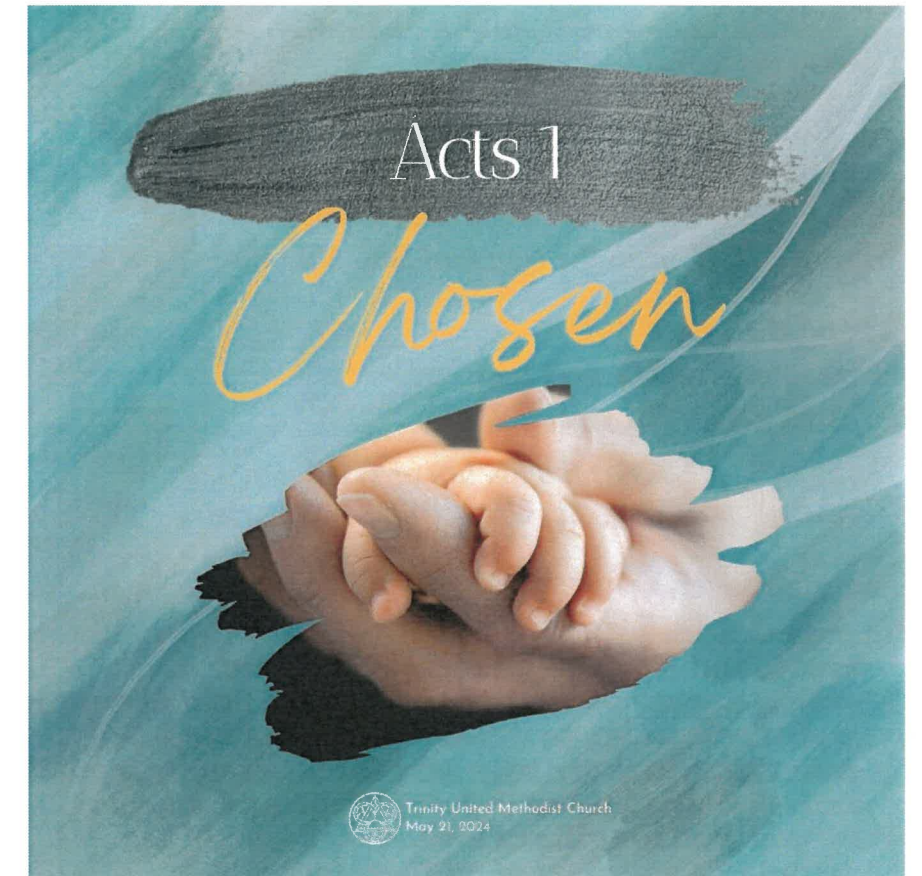


Samaritan Fund Offering




