Isaiah 42:2	Gentle, not self-promoting	Matthew 12:15–19
Isaiah 42:6	Light to the Gentiles	Luke 2:32; Acts 13:47
Isaiah 49:6	Salvation to the ends of the earth	Matthew 28:19; Acts 1:8
Isaiah 49:7	Despised and rejected by rulers	John 1:10–11
Isaiah 50:6	Beaten, mocked, spit upon	Matthew 26:67; 27:26–30
Isaiah 50:7	Sets His face like flint	Luke 9:51
Isaiah 52:13	Exalted after suffering	Philippians 2:9–11
Isaiah 53:3	Rejected by men	John 1:11
Isaiah 53:4	Bore our griefs	Matthew 8:16–17
Isaiah 53:5	Pierced for our transgressions	John 19:34–37
Isaiah 53:6	Iniquity laid on Him	2 Corinthians 5:21
Isaiah 53:7	Silent before accusers	Matthew 27:12–14
Isaiah 53:9	Buried with the rich	Matthew 27:57–60
Isaiah 53:12	Numbered with transgressors	Luke 22:37

Examples of Prophecy to Consummation

Stage	Scripture	Key Phrase	Meaning / Fulfillment
Prophecy	Isaiah 53:4–12	He took up our pain; by His wounds we are healed; death sentence for our sin; afterward, “the light of life”	The Servant brings us healing by His wounds and life through His death.
Prophecy	Luke 4:18-21, Matthew 16:21, 17:22-23, 20:18-19	Jesus predicts His mission to heal, His own undeserved suffering and death, and then His resurrection.	The Servant’s sacrificial suffering and death bring our justification.
Fulfillment	Luke 8:46, etc. healing passages; Acts 4:10	Jesus said “power has gone out from Me” when anonymous woman touched Him. He died and was raised from the dead.	Jesus fulfills both Isaiah’s and His own prophecies, glimpses of the supernatural in the natural world.
Consummation	Revelation 21:3–4	Death, suffering, and pain will no longer exist in the new earth and heaven.	MISPAH: complete and eternal removal of a need for hospitals or morgues.

Blue = Prophecy Green = Fulfillment in Christ Gold = Final Consummation

The Servant in Isaiah's Four Servant Songs

Song	Passage	ROLES	RESPONSIBILITIES	Example of Fulfillment
1 st	Isaiah 42:1–9	chosen and upheld by God's Spirit	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• establish justice (“mishpāt”)• bring light to the nations	Matthew 12:18–21
2 nd	Isaiah 49:1–7	called from womb as display of God's splendor	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• restore Israel• reach Gentiles	Luke 2:32
3 rd	Isaiah 50:4–7	given supernatural wisdom and strength to speak and act for God	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• face humiliation• trust God for instruction and vindication	Philippians 2:8
4 th	Isaiah 52:13–53:12	suffers as sin-bearer of man but ultimately exalted by God	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• suffer well as sacrifice• provide complete atonement	Acts 8:30–35
