



## Week 2 - “God’s Plan for the Ages”

**Read Daniel 9:20-27.** The prophecy that the angel Gabriel gave to Daniel included a spiritual revival among the Jewish people. How would you describe the current relationship between the church and the Jewish people? In what ways are those two groups connected and disconnected?

**Read Matthew 16:13-17.** The prophecy that Gabriel delivered to Daniel also pointed forward to the arrival of the Messiah. How did Peter indicate in this passage that he understood Jesus to be the fulfillment of all the Old Testament prophecies concerning the Messiah? What are some of the ways Jesus’ appearance has shaped our world in the centuries since his resurrection?

**Read Psalm 28:7-9.** Followers of Jesus have literally staked their eternal destiny on the truth of God’s Word. Your hope for eternal life rests in your belief that God’s Word is true. What helps you to trust in the Bible as the foundation for your eternal future?



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**Read Matthew 25:1-13.** In this parable, Jesus commended the five virgins who took oil with them and were prepared for the bridegroom's return. What was Jesus' point as it relates to his followers? Why is it important to understand and be ready for *what happens next* on God's time line?

**Read Isaiah 11:6-9.** This prophecy portends a unique chapter in human history. It sounds like heaven. But when you read Isaiah 11:10-11, you find that those verses look forward to the same prophetic period, but it does not appear that the eternal state has yet begun. Do you think what Isaiah was describing in verses 6-9 is actually the millennium? How do you respond to these kinds of promises in the Bible of a golden age here on earth?

**Read Acts 1:6-9.** This was Jesus' final conversation with his disciples before he ascended into heaven. How does the disciples' question reflect their belief in a *literal* kingdom on earth ruled by the Messiah? How does Jesus' answer add to your understanding of such a kingdom?

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
