The Tapestry of Isaiah 40-53

Six Threads or Themes in Isaiah 40-53

- 1. The futility and impotency of idolatry (**40**:18-20; **41**:7, 21-24, 29; **42**:8, 17; **44**:9-20; **45**:16, 20; **46**:1, 2, 5-7; **48**:5).
- 2. The incomparable nature, uniqueness and eternality of God in contrast to idols. In every chapter from 40 to 48 this theme is met: **40**:18-26; **41**:4; **43**:10, 13; **44**:6, 8; **48**:12 with a crescendo in **45**:5, 6, 14, 18, 21, and 22. Note the significance of "I am the first and I am the last" (**41**:4; **44**:6; **48**:12) when compared to Rev. **1**:8, 17; **2**:8; **22**:13.
- 3. Words of comfort and promise of release (as in **49**:15f).
- 4. The gradual revelation about Cyrus who will free Israel from captivity (41:2, 3, 25; 45:1-3, 13; 46:11; 48:14, 15).
- 5. The servant passages that culminate with the Messiah's redemptive work. In the early occurrences the word *servant* refers to Israel; in the later passages it refers to the Messiah.
- 6. Prophesies regarding the salvation of Gentiles (**42**:1, 6; **45**:22; **49**:6; **52**:15; note also **58**:8 and compare Jn. **10**:16).
