




## II Tim. 3:16

All scripture is God-breathed and useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness





It was a typical day at Jefferson Elementary School. The teachers were teaching, the students were learning, and the birds were chirping outside the window.


"Man, I really want to be outside right now," said Matthew. "Look at it out there. The sun is out, it's a clear day. Why am I stuck in here!"




That got Matthew even more charged up. It was one thing to say we have to go to school because the law says so. It is another thing to say God says so.

"See, Peter and Paul, but not God," he said, sounding triumphant.


Just then, God put a Bible verse in Amanda's mind that she knew would really help Matthew understand what she was saying.

"Inspired means that God put His thoughts into the hearts of everyone who wrote the Bible and then they put it all down in their own words," she said.


God made it perfectly clear what He wanted in the Bible, she explained, and then gave all of those truths to Peter and Paul and many others to write down.

When II Timothy 3:16 says "all scripture is God-breathed" it is telling us that every word in the Bible comes from the heart of God. Peter said it best when he explained that no words in Scripture came from the writers own understanding of things. The Bible "never had its origins in people," Peter said, but instead the writers "spoke words from God as they were guided by the Holy Spirit."
