




## Timethy 2:1

I urge you, first of all, to pray for all people. Ask God to help them; intercede on their behalf, and give thanks for them.


Sally thought for a minute about how she should answer Jim's question. The Bible tells us to pray for all people, and that includes our friends, and so many other people. So, how should she answer his question.

"I can do that," said Jim. "But there was another part of that verse that I didn't really understand."


"Which part?" asked Sally.


"Yeah, it does," he said. "And I know I can do all that. Pray, be thankful and intercede. Yeah, I can do that."
