The Centurion's Secret

Matthew 8:5-13 June 12, 2022

Introduction: We're rightly suspicious of authority. "Power tends to corrupt and absolute power corrupts absolutely," Lord Acton quips. But one day Jesus met a Roman soldier who understood the power of being under power. "I am a man under authority," he says, and because I am, "I say to one 'Go,' and he goes." Maybe today we feel so impotent because we're so intent on throwing off authority and becoming our own. The Bible offers an alternative: to find the authority of our lives under the authority of a great King.

Prayer: Father, help us to see the centurion and his need through the eyes of Jesus. Amen.

Read: Matthew 8:5-13

Discussion:

- 1. What drew the centurion to Jesus? What troubled the centurion?
- 2. What was Jesus' response? How to you react to his response? What was the result? Surprising?
- 3. What is most significant to you in verses 6-9? Why? What does this teach us about authority?
- 4. What caused Jesus to be so astonished (verse 10)?
- 5. What is the significance of verses 11 and 12 in this text about the centurion?

Application: Remember this week the grace given to the centurion, one who was "outside the family".

Prayer: Father, we are grateful for this instructive text about authority and the interaction between Jesus and the centurion. Amen.
