Anticipates an eternal reward.

(Heb 11:10, Jn 14:1-2, Matt 6:19-21, Prov 23:4-5)

Small Group Sermon Study - Hebrews 11:8-19, 7:1-9

Prayer: Father, in Jesus' name, through the Holy Spirit, come and speak to us, teach us and transform us as we read, discuss and reflect on Your word.

Icebreaker:

Describe a situation in which you enjoyed getting “the biggest bang for your buck” or “the best return on investment.”

Keeping in mind Abraham's story and the sermon notes, discuss the following:

1. Faithful giving is obedient.
 - Read 2 Corinthians 9:6-8. Has God ever tested your faith by asking you to give generously to someone? How would you describe your attitude and the impact of your obedience or disobedience?
 - Read Hebrews 7:1-8 and 1 Corinthians 16:1-2. When you consider tithing as an act of worship, done regularly, and in proportion to your budget, what do you find challenging?
2. Faithful giving involves sacrifice.

Read Hebrews 11:17-18 and Mark 12: 42-44. What is the most daring or sacrificial thing you have done with some of your money? What was your motive? What did you learn about yourself or God from that risk?
3. Faithful giving anticipates an eternal reward.

Read Hebrews 11:10-12 and Matthew 6:19-21. If your finances reflect your priorities, what is it revealing about your heart's focus?
4. Do you have a growing faith? How is obedience to God, sacrificial giving, and living for eternity shaping your journey?

Personal Reflection:

- To what extent do your tithing habits and attitudes line up with Scripture?
- What do you need to surrender to Jesus? How will you respond to what Jesus is showing you?
- What verse, phrase or word do you need to take with you this week? How will you act on what you've heard?

Prayer: Spend time praying for one another, inviting the Holy Spirit to search your heart and ask Him to highlight any area where you can grow in faith.
