I Samuel 1: There was a man from Ramathaim-zophim in the hill country of Ephraim. His name was Elkanah son of Jeroham, son of Elihu, son of Tohu, son of Zuph, an Ephraimite. <sup>2</sup> He had two wives, the first named Hannah and the second Peninnah. Peninnah had children, but Hannah was childless. <sup>3</sup> This man would go up from his town every year to worship and to sacrifice to the LORD of Armies at Shiloh, where Eli's two sons, Hophni and Phinehas, were the LORD's priests.

- I. A little about Hannah
- A. She was a favorite of her husband
- <sup>4</sup> Whenever Elkanah offered a sacrifice, he always gave portions of the meat to his wife Peninnah and to each of her sons and daughters. <sup>5</sup> But he gave a double<sup>□</sup> portion to Hannah, for he loved her even though the LORD had kept her from conceiving.
- B. She was a heart broken about her childlessness
- <sup>2</sup> He had two wives, the first named Hannah and the second Peninnah. Peninnah had children, but Hannah was childless.
  - <sup>6</sup> Her rival would taunt her severely just to provoke her, because the LORD had kept Hannah from conceiving.
  - <sup>8</sup> "Hannah, why are you crying?" her husband, Elkanah, would ask. "Why won't you eat? Why are you troubled? Am I not better to you than ten sons?"
  - <sup>10</sup> Deeply hurt, Hannah prayed to the LORD and wept with many tears.
  - <sup>15</sup> "No, my lord," Hannah replied. "I am a woman with a broken heart.

<sup>9</sup> On one occasion, Hannah got up after they ate and drank at Shiloh. <sup>11</sup> The priest Eli was sitting on a chair by the doorpost of the LORD's temple

<sup>12</sup> While she continued praying in the LORD's presence, Eli watched her mouth. <sup>13</sup> Hannah was praying silently, and though her lips were moving, her voice could not be heard. Eli thought she was drunk <sup>14</sup> and said to her, "How long are you going to be drunk? Get rid of your wine!"

C. BUT GOD....blessed her with a child


