, several stood their ground and a few even charged the British Army. They fought valiantly and even though they lost it gave many others the opportunity to see courage in action and it would take such courage for the Americans to eventually win the Revolutionary War. Washington needed to see these men take his advice and stand their ground. America needed to see these men stand their ground otherwise we would have been known as a nation of planners but not implementers.

Church work often needs the same shot in the arm that those who stood their ground provided for Washington and America during the siege of New York City in 1776. We need planners but we also need implementers. You can have the best laid out plan but if that is all you have then you really have nothing. Plans can be developed by many of us but implementing those plans by rolling up your sleeves and getting busy is a different battle cry that many refuse to hear. If you're ready to roll up your sleeves and to get busy for the Kingdom, believe me when I tell you, we already have a plan for you. Let it not be said of us: The harvest is great but the workers are few.

#### HOW SHOULD WE VIEW SCRIPTURE?

Through the years there have been various approaches to Scripture. From earliest times there were those who said the Gospel was not an all-sufficient guide in religion, as many Jewish Christians said that unless Gentile converts kept certain portions of the Law of Moses they could not be saved. The Jerusalem Conference (Acts 15), attended by the apostles, elders from the Jerusalem church, and others, came to the conclusion that Christ and His Word were sufficient for salvation. Soon after the close of the first century, others (most notably the Gnostics) taught that one needed additional illumination apart from the Gospel in order to come to a knowledge of the truth. Through the centuries church synods and conferences have added to and taken away from the teaching of the New Testament. It is not surprising that in our times there are various views of Scripture. On the one hand there are those who reject outright the Scripture as the authoritative and inspired Word of God. On the other hand there are those who believe the Scripture to be the final, complete, authoritative, inspired Word of God (this is what I

believe -- JPL). Between these two views there are various and sundry other beliefs about Scripture. In an effort to justify actions that are not approved by Scripture or that are prohibited by Scripture, there are those who are now saying that "Christianity should consider calling previous words of God into question." Others are saying that "the church must grow beyond Scripture." A member of the church said that "Scripture must be interpreted in light of the culture," suggesting that the culture decides the meaning of Scripture. This is what happens when people prefer human thought, human innovations, and human agendas to what the Bible teaches. I have some questions. If the Bible is not authoritative as it is for man as he is and where he is, of what real value is Scripture? If it doesn't matter what I believe, why does it matter if I believe? If the church doesn't know who it is or what it believes, what real influence can it have in the world? What is better than accepting what the Bible teaches (whether I like it or not), being a Christian only, and seeking to be a member of the church of the New Testament? How do you view Scripture?



#### THE WAY I SEE IT .....

The way I see it is most of us are biblically educated beyond our character. Bible knowledge is imperative, yet never enough. James 2:19 says even demons believe. Satan, himself, apparently reads the Bible (Matthew 4:6), yet the Words do not alter his behavior.

Paul contrasts those who were "quarreling about words," which he said "is of no value, and only ruins those who listen" (2 Timothy 2:14). He later says, "avoid godless chatter" -- mere discussion of the Bible without the goal of godliness. He says it makes you more and more ungodly.

## Paul, therefore, warns Timothy to "flee the evil" desires of youth" (2:22) which in context has little or nothing to do with sexual desires as usually interpreted. Paul still has in mind arguing and those who do so are mishandling God's Word in such a way that we ought to be ashamed (2:15). Instead of arguing about meanings, Timothy was to "pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace ..."

The purpose of Bible knowledge then ought to produce character more and more like Jesus to the extent that when we read the Scriptures for that reason our Bible study is valid. And, if not, our study is nonproductive ... even worse -- it's counter productive, making us less and less like our Savior.

Sing it with me: "Beyond the sacred page I seek Thee Lord; my spirit pants for Thee, O living Word."



## **UNCERTAIN SOUNDS**

I don't know about you, but in articles I am reading, in sound words" (2 Timothy 1:13) to some suggestions tapes I am listening to, and in conversations I am having, I am hearing some uncertain sounds from some members of the church. These uncertain sounds are coming at the very time that the churches of Christ have moved from the fastest growing church in America to the place that we are barely holding our own -- some students of church growth tell us we are actually in decline. Whatever our problems are that have halted our growth, the uncertain sounds coming from various places in our brotherhood do not seem to be helping but in fact may be a contributing factor to failure to grow. The Apostle Paul said, "If the trumpet makes an uncertain sound, who will prepare for battle" (I Corinthians 14:8). When we were the fastest growing church in our country, we knew what we believed and we boldly proclaimed it. At the present time there are those among us who are saying that our attitudes were bad, our methods were faulty, and our view of Scripture was wrong. I am not here to defend anything we did that was not right, but I am wondering why some of us have so watered down the message that we reach few people. Some have reduced "the pattern of

about how to be nice and give little attention to how we are to worship, the nature of the church, the authority of Scripture, or how to be saved. We are told that if we go easy on doctrine we can reach the unchurched, but many who say this are seeing their churches decline. They tell us that the New Testament presents no patterns for us, yet these very people often look to community churches like Willow Creek in Chicago and Saddleback in Southern California as their patterns. They are often busier reading best selling religious authors than they are Peter, Paul, James and John and they believe the church will grow if we follow cunningly devised fables based upon little more than the feeble thoughts of human reason. These are the folks who are telling us to let them show us how to grow the church. The church will grow when we believe the world is lost; when we care enough to take the gospel to the world; when we boldly present the truth in love; and when we honor God's Word and trust Him for the increase. On the other hand, an uncertain sound will assure perpetual decline. Which will be for us?






#### NONCONFORMING TRANSFORMERS

Rocky Mountain Christian is a newspaper published in Eastlake, Colorado. It's Editor/Publisher is Ron Carter and its stated mission is to serve "congregations of the Church of Christ throughout the world with news and thought provoking columns." I read each issue of the paper and believe it accomplishes its mission. In the May 2006 issue Jack Carter wrote a provocative article entitled, "Is It Better Now?" As he compared the growth, the unity, and the trends of the church of the 40's, 50's, and 60's with today's lack of growth, divided congregations, and the influence of Postmodernism, he asked the question, "Is It Better Now?" His answer was in the negative. His solution was for us to again become the church that loves the truth. Jack Carter's article opened up a vast area of thought for me. This year marks my 50th year of preaching and during this half century I have observed a few things. I have observed efforts to "quick-fix" the growth of the church as many have presented their ideas about how to make a church grow ... right now. Most of these ideas didn't provide a permanent solution and have been abandoned. In more recent times we have seen efforts at church growth that include "meeting felt needs," coffee pots, and better and more effective way to do church?

entertainment, but the church remains stagnant. So along comes Mr. Postmodern with his solution: little emphasis upon doctrine, move into the community church arena, give up our identity, and view the Bible as a culture-bound book of suggestions about life. It is interesting that some of these churches will seem to grow because they are built around a strong personality or draw from a wide area, but many become unhappy, divided, and smaller. Without being overly simplistic, I wonder what a difference would be made if all of us would again declare our allegiance to the authority of Christ and Scripture, to the appeal to be Christians only and members of the church for which Christ died, to the principle that the culture is not to change us, but we are to change the culture, to a recognition that the world is to accept the grace of God by obedience to the gospel, to a renewed emphasis upon evangelism, and to the spiritual nature of worship as opposed to entertaining ourselves. It seems to me that if we are to make any real difference in this world we must never conform to it, we must allow Christ to be formed in us, and we must be "transformed by the renewing" of our minds. Wouldn't that be the


## WHAT I SAW IN CHURCH



#### **ROASTED LAMB ANYONE?**

When Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper, he did it and neither do I. However, there are people today who during the Passover meal on a Wednesday or Thursday evening, depending on how one calculates the days of the final week of Jesus' ministry. We know from Scripture the things that were used by Israel to celebrate the Passover: Others reason like this: since Jesus instituted the Supper a roasted lamb or kid; unleavened bread; wine, the fruit of the vine; a sort of pasta or salad; and bitter herbs were included. When Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper he used the unleavened bread and the cup, the wine or fruit of the vine, to represent his body and his blood. Bible students know this. When the first century church came together on the first day of the week, or the Lord's Day, to observe the Supper in memory of Christ, we believe they used unleavened bread and the fruit of the vine. Through the centuries these elements have been used in the Lord's Supper and today we break unleavened bread and drink of the cup, the fruit of the grape, to remember Jesus' death until He comes again. Now, my question is this: would it be acceptable to add some roasted lamb to the Supper? After all, roasted lamb was present when Jesus instituted the Supper and I like roasted lamb! And Jesus did not say not to use roasted lamb! Not one person in a thousand would agree with this line of reasoning ....

use this kind of reasoning to add other things to worship that are neither authorized nor specifically forbidden. We use unleavened bread because that's what Jesus used. on a weekday, we may take of it any day of the week. Our reply is that the first century church assembled on the first day of the week to observe the Supper and that's when we should partake of it. The recourse given by some is: "Examples are not binding upon us, so we may observe the Supper whenever we want to do it." I would offer this rebuttal: if an example (an action of the early church based upon a commandment -- "Do this in remembrance of me" is the command and "Upon the first day of the week the disciples came together to break (the) bread" is the action) is not binding upon us, why do we use unleavened bread? We use unleavened bread because Tesus said it (the unleavened bread as used in the Passover) was his body. No command about "unleavened," just his example. We would do well to do what is authorized and leave other things alone. Roasted - Jay Lockhart lamb anyone?






## AMUSING OURSELVES TO DEATH

Neil Postman wrote a book entitled Amusing Ourselves To Death. In his book, published two decades ago, Postman expressed his fear that television would impair our capacity to think. His fears may now be realized. According to an article by Charles Colson in a recent issue of Christianity Today, the average college graduate's proficient literacy in English has declined from 40 percent in 1992 to 31 percent today. Proficient literacy is defined as "the ability to read lengthy, complex texts and draw complicated inferences." Colson's article reveals that one out of three college graduates cannot read and absorb a book. The age of television may have limited our attention spans and crippled us in our ability to think about and to absorb the bigger issues of our times. Our attention spans cannot exceed a very few minutes and television producers play to this fact by short, action-filled commercials and by action-packed programming that moves quickly from one scene to thing will happen -- we will become, by God's grace, not another. The trend that we are experiencing affects the church too. The church is the "pillar" (supporter) and "ground" (defender) of the truth (I Timothy 3:15). And truth, God's Word (John 17:17), is to be taught, learned,

pondered, and lived. For us to prosper in our spiritual lives we must engage the truth on a deeper level than just thinking about God for a few minutes, singing a few choruses, and entertaining ourselves. The call of Christ is an invitation to confront God (or to be confronted by God), to examine ourselves, and to be transformed -- a process that cannot be accomplished in a brief moment. Additionally, the church is called to confront the culture, to bring people into a saved relationship with Christ, and to equip Christians for service. To fulfill our calling we must reject a casual approach to Christianity, abandon the desire to focus our attention on ourselves, and forsake the notion that the design of worship is to meet our felt needs. When we meditate upon the Word of Truth, struggle to discover the will of God for our lives, develop a passion to become Christ-like in our lives, and long for what we need rather than what we want, a wonderful conformers to the culture, but the transformers of our culture that God desires. God calls us to live, really live, rather then amusing ourselves to death.

### **DENYING WHAT WE AFFIRM**

According to a report published in the new *Think* assembly (Hebrews 10:25). One may affirm loyalty to the magazine, published by Focus Press, Hollywood made 12 times as many R-rated movies as G-rated movies from following a personal agenda. One may affirm God's 1989-2003. However, studies show that G-rated movies ownership of all that he has and then deny it by were 11 times more profitable than R-rated movies. Movie producers may affirm that they make movies that the public wants and movies that are most profitable to the industry, but the facts show that the average PG-rated movie performed three times better than the average R-rated film. The evidence shows that Hollywood has a godless agenda and thus it denies what it affirms. The same denying what it affirms principle was practiced by the Pharisees of Jesus' day. They affirmed loyalty to and love for God, but they denied their claim by practicing injustice toward their fellows (Matthew 23) and by condemning Jesus, an innocent man, to death. The Jews of the first century affirmed devotion to the Law of God, but denied their claim by following their own ways racism. One may affirm that he wants the church to grow (Romans 10:1-3). Today the principle of denying what one affirms may be seen among God's people. One may affirm the importance of the worship assemblies of the

authority of Scripture and then deny the claim by covetousness and a failure to give liberally in support of the work of the church. One may affirm the power and importance of the cross of Christ and then deny the claim by a failure to deny himself and to take up his own cross and follow Jesus (Matthew 16:24-26). One may affirm his desire to follow Christ by emphasizing what Jesus said in the gospels and then deny his claim by neglecting or rejecting what Christ said through the apostles in the New Testament epistles (I Corinthians 14:37; I John 4:6). One may affirm his concern for unity in the church and then deny his affirmation by sowing discord among brethren by promoting his own agenda. One may affirm his love for all men but deny his claim by practicing and then deny it by practices that cause the church to decline. One may "profess to know God, but by ... deeds ... deny Him ... being disobedient" (Titus 1:16). It's church and then deny the claim by forsaking the something to think about: denying what we affirm.







# IF YOU DON'T KNOW WHERE YOU'RE GOING YOU MAY NOT LIKE YOUR DESTINATION

Several years ago we began to hear some in the church say that unless the churches of Christ underwent radical changes we would die. Of course, Christianity is about change. The act of conversion is about change from one kind of life to another kind of life. So when Peter said, "Repent therefore and be converted" (Acts 3:19) he was calling for change. The Christian life is about change as we grow more and more into the image of Christ (2 Corinthians 3:18). However, the changes of conversion and the Christian life were not what the advocates of radical change in the church had in mind. They wanted to change the church from seeking to be the church of the New Testament to being a denomination in the community church movement. They called for greater love, but if one challenged or disagreed with them, he experienced their wrath. They said there was no pattern for the church in the New Testament (ignoring such passages as 2 Timothy 1:13) and set out to follow the pattern of community churches like Saddleback in California and Willow Creek in Illinois. They speak of the need to emphasize grace (but apart from accepting the New Testament as the final authority in religion), the cross of Christ (but apart from commitment to His Word), and the teachings of Jesus over the Epistles (as though all of the New Testament is

not given by the authority of Christ -- see I Corinthians 14:37, but if they stayed away form the Epistles they would not have to deal with passages that would prevent them from doing what they wanted to do in worship and church organization). What does the change movement want to accomplish? They (at least many of them) want the church to be denominationalized; they want to accept the pious unimmersed into fellowship; they want to worship with instruments: they want women in church leadership roles; they want to disassociate themselves from congregations that seek to restore first century Christianity; and, rather than simply going out from us and starting churches of their choice, they want to take over established congregations and drive out those who resist their changes. That's where this movement is going. In spite of pious platitudes, this movement is not the work of shepherds of the sheep, but of wolves. It will not pass without fervent resistance. Do you know where you are going in your spiritual life? Do you know where the church to which you belong is headed? If you do not know where you are going, you may not like where you land. More importantly, we should be asking if the Lord will be pleased with our direction and destiny.

## **EVANGELISM AND BENEVOLENCE**





Last week I had the opportunity of traveling back to Gulfport, Mississippi. It was my first trip back down to the coastal region since I visited that area shortly after Katrina hit. I noticed significant improvement in the clean up effort even though the damage is still overwhelming. Little by little this region is trying to rebuild. Both the

Orange Grove congregation and the Long Beach congregation are engaged in similar works at this time. They are busy in their communities, doing a lot of roofing and sheet rocking. They would love to have teams of trained men/women to help in the above mentioned areas. The Long Beach congregation has offered their building to house any team that can make this journey. They recommend that you bring your own food and they have cooks who will prepare the meals for you at the building. The Orange Grove church also needs workers but they also need spiritual disaster relief. They need a team of workers to come in and follow up on contacts they have made since August. There are simply too many names for this congregation to get to and still do the sheet rocking, etc. Perhaps we can be of assistance. Let's continue to involve the Lord and Let's see if we can help. Let me know what you think our involvement should be in this matter.


## SOME STRANGE FACTS ABOUT GIVING

Giving in the church brings forth interesting and often puzzling responses from people. Interesting because of the abundant liberality of some and puzzling because of the attitudes and comments of others. Here are some of them.

- People often say that they cannot purpose to give a certain amount over the course of a whole year because they are not sure they could keep up with their commitment. These same people may have signed a note for five years to purchase a car and thirty years for a mortgage. Interesting.
- Some folks say that they do not give at least a tenth of their incomes to the Lord because tithing was under the Law of Moses and is not a part of the New Testament. This gives them the right to give 3% (the national average of giving). While everything under the gospel is better than the Law of Moses (Hebrews uses the term "better" thirteen times to show the superiority of the gospel over the law), the Lord, we are told, is pleased when we give less than did the people under the law. Strange.
- Those who are the most liberal in their giving and who give the most toward special contributions and building programs never seem to say much about "the church is always needing money." On the other hand, those who give the least resist teaching on giving and make negative comments about the budget of the church and exhortation from the leaders of the church to increase our giving. Astounding.
- Some people who live on fixed incomes have little to give, yet from their little give much. Others tell us they live on fixed incomes, but because of investments and inheritances their fixed incomes put them in the upper levels of income in the church. These folks, from their much, give little. Puzzling.
- There are those who can quickly believe many of God's promises, but when God says, "And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work" (2 Corinthians 9:8), they can easily disbelieve and explain away this promise. Remarkable.

The dictionary defines "propaganda" as "the spreading of ideas, information, or rumor for the purpose of helping or injuring an institution, a cause, or a person." During World War II there was a lot of propaganda used by the Axis powers in an effort to demoralize the Allies and to make their losing cause to look better than it was. There it. On television more people watched the Rose Bowl is propaganda being used today concerning the war in Iraq. Hollywood uses propaganda to further its cause. A case in point is the recent Golden Globe Awards, a Foreign Press Association that passes out awards for what they say are the best movies, television programs, and actors and actresses. "Brokeback Mountain," a film about a romance between two cowboys, won four prizes; "Transamerica," a story about a man's sex change surgery, won an award; and a prize went to "Capote," a film about gay author Truman Capote. The television Fiction," we rank 10th among 245 religious groups in show "Desperate Housewives," a show about dysfunction and promiscuity, won the award for best musical or comedy series. What message is Hollywood sending us? The message is this: these movies and television themes clear and firm concerning doctrine. In all areas of life we are good, acceptable, and normal and should be need to know the difference between truth and rewarded. Either Hollywood's memory is short or its

commitment to its obscene agenda is great. Wholesome films like "Beauty and the Beast," "Lion King," "Remember The Titans," and "The Chronicles of Narnia" were box office smashes, but how do the obscene films do? But the public keeps having this stuff pushed on than watched "Desperate Housewives." So, what's going on? It's propaganda. A similar thing is happening in the church. We are told by some that the church is dying and without radical change it will die. We are told that we are losing our young people because we are not keeping up with the times. We are told that holding too closely to biblical teaching keeps us from growing. However, according to Flavil Yeakley, a respected pollster among churches of Christ and author of "Separating Fact From America; we are 4th in number of congregations; our dropout rate among young people is lower than other groups; and multitudes of people want the church to be propaganda. - Jay Lockhart



#### **HURRICANE RELIEF UPDATE**

Soon after the hurricanes hit the Gulf Coast, 22 men from West Erwin went to Gulfport, Mississippi with tractors, chain saws, etc. and supplies to aid those who were devastated by the storms. After assessing the damage and working in the area for several days the group reported to the elders at West Erwin church and we sent \$12,802.47 to leaders in the church in Gulfport, men we trusted to properly disperse the money. Additionally, in Tyler we served as a distribution center for clothing and food for the 2000 evacuees who came to our city, so \$10,445.89 went to this work. Further, we contacted the Churches of Christ Disaster Relief effort in Nashville, Tennessee to find what areas of the Gulf Coast could best be served by our efforts. These included Biloxi and Hattiesburg, Mississippi and Mandeville, New Orleans, and Lake Charles, Louisiana. \$30,000.00 went to these areas. Finally, we sent another group of men from our congregation to Jasper, Texas to help with cleanup and distribution of needed commodities and \$3,252.43 of funds were spent there. In all, we received \$35,004.75 from 14 congregations and individuals outside of Tyler and West Erwin contributed \$21,496.04 for a grand total of \$56.500.79 which has been used for helping hurricane victims. We have closed the Hurricane Relief Fund with a -0- balance. Thank you for your generosity in helping in this work.

Well, we have successfully concluded another year here at West Erwin and I'm proud to say that we have once again experienced growth. Of course, it goes without saying that we are talking about spiritual and numerical growth. Spiritual growth is a process that some suggest cannot be measured accurately. I'm not exactly sure that I agree with such a statement. I don't know how many times I have read the Bible completely through but however many times it is I can guarantee you this, I always learn something new. It is the most amazing book I've ever read. All of us should be studying our Bible because if we stop studying God's Word, we stop the spiritual growth process. Through a continual Bible study we will move forward or perhaps a better way of saying it, we will move upward. I look at spiritual growth in terms of stairs. If I study to show myself approved, I should be at least one step higher than I was last year. Failure to be a good student of God's Word will not keep me where I was last year but I'll actually be one step lower. If I want to grow spiritually I must study to show myself approved.

Numerically (within our Bible school ministry) we once again grew. The growth was very small this year but nonetheless we did grow. When you consider that just 5 years ago we were declining at an annual rate of -5% in our Bible school attendance, even this small growth is welcomed. Our Sunday morning Bible school attendance only saw a net increase of 1 this year. I must tell you it could have been and should have been much greater than this. Over the last 5 years we have increased our Sunday morning attendance by +25. Our Wednesday evening attendance in 2005 grew by +9. Five years ago we were plateaued at 250, today we are averaging 331. That's +81! That's not bad. We are fast approaching the +100 mark for Wednesday evenings. We have many things planned for 2006 and perhaps at this time next year when I give my year end report, I'll be able to say that we grew significantly in 2006. It'll happen if we all get behind our Bible school ministry. Let's grow as God would have us to grow!

## Write It Down

"Write this down so you don't forget it!" How many times have we heard that excellent advice? Chances are you've heard that phrase from teachers, parents, your spouse and several others.

Writing things down is such a simple solution to many problems. If students are able to take good notes in class, then they likely will fare much better when it is time to take exams. This allows them to better remember what they heard in class.

Preachers and Bible class teachers like to see people taking down notes during their lessons. Scriptures, main points and illustrations that are written down will help to reinforce a person's memory of the lesson they have just heard.

God saw the importance of having a written representation of a message. God wrote the 10 commandments in stone. After God gave the children of Israel a victory over Amalek in Exodus 17, God gave the following instruction to Moses. "Write this for a memorial in the book and recount it in the hearing of Joshua, that I will utterly blot out the remembrance of Amalek from under heaven." God understands that if we write it down, we will remember it better.

Moses recorded that the people of Israel were to revere the word of God and that they were to write it down and teach it to their children. "And these words which I command you today shall be in your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by

the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates." Deuteronomy 6:6-9.

But God didn't limit His writing to stone or paper. In Jeremiah 31:33 we read, "But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put My law in their minds, and write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people." These thoughts are echoed in Hebrews 8:8-12 and 10:16-17.

In the popular hymn, *Tell Me The Story Of Jesus*, Fanny Crosby penned the following words in the first verse. "Tell me the story of Jesus, write on my heart every word." What a wonderful vision! Having the story of Jesus written on our hearts, embedded into our minds, forever with us!

Do you have the words of God written on your heart today? Make it your goal this year to become a more frequent reader of God's word. Keep a notebook or pad of paper handy as you read and write down key words, thoughts and principles. Always keep the written word of God in front of your eyes. And keep the story of God's love written on your heart.

## The Smallest Effort Is Worth More Than The Greatest Excuse

A few years ago a news story appeared about a man who lost a local election by just one vote. Unfortunately for him, the man's two sons had failed to cast their own votes which would have given him the victory. Whatever excuse they provided in their defense certainly was of little comfort to the defeated candidate. The saying is very true: "the smallest effort is worth more than the greatest excuse."

Sometimes we can underestimate the amount of good that can be generated through our actions. For example, some may be unsure of their ability to teach the gospel to others, thinking that they don't know enough. But as someone has said, "If you know enough to be a brother, you know enough to teach another." Any effort is better than none at all.

A story is told of a young boy who was walking along the seashore. As he walked, he would stoop down and pick up a starfish off the sand and then toss it back into the water. Someone stopped the young boy and said, "What do you hope to accomplish? There are far too many starfish and you can't possibly toss them all back into the ocean." The young boy replied, "No, I can't get to them all, but to the ones I do get to it makes a big difference."

That should be our attitude when it comes to doing the work of our Lord. When called upon to trust God and put our efforts into a cause we should be ready and willing to give it our best effort. Reality will creep in at times and try to persuade us that our effort won't make a difference. When that happens we

of all who obey the gospel

need to refocus on our task and know that whatever we do in God's name will be of good to someone somewhere.

When Jesus challenged His disciples to find a way to feed 5,000 people, Andrew responded in John 6:9 and said, "There is a lad here who has five barley loaves and two small fish, but what are they among so many?"

Likewise, we sometimes look at the great commission and other commandments and think, "With so many people in the world, how can my effort make any difference?" But remember, the smallest effort is worth more than the greatest excuse.

What difference does it make if you are faithful in attendance in worship and Bible school? Someone may be patterning their habits after yours. You make a big difference in the lives of others, especially in your own family.

What difference does it make if you are honest in business or dress and act modestly during the week? You portray the body of Christ every day, not just on Sundays. Every action in your life has the potential to draw others closer to Christ or to repel them.

May we remember to make good on our commitments to God, to the church and to others. May our life and actions become a force to draw others to Christ. May we all learn to stop making excuses and start making a difference.



# **Heed The Warning**

Hurricane Ike swept through our area and, thankfully, we were mostly untouched. Many of our members were without electricity for a few hours and a few of them were without it for days. But we were all unharmed and for that we are very thankful.

As I watched the news coverage of the storm I was struck by the foolishness of people who were unwilling to heed the warning of this severe storm. One scene in particular showed a group of people drinking outdoors at a sea side bar as the storm was approaching Galveston.

During an on air interview, one newscaster pleaded with them to reassess their decision to stay and to seek safety away from the storm. Yet they were determined to stay and drink their way through it.

Have you ever wondered why some people simply will not heed the warnings given to them? The warnings from the authorities stated that "certain death" was in store for those who did not evacuate. But many people would not evacuate. As far as I know, this group at the bar escaped with their lives.

The writer of Hebrews reminds us in Hebrews 9:27, that "it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment." One may escape paying taxes and may elude other responsibilities in life, but one may not escape the

certainty of physical death. It will happen. Maybe not today, or even within a decade. But we will all die.

In a manner similar to those at the sea side bar, many people today will not heed the warnings of the Bible to prepare their souls to be right with God. They will ignore, discard and belittle the pleas from God through us (2 Cor. 5:20) for them to reconcile to God while they still have the chance.

I'm glad those people at the bar survived the storm. But instead of feeling more sure of their decision, I hope that this close call will cause them to think more responsibly about the safety of both their physical and spiritual lives.

Friends, we live in a world where people think they are invincible. An estimated 140,000 defied the order to evacuate and some 2,000 people had to be rescued in the aftermath of lke. I'm glad they found physical safety. I pray that they, and others, will seek and find spiritual safety as they heed the warnings from God.

"For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away." James 4:14. Friends, let's heed God's warnings and prepare for eternity!
