EDITORIAL

Unity Is Our Heritage

Heritage is important. It provides a sense of direction and purpose. It solidifies the foundation built by predecessors. It promises hope of achieving goals passed down through generations. It confirms identity. And, when remembered, it prevents repeating poor performances of the past.

Churches of Christ in America have a rich heritage, but it isn't directly traceable to the first century, as many would claim. Jesus' church has always persevered in one form or another since the cross of Christ, but it hasn't always looked like us. The origination of our Christian heritage actually can be traced to the early 1800's. Leading men and women from many denominations came to the same conclusion: Christianity had lost its way and was too divided to be effective in its mission of seeking and saving those who were lost in sin. So Presbyterians, Ana-Baptists, Pentecostals and others got their heads together and decided the division had to end.

What caused all the division in the first place? Man-made traditions and interpretations had taken on the same level of authority as the Word of God for most of the Christian world. So men like Alexander Campbell, Thomas Campbell, "Raccoon" John Smith and Barton W. Stone challenged folks to go back to the Bible, and the Bible alone. They decided speculations created arguments which led to division, and division stunted growth in Christ, so confinement to the language of the Scriptures was agreed upon as the only instruction to be taught. The history books have dubbed this the American Restoration Movement; calling Bible things by Bible names, speaking where the Bible speaks and being silent where it is silent. This was a great beginning, which saw early adoption by literally thousands of believers.

But a strange thing has happened on the way to the Restoration Movement: most of our members have forgotten that **unity is our heritage**. Not unity for the sake of being in the same exclusive club. But unity of purpose to seek and save people who need Jesus. *If what we do as a church doesn't save people from sin, then what is the point?* Distractions like budgets, paint colors, types of carpet, songbooks or slides, parking lots, who's in charge, and other trivialities have dominated our time. Inability to play well with others is turning the hearts of the current generation away from traditional church in search of something with more hands-on and heart.

As we finish up 2022, having just celebrated our 70th anniversary as a congregation as well as remembering the many disciples who have left us a great heritage, let's also remember that unity is our heritage and absolutely necessary if we are going to grow and reach people for Jesus Christ. It is time to revive the call of our heritage for unity among all believers. Let's focus on agreement and minimize disagreement. Let's be the church whose heart and hands work as one.


