- 3. Would you describe the intentionality and effort required as a sacrifice, a joy, an act of faith, a burden or other?
- 4. What internal or external obstacles are in the way? How does or could this affect your faith?
- 5. What are some ways to get around these obstacles? How can we as a small group support you in this?
- 6. What transformation or positive outcomes have you witnessed or personally experienced from serving sacrificially?
- 7. How can we as a small group bring glory to God through serving together? \*

#### **Personal Reflection:**

- What emotions does this passage or key theme bring up in your heart?
- How will you respond to what Jesus is showing you?

**Prayer:** Spend some time praying for some of the practical and spiritual needs of those around you. You can also pray for any of our community partners or other local agencies.
