Series: Jesus Saves [Part 1]

Big Picture

"Jesus saves" is a phrase commonly used. However, it is important to know that His salvation is not only intended for our benefit in the afterlife but also to help others. Jesus taught us to be humble servants, kind to those who are marginalized, and compassionate towards those who need help. By serving others, we gain a unique perspective on life. When we serve God and others, we express gratitude for His salvation.

*42 Jesus called them together and said, "You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. **43 Not so with you...** Instead, whoever wants to **become great** among you must be your **servant, 44**, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. **45** For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but **to serve**, and to give his life as a ransom for many."*
