
36 "Joseph, a Levite from Cyprus, whom the apostles called Barnabas (which means "son of encouragement"),

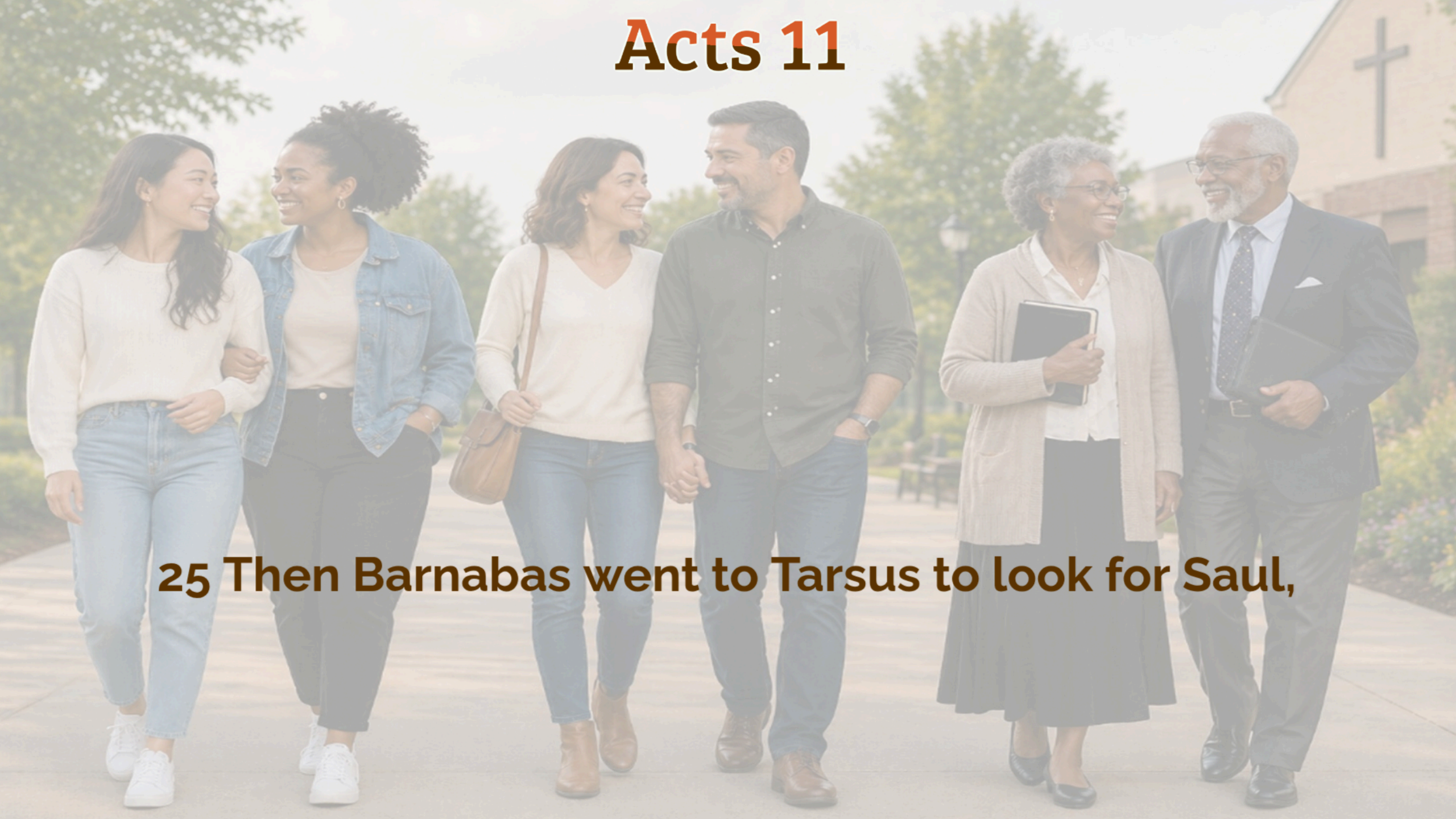



25 Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul,





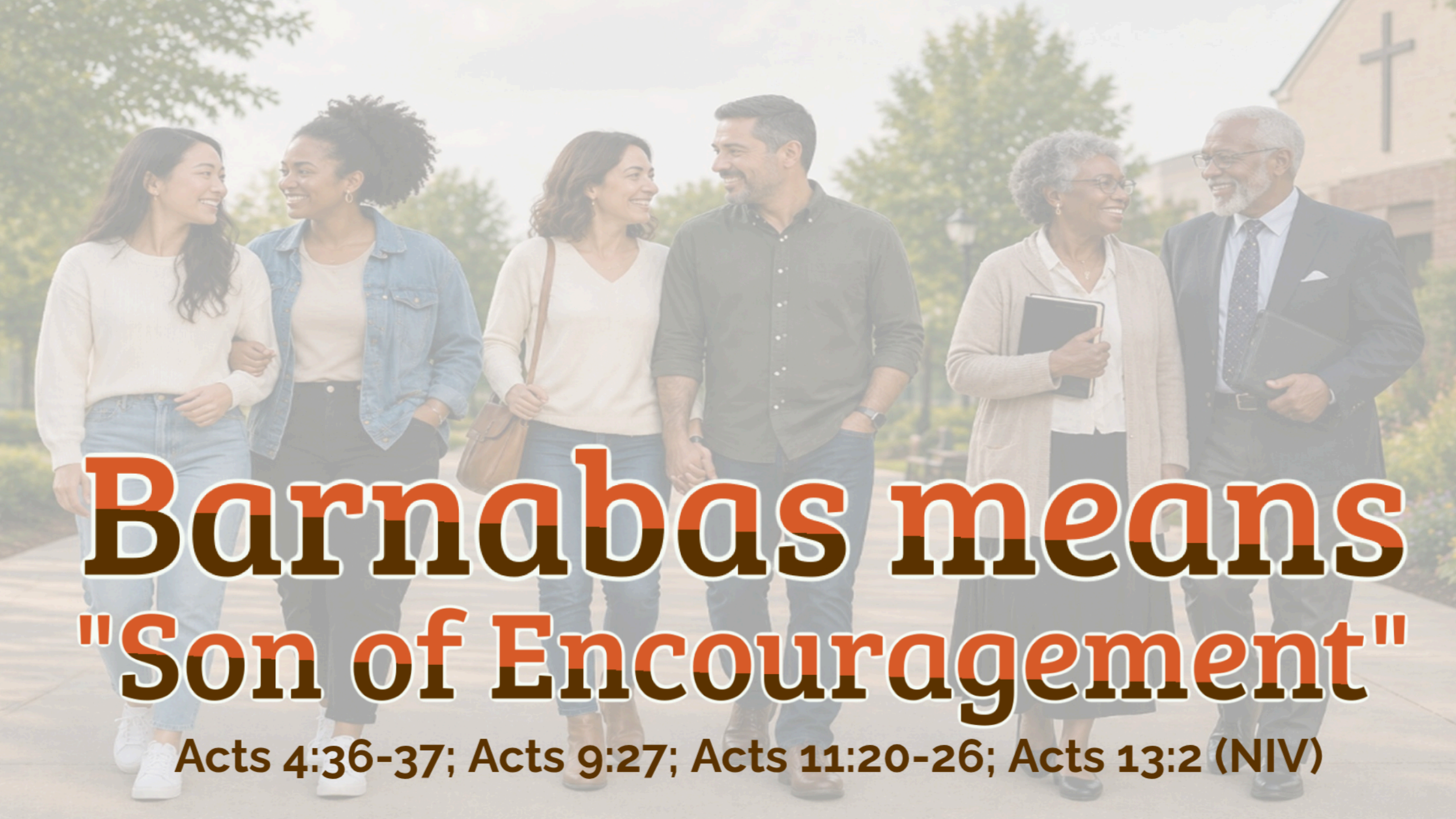
