## **Everyone Gets the Same Punishment**

<u>Luke 10</u>: "Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the miracles that were done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago, sitting in sackcloth and ashes. <sup>14</sup> But it will be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon at the judgment than for you. <sup>15</sup> And you, Capernaum, will you be exalted to heaven? No, you will go down to Hades. <sup>16</sup> Whoever listens to you listens to me. Whoever rejects you rejects me. And whoever rejects me rejects the one who sent me."

## C. Hell is in 2 locations/phases

"Scripture speaks of two locations as places of torment. Both places are commonly called "hell." Hades is the current place of departed spirits who are not with the Lord, that is, those who never accepted the forgiveness that God offers in Jesus Christ. The second place of torment is Gehenna or the <u>lake of fire</u>, which will be the final place of punishment for those who die in their sins" gotquestions.org

## III. What does scripture teach about hell?

# A. Why was hell created?

Hell was created for the Devil and wicked angels.

<u>Matthew 25:41</u>"Then he will also say to those on the left, 'Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels!

# B. Why do people go to hell?

The bottom line is SIN!

Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

God is perfect.

Heaven is perfect.

Sin cannot exist in heaven.

We are sinners.

God provides a substitute for sin and penalty.

Romans 5:-8 But God proves his own love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. 9 How much more then, since we have now been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from wrath. 10 For if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, then how much more, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life. 11 And not only that, but we also boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received this reconciliation.

If we choose not to accept the substitution, we pay in hell.

Il Thess 1:5 It is clear evidence of God's righteous judgment that you will be counted worthy of God's kingdom, for which you also are suffering, <sup>6</sup> since it is just for God to repay with affliction those who afflict you <sup>7</sup> and to give relief to you who are afflicted, along with us. This will take place at the revelation of the Lord Jesus from heaven with his powerful angels, <sup>8</sup> when he takes vengeance with flaming fire on those who don't know God and on those who don't obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. <sup>9</sup> They will pay the penalty of eternal destruction from the Lord's presence and from his glorious strength <sup>10</sup> on that day when he comes to be glorified by his saints and to be marveled at by all those who have believed, because our testimony among you was believed.

#### C. Where is hell?

Most scholars agree hell is "down".

<u>Luke 10:15</u>And you, Capernaum, will you be exalted to heaven? No, you will go down to Hades.

#### D. When was hell created?

Most scholars agree hell was created after the 6-day creation event since no sin existed.

## E. What will people in hell experience?

"The nature of hell is debated, but three things are made clear. First, hell is eternal. Second, in hell souls are conscious. Third, hell is torment." Alisa Childers

Matthew 25:41, "Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels."

Matthew 8:12, "But the subjects of the kingdom will be thrown outside, into the darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

<u>2 Thessalonians 1:6–9</u>, "God is just: He will pay back trouble to those who trouble you and give relief to you who are troubled, and to us as well. This will happen when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven in blazing fire with his powerful angels. He will punish those who do not know God and do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. They will be punished with everlasting destruction and shut out from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of his might."

Revelation 20:10, 15, "And the devil, who deceived them, was thrown into the lake of burning sulfur, where the beast and the false prophet had been thrown. They will be tormented day and night for ever and ever. . . . Anyone whose name was not found written in the book of life was thrown into the lake of fire."

Romans 2:8, "But for those who are self-seeking and who reject the truth and follow evil, there will be wrath and anger."

Matthew 25:30, "And throw that worthless servant outside, into the darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

F. How long are people in hell?

Hell is eternal.

**Matt 25:41** "Then he will also say to those on the left, 'Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels!
