o 1 Peter 4:10–11 NET Just as each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of the varied grace of God. Whoever speaks, let it be with God's words. Whoever serves, do so with the strength that God supplies, so that

in everything God will be glorified through Jesus Christ. To him belong the glory and the power forever and ever. Amen.

Matthew 20:28 NET

...just as the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.

- Christ came to serve, not be served: In Matthew 20:28, Jesus said He
 did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom
 for many.
- We are being made in His image: As followers of Christ, our spiritual journey is one of being conformed to His character.
- Service is about reflecting Christ's glory: By following His example of humility and service, our lives become a reflection of Him.

2. How We Are Equipped to Serve

- Ephesians 4:12 NET
 - ...to equip the saints for the work of ministry, that is, to build up the body of Christ...
- 1 Corinthians 12:7 NET
 To each person the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the benefit of all.
- 1 Corinthians 12:11 NET
 It is one and the same Spirit, distributing as he decides to each person, who produces all these things.
- You were saved for good works: You weren't just saved from sin and death, but saved for a purpose—to be part of God's mission.

- God has given you the Holy Spirit and a spiritual gift: Every believer receives a unique spiritual gift to carry out this mission (1 Corinthians 12:7).
- Spiritual gifts are for the benefit of others: These gifts are not for our own gain but for serving and building up the church body.




