¹⁵ Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will in all things grow up into Him who is the Head, that is, Christ. ¹⁶ From Him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work."

We grow up

- Our bodies get bigger and can do more as we get older. The church is Christ's body. Everyone must do his/her part to work together.
- We need to mature. Maturing as a Christian means to study God's word (our beliefs) and live in community with other followers of Christ so they can help us (our behaviours).

Into Christ

- Growing into Christ means our life is all about Him!
- Having Jesus at the centre of our lives means living differently than lots of people around us. It can be hard, but God loves when we try our best to follow Him.

By speaking the truth in love

- Speaking the truth in love is tricky. It's like when your parents discipline you. They don't do it to be mean; they do it because they love you and want you to be safe.
- When we are with other Christians, sometimes they can say or do things that don't line up with God. We need to gently and kindly tell them what God would want them to be doing or saying. That is speaking the truth in love.

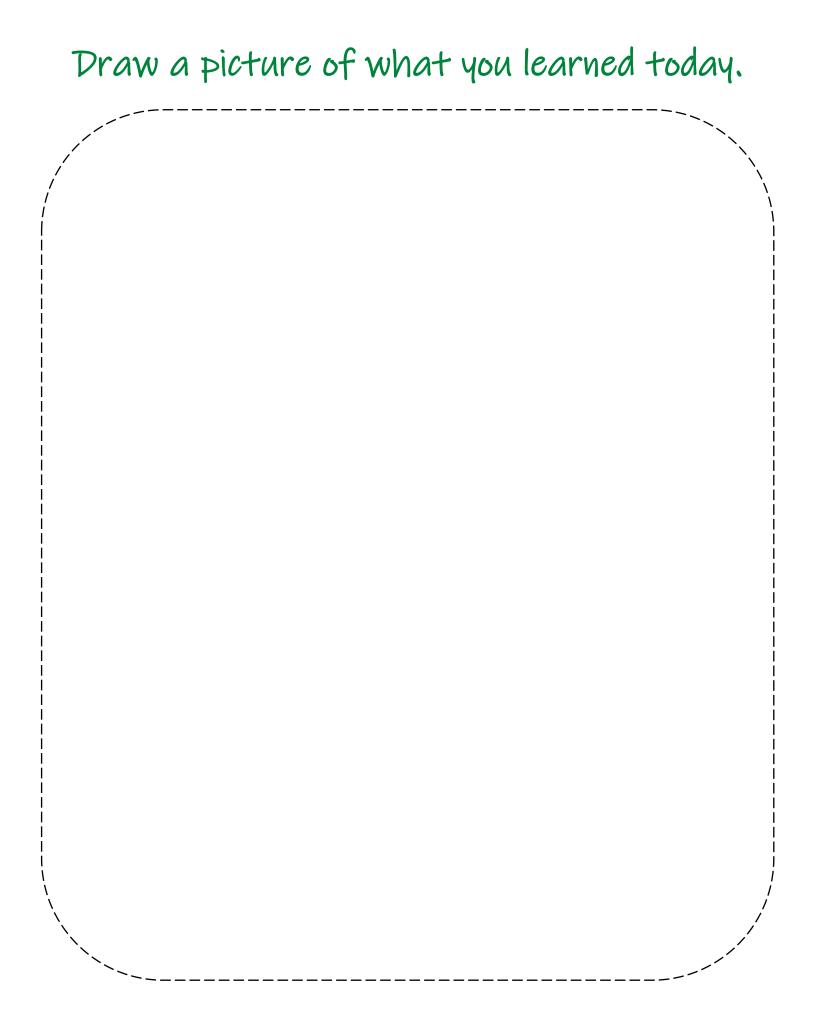
By each doing our part

The Small Group Sermon Study Ephesians 4:15-16



Opening Prayer: Father, in Jesus' name, through the Holy Spirit, come and speak to us, teach us and transform us as we read, discuss and reflect on Your word.

- 1. Big Picture: What did you like or appreciate about this message? What challenged you in this message?
- 2. Read the key passage(s) of Scripture from the message and review the points from the sermon notes, then answer the following questions:
 - a. How have you seen someone speak the truth in love effectively? Can you think of any examples of how our small group has spoken the truth in love?
 - b. How has working together with our small group helped you to grow up in Christ?
 - c. After reading this passage and hearing this message, what might be a good "next step" for our small group?
- 3. What don't you understand or what other questions does this passage raise for you?

Silently re-read the key Scripture(s) from the message, asking the Holy Spirit to speak to you.

- 4. What emotions does this passage or key theme stir up in you?
- 5. Is there anyone in your life to whom you need to "speak the truth in love?" Is there anyone who has tried to speak the truth in love to you, and you have not received it well?
- 6. What verse, phrase or word do you need to take with you this week? How will you act on what you've heard?

Prayer: Spend time praying for one another (that we would grow in our love for God and others, that we would be transformed by what God has revealed, that we would be alert and obedient to God, etc.).
