Two Visions and Seven Trumpets

Introduction

Acts 1:6-11

• Focus on the opportunity, and

• The empowerment for that opportunity and responsibility to be witnesses Matt. 24:3-8

- I. Two visions of the followers of Christ (7:1-17)
 - A. The purposes of the interlude
 - 1. The calamities inflicted by the wrath of the lamb on rebellious humanity cannot sever us from God's protective care.
 - 2. The interlude creates suspense.
 - B. Some important details of the two visions
 - 1. The first vision emphasizes the Israelite history of the church (7:1-4).
 - 2. The second vision emphasizes the international character of the church (7:9-10).
 - 3. Only those who have the Lamb's seal of ownership can withstand the Lamb's wrath.
 - 4. The first vision emphasizes an ordered people in battle formation braced for war.
 - 5. The second vision emphasizes a countless, international crowd celebrating.

 - 1. Their identity: the church
 - Fits the parallel interlude between 6th and 7th seal
 - Fits the immediate context of the beast making war against the church
 - Fits the time frame
 - 2. Their importance
- D. The Seventh Trumpet (11:15-19)
