Not every class has a handout, and some classes could have two or more handouts. For this reason, handouts are numbered sequentially by handout number in the order received. These numbers will not likely match the lecture/class number. Some classes will have no handouts at all, so for those classes only the audio file will be posted.

In order to conserve space on the host computer and time required to upload files to the host, audio files are in MP3 format with a single channel of audio (i.e., monaural).

There are two ways you may deal with these MP3 files:

1. To listen to an MP3 file directly from your computer, simply click on the named file.
2. MP3 files are also suitable to be downloaded to your computer, and from there can be copied to a personal MP3 file player such as an iPod. After downloading an MP3 file to your computer, you can use the computer to play the file as well.

If you choose to download an audio file, it will depend on the type of computer you are using:

- PC-type computer. Right click on the MP3 file name. Then after choosing where you want the downloaded file to be stored, click on your choice and the file will be downloaded.
- Apple/Mac computer. Hold down the Control Key (just as you would the Shift Key to make a capital letter), then click on the MP3 file name. Then after choosing where you want the downloaded file to be stored, click on your choice and the file will be downloaded.

Christ in the Old Testament

“In the Volume of the Book it is Written of Me”

1. Why look for Christ in the O.T.? What is hermeneutics and where did the hermeneutical principle of looking for Christ in the O.T. originate? The example of Christ.
2. Why look for Christ? The example and practice of Christ and the apostles.
3. Why look for Christ? The unique nature of redemptive history, the way it has been constructed.
4. How should we look for Christ in the O.T.?
5. Where should we look for Christ in the O.T.? Theophanies such as the Angel of the Lord and the Word of the Lord.
6. Where should we look? Perhaps in Isaiah’s vision in Isa. 6 and in Daniel’s experience in Dan. 10.
7. Where should we look? Prefigurements and types in events such as the Flood, the Exodus, Passover, and Yom Kippur.
8. Where should we look? Prefigurements and types in things, objects such as Noah’s ark, the Tabernacle, sacrificial animals, and others.
9. Where should we look? Prefigurements and types in the three offices of prophet, priest, and king.
10. Where should we look? Prefigurements and types in persons such as Adam, Isaac, Moses, and others.
11. Where should we look? In prophecies in the Pentateuch, the poetical books, and the prophets. As to the Pentateuch and poetical books, principally the Psalms.
12. Where should we look? In the prophets as to Christ’s incarnation and two natures.
13. Where should we look? In the prophets as to Christ’s death and resurrection.
