Paul's Trouble In fact, when we came into Macedonia, we had no rest. Instead, we were troubled in every way: conflicts on the outside, fears within. 2 Corinthians 7:5	
But God, who comforts the downcast, comforted us by the arrival of Titus, 2 Corinthians 7:6	

Paul's Comfort Corinthian Testimony and not only by his arrival but also by the comfort he received from you. 2 Corinthians 7:7a	
Paul's Comfort Corinthian Testimony He told us about your deep longing, your sorrow, and your zeal for ME, so that I rejoiced even more. For even if I grieved you with my letter, I don't regret it. And if I regretted it—since I saw that the letter grieved you, yet only for a while. 2 Corinthians 7:7b-8	
Paul's Rejoicing Grief That Leads to Repentance I now rejoice, not because you were grieved, but because your grief led to repentance. For you were grieved as God willed, so that you didn't experience any loss from us. 2 Corinthians 7:9

Results of Godly Grief For consider how much diligence this very thing—this grieving as God wills—has produced in you: what a desire to clear yourselves, what indignation, what fear, what deep longing, what zeal, what justice! In every way you showed yourselves to be pure in this matter. 2 Corinthians 7:11 Results of Godly Grief So even though I wrote to you, it was not because of the one who did wrong, or because of the one who was wronged, but in order that your devotion to us might be made plain to you in the sight of God. 2 Corinthians 7:12	
Results of Godly Grief For this reason we have been comforted. In addition to our own comfort, we rejoiced even more over the joy Titus had, because his spirit was refreshed by all of you. 2 Corinthians 7:13	
Results of Godly Grief For if I have made any boast to him about you, I have not been disappointed; but as I have spoken everything to you in truth, so our boasting to Titus has also turned out to be the truth.

Results of Godly Grief And his affection toward you is even greater as he remembers the obedience of all of you, and how you received him with fear and trembling. I rejoice that I have complete confidence in you. 2 Corinthians 7:15-16
