# The Best Use Of Time

Last Sunday evening our lesson was on the importance of time management. God provides us with the gift of time each day. Whether one is young or old, rich or poor, male or female, we each receive the same amount of time on a daily basis.

Unfortunately not every person values this time in the same way. Some will squander it, waste it and let it get away from them. Others will be more mindful of its value and will look to plan it, measure it and make the most of it. But whether we give attention to time or not, time will keep marching on.

As Americans we have become accustomed to being busy. We work hard, play hard and generally fill our lives with a great amount of activity. Rarely is the average citizen of our country without something to do or some place to be. Somehow we find a way to fit in what has to be done.

But I worry that we don't spend enough of our time on things that are really important. Charles Humel said, "Our greatest danger in life is in permitting the urgent things to crowd out the important."

When I was a manager in a corporation some of the employees I managed had difficulty finding the time to do their own assignments. They seemed to be always

busy helping others and were almost always around to volunteer for some division-wide event. But their own work was often neglected. As a result, they often complained that they didn't have the time to complete their own tasks by the deadlines.

In short, they didn't manage their time properly. The English Standard Version of Colossians 4:5-6 uses a phrase that I really like. "Walk in wisdom toward outsiders, making the best use of your time. Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person" (emphasis added, MB).

Many high achievers in life will never outwardly appear in a rush. They have already established priorities and know what things must be done. Then they simply execute a reasonable plan to allocate sufficient time to each task until they are all completed. They make the best use of their time.

Friends, think about our spiritual priorities. Do we allocate sufficient time for God in our lives? What about Bible classes, prayer, reading the Bible or Sunday night worship? Think about these and don't let the urgent crowd out the important.

# What Does It Profit?

I love to read the insights of others and I was moved recently by reading articles from two of my preacher friends, Steve Kirby and Steve Higginbotham. One wrote on the challenges of being a Christian servant, leader and teacher to others. He spoke of the fact that "talk is cheap" but action to fulfill the needs of others comes at a price.

He's right. Any position of leadership for our Lord will require more than words. Actions are also needed, but sometimes they become a heavy burden to carry. To help encourage such workers he cited three passages.

"And whatever you do, do it heartily, as to the Lord and not to men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the inheritance; for you serve the Lord Christ" (Colossians 3:23-24).

"Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord" (1 Corinthians 15:158).

"And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart" (Galatians 6:9).

The other friend wrote of the fact that we sometimes mistakenly think a problem is solved when the complaining stops. He used the following illustration.

> 2010 Theme We Believe

A little boy goes to school and his teacher asks if anything exciting happened over the weekend. The boy raises his hand and says, "Yes, my daddy fell in a deep well." "Is he ok?," the teacher asked. "Well, he must be. He stopped crying for help yesterday."

My friend then adds, "Friends, every day we find ourselves in the company of people who are hurting, in trouble, and in overt and covert ways are crying out for help. Therefore, I have two questions: 1. What have we done to answer those cries for help? 2. Have we incorrectly assumed that just because the cries have stopped that the problem has vanished?"

Listen to what James had to say about this. "What does it profit, my brethren, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can faith save him? If a brother or sister is naked and destitute of daily food, and one of you says to them. 'Depart in peace, be warmed and filled,' but you do not give them the things which are needed for the body, what does it profit? Thus also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead" (James 2:14-17).

Friends, prayer is important. But don't just pray for God to help solve a friend's problem. Open your eyes to see that you just may be the solution God intended.

# Growing in Grace by Mike Gravois

Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see.

This is what the ancients were commended for. Hebrews 11:1-2

**Perseverance** n.: steady persistence in adhering to a course of action, a belief, or a purpose; steadfastness. continued steady belief or efforts, withstanding discouragement or difficulty; persistence.

So was it perseverance or faith that kept Joseph going when times were difficult? How would you maintain your faith when sold into slavery by your brothers; being unjustly accused by Potipher's wife and imprisoned; and sitting in a dungeon with no indications that your situation would change?

I believe these two words operate hand-in-hand. You see, to me, perseverance is faith applied. It is continuing to live your life one day at a time when the future is uncertain. Perseverance is relying upon a God who is bigger than our circumstances. Listen to these verses written by the apostle Paul.





# What Question Would You Ask?

Do you remember the Magic 8 Ball toy that was introduced years ago? My sister had one of those when we were young. This toy, that resembled an oversized billiard ball, had a small window on the bottom. A person was supposed to ask a question, shake the ball and then turn it over and the answer would magically appear in the window.

Naturally I didn't believe in such nonsense. That's why I would wait until my sister was out of the room before I asked the 8 ball a question. Of course if I didn't get the answer I wanted I simply ignored it and tried again. So much for something telling your future!

I believe people are, by nature, very curious beings. When we see something new we want to learn about it. When we have a problem we look for a solution. But if the things we discover don't meet with what we expect, sometimes we ignore the information and keep looking.

I've read some amusing lists of questions that people would like to ask God. Did Adam have a belly button? Were there termites on the ark? Some questions are trivial while others are rather weighty.

There was a young man in the Bible who had a chance to ask Jesus some questions. He didn't ask about

the trivial. Rather he asked about something very important.

He asked, "Good Teacher, what good thing shall I do that I may have eternal life?" (Matt. 19:17). He was told to keep the commandments.

So then he asked, "Which ones?" (Matt. 19:18). Jesus named six commandments to follow to which the young man replied, "All these things I have kept from my youth. What do I still lack?" (Matt. 19:20).

# Acts of Compassion By Don Crawford

Never underestimate the spiritual significance of even one act of compassion done in the name of Jesus. One simple act of Spirit-prompted compassion can change the course of history.

This is the message that rings loud and clear from an Egyptian dungeon 3,000 years ago. It's all recorded in the book of Genesis beginning in chapter 37. The imprisoned cupbearer shared his dream. Joseph interpreted it. Three days later the dream came true. The cupbearer was released from prison and reinstated to his

position.

Several years later when Pharaoh had a strange dream the cupbearer remembered how Joseph helped him and he told Pharaoh. Joseph was summoned. He interpreted Pharaoh's dream and landed a job in Pharaoh's administration. A single act of compassion in an Egyptian dungeon years later led to the salvation of two nations, Egypt and Israel.

Never underestimate a single act of compassion, no matter how small. In GOD'S hands, anyone of them have the power to change the course of history for a life or a entire nation.

# Growing in Grace by Mike Gravois

As we prepare for this summer's VBS, I hope you are taking some time to look at the life of Joseph, our main character. Joseph's life was characterized by his persistent faith in difficult circumstances. As tough times presented themselves in Joseph's life, He 1) maintained a clear conscience by putting God first in every situation; 2) he kept doing his best despite the circumstances, whether in prison or Pharaoh's palace; and 3) Joseph felt and practiced God's presence in the circumstances of his life

VBS is coming, but there is so much you and I can learn from the life of Joseph as well. Let's not wait and "do this for the children." Open your Bible and see what lessons, practical truths, and illustrations God has in there for you today. In good times and in bad Joseph was a righteous man and we can learn a great deal from the way he lived his life.

"Righteousness – true holiness – is seen over time in our persistence. It is relatively easy to 'flirt' with righteousness – being occasionally courteous to other drivers (if you happen to be in a good mood), helping someone in need by opening the door for them (if you have time), throwing a few extra bucks in the offering plate (as long as you won't miss them). But this behavior is in reality superficial righteousness. The righteousness God seeks is a persistent righteousness, a commitment to continue making the right decision even when, perhaps hourly, you feel pulled in the opposite direction. Holiness is far more than an inclination toward occasional acts of kindness and charity. It is a commitment to persistent surrender before God."



# Moments with Mike

# Do You Believe?

A couple of weeks ago we witnessed two people put on Christ in baptism. Before they were baptized they were asked, "Do you believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God?" They answered in the affirmative.

Belief is such an important part of our spiritual being. Even those who do not believe in God believe in something. But the belief that God wants us to have is a belief not only in His Son, but also in His way for us to live.

When Jesus was with the apostles, He asked them who others thought that He was. They answered with several names including John the Baptist and Elijah. Then He asked them who they thought He was.

It was Peter who announced, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God" Matt. 16:16. Jesus said that the church would be built upon that confession of belief. What we believe makes a difference.

In the Gospel of John we find the account of Lazarus and his death. When Jesus first arrived He was greeted by Martha and later Mary and both had the same comment to make to Jesus in their grief. "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died" (John 11: 21, 32). They believed in His power to heal.

To Martha, Jesus comforted her with the knowledge that her brother would live again, but she mistook this for only a spiritual life and not an earthly one. Then Jesus replied. "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this" (John 11:25-26).

Her response was similar to that of Peter. "Yes. Lord. I believe that You are the Christ, the Son of God, who is come into the world" (John 11:27).

I watched a video online a week ago where many people were interviewed about their beliefs. Most of them said that they believed in Jesus but mostly as a prophet. Some put Jesus on the same level with Buddha or Mohammad. Others said that they didn't believe in Jesus at all except as an historical figure.

Friends, to believe in Jesus is more than simply to believe that He lived on earth or even that He was sent from God. To believe in Jesus is to believe that He is our path to God, our Savior and our hope.

Sunday morning we will examine belief in the sermon, "Does It Matter What We Believe?" I hope that you will be here for that lesson.

And Paul chimes in on this issue as well in Romans 12. Verse 14 says, "Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse." Later in the passage he quotes from Proverbs 25:21-22, in verse 20, "If your enemy is hungry, feed him: If he is thirsty, give him a drink: For in so doing you will heap coals of fire on his head."

The goal of this is summarized in the next verse when he says, "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." Friends, let's be careful to keep the right perspective about those who would oppose God and righteousness. Let's pray for them to be open to the truths of the Bible and let's pray that our lives will always be a positive representation of what it means to be a Christian.

I don't pray for anyone to succeed in doing wrong, nor do I believe God expects us to do so. But I do believe in praying for hard hearts to be softened by the love of those who serve the risen Savior. Friends, how we pray makes a difference, if not in them, then in us.



Nehemiah 4: The common laborers held a tool in one hand and a spear in the other.

Preparedness and perseverance

Nehemiah thinks the threats of his enemies to attack the builders are more than just hot air. Prayer is backed up by planning. He stations armed guards, divides the work crew up into builders and defenders, and distributes weapons to every worker. He also assigns trumpeters to each work crew so that they can quickly call for help if an attack comes. Some are given double duty: they are guards at night and workmen by day. They sleep in their clothes with weapons at hand. A key phrase is: "and so we kept working." Nehemiah and his crew's commitment to the task is impressive. Even without the threat of an attack their job is a daunting one as they attempt to build a great wall out of rubble. Great accomplishments often include working through opposition and discouragement. It might be said that the greater the goal the more difficult the task. How do I respond in such situations? Do I work with "a tool in one hand and a spear in the other" or do I decide it's too hard and find an easier route? Nehemiah's story teaches us the importance of preparedness and perseverance.

The Power of the Word by George H. Stephenson | November 21, 1968

"For the word of God is quick and powerful and sharper than any two edged sword..." (Hebrews 4:12)

God's word has always been a source of power. The Bible teaches that God's word made and upholds the world about us. "By the word of the Lord were the heavens made, and all the host of them by the breath of his mouth." (Psalm 33:6). "Through faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that things which are seen were not made of things which do appear." (Hebrews 11:3).

Before God's word was spoken, there was neither light nor life. (Genesis 1:2). Just as God's word brought natural life into existence, His word is also the source of spiritual life. "The words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life." (John 6:63).

The power of the word is seen in the life of Christ. He spoke to the troubled waters, "Peace, be still, and there was a great calm." (Matt. 8:23). He spoke the word and brought sight to the blind, hearing to the deaf, and cleansing to the leper. He spoke the word which brought Lazarus, who had been dead four days, from the tomb. Some day, Jesus will speak the word which will restore life to all who

are in the grave. (John 5:28,29). The word of the Lord gives strength to all in whom it abides. "I commend you to God and to the word of his grace which is able to build you up and to give you an inheritance among all them that are sanctified." (Acts 20:32). We are taught to receive with meekness the engrafted word which is able to save your souls." James 1:21).

The Bible contains the word of God. (II Timothy 3:16,17). Good men alone did not write the Bible, because whoever wrote the Bible declared that it was the product of the Holy Spirit. Human wisdom did not produce the Bible, for it contains so much knowledge that human wisdom did not possess at the time the Bible was written. Text books which were used in schools a generation ago are now discarded and out of date but the Bible contains wisdom adequate for our spiritual needs in our day and in every generation.

As the work begins on the big wall rebuilding project, Nehemiah, as general contractor, takes us on a tour of the job site. This is a huge undertaking so he's organized the leading families of Jerusalem to take on different sections of the wall, including some who are rebuilding the gates to the city. We meet Hanun and his team who are rebuilding the Valley Gate and then we come to Malkijah and his crew. Malkijah is an important person among the returned exiles; in fact, he's the mayor of the nearby district of Beth Hakkerem. Just a second, it looks as though Malkijah is taking a short break, maybe we can have a word with him, "Excuse me, your honor, do you have a second?"

"Sure, but not long mind you; there's work to be done."

"Being such an important person in Jerusalem, I imagine you have an important gate to rebuild. So tell me about this gate...is it one of the historic royal gates, used only for the king?"

He smiles and shakes his head.

"Maybe it's used for religious purposes, like the Sheep Gate...or for commerce?"

Malkijah grins at us, "This, my friends, is none other than the Dung Gate."

We are somewhat taken back by this. "Do you mean this gate is primarily used for human waste disposal?" We're surprised that this important man is rebuilding such a lowly gate.

Then Malkijah son of Recab, mayor of Beth Hakkerem says, "But it is an important gate – it's important because it's being rebuilt in the Name of the Lord. Anything you do in his Name is a worthy effort."

tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things," he was not telling us that we should never make plans, but that we should not become so burdened by the possible troubles of tomorrow that we cannot live well today. After all, today is all we have-yesterday is past, tomorrow is future and today is ours. So, love well today. What would happen if we made the decision to live well right now? With this in mind, let me suggest some things that we can do today which will transform our lives and the lives of others. Let us resolve that just for today we will:

# Holy Curiosity By Don Crawford

If there ever was a person who could be considered a genius it's Albert Einstein. But he said of himself, "I have no special gift. I am only passionately curious."

Most academic programs revolve around force-feeding knowledge rather than unleashing curiosity. We learn some things, but we lose the love of learning and a large part of what we learn we forget. One classic study at a university proves my point. All the summa cum laude graduates were given their final exam one month after graduation. They all failed.

When you force-feed the mind it rarely gets past the short-term memory. So.....what if we stopped force-feeding answers and learned to unleash holy curiosity in the church?

Have you noticed how Jesus uses curiosity to catch people? In John's Gospel Jesus used it with Nicodemus, the Samaritan woman at the well, and an invalid at the pool of Bethesda in chapter 5. "Do you want to get well?" What an unusual question to ask an invalid.

Perhaps asking questions rather than spitting out answers is how we begin using curiosity to point people to Jesus? What do you think?

# Nehemiah 2: The God-of-Heaven will make sure we succeed. We're his servants and we're going to work, rebuilding. With God's help anything is possible.

Upon his arrival in Jerusalem, Nehemiah quietly inspects the walls of the city. Well, it might be better said that he inspects the ruins of the city walls. They were demolished decades earlier. He meets with city leaders and proposes that the next big project be rebuilding those walls and gains their enthusiastic support. As word of this project spreads, we meet Nehemiah's three adversaries: Sanballat, Tobiah, and Geshem. These men are leaders of the area's non-Jewish residents and they oppose the rebuilding of Jerusalem's walls. There is likely a power struggle here. At first, the returning Jews brought welcome capital and man power to the area, but now they threaten to become the dominant residents of the area once again. Nehemiah's reply to them is that in spite of the overwhelming task before them and even in spite of the opposition of these three men that he's assured of success. The reason is that he is doing God's work and that God, Himself, will bring them success. As I hear this declaration of faith from a man standing in the rubble of a city I'm impressed with his absolute trust in God. This isn't some "pie in the sky" situation; this is real work in the most unlikely of circumstances and with real and powerful opposition. Nehemiah doesn't think he can rebuild the wall because he's going to try real hard or because he's going to outsmart his enemies. He's going to do it because God is there to help them. There's a good lesson here for me in all I attempt to do in the name of the Lord. I hope to see you on Sunday as we continue this series of lessons.

# Love Abounding by Dean Brookshire | April 26, 1962

Phil. 1:9-11, "And this I pray, that your love away from Him rather than drawn unto Him. may abound yet more and more in knowledge and discernment; so that ye may approve the things that are excellent; that ye may be sincere and void of offence unto the day of Christ. Being filled with the fruits of righteousness, which are through Jesus Christ, unto the praise and glory of God."

The church at Philippi must have been a great one, because Paul had less criticism for it than he did any other church. In spite of their greatness he urged them to grow in love. He prayed that their love might abound yet more and more. The word abound suggests the idea of getting full and running over. As long as we live in this life it is possible to grow in love. When a Christian's love wanes he is not growing or going on toward heaven. The Christian grows more in the divine nature of God by causing his love to abound than in any other way. God is love and if we expect to live in heaven with Him we must be filled with love too.

The Philippians were exhorted to grow in knowledge too. The Christians' love must be an intelligent love. Without knowledge there can be no genuine love. Love works in two ways, it either repels or draws. Even the love of God does not draw all men unto Him, nor keep all Christians faithful unto Him. God's love would compel them to do things they do not want to do, hence they are driven

The greatest commandment in the law, according to Jesus, "is to love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind." This, of course, takes in all of one's faculties. This causes one to surrender all of his own ways in favor of God's ways. Sinners are saved by a reciprocal love. God loves us and He expressed it. We must love God and express it too. "For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandment; and His commandments are not grievous."

The Apostle wanted the Philippians to have a discerning love. He said, "In knowledge and discernment." We must learn to discern between things worthy of our love and things unworthy of our love. We are told to love not the things of the world, and in another place we are told to set our mind on things above (heavenly things). A discerning love enables us to approve the things that are excellent. Nothing is worthy of our love that will condemn the soul. Much is being said today about the condition of the world (or the people). There is nothing wrong with us that Scriptural love will not heal. We have learned to love the wrong things. Many of our children are being taught to love the wrong things. This is being done mainly because our love is not an abounding one.





# **Preventative Maintenance**

was about 16 years old. It was a 1972 four door Fiat. Not much to look at, but hey, it was a car. It was not only a car, but it was MY car. I loved that car even though it did not go much faster than 45 mph. One day my uncle shows up and tells me we are taking MY car to a garage. You should have seen the look on my face. MY car?? At some garage?? Why?? Frantically, I protested, "But there is nothing wrong with it. Why do I have to take it to a garage?" My uncle then explained that although there was nothing wrong with my car, it still needed to go to the garage for an oil change, tune up and other things. He explained that this was called "preventative maintenance." In other words, one should service the car before it has problems. By servicing the car before it has problems, one can prevent certain problems from happening with the car. Checking the wear on the tread of a tire can prevent a flat. Checking belts and hoses can prevent a break down. Checking fluid levels can prevent engine trouble.

Over the years I have learned that this "preventative maintenance" ideology works for just about everything in life. If we plan ahead and prepare, we can save ourselves a lot of trouble later. No matter what situation you are facing, preventative maintenance applies. Have you ever forgotten your anniversary brethren? Marking it on the calendar NOW, will prevent an unpleasant situation when that day comes.

I remember getting my first car when I out 16 years old. It was a 1972 four door for much to look at, but hey, it was a car. not only a car, but it was MY car. I loved r even though it did not go much faster 5 mph. One day my uncle shows up and e we are taking MY car to a garage. You have seen the look on my face. MY car?? me garage?? Why?? Frantically, I Have any of you sisters ever found out at the last minute that you needed to be two places at one time? Better scheduling could have possibly prevented such a situation. All of our life is about planning ahead and being prepared so that we can prevent life's little breakdowns along the way. This is why we make reservations, save money, leave early and get a good night's rest.

The most important place to apply this "preventative maintenance" ideal is in our relationship with God. The Bible tells us that Jesus will return one day to claim those who have been faithful to Him. The Bible tells us to watch and pray for the coming of the Lord. Now is the time to prepare to meet the Lord. If we wait till he comes to begin to prepare, then we will have waited too late. We should be in preparation now! The Lord may return at any time. Therefore we should get our lives in order! As we live each day we should prepare to meet God by putting aside the habits and thoughts that are displeasing to God. Our preventative maintenance is to change ourselves to be more like God, in doing so we will begin to look forward to the return of Christ. What a glorious day this will be for those who are prepared!

# Growing in Grace by Mike Gravois

#### 2 Kings 4: Hand Me Another Jar

The series of stories in the first part of 2 Kings are examples of what a powerful man of God Elisha is. Still, it seems that, like a symphony, each story is a variation on one theme: that when people have faith they act on that faith. These miracles all start with a need and the promise of God. Then, the person has to take action in preparation for God to move. In one story we see soldiers digging ditches in the desert in preparation for water to miraculously flow into them. Now we have a widow with just a little oil being told to go out and borrow jars from everyone she can. When she starts pouring oil out of her meager supply she fills all the jars she collected. It's only when she runs out of jars that she runs out of oil. So often we take our needs to God and then stand back to watch what he does. However, in this, and the other stories, we see that God invites us to partner with him in what he does for us. No doubt, he does the greater work; after all, anyone can collect jars. Only God can fill them all from such a limited supply. Lord, help me to be a "jar collector." #### **Show Your Love**

A few years ago I learned a very valuable lesson from our denominational friends, the Mormons. In central California, the Mormons will send out very young men, (known as Elders), to go door knocking. You can always recognize these young men because they are easily identified by the white button down short sleeved shirts, dark slacks, short tie and backpacks they wear. They also use a "ten speed" bike for their transportation.

One particular day I noticed two of these young men get off their bikes and approach a neighbor of mine who happened to be working in his yard. The Mormons approached him at the gate of his yard and asked if they could share a few words from the Bible with him. My neighbor looked irritated at them asking and gave the same short and grumpy reply most of us would have given, "Can't you see I am busy?" The young men asked him what it was he was doing. He told them he was digging trenches so that he could lay a sprinkler system in his yard. The young men politely took off their backpacks, parked their bikes and picked up shovels to help my neighbor dig his trenches.

It was a very hot day, yet the young men worked without stopping all the day. In the evening time, after every trench had been dug, the young men turned to my neighbor and asked again if they could share something with him from the word of God. I thought it quite amusing to see the resigned look on my neighbor's face as he agreed. What could he do but listen to what they had to say? They had spent all day helping him complete his work. They did it freely with a pure heart. They did a good job as he gave them direction. It was a very small price to pay for my neighbor to sit quietly for a few minutes and listen to what they had to say.

Hearned a few things from this event. First off, I

learned that people don't care what you know, unless they know how much you care. The neighbor recognized that these young men cared about his work, his yard and his personal feelings. They tended to his PHYSICAL needs before they tended to his spiritual needs. The second thing I learned is that Jesus did the same when he preached the gospel to unbelievers. We find Jesus feeding the hungry, healing the lame and sick, consoling the bereaved and giving hope to the hopeless. The Lord understood that when you care about people, genuinely care, then the people are more willing to listen to what you tell them about God. The last thing I learned was that caring for people means to show or demonstrate our love for them. We should not just tell them we love them, but we should show them our love.

How many times has someone come to you to share a challenge or struggle in their life and you gave a simple and patented reply, "I will pray for you," and then walked away? How many times did you actually pray for that person? Why not pray with that person and then pray for them later? Did they want or need prayer? Maybe they needed to talk. A prayer is fine, but it does not feed a hungry person or give a sick person medical attention. My fellow Christians, we wish to convert the entire world to the Lord, but we never stop and realize that in order to do this, we must first love the world and tend to the very needs that the world has. Show them our love, and by this, they will know we are truly the Disciples of Christ.

Ioshua 7: "Achan lied and men died."

Jericho's defeated and destroyed. Now their attention's on a much smaller, less fortified place, Ai. An armed force of 3000 is sent to do battle at Ai, more than enough to win an easy victory. However, it doesn't work that way. The people of Ai rise up and rout the larger Israelite force. How could that happen? They not only have superior numbers, but God is on their side. Right? Wrong! They go to Ai without God and are defeated there. Dismayed by what has happened on his watch Joshua goes to the Lord. He's told that there's sin in the camp. As long as there's sin there'll be no help from God. You see, sin is always serious in the eyes of God. Beyond that, my sin impacts others in unexpected ways. Achan thinks that God won't notice and that his intentional disobedience of the Lord's command will have no consequences. Instead, because of his sin, God withdraws his blessing and over 30 men die. In our western culture, we like to think it's every man for himself. Had an American written this story, Achan, and maybe family, would have died for his sin in tragic poetic justice. Everyone else would have gone on with "business as usual." Here we see a different picture. "Achan lied and men died." Is it possible that some churches struggle because there's hidden sin in the camp? And why stop at the church? What does this story say to me as an American? A country where babies by the millions are aborted, where immorality is the accepted mode of behavior? Am I really free to stand back from that and be dismayed, expecting the judgment of God to only fall on "them?"



### **Putting Up Christmas Lights**

I put up Christmas lights every year. It is a lot of work and sore muscles. I grapple with burned out bulbs and blown fuses, and getting the wiring just right so the circuit breakers do not trip. People ask me why, and the answer is easy — my wife loves it.

She grew up in a modest home where meatless meals were not uncommon, heralding the approach of payday and the bottom of the bank book. But every year, her father put up a few strings of Christmas lights. In the dark evenings of winter and stretched budgets of her childhood, Christmas lights were very reassuring. The bright colors in the cold black night were lights that warmed her heart and made her feel secure. After all, she reasoned in a youthful mind, if her father could still afford to put up Christmas lights, then all will be well. To this day, Christmas lights make my wife feel happy, warm, and secure — reason enough for all the effort.

We spent two decades of our marriage traveling around the world as I was first an Army and then a Foreign Service officer. During the years of moves to Europe and the Middle East, living in government housing and rental properties in Washington, DC, we never got around to putting up Christmas lights.

That all ended when we moved to Texas. Our first Christmas in our own home, I put up Christmas lights. I started out modestly, but I got into the challenge of being creative and putting more and more strings up. It made my wife happy — reason enough for all the effort.

We moved onto a short street that is nestled between two through streets. Not quite a *cul-de-sac*, but with the benefits of less traffic without the inconvenience of only one way in and out. When Christmas came around, I built my annual lighted monument to Christmas and my wife. In the dark nights of late November and December, it was almost the only bright spot on a street of well kept, but unlit homes.

Season after season, I put up Christmas lights. What I didn't realize is that it made my neighbors happy, not just my wife. They liked my lights. It made them feel warm and hopeful in the dreary dark of December. I heard neighborhood kids asking their parents why they didn't put up lights. One year, due to my travel schedule, I was late getting my lights up, and people asked if something was wrong, why the lights weren't up yet. The Christmas lights were reaching people beyond my driveway.

As the years wore on, people asked for tips on lighting, borrowed my ladder, and more houses began to light up each year. This year, with the gloomy news on the economy, terrorism, and uncertainty in the world, I noticed that several of my neighbors had their lights up before me. They wanted to see the glow of Christmas lights, the reassurance and brightness, in an otherwise dark and uncertain time.

It occurred to me that we all have a light within us — just like Christmas lights — that everyone sees. When we let it shine it reassures others, it makes them happy, and brightens an otherwise dim world. Over time, looking at our light, others decide to light up themselves as well. It is contagious. We can light up others in ways we cannot comprehend as long as we carry God's light within us and let it shine. In this dark season of short days and long nights, of uncertainty and terror, remember to let your light shine. It makes others happy — reason enough for all the effort.

[Jesus told us] You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden; nor does anyone light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light shine before men in such a way that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father who is in heaven (Matthew 5:14-16 NASB).

### **Always With Thanksgiving**

When I was a little boy, my dad sometimes filled in as a preacher at little congregations. What he lacked in polish, he made up for in passion and colorful stories. One of his favorite sermons that I heard several times was on prayer. Dad's specific emphasis was always including thanksgiving in each and every prayer. He grew tired of "gimmie prayers" — the kind of prayers that only ask for things for others and ourselves, but have little praise of God and even less thanksgiving given to him.

Dad always felt that we could thank God regardless of our circumstances because of who he is, what he has done for us, what he has promised to do in our future, and what he is continuing to do in our lives. Dad's infamous line in his prayer sermon went something like this: "Even pigs grunt in appreciation to their master when he brings them their slop, surely we should pause long enough to talk to the Father and include a few words of thanksgiving."

While I know this isn't the most appetizing image, nor is it the deepest theological statement known to Christian communication, it does colorfully make the point. In many ways, the Thanksgiving holiday in the USA demonstrates it. We dedicate one holiday a year to giving thanks to our Creator for his blessings and care for our world and for us. Even on most of our best years, shopping and football still swallow up the "giving thanks" focus of the Thanksgiving holiday.

Our family has been truly blessed with Thanksgiving this year. We've been with all of our immediate family. We've given thanks privately as a family and publicly with God's people. We've enjoyed a beautiful snowfall, games, football, conversation, recreation, shopping, and lots of incredibly good food.

We've been blessed to be able to give thanks! However, my prayer coming out of this Thanksgiving is for more than safe travel, good

health, and a blessed Christmas season. My deepest prayer is that we all will be committed to thanking and praising God every day, in every prayer, with genuine admiration, adoration, and appreciation. God's blessings are rich and real no matter what our apparent circumstances suggest. Our conversations with the Father should always be seasoned with a strong portion of thanksgiving.

Remember Paul's words to the Philippians: Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:4-6 TNIV, emphasis mine).

Paul taught the early Christians that joy and peace come to hearts that pray ... but those prayers must be offered always with thanksgiving!

### **Do** I really believe the battle belongs to God?

"This very day God is handing you over to me." So says David as he prepares for battle with Goliath. For us this is a nifty story, one of the most memorable in the entire Bible. For David, well, this was the real deal. Before him stands a giant of a man who intends to disembowel him. David has chosen a sling and some stones as his weapon of choice but he knows this fight isn't really about weapons at all. This is a spiritual event, and he correctly identifies it as such: "I come to you in the name of the LORD of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have taunted." In spite of the real and material

threat, David correctly classifies it as a real and spiritual matter. As much as I like this story, do I really apply it to my own "real and material" life? Am I good at praying and trusting God only in theory or do I put it into practice, where the "rubber meets the road"? Instead of viewing conflicts as spiritual events, do I rush to defend myself — or call a meeting to plot a strategy for getting my way — or throw my weight around - or manipulate the people involved? To do so is to view the issue at hand as one of "swords and spears" rather than as a spiritual battle that belongs to God. When I do that kind of stuff, I may get my way in the short run, but it will always come at a price to me and to others. Then again, I may not get my way at all and the giant may just win, leaving me fatally wounded.

### **Mower Musings**

It makes absolutely no sense at all why an asthmatic, hyper-allergic man in his forties would love to mow the lawn. My family assumes it's just another demonstration of my off-center way of looking at life. I've often tried to figure out the origin of this strange affliction. Of course my musings on my mowing fascination nearly always occur when... yep, you guessed it, when I'm mowing. The best I can figure it, there are several things that contribute to this fascination with mowing.

First, there are no phone calls or interruptions. Most folks don't interrupt a forty-five year old man in old grassstained tennis shoes, who is red-faced, sweating profusely, and covered with bits of grass and dirt who is talking to himself. This is especially true when he is pushing a loud engine with a wildly spinning dangerous blade. It's nice to mow because I get to be alone with my thoughts and myself. It's hard to find good think-time. So I use my mowing time as think-time and clear away the clutter in mind.

Second, I get a real sense of accomplishment. So much of what I do has no sense of closure -- well, I guess funerals are the exception, but then that's a different matter. Ministry is a lot like raising kids and juggling warm Jell-O; about the time you get everything under control, things come apart and end up a huge mess. Ministry is good for humility, but not so great for a sense of accomplishment. It's nice to take a scraggily lawn, cut it in neat rows, and then take pride in the accomplished task. Third, I get to burn off some of my meanness. Without a physically demanding job, it is hard to work "a mad" off. I'm not sure where "a mad" comes from exactly, but I've got an idea that maybe it's some disease transmitted in car exhaust because mine always manifests after a rush hour commute. When I get "a mad," it is usually not directed at anyone in particular, it's just that frustrated, angry feeling that can ruin an evening with the family and hurt those I love. There are just some times when I need to mow to burn up "a mad" so I can be who God wants me to be with my family.

(By now, you're probably wondering, "What in the world is Christian or spiritual about a bunch of random musings about mowing?" To be honest, I don't really know myself. But as long as we've gotten this far, why not go ahead and finish.)

Fourth, I get to talk with God. When my mind is free from its many distractions, I begin to talk with God as I mow. It's a lot like Tevia in Fiddler on the Roof. I tell God what I'm sorry about over the past week. I pray for folks I love. I talk to him like I would my own father about how to help my children, encourage my wife, lead our church, or help folks mend problems between themselves. He never talks back; at least not directly. But the Father does use that time, in some way, because by the time the edging is done and the clippings are swept up, I feel like I have a lot better handle on things. I'm not nearly as stirred up about my problems. I'm tired, smelly, dirty, and sneezy, but I emerge with a new game plan and attitude for my life.

I've read the story of Abraham many times with a deep sense of wonder. I've noticed that he repeatedly built altars and offered sacrifices to God wherever he went. I see this as his real claim to fame. Without this, I don't believe Abe could have handled the big stuff -- leaving home without a destination, taking a long journey with a quarreling family, having miracle kids as an old man and be willing to sacrifice for God. I'm no Abraham. When my grandchildren talk about me, they're probably not going to have a long list of accomplishments to praise. But I'm comforted that at least they can talk about all the lawns I mowed, and how mowing made me a little easier to live with and helped me find God's way for my short journey through life. So if you see some forty-five year old man, red faced and pushing a mower, talking very animatedly to no one but himself, just realize it's me and I'm having one of my mower musings and celebrating a holy moment with God.



### Thanksgiving

Wilbur was a sweet man with a serious countenance — those who didn't know him would call him dour or crusty. But, his heart was good and generous and kind. His young grandson, who was four or five at the time, came to stay with his grandparents for a week. On weekdays, they had the typical southern breakfast — eggs, bacon, toast, orange juice, and coffee. On Saturday, however, Wilbur and Willie Maude usually had cereal and coffee or juice. They sat down at the breakfast table and Wilbur asked his young grandson to say the blessing. The little guy hesitated for a minute, and then prayed, "Dear God, we thank you for this breakfast ... even though it's small. In Jesus' name. Amen."

Wilbur cracked up with laughter.

We do have so many things for which we can be thankful. However, if we are not careful, the challenges of our moment in time can wilt the joy right out of our Thanksgiving. Like many of you, I've lost 1/3 of my retirement over the last year. I know folks on fixed incomes who are seriously hurting now financially. I opened an email this morning from a friend who will have no job this week. A family that I love is deep in grief during what is supposed to be a special and blessed time of the year.

These concerns easily give way to fear. With the negative orientation our news and gossip magazines take, our hearts can be seized with anxiety and dread. Our prayers soon become laundry lists of things for God to fix listen to our words: "Give me!" "Help me!" "Heal me!" "Rescue me!"

Certainly we are to turn to God honestly and openly about the burdens of our hearts to "receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need" (Hebrews 4:16 TNIV). But with our cries for help, we must not forget the importance of being thankful for the incredible blessings we have in Jesus (Colossians 4:2).

God isn't asking us for false or forced thanksgiving

or some kind of simplistic relabeling of bad stuff. We are called back to the deep spiritual wells of grace we have in Jesus. From prison, Paul writes:

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ (Ephesians 1:3).

Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:4-7).

Because we have Jesus, and because he has us, our

future is secure. Our are eternal. All partings and every agony we face here are temporary. With this hope, we are to

reframe all of life in a chorus song of thanksgiving:

Cultivate thankfulness. ... Let every detail in your lives words, actions, whatever — be done in the name of the Master, Jesus, thanking God the Father every step of the way (Colossians 3:16-17 MSG).

In Jesus, the liturgy of our lives is thanksgiving not just one day a year, but every day until we are lost in the thankful wonder of His presence, at home with Him forever. Yes, dear God, we do thank you for all the ways you have blessed us, for they are indeed, NOT small!

The subject of rationalization has a "No Trespassing" sign hanging on it. It describes the way we attempt to be righteous when we are not. It's the path we usually take to get out our responsibility. If it works, then we can do what we want to do; we can think what we want to think. The problem is this; rationalization deceives ourselves as we try to deceive others.

For instance, if I should rationalize that one religion is as good as another, I say that in order to feel good about my own belief. No standards are necessary. I just keep telling myself that my belief is as good as another.

Another rationalization is: GOD has been good to me, therefore, I must be right. Can you feel the spiritual pride in these statements? GOD'S goodness is not a proof of our goodness. It's His goodness. The goal of rationalization is selfjustification. On a scale of 1-10 (10 being an expert) how good are you at rationalization?

### Summing up a good man's life

As we reach the conclusion of Nehemiah's story we find ourselves reflecting on this man's life. One thing that stands out is his leadership and vision. Even from far off Babylon Nehemiah envisions the great project of rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem. He organizes the work and stays on course through all kinds of distractions and discouragements. A second thing that comes to mind is his love for, and trust in, God. Nehemiah isn't driven by desire for power or to leave some sort of legacy. Instead, his eye is always on the God he serves. Finally, we see the third outstanding thing about Nehemiah. That is his spontaneous prayer life. Nehemiah doesn't wait until some specified time to pray, although it is clear that he does honor the scheduled worship times. For him, prayer is like breathing; a natural and necessary part of life. In the final words of his story, written by his own hand, three times he inserts short bursts of prayer, asking for God's favor in light of his faithfulness. we get the feeling that this is not just for the official record of his work but an example of what it was like to be around Nehemiah. Here's a man who practices the constant presence of God in his life and it is not unusual to hear him address the Almighty right in the middle of a conversation. This, is one of the greatest lessons we can learn from this good man.

### From The Heart Of Tyler-125 Years

The church in Tyler, TX dates back to 1885 when a few brethren began to meet in South Tyler. Around the turn of the 20th century, the church moved to Mary Street and in 1922 began meeting in a "tabernacle," a sheet iron building, at 420 West Erwin. In 1927 a beautiful new building, seating 400, was ready for use at this location. By 1955, a new auditorium with a capacity of 800 was constructed and in 1966 an educational building was added. In 1968 and again in 1986 the auditorium was remodeled and other building projects included a fellowship hall (1979), a benevolent center (1985), a new auditorium (1992), and finally a family life center and a new benevolent building. Buildings never tell the whole story of a church, but they do indicate growth and commitment to the mission of the church. Throughout all of the 125 years of West Erwin's history, this church has fulfilled its Godgiven mission of saving the lost. To this end, the emphasis of West Erwin has been to preach the gospel at home and abroad, to care for those in need, and to build up the body of Christ.

As the church at West Erwin celebrates its 125th anniversary, there are three important things for each of us to keep in mind:

- 1. Let us honor the past. In the past 125 years there have been many who have dreamed big dreams, served beyond the call of duty, and made tremendous sacrifices to bring, with the help of God, the church to where it is today. We must never forget our heritage.
- 2. Let us serve in the present. It is so important for the church of today to hold high the flaming torch of the cause of Christ so that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ our Lord.
- 3. Let us have vision and faith for the future. As we look to the future, may we commit ourselves to being the people of God and the church of the Lord. Let us do all that we can, as the Lord continues to bless us, to be "the light from the heart of Tyler" in all the coming years.

### Nehemiah 8: The God of Second Chances

Many of those listening to Ezra read and explain the Scripture this day left the land of their birth to return to this land of their ancestors. They left family and friends, security and comfort to go to an unsecured city that was not a city at all; rather, it was a pile of rubble. They made the hazardous journey to Jerusalem and then braved real opposition as they labored to rebuild the wall and prepared to re-occupy the City of David. As this task is completed, a holy event is planned. Governor Nehemiah and Priest Ezra organize an event centered on the Word of the Lord. However, something unexpected happens as Ezra reads and explains the Scripture to them. These good people begin to weep and wail. The sense of celebration is replaced with a feeling of failure and fear. The leaders have to act quickly or this holy day will turn in to a day of mourning. Why is it that the people react as they do? I think it's because they begin to grasp the enormity of their sins and that of their forefathers. Generations earlier, King Josiah responds in the same way when the Book of God is found in the Temple. As he hears it read he's alarmed and responds in humble fear of God. There's a place for this kind of response to God's Word. In fact, I need to be fearful and heartbroken when I realize my sin. However, the story must never end here. The Word of God is not intended to condemn me. Instead, it's to be for me a wonderful message of hope. I've failed God and should stand condemned but God is gracious and offers me hope. The bad news is that I've sinned against God. The good news is that he's the God of Second Chances graciously offering me and you hope and restoration.

#### The Secret Is Exercise

That's the phrase the family doctor used as he spoke recently with a busy and successful young man in his 40s who had suffered a heart attack and was going home for recovery. "Take your meds and get a lot of rest, but the real secret in regaining your health and strength is *exercise*, and lots of it!"

Those were his words and, as we all get a bit older, we hear them often. That wonderful body created by God's marvelous plan involves intricate engineering driven by details carefully designed by the Master as Genesis 1:26 says, "let us make man in our image, according to our likeness..." The Psalmist declared it to be "fearfully and wonderfully made" Psalm 119. Because it is the house for God's Holy Spirit, we are compelled and commanded to take good care of that body.

But there's another need for exercise in a spiritual sense, more important because it affects our preparations for eternity. 1 Timothy 4:6-11 tells us how to stay spiritually fit and "nourished in the words of faith and of the good doctrine which you have carefully followed." It begins and ends in spiritual exercise, which he calls "godliness, profitable for all things, having a promise to the life that now is and of that which is to come." We can't just talk about our faith; we've got to deliberately develop a plan for spiritual exercise. He calls us to:

Walk in the light. Our lord is the light of the world, and we must learn to stay out of the dark and "walk in the light as He is in the light." When we do so, we share a wonderful fellowship in Christ and find that forgiveness and peace in Him. See 1 John 1:7. In a busy world filled with potholes as well as blessings, we must hear Paul in Ephesians 5:15, "Look therefore carefully how you walk..." Yes, we are called to "walk by faith and not by sight" in 2 Corinthians 5:7, but that simple command assumes that our eyes are wide open and fixed on the source of faith, His holy Word!

Lift up our eyes and see the opportunities and joy of Christian living. Psalm 123:1, "Unto you I lift up my eyes, O You who dwell in the heavens." To those disciples who were absorbed with earthly needs and things, Jesus tells them in John 4:35, "Behold, I say unto you, lift up your eyes and look at the fields, for they are already white unto harvest!"

Arm yourselves and be ready for the challenges and battles that lie ahead, for you and I know that they are coming. Peter explains in 1 Peter 4:1,2 "Forasmuch then as Christ has suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves likewise with the same mind..." It means putting on the "whole armor of God." Ephesians 6:11. Only then are we prepared and ready.

Buffet our body daily with the exercise that comes from personal discipline and purpose. Just as Paul talks about how to "discipline my body and bring it into subjection," we must do the same with our spiritual bodies. We do it by "Desiring the sincere milk of the Word" and eating "Strong meat" that belongs to them that are of full age. See 1 Thessalonians 5:21 and Hebrews 5:14. Weakness comes from a diet void of God's Word, our spiritual nutrition.

Finally, running is necessary for good spiritual health. The Hebrew writer calls us to "run with patience the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith..." And as the way gets long and your years many, Isaiah 40:31 promises, "They shall run and not be weary..."

If we are going to maintain good healthy souls, we must be certain to get the right amount of exercise. Only then can we be ready to work and serve Him who died for us. So, get your spiritual exercise, and you'll be healthier and happier now and in the days to come!

### Nehemiah 6: I'm doing a great work; I can't come down.

I think this is my favorite quote from Nehemiah. His enemies have tried intimidation but Nehemiah refuses to be intimidated. Now they resort to the ploy of trying to lure him away from Jerusalem where they can do him harm. They suggest a meeting of the minds, a "friendly" get together where they can discuss their differences. Nehemiah sees it all for what it is: an attempt to stop him from doing what God called him to do. Four times they invite him to cease the work and

come to their meeting and each time he sends word back, "I'm doing a great work; I can't come down." Not everything we do is a "great work." Sometimes we'd be better off to put our agenda on hold and do something different instead. However, if we're sure it's God's work that we are doing we too, can respond in Nehemiah's words. In fact, we ought to. This principle applies to church members who say, "That church down the road has a better song leader, (children's, teen's, senior adult's, etc.) program so we're going to go there." If you're where God wants you to be there's no better place to be then right here, right now. Just tell 'em that you are "doing a great work and can't come down."

### A Life Story

I enjoy reading good books and I really enjoy reading the story of a famous person's life. Biographies and autobiographies have always held a certain fascination with me. They even have a channel on TV (Biography) to help feed my need to know more about people.

Among the books I read each year I always try to have 3 or 4 good biographical books. I especially enjoy discovering nuggets of insight into a person's life showing that they overcame obstacles.

Of course, we all face obstacles in our lives and most of them we meet head on and trudge our way right on through. But on occasion we meet an obstruction to our plans that just seems to get the best of us.

That's where I enjoy reading about how others have faced even greater problems and still worked their way though to success. It is as if they are writing their story just to show the rest of us the way to our goals.

I like that for several reasons. First of all, I don't want to be the first one to ever face a problem. I'd rather be way on down the list and able to see the example of others and use that as my guide. Knowing that others overcame the same problem gives me strength.

Secondly, I love knowing how the person's life turned out and then learning about the difficulties they

overcame. It's like watching a recorded ballgame when you already know the final score. I feel for their struggle but know already that they can (and will) overcome.

Finally, I like these because a well written, believable life story includes lessons from failures as well as victories. Reading about the lessons from failures causes me to value that person's success all the more.

One of the best sources for life stories is our Bible. In it you will read of well known men and women. Some were faithful to the end. Others were not. But all faced obstacles, temptations, trials and fears.

God provided us with a view into their lives. We can learn that we are not the first to face the problem. We learn how they faced it. We read their story often already knowing the outcome of their life. So we root for their success, but already know their decisions. And finally we know that no one but Jesus was perfect. They all had failures as well as successes.

Friends, our "life story" is being read by others each day as we live it. Let's live in such a way to lead others through the problems and on to the victories of life.

As Paul said, "Imitate me, just as I also imitate Christ" 1 Cor. 11:1. Think about it.

### **A Good Name**

Sunday night's sermon will be on the value of a good name and why who we are is more important than what we have. I hope that you will be here for that lesson.

The text for that sermon will come from Proverbs 22:1. "A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches. Loving favor rather than silver and gold."

The Book of Proverbs is such a wonderful resource for great wisdom. I've enjoyed teaching that book recently in two different classes and I don't think we could ever really exhaust the ways to apply those words of wisdom.

Unfortunately our culture doesn't always respect the same values that are laid before us in the Bible. The world says "step on others, push them aside and get ahead any way you can." But God calls us to live to a higher standard.

Many years ago I received a small wooden plaque with a bronze plate on it. Our family name "Baker" was inscribed at the top. Below that was the following verse.

You got it from your father, it was all he had to give.

So it's yours to use and cherish, for as long as you may live.

If you lose the watch he gave you, it can always be replaced.

But a black mark on your name, son, can never be erased.

It was clean the day you took it, and a worthy name to bear.

When he got it from his father, there was no dishonor there.

So make sure you guard it wisely, after all is said and done.

You'll be glad the name is spotless, when you give it to your son.

I don't know who wrote those words, but I'm thankful that they were written and shared with others. We should always be mindful of the name that we wear. After all, as the poem said, it was clean when we received it and it should be clean as we pass it on.

Perhaps you will take a moment to go back and reread that poem with the name Christian in mind. Do you feel the honor in wearing it? Do you also feel the responsibility to wear it in such a way to uphold its reputation?

You didn't get to choose the name given to you when you were born. But you did choose to wear the name of Christ. Honor the name you wear.

### Seeing The World As God Does

"Why am I here?" "What is the purpose of life?"

This is the question the author of Ecclesiastes wrestles with in his book. We see a man of considerable wealth looking back on his life and how he has spent his lifetime. In the end he arrives at the following conclusion:

"Now all has been heard; here is the conclusion of the matter: "Fear God and keep His commandments, for this is the whole duty of man.

For God will bring every deed into judgment, including every hidden thing, whether it is good or evil." Ecclesiastes 12:13-14

The author realizes two things: 1) Man was created by God to love and serve Him. and 2) There is more to this life after we die and that we will be held accountable for our choices made during our lifetime. Listen to the words of John:

"We know that we have come to know Him if we obey His commands. The man who says, "I know Him," but does not do what He commands is a liar, and the truth is not in him. But if anyone obeys His word, God's love is truly made complete in him." 1 John 2:3-5

Jesus put it this way in John 15:9-11

"As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you. Now remain in my love. If you obey my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have obeyed my Father's commands and remain in His love. I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete."

There's a God-shaped hole in our hearts. Our life is a quest to fill that void. When we don't have a relationship with God, there is an emptiness within us. Our worldview determines how we see the world in which we live. Let's take a look at a half glass of water. To the optimist, the glass is half-full. To the pessimist, the glass is half-empty. To a man dying of thirst, it is life. To a homemaker, it's another dirty glass someone didn't pick up or wash. To the realist, it is a half glass of water. In each of these instances, the glass of water did not change. What changed was the perspective of the person looking at the glass of water.

Our worldview perspective is applied every day towards everything we experience. Now, let's use the world as our example. To the optimist, we see good in others and look for people reaching out to help others. To the pessimist, this world is filled with sin and corrupt people and getting worse by the day. To the man trying to find God, or meaning in this

life, he is continually looking for burning bushes. Some find them. Others don't. To a caring parent, the world is a harsh or wonderful place to raise a child. And on and on and on . . .

So tell me about the world you live in. Is it a field white unto harvest? Is it a sinful society where we choose to protect ourselves and our family and stay away from strangers? The way you see the world, determines how you will react towards it. The important question is "How does God see the world?"



### And The Rains Came Down

Lasi weekend a series of slow moving storms passed over several areas of the southeast. In Nashville, TN, and surrounding areas, over 13 inches of rain came down in just two days. That was double their two day record and represented nearly one-fourth their annual rainfall. Needless to say there was some flooding.

Having lived in the middle Tennessee area two different times, I was naturally drawn to the coverage of the flood damage. Watching the photo slide shows over the internet gave a pretty realistic view of the damage. But the videos of the flooding, the rescues of stranded people, etc., those gave the most revealing looks.

One of the hardest hit areas was in Bellevue, just to the south west of Nashville. We lived there in the 1990s and as the helicopter panned the flooded areas I was able to recognize many businesses, roads and subdivisions, all under water.

One dramatic rescue unfolded as a bedridden woman was trapped for 3 hours in her upstairs bedroom. She was up to her neck in water before some neighbors were able to rescue her. Others were airlifted from roofs and some from the interstates as the rapidly rising water stranded many.

One of my preacher friends in the area emailed an

update on the disaster and reported that when the newscasts were listing places for shelter and relief the churches of Christ in the communities were often mentioned first. That's great to hear. Christians in that area have long been known for their prompt assistance to others in need and the communities have come to know them for such.

### Milk. Meat & Honey

"...if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sins and will heal their land." (2 Chron 7:14)

The milk is that portion which explains GOD'S basic nature. We pick up on His nature by observing how He dealt with His people. The passage above is GOD'S statement to Solomon after the temple had been completed. GOD said to Solomon, "I have heard your prayer and have

chosen this place for myself as a temple for sacrifices." Then GOD made the statement above...(:14). The next sentence GOD says, "Now my eyes will be opened and my ears attentive to the prayers offered in this place."

Solomon had stood before the altar in front of all Israel and petitioned GOD to always listen to the prayers offered in the temple (6:20,40).

The writer wanted us to know two things First, is the sequence — trouble arises from sin and only humble penitence will lead to reconciliation and restoration. Second, is to hear Solomon's request and GOD'S reply.

#### Growing in Grace by Mike Gravois

Ephesians 4:11-13: 11 It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, <sup>12</sup>to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up <sup>13</sup>until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

We're continuing to look at God's four-fold plan for the Ephesian church according to Paul.

Step 4: ". . . and become mature attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ."

"But solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil." Hebrews 5:14

"Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know the testing of your faith develops perseverance. Perseverance must finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything." James 1:2-4

WE Believe in Loving God & Loving Others (Matthew 22:34-40). Let's be honest with each other. This world is not always a safe place for children, or adults for that matter. There

are many temptations and dangers that confront each of us every day. The successful person knows where to turn for help and how to use the resources at their disposal to handle difficult situations. That is the story of mankind. To be successful in this fallen world, we learn to rely upon Jesus and use His Word to light our way Psalm 119:105. As we study God's Word and allow it to take root in our heart, we learn how to determine what is good and evil and make the Godly choices. Read Psalm 1 and Psalm 119:33-40.

Remember the hymn we used to sing "All of self and none of thee?" The verses progressively changed until we reached the last verse where we sang "None of self and all of Thee." That is the maturing process we must go through as a Christ follower. When Satan tempted Jesus in the wilderness he used scripture to tempt the Son of God. Jesus answered with scripture in each case. If Satan were to tempt you today, could you defend yourself?



i found out recently that a friend of mine was found dead in a town where we used to live. I can't say that I was really shocked to hear the news because this friend had many problems. But still I was very saddened to hear of his passing.

This friend was a Christian, but struggled most of his life. His life was peppered with many instances where he made the wrong choices. Of course, we all make mistakes in life, but his seemed to be more public than others. He even went to jail a couple of times.

Along the way his mind began to show the effects of chemical imbalance, some brought on by his past use of various substances and some because that's just what his brain did. He recognized that he would always be a work in progress and that he would quickly lose ground if he was ever off of his regiment of corrective medications.

A couple of weeks ago while going through a few of my books I found a book that this friend had given to me to help encourage me in my work as a minister. Inside the book was a card in which he had written a very encouraging note. When his mind was functioning properly he was very kind, generous and caring. But at other times he was, well, a hand full, as some would say.

Even though he was a Christian since his younger

days, he didn't fit in very quickly when he came back to church. But gradually most people were able to see past his past and try to join him in seeing something better in his future. Still there were some that I feel probably never fully accepted him. That always made me sad to witness.

In Matthew 25, Jesus speaks of being hungry, thirsty, sick and in prison among other things. He speaks of how others came and saw to His needs. But the crowd responded in verses 38-39 saying, "When did we see You a stranger and take You in, or naked and clothe You? Or when did we see You sick, or in prison, and come to You?"

Jesus simply replied that when we take care of others we are also taking care of Him.

I know several others who spent much time with this friend over the years. They assisted, encouraged, fed, protected and even housed him. In the end, I would suppose that most of us were frustrated that we couldn't fix what couldn't be fixed. But in the days that his mind would allow us to do so, we helped to provide for this brother in Christ just as if we were providing for our Lord.

Every person you see has a need that needs to be filled. Have you seen them? Open your eyes, then open your heart. Find your joy in serving the needs of others.

### Growing in Grace by Mike Gravois

Instead, whoever wants to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slave- just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many." Matthew 20:25b-28

"I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for Me." Matthew 25:40 Read Paul's charge to the Philippians in 2:5-11.



## **Moments With Mike**

#### Without Him

Over the past two Sundays I have preached on the betrayal by Judas, the denials by Peter and then the crucifixion of Jesus. This Sunday we will examine the resurrection and then also an appeal that we never forget what Jesus has done for us.

As the sermon ended on Sunday, Jesus was dead and still on the cross. There is no joy in such a death. The joy is in the resurrection to come. You know the events of that day, but let's review some of them anyway.

Soldiers were going to hasten the death of the victims on the crosses by breaking their legs. But when they got to Jesus they found He was already dead.

A soldier pierced His side with a sword and blood and water flowed out. Our blood breaks down and separates in this way after we die.

Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus took the body of Jesus and quickly prepared the body for burial in a new tomb nearby. Pilate was reminded of the words of Jesus saying that He would rise again after three days, so he commanded that a guard be placed at the tomb and that the tomb be sealed with a stone.

But where were the disciples? They had fled during the arrest. Some were curious enough to follow Jesus through the trial stage and some were present at the

taken off the cross and buried? What were their thoughts? What were their feelings or their fears?

The Bible gives us little insight on the answers to these questions. One thing we can assume is that this was a very difficult time for the disciples. After three plus years of watching Jesus perform miracles and elude His enemies they are suddenly without Him.

Without Him. Without Jesus. Let that sink in for a moment. Jesus had been taken away from them. What will they do now?

Fortunately for them by the time Sunday came around the tomb was empty and Jesus was soon to be in the presence of the disciples again. But in the time before that the faith of the disciples was surely put to the test.

Sadly many people today will experience life without Jesus but not because Jesus was taken away from them. No, the sad part is that many people simply leave Jesus out of their lives.

Friends, that is a condition that I pray you will never experience. Think about your choices and determine today that you will never leave Jesus out of your life.



I'm also a part of an email group of West Nile Virus survivors. We exchange our stories, discoveries, fears and hopes with one another. Having survived that illness provides us with a kinship of sorts. Fellow survivors relate to one another.

This Sunday, March 7th, we will be handing out purple ribbons to our attendees who are cancer survivors.

Don Crawford will have a table in the lobby and we encourage all cancer survivors to go there and sign up and receive your purple survivor ribbon. We will also acknowledge our survivors at the start of our morning service.

The mere mention of the word cancer strikes fear in the minds of many. Great progress has been made over the years and treatments and medications can halt or cure many cancers. Better yet, our understanding of how cancer occurs has helped us to avoid activities that would expose us to this deadly disease. But cancer still exists and still claims the lives of many in our time.

This Sunday morning's lesson will be geared toward how we can face any adversary in life (like cancer) and how we can look to God for ways to survive it. I hope you will make your plans to be here.

My sincere thanks go to Paul Montandon and Stan Mallory who taught my classes and to Don Crawford who preached on Sunday evening. I really appreciate these men and their ability and willingness to step in and help when I was unable to go on. Thanks, fellows.




Paul said, "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave Himself for her" (Eph. 5:25). Husbands, have you thought recently about how

Christ...a kingdom that cannot be shaken.

## **A Mission From God**

As children we sometimes played games where we imagined we were superheroes, firemen, policemen or some other figure of authority. In these games, we saved the world from evil, put out raging fires, rescued hostages from the bad guys and a host of other virtuous things. In all of these games we discussed the mission or task that needed to be completed, then we went about to accomplish that mission.

The word mission has many definitions. Among these are the general concepts of a task to be undertaken, a representative group sent to establish relations with another group, a religious outreach, etc. Today in the church, many times when we hear the word "mission" we immediately think of missionaries in foreign countries or in the mission fields of our own country. But the mission of the Christian includes many other aspects in addition to church work in "mission fields."

Paul tells us that the body of Christ is comprised of many members, each having their own ways of contributing to the health and strength of the church (1 Cor. 12). Each of us participates in the growth of the church in various ways. Not everyone can go to a foreign mission field, but everyone can aid in the process of doing the Lord's work.

Jesus gave a mission to us in Mt. 28:18-20. "And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and Io, I am with you always,

even to the end of the age." Amen."

Is that your mission today as a Christian? If not, it should be. Someone may answer and say, "But I'm not able to go into a mission field," or "I'm not able to preach or teach to someone else." But God expects us to be his representatives here and to continue in the task of teaching others about the gospel.

Our Lord came to this world for the purpose of seeking and saving the lost (Luke 19:10). Our purpose as Christians should include the spreading of the gospel to a lost and dying world. As Paul stated in 2 Cor. 5:20, "Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God."

What are you doing to aid in the process of reconciling the world to God through Christ? Are you praying for the efforts of those who teach and preach? Are you supporting these efforts financially? Are you growing in your own knowledge of the word so you can be better equipped to personally teach others? Are you living a sanctified life that will stand as a positive example to others?

I know that many of you are doing these things and great results are seen because the church here has embraced the fact that we have a mission from God. We have a duty to spread the good news to all we can, whether in Tyler or anywhere else in the world. May God continue to bless our efforts for His cause.

#### Defining Ourselves

"GOD, I thank you that I am not like all other men —- robbers, evildoers, adulterers — or even like this tax collector." (Luke 18:11)

Something was wrong in Luke's day when one person attempted to compare himself to another person. Something is still wrong with it today. It's even wrong for us to attempt to compare our church to another church down the road. "We're not like them" isn't the only thing we have to say for ourselves. How much more powerful would it be to have a productive conversation that turned to who GOD is calling us to be and how GOD is at

work in our lives? What testimony do we offer about GOD and about GOD'S work in our midst?

Try changing the conversation to something like this: Spirituality is real. Worship is vital. GOD is alive. And His people are engaged in living their faith in their jobs, in their homes, and in their communities. How's GOD working in your

## Growing in Grace by Mike Gravois

Have you ever had one of "those" days? In her children's book Alexander and the Terrible, Horrible, No Good, Very Bad Day, Judith Viorst tells us about just such a day. If anything can go wrong for Alexander it does. Throughout the book we see how Alexander deals with all of the obstacles placed in his path.

Sometimes we have days just like Alexander. In his letter "To the twelve tribes scattered among the nations:" James writes these

## The Danger of Anger

Out of control anger is at the foundation of most or our people problems. It's corrosive. Holding on to anger is like soaking your heart in acid. It destroys every good thing GOD wants to bless us with. It kills compassion, empathy, love and relationships. Everything we need in our lives to become more like GOD.

Destroyed relationships close us off from the love GOD knows we need. If my anger keeps me from loving others, who am I trying to fool? I'm only fooling myself if I think I

love GOD. John spelled it out for us in clear, authoritative words: "If anyone says, 'I love GOD,' yet hates his brother, he is a liar. For anyone who does not love his brother, whom he has seen, cannot love GOD, whom he has not seen" (1 John 4:20).

GOD'S answer comes to us in (Col. 3:13-14):

"Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you." Forgiveness replaces anger with love which restores two relationships; the one with your brother and the one with GOD.

"My dear children, for whom I am again in the pains of childbirth until Christ is formed in you," Galatians 4:19

Paul, in his letter to the Church in Galatia, describes an amazing process that occurs in the life of Christian believers. God literally forms and develops inside of us.



## Would You Believe?

Anyone remember Maxweii Smart from the TV show *Get Smart*? If you do, you likely remember some of the gadgets he used, like the shoe phone, (I really liked that one) and some of the phrases he used like, "missed it by that much."

But there was another phrase he used that I would imagine you remember as well. When surrounded by the enemy, he would sometimes exaggerate how many people were outside ready to come to his rescue. Of course, no one was actually there to save him. When his enemy would not seem impressed, he would lessen the number and say, "would you believe....?"

Unlike Maxwell's failed attempts to get people to believe him, the Christian should be positioned in such a way to begin with the truth, continue with the truth, and actively persuade others to believe that truth.

When a Christian teaches the wonderful story of redemption, God's love, the sacrifice of Jesus, the patience of a loving Father and the assurance of an eternal life in heaven there are certainly going to be some people who are not persuaded. Some may say it sounds too good to be true. Others may simply not have an interest because they haven't considered the alternatives.

Still, the Christian is called to plant and water the

seed, the word of God (1 Cor. 3:5-9), and to be an instrument of God to bring about a reconciliation between the sinner and God (2 Cor. 5:16-20). Despite sometimes thinking that we don't know how to teach others, I like the phrase, "If you know enough to be a brother, you know enough to teach another." You believe. So let's work on getting others to believe also.

John's gospel includes these wonderful verses in John 20:30-31. "And truly Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples which are not written in this book, but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name."

Would your friends believe that Jesus died for their sins? Would they believe that God is willing to forgive the sins of a Christian who repents? Would they believe that you don't have to be perfect to go to heaven? Would they believe that God is powerful enough to raise the dead, cure the sick and destroy the world?

If we are teaching through our words and our lives, our friends will be much more likely to believe what the Bible says. Let's solidify in our minds what we believe and be ready to teach those things to others.

instead of wasting time resting. We could be advancing our cause instead of laying low and burning daylight on resting. We could be wringing an ounce or two more productivity out of the day if we could only get by with a little less rest. Rest is for down the road when we're older ... or when we go to heaven and don't have to worry about pleasing our manager ... or for when we don't have to try to keep our family afloat financially ... or for those days when we've actually gotten our "to do" lists finished. Our modern mindset is that rest is for when we're weary or sick or have time to rest. God didn't make our world this way. God rested on the seventh day. He called it Sabbath. He built that rhythm into our world. Surely the almighty, sovereign, and all-powerful God didn't NEED to rest. So why did he rest on the seventh day? Why did he put this imprint into our busy world of work, labor, and endurance? Simple! We needed to see God rest! We needed to know that God made rest a priority. We needed to know that our rest is crucial to us, to our lives, and to those around us. Jesus practiced the rest principle in his busy ministry. He taught his disciples the importance of rest. Jesus clearly had much to do and very little time in which to do it. ## **Give Account**

Well, here we are in the second week of the new year. How are you doing with your resolutions? Have you stayed on course or have you already given up on some of them?

In last week's article I mentioned three things that might help in keeping a resolution. Make it specific. Make it meaningful. Make it known.

Of those three, it is the last one that really lends itself to accountability. By telling others about your goals you are placing yourself in a position of accountability to them. That is a very important step.

Several of you have told me that you intend to keep up your daily Bible reading this year, and maybe even purchase the One Year Bible that I mentioned in a recent lesson. Guess what? By sharing that goal with me I'm in a position now to follow up and ask you periodically how you are doing. If you are falling behind I hope to encourage you to get back on track. Accountability isn't to be feared. It should be welcomed as it helps us to reach our goals.

Paul tells us in Romans 14:12, "So then, each of us shall give account of himself to God." Think about what that means. We made promises to God when we exchanged the old life of sin for a new life of righteousness. By agreeing to put on and wear the name of God's Son, we

set our goal to be pleasing, and yes, accountable to God.

So how are we doing in those goals? Only you and God know for sure. But others can be very beneficial in helping you reach those goals if you will make them known.

Our shepherds, for example, also must give an account. Hebrews 13:17 says, "Obey those who rule over you, and be submissive, for they watch out for your souls, as those who must give account. Let them do so with joy and not with grief, for that would be unprofitable for you." When you share your current spiritual condition and your spiritual goals with the elders, they will be in a much better position to help you grow and meet your goals.

Here's a short list of a few goals we might have that would help us spiritually.

- Pray every day.
- 2. Read the Bible every day.
- 3. Gather with God's people each week.
- 4. Give diligence to add 2 Pet 1:5-11 to your life.
- 5. Share your goals with others who can help hold you accountable.

Every day we live is a great gift from God. Let's do what we can to make the most of every one of them!
