

Summary

The sermon focuses on the importance of discipline in prayer, using the story of Jesus turning water into wine from John 2 as a framework. The pastor outlines five key disciplines for prayer: making sure Jesus is involved, praying for things only God can give, listening and doing what He says, praying even when it's hard, and understanding that prayer requires faith and faith requires action.

7. How can we balance being both children of God and servants of God in our prayer life?
8. What practical steps can you take to develop more discipline in your prayer life?

Life Application

This week, commit to spending the first few minutes of each day in silent prayer, focusing solely on listening to God rather than speaking. Keep a journal of any impressions, scriptures, or nudges you receive during these times.
